REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the members of the 10th annual conference of the Louisian District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, to Reverend R. C. Hawkin our chairman and General Secretary of Church Extension, to our laymen and many friends, I greet you in the name of our Redeemer and coming King.

In the following report, whatever victories have been gained and the material progress we have made can be credited to the efficiency and hard work of consecrated pastors and laymen of our district.

GENERAL:

ALEXANDRIA: has remodeled the living room and dining room and also painted the parsonage outside. The church has been redecorated inside.

BASTROP: The church floor has been covered with a beautiful tile and the nursery completed.

BATON ROUGE: We have rented the church for \$100.00 a month for one year with an option to buy at the end of the year. We will not quit at Baton Rouge. Plans are being worked out to send a man there soon after conference.

COLUMBIA, MISS.: The church has been completed on the inside and brick veneered outside. This church shows signs of great promise

LAKE CHARLES: We have reopened our work here under the leadership of Reverend and Mrs. Don Fuller. At the present time a complete church program is being conducted in the parsonage with favorable results. The old church was sold and a new building is well unde way. The new church is an L-type structure with laminated arches and an exposed tim-deck ceiling inside. The outside is a beautif buff-color brick. The educational unit has six class rooms, restrooms and a nursery. God is blessing this fine young couple and the outlook is very good.

SHREVEPORT: Has built a new church this year. This project which seemed almost impossible has been accomplished by months of hard work and sacrifice by Reverend and Mrs. Horne and their fine people. I was priveleged to preach the first sermon in this new building on Easter Sunday. The building is of block construction and is 36' by 70'. The floor plan provides for seven classrooms, restrooms, a nursery, and an auditorium 36' by 36'. The total debt on this new building is only \$2,800.00.

SIMMS: The church has been repaired and covered outside with an asbestos shingle. This has greatly imporved the value and appearance of the property.

GENERAL:

TIOGA: This is our newest project and the building is nearing completion. With the \$1500 Helping Hand money that we received for this project we were able to buy the lot which is 80° by 200°, move the portable tabernacle and erect it on a concrete slab and build a new roof. Brother and Sister Titus Creech are pastoring this work and services are being held in the homes of our people until the church can be finished on the inside.

WEST MONROE: Has purchased a new parsonage. This was made possible through the Easter Offering from our district last year. We anticipate a sale of all our West Monroe property to the state in the immediate future due to a new highway. This could be to our advantage.

I have visited each church at least twice and most of them three and four times. CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The first sitting of the tenth annual conference of the puisiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 30 A. M. July 21, 1958

The conference was opened by singing "Sunshine in the Soul" ed by Mr. Julius Hooter. Rev. William Murray then led in rayer after which Rev. Arnold Peck, the District Superintendent, atroduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church stension, who presided over the conference.

Rev. Hawkins addressed the conference basing his remarks the scripture found in II Thessalonians 3:15.

The first order of business was the calling of the roll by ne secretary.

The first ten rows of seats in the left center section of ne tabernacle were designated as the conference bar.

It was moved and seconded that Rev. John Horne and Rev. Don aller, new pastors in the conference, be seated in the conference bar. Motion carried.

The chairman called for the establishment of time for the ittings. It was moved and seconded that the morning session at at 11:45 A. M. and the second session begin at 1:00 P. M. and remain in session until the business be completed. Motion arried.

The District Superintendent read his report. It was accepted ith a hearty "Amen."

The report of the auditing committee was read and accepted.

The district treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The Statistician's report was then read. One correction was ade, that being the utilities of the parsonage at Shreveport were of being paid by the church as the report indicated. With this prrection the report was accepted.

The District Sunday School Promotional Secretary's report as read and accepted.

The District Youth Secretary's report was read and accepted.

The Educational and Examining Board presented the following recommendations:

Fourth Year District License, R. D. Rodriguez Irene Creech Don Fuller

Second Year District License, Herman Henderson William Murray

First Year District License, Elbert Squyers

First Year Deaconess License, Mrs. John Boyette.

The Board also recommended that Rev. John Horne and Rev. Curtis Cox be received into the conference on credentials from the West Virginia conference.

An amendment was presented to include Rev. Robert Green in the report. The amendment was carried. The report was accepted.

The Resolutions Committee presented a partial report: Resolution No. 1. Adopted. Resolution No. 2. Was read. It was moved and seconded to table this until resolution No. 3 was acted upon. Motion carried. Resolution No. 3. Adopted. Resolution No. 2 was reread and adopted. Resolution No. 4. Adopted Resolution No. 5 Adopted.

The Ways and Means Committee began its report. Recommendation No. 2 page 11 of the minutes was read. It was moved and seconded to delete this recommendation from the minutes. Carried. Recommendations Nos. 2-5 from the memograph sheet were read and adopted. Recommendations No. 6 was read. It was moved and secon to refer back to the committee to amend. Motion lost. Recommendation No. 6 was carried. Recommendation No. 7 Carried.

The session was adjuourned by expiration of time. Prayer by Brother Hawkins.

The afternoon session opened with Brother Julius Hooter eading the conference in singing "Victory in Jesus." Prayer V Brother Peck.

The minutes of the morning sitting were read and approved.

The Ways and Means Committee continued its report: Recommendation No. 8 Lost. Was read. Recommendation No. 9 It was moved and seconded to amend. The amendment was carried. Recommendation No. 10 Carried. Recommendation No. 12 Carried.

The next order of business was the election of officers. rother Hawkins read the appointments: District Superintendent-ev. Arnold Peck, District Secretary -- Rev. Paul Sherwood, Istrict Treasurer -- Rev. Raymond Kensell.

Those who were elected as advisory members to the council ere: Rev. John Horne and Mr. B. F. Garlington.

The District Secretary read the nominations for the ducational and Examining Board along with the following motion rom the council. (Moved and carried that since there are two erms to be supplied--the first and third--that the one receiving he highest number of votes be elected to the third year term hd the second highest be elected to the first year term). nose elected were: Rev. Raymond Kensell-three year term, Rev. at LaFon-one year term. Rev. Arnold Peck was elected as rustee for a three year term.

The various committee appointments were read by the District uperintendent. These appear in the directory.

Rev. Raymond Kensell read the report of the Memoirs Committee. he report revealed the passing of one of the charter members f the West Monroe church.

The Resolutions Committee presented three more resolutions,

hus completing their report. Resolution No. 6 Adopted. Resolution No. 7 Adopted. Resolution No. 8 Adopted by a rising vote.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins presented the program for the next four ears, calling for the Louisiana District to become fully rganized by the next General Conference.

Rev. Arnold Peck, District Superintendent, spoke to the onference out of a burdened heart. At the conclusion of his peech, it was moved and seconded to accept the program handed own by the Department of Church Extension. The motion was arried.

There being no further business the conference was adjourned n prayer by Rev. S. P. Creech.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Resolved that three copies of all reports be made; the monthly reports to be mailed; one to the General Secretary of Church Extension, and one to the District Superintendent. The annual reports to be sent immediately at the close of the year to the District Statistician and District Superintendent. The third copies of the reports to be retained for local files.

2. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his or her report to the District Statistician not later than ten days after the conference year closes.

3. Resolved that each church give a pounding for the pastor the first Sunday of each month and that the church board appoint someone to take care of this matter.

4. Resolved that minister's license shall not be granted to anyone who does not tithe to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

5. Resolved that all register who come to camp.

6. Resolved that every person attending the camp bring his own bed linens.

7. In as much as there are two elected advisory members to the District council; Be it resolved that one may be a lay member.

8. Resolved that if funds are available the District shall send the District Youth Leader and the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary to the Workers Conference each year.

9. Resolved that the District Youth Leader and the Distric Sunday School Promotional Secretary tour the district once each year in the interest of their respective fields in the company of the District Superintendent.

10. Resolved that the district be divided into zones and that each zone have a leader appointed by the Council. The purpose--to provide opportunity for fellowship and Youth Rallys for our young people. Further that a meeting be held in each zone at least twice a year. 11. In as much as it seems to work a hardship on pastors and the churches for their pastors to be away so much during the summer, on vacations and at the camp meeting, therefore be it resolved: To change the district camp to one week, beginning on Monday night and continuing over one Sunday with conference collowing on Monday after camp; Be it further resolved, To provide for a Youth Camp separate from the District Camp, the same to begin on Monday night and close on Friday night.

12. Whereas our present camp ground is not being used, We the Resolutions Committee hereby recommend under the direction of the District Council, the sale of the present camp property at Simms; and be it further resolved that the money be used for a camp site.

13. Be it resolved that a camp planning and building committee be appointed by the District Superintendent and approved by the District Council.

14. Whereas the Finance Committee functioned so efficiently In this capacity be it resolved that the council appoint another committee for the coming year.

15. Whereas our pastors come and go, Be it resolved that the camp planning and building committee be divided equal between pastors and laymen. Be it further resolved that the camp location cannot be moved without conference action.

16. Whereas it works a hardship on the churches for the bastors to be gone so long at one time, Be it resolved that the bastor's vacation consist of sixteen (16) days.

17. In as much as the General Board has rezoned our district as a part of the Colorado Springs Bible School zone, Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall serve as our representative on the school board during the coming year while the process of reorganization takes place.

18. Resolved that the conference express our appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. Arnold Peck; our Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, and all of our District Officials, by a rising vote of thanks.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that all ordained and licensed ministers pay their ministerial tithe into the District Treasury through their local church treasurer.

2. We recommend that all monies from the local churches destined to the General Treasurer be sent to the District Treasurer, and sent not later than the tenth (10th) of each month.

3. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$5.00 per month for his services; also that each member of the District Council be paid at the rate of five cents (5ϕ) per mile when called to District Council meetings and the District Treasurer and Secretary be supplied their stationary and postage for District work.

4. We recommend that five per cent (5%) of the District Budget be paid to our zone Bible College.

5. We recommend that our Sunday School Promotional Secretary and Executive Youth Secretary attend the Worker's Conference held annually at Church Headquarters. Expense for same shall be taken from these separate departmental funds.

6. We recommend a Sunday School Fund be adopted by the following plan: (a) The first Sunday of August shall be known as "Sunday School Dollar Day" in our churches, wherein adults shall be urged to give one dollar. (b) All Sunday School offerings received this first Sunday of August shall be sent no later than August 15th to the District Treasurer. This is to become a separate Sunday School fund which shall further be used to promote District Sunday School work.

7. We recommend that a District Youth Budget be inaugurated according to the following plan: Each local Youth Society shall set aside ten percent (10%) of its weekly offerin to be paid monthly to the District Youth Treasurer, and that seventy-five (75) percent of the zone rallies' offerings be sent to the same immediately following such rallies. This fund shall be used to promote District Youth work.

8. We recommend that the camp meeting registration fee be \$1.00 per person above the age of six (6) years, and all meals taken in the camp dining room be charged at the following rates: Breakfast 25ϕ , Dinner 35ϕ , and Supper 30ϕ . Meal tickets shall be sold at the above rates. 9. We recommend that the churches pay their pastors while they are attending camp and conference the same as if they were on their charge.

10. We recommend that the District pay its portion of the District Superintendent's salary which is \$100.00 a month, also that we pay him five cents $(5\not\epsilon)$ per mile travel expense, his postage, stationary, telephone expense (as used in connection with his duties in district work) and utilities.

11. We recomment that each church pay District and General budgets according to the following: \$8.00 total per member of voting age, of which \$6.00 remain in the district for district expenses, and \$2.00 be forwarded by the District Treasurer to the General Headquarters. We further recommend that this budget be paid monthly, and that all pastors whose budgets are delinquent be accountable to the District Council.
