DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT

To the Eighth Annual Conference of the Louisiana District, to our faithful ministers, to our loyal members and friends, to Rev. R. C. Hawkins General Secretary of Church Extension, and Chairman of our Conference, greetings in the name of our Saviour.

GENERAL:

Alexandria has had a good year under the capable leadership of Rev. Wayne Quinn. They have been able to add a new Sunday School unit of three rooms, purchase a P. A. system with chimes and have their indebtedness well in hand, having paid their parsonage side-note ahead to July, 1958. They have had a gain of fifteen in membership.

Bastrop has been remarkably blessed of God. They show gains in both church membership and Sunday School attendance. Due to the untiring efforts of their pastors, Rev. and Mrs. Jack Polson, they now have a beautiful new 30 X 60 church building. I call this the miracle church. It is built of haydite block, it has indirect lighting, mahogany doors, lifetime aluminum windows and screens, with beautiful synite glass. It also has forced air ventilation, four class rooms, a nursery and rest rooms. New pews have been ordered and best of all this entire building with pews has cost less than \$3,500.00 yet a conservative estimate of value is \$12,000.00. The total indebtedness of the two lots where it is situated and the building is only \$3000.00. The church at Bastrop has also purchased a new parsonage.

Bogalusa has moved along well under the leadership of Bro. and Sister Titus Creech. They have added at least one new Sunday School room and have made other improvements to the property, which will be conducive to progress. This church has called Rev. and Mrs. R. D. Rodriguez as their pastors.

Boston Rouge has called Bro. and Sister Titus Creech as their pastors for the coming year and I predict that this church will move forward under their leadership.

Lake Charles has suffered severe reverses this year, but we believe this situation is clearing up, and that we will soon have property better located and practically free of debt.

Oakdale has enjoyed a good year with Bro. and Sister R. E. Ross their pastors. They have made many improvements to the property which has beautified the interior of their church. They also show a gain in Sunday School attendance.

Pineville has moved forward again this year with Rev. and Mrs. Granville Carroll as their pastors. They have been able to liquidate a large amount of the indebtedness incurred in their recent remodeling program.

Simms has moved along well with their pastors Rev. and Mrs. Paul Sherwood. The spirit of this work is so improved that it is my personal feeling that they are making sound progress.

Shreveport has done well despite the fact they had a change of pastors in the middle of the year due to the resignation of Rev. C. P. Pridgen. Rev. and Mrs. S. P. Creech have supplied the work since that time, and have been recalled for another year and they are doing a splendid job.

West Monroe has a beautiful new sanctuary of ultra-modern design, with class room and rest room facilities, indirect lighting, central heat and beautiful blue koolite windows. Rev. and Mrs. Walter Stogdill came from the Illinois Conference to Pastor this work in January.

I would like to summarize this part of my report by saying that there has been a small gain in Sunday School attendance and church membership. That our people have handled more money than ever in their history. A grand total of \$51,061.51 has come into our treasuries. This means we have had a percapita giving of \$221.00. It should also be kept in mind that this report only covers an eleven month period.

Our Pastors have received \$14,160.99 which is an increase of 11% over last year.

PERSONAL:

I have preached more than 100 times. I have had the privilege of seeing a number of people bowing at the alter for pardon or purity. I have visited each church in the district at least twice. During the course of the year I have travelled more than 10,000 for the district. I have given more than 1000 hours of manual labor to the district. This time has gone to the West Monroe and Bastrop churches which I have had the responsibility of constructing. I pastored our church in West Monroe for six months of the year. I made many pastoral calls in connection with this work. It has also been my privilege to negotiate the opening of the new work in Columbia, Miss. This is the first Pilgrim work situated with the bounds of this State. I have acted as supply pastor for this work for the past few months. Rev. & Mrs. Pat LaFon of Owosso, Mich. have been secured as pastors of this new work. It is my own personal belief that it presents one of the greatest challenges and finest opportunities that we have today. I attended the church leaders Conference in Indianapolis and one school board meeting in Kernersville, N. C.

I wish to express my appreciation for every co-operation I have received from both the ministers and members of the District. Also to

thank Rev. R. C. Hawkins and the Department of Church Extension for everything they have done for the district. My love for Christ deepens, my determination to do His service increases, and my sincere prayer is that the Louisiana District will be able to move forward this year to greater victories that it has never experienced before.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The first sitting of the Eighth Annual Conference of the Louisiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:30 A. M., June 13, 1956 at Camp Lake Mil Mar, Pineville, Louisiana.

The Conference was opened by singing the hymn "Trust and Obey" followed by the chorus "Fall Fresh on Me" led by Rev. James Butler, our camp song evangelist. Rev. G. B. Carroll led in the opening prayer after which Rev. J. E. Abila, District Superintendent, introduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Extension, to the Conference. Rev. Hawkins took charge of the Conference and presided at the business sessions.

Before opening the business session Rev. Hawkins addressed the pastors, delegates and friends of the Conference on the subject of the "Forward Movement". Basing his remarks upon Acts 16:5, he stated that the text is divided into two parts: (1) Established in the Faith (2) Increased in number daily. He stated that there is a place in the grace of God where it is settled, that one need not always be returning to an altar of prayer, but that through determination and faith one's experience can be established. He also advanced the thought that compromise is not essential to progress but that dependence upon God at any cost will enable us to push out beyond excuses that the battle is too hard. As a summary statement he said, "Let GO FORWARD be our watch word".

After the address the Secretary called the roll, calling first the ministerial delegates then the lay delegates.

Moved and carried that Mrs. Stogdill be seated as delegate from the West Monroe church.

Moved and carried that the first five rows of seats on both sides of the auditorium be designated for the Conference bar.

The reception committee presented to the Conference Rev. and Mrs. James Butler, Rev. and Mrs. B. F. Durham, Rev. and Mrs. Walter Stogdill, Rev. and Mrs. Finas Corie and family and Rev. and Mrs. Pat LaFon. It was moved and carried that these fine people be given a seat with in the Conference bar.

The chair called for establishment of time for the sessions. It was moved and carried that the morning session end at 11:45 A. M. and that the second session convene at 1:00 P. M. and remain in session until the business is completed.

Rev. J. E. Abila our District Supt. read his report of the work of the district as well as his personal report. This report was accepted with a hearty "Amen" from the Conference.

Rev. S. I. Emery, camp evangelist, was presented to the Conference. Bro. Emery gave a wonderful testimony. It was moved and carried that he be given a seat within the Conference bar.

The Auditing report was read and accepted.

The District Treasurers report was read and accepted.

The District Statistician's report was read and accepted. Special note was taken concerning the gain of the district property value.

The Sunday School Promotional Secretary's report was read and accepted. The Secretary then presented the highest numerical gain and the highest per centage gain awards. Both went to the Alexandria church.

It was moved and carried that new ministers coming into the district be received into the Conference, pending their transfer, in order to give them a voice in the Conference proceedings.

The Resolutions committee began its report.

Adjourned by expiration of time. Prayer by Mr. Elbert Squyers.

SECOND SESSION OF THE CONFERENCE:

The second session of the Conference opened with Rev. Lee Rathbun leading the song "Near the Cross". Rev. B. F. Durham prayed.

It was moved and carried to dispense with the roll call.

The minutes of the morning session were read and approved.

The Women's Missionary Society report was given by Mrs. G. B. Carroll. It was accepted with a hearty "Amen."

The Resolutions committee concluded its report. With certain corrections and rejections it was accepted.

The Educational and Examining committee offered the following recommendations.

- (1.) Rev. R. D. Rodriguez to receive fourth year license.
- (2.) Rev. Irene Creech to receive third year license.
- (3.) Rev. Herman Henderson and Rev. Jessie Carter to receive second year license.
- (4.) Rev. Ira Lee Young and Rev. Lee Hollingsworth to receive first year license.
- (5.) Mrs. John Boyett to receive deaconess license.

The next order of business being the election of officers Rev. Hawkins read the names of those appointed by the General Board. These and other officers elected will be found on the page with the official directory.

Rev. Abla asked that the council be dismissed for a short session. Permission granted.

Rev. Jessie Carter was asked to sing and play. He sang, "It is no Secret What God can do."

The chair then called for a five minute recess.

The Conference reconvened and Bro. Abla read the various committee appointments.

After a few words of commendation and exhortation by Rev. R. C. Hawkins the Conference adjourned with prayer by District Supt., Rev. J. E. Abla.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Resolved that three copies of all reports be made; the monthly reports to be mailed; one to the General Secretary of Church Extension, and one to the District Superintendent, and the annual reports be sent immediately at the close of the year to the District Statistician and District Superintendent. The third copies of the reports to be retained for local files.
2. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his report to the District Statistician not later than 10 days after the Conference year closes.
3. Resolved that each church give a pounding for the pastor the first Sunday of each month and that the church board appoint someone to take care of this matter.
4. Resolved that the minister's license shall not be granted to anyone who does not tithe to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.
5. Resolved that all register who come to camp.
6. Resolved that every person attending the camp bring his own bed linens.
7. Resolved that each pastor be given a vacation of two weeks each year with pay.
8. Resolved that all ministers pursuing the course of study, take the examination through the Pilgrim College at Kernersville, North Carolina.
9. In as much as there is to be two elected advisory members to the District Council; be it resolved that one by a lay member.

10. Resolved if funds are available that the District send the District Youth Leader and the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary to the workers Conference each year.

11. Resolved that the District Youth Leader and the Sunday School Promotional Secretary tour the District once a year in the interest of their respective fields in the company of the District Superintendent.

12. Resolved that the District be divided into zones and that each zone have a leader appointed by the Council. Purpose to provide opportunity for fellowship and Youth Rallys for our young people. Further that a meeting be held in each zone at least twice a year.

13. Resolved that the Conference show our appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. J. E. Abia; our Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins; our camp evangelists, Rev. S. I. Emery and to our musicians, Rev. and Mrs. James Butler; and also to our cook and kitchen help.

Be it further resolved that a note of appreciation be given to Mrs. Roy O. Martin for her kind consideration in leasing these beautiful commodious grounds to the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Louisiana District.

Be it further resolved that we as a Conference show our appreciation to the District Officials by a rising vote of thanks and with an "AMEN".

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that all ordained and licensed ministers pay their ministerial tithe into the District Treasury through their local church treasury.

2. We recommend that all birthday offerings be paid to the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Home Missions.

3. We recommend that the Ministerial tithe and budget system as practiced last year be continued, providing that in some of the churches the budget be raised to an amount agreed upon by the pastor and conference. We also recommend that offerings taken on the superintendents expense when he is present at a church be applied on the local church District budget.

4. We recommend that each church pay budget on monthly bases. Set up on 11 months. The conference month be excluded from budget. In this case month of June. Alexandria \$16.00, Bastrop \$4.00, Baton Rouge \$4.00, Bogalusa \$6.00, West Monroe \$6.00, Oakdale \$8.00, Pineville \$16.00, Shreveport \$12.00 and Simms \$13.00.

5. We recommend that all monies be sent to the District Treasurer not later than the tenth of each month.

6. We recommend that all monies from the local churches destined to the General Treasurer be sent to the District Treasurer.

7. We recommend that each church pay equivalent of \$1.00 per member of voting age, per year to be applied on the General Conference expense, the last payment to be made not later than May 1. 1958.

8. We recommend that there be a camp meeting registration fee of \$1.00 per person above the age of twelve years old, to be applied to the expense of the camp.

9. We recommend that five per cent of the District Budget be paid to our zone Bible School.

10. We recommend that the District raise it's portion of the District Superintendent's salary of \$100.00 a month. We further recommend that we pay five cents per mile travel expense, also that we pay his postage, stationary, and telephone expense as used in connection with his duties in District work.

11. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$3.00 per month for his service. Further we recommend that each member of the District Council be paid at the rate of five cents per mile when called to District Council meetings. Further we recommend that the District Treasures and Secretary be supplied their stationary and postage for District work.

12. We recommend that all who have books of the study course for licensed ministers or deaconess, send a list of the same to the District Secretary and that the District purchase the remaining needed books to complete the courses, that these books be placed with the District Secretary to be lent to anyone taking the courses, but who do not have the means to purchase same, and the care of the books or loss of the same be chargeable to the borrower as well as the mailing charge both way.

13. We recommend that there be a offering taken in the local church to defray the pastor's expenses to and from camp; this offering to be taken by the District Superintendent at his annual meeting with the local church.

14. We recommend that the churches pay their pastors while they are attending camp and conference the same as if they were on their charge.

15. We recommend that there be organized with this District-A NEW CHURCH FELLOWSHIP to be patterned after the HELPING HAND FELLOWSHIP of the Department of Church Extension. The purpose of this fellowship will be to receive as many members as possible who will contribute \$3.00 per call. Said call not to exceed two per year.

16. We recommend that the Sunday School Promotional Secretary and Youth Secretary raise the finance for trip to Headquarters in September through a Sunday School and Youth Rally or a bulletin sent to each church.
