REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the members of the 11th annual conference of the Louisiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, to Reverend R. C. Hawkins our chairman and General Secretary of Church Extension, to our laymen and friends, greetings in the name of Him who loved us and redeemed us from sin.

This convention and conference has been highly honored with a wonderful moving of God's Spirit upon us. The ministry of Brother Hawkins has quickened within me a desire for a spiritual revival in our district. I believe this seed has been sown in each of our hearts and will germinate and bring forth fruitage in our churches.

Following is a report of the numerical and material progress that we have made in our district this past year.

GENERAL:

ALEXANDRIA-has built a new unit into the Sunday School annex which is serving a threefold purpose; Sunday school, children's church, and youth activities.

BOGALUSA-has made wonderful progress in their remodeling program. The inside walls and ceiling have been refinished with wall board. The outside church roof and entrance have been rebuilt. The parsonage has undergone extensive and much needed repair. Future plans call for an added unit on the parsonage.

LAKE CHARLES-our people are enjoying the accommodations of their new church which is ninety percent complete. This is a beautiful building in a fine location and I feel it has a great future.

PINEVILLE-has showed marked improvement in every respect. The basement has been finished and decorated throughout. A steeple has been added to the church structure and a bulletin board erected on the lawn. The parsonage has been redecorated outside and inside.

TIOGA-the chapel has been completed and is very attractive on the inside. Much of the planning and labor can be credited to Brothers Elbert Squyers and Titus Creech. It was my privilege to organize this church recently.

WEST MONROE-is a bright spot in the picture now because of its spiritual and numerical growth.

While we should never look for excuses to justify our losses or meager gains, yet the facts are that some of you have been faced with obstacles that have not been easy to surmount. Some have met and gone beyond the goal of a ten percent increase for which we give God thanks and praise. Our general church stewardship fund was paid in full for the year.

A preaching point has been established at Elizebeth with the help of our Oakdale church and pastor. Brother and Sister Rodrigue are endeavoring to give us a new work there.

With three months having been taken from me this year because of the automobile accident in which the Cox's and myself were involved; with whatever problems and privileges we have shared together I count it an honor and privilege to have served you and the church.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The first sitting of the eleventh annual conference of the Louisiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:00 a.m. June 6, 1959, in the Alexandria Church.

The conference was opened by singing "We Have an Anchor", led by Rev. C. B. Cox. Rev. Lee Rathbun led in prayer after which Rev. Arnold Peck, our District Superintendent, introduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins, Secretary of Church Extension, who presided over the conference.

Rev. Hawkins addressed the conference basing his remarks on the scripture found in Galatians 5.

The first order of business was the roll call by the secretary.

The conference bar was designated to include the first three rows of seats across the front of the church.

The time for closing the first sitting was set for 12:00 noon

The District Superintendent read his annual report to the conference. This report was accepted by a hearty "Amen."

The newly organized church at Tioga along with the pastor and delegate were received into the conference by a rising vote.

The Auditing report was read and accepted.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The statistician's report was read and with certain corrections was accepted.

The Sunday School Executive Secretary read his report which was accepted.

The Youth Executive Secretary read his report which was also accepted.

The Educational and Examining Board presented the following recommendations:

The District Superintendent read a letter from Rev. S. P. Creech expressing regrets that he was unable to attend the conference. Brother Creech sent regards to all at the conference.

The next item of business to come before the conference was the report of the resolutions committee, with certain corrections and rejections it was adopted.

The ways and means committee presented its report which after certain corrections was adopted.

The order of business turned to the election of officers for the coming year. The Chairman read the appointments passed upon by the General Board: District Superintendent-Rev. Arnold Peck, District Secretary-Rev. Paul Sherwood, District Treasurer-Rev. Raymond Kensell.

Those elected to the District Council as advisory members were Rev. C. B. Cox and Mr. B. F. Garlington. These and other officers elected appear on the page with the official directory.

The District Superintendent read the committee appointments.

After a few encouraging remarks by the Chairman, the conference was adjourned in prayer.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Resolved that three copies of all reports be made; the monthly reports to be mailed; one to the General Secretary of Church Extension, and one to the District Superintendent. The annual reports to be sent immediately at the close of the year to the District Statistician and District Superintendent. The third copies of the reports to be retained for local files.

2. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his or her report to the District Statistician not later than ten days after the conference year closes.

3. Resolved that each church give a pounding for the pastor the first Sunday of each month and that the church board appoint someone to take care of this matter.

4. In as much as there are two elected advisory members to the District Council; Be it resolved that one may be a lay member.

5. Resolved that the District Youth Leader and the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary go to the workers conference each year.

6. Resolved that the District Youth Leader and the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary tour the district once each year in the interest of their respective fields in the company of the District Superintendent.

7. In as much as it seems to work a hardship on the district therefore be it resolved that the district camp be changed to a three day conference, beginning on Thursday and closing on Saturday. Be it further resolved to provide for a youth camp separate from the District Conference, the same to begin on Monday night and close on Friday.

8. Whereas the Finance Committee functioned so efficiently in the camp of 1958; Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appoint another committee for the district conference the coming year.

9. Whereas it works a hardship on the churches for the pastors to be gone so long at one time, Be it resolved that the pastor's vacation consist of sixteen (16) days.

10. In as much as the General Board has rezoned our district as a part of the Central Pilgrim College School Zone, Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and one lay member serve as our representative on the school board during the coming year.

11. Whereas the District Superintendent is in closer relation with our ministers of the district and their ministerial standing than the Educational and Examining Board; Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be a standing member of the Educational and Examining board.

12. Be it resolved that the entire camp fund be placed in a savings account to be used only at the discretion of the district conference.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that all ordained and licensed ministers pay their ministerial tithe into the District Treasury through their local church treasurer.

2. We recommend that all monies from the local churches destined to the General Treasurer be sent to the District Treasurer, and sent not later than the tenth (10th) of each month.

3. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$5.00 per month for his services; also that each member of the district council be paid at the rate of five cents (5¢) per mile when called to district council meetings and the District treasurer and secretary be supplied their stationary and postage for District work.

4. We recommend that five per cent (5%) of the District Budget be paid to our zone Bible College.

5. We recommend that our Sunday School Promotional Secretary and Executive Youth Secretary attend the Worker's Conference held annually at Church Headquarters. Expense for same shall be taken from these separate departmental funds.

6. We recommend a Sunday School Fund be adopted by the following plan: (a) The first Sunday of August shall be known as "Sunday School Dollar Day" in our churches, wherein adults shall be urged to give one dollar. (b) All Sunday School offerings received this first Sunday of August shall be sent no later than August 15th to the District Treasurer. This is to become a separate Sunday School fund which shall further be used to promote District Sunday School work.

7. We recommend that a District Youth Budget be inaugurated according to the following plan: Each local Youth Society shall set aside ten percent (10%) of its weekly offering to be paid monthly to the District Youth Treasurer, and that seventy-five (75) percent of the zone rallies' offerings be sent to the same immediately following such rallies. This fund shall be used to promote district youth work.

8. We recommend that the churches pay their pastors while they are attending camp and conference the same as if they were on their charge.

9. We recommend that the district pay its portion of the District Superintendent's salary which is \$115.00 a month, also that we pay him five cents (5¢) per mile travel expense, his postage, stationary, telephone expense (as used in connection with his duties in district work) and utilities.

10. We recommend that each church pay district and general budgets according to the following: \$10.00 total per member of voting age, of which \$6.00 remain in the district for district expenses, and \$4.00 be forwarded by the District Treasurer to the general headquarters. We further recommend that this budget be paid monthly, and that all pastors whose budgets are delinquent be accountable to the District Council.

AUDITING COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the auditing committee, have examined the District Treasurer's books and have found them to be correct.

DISTRICT SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

This year our district has twelve churches reporting. We are happy to add the Tioga church to our number, and certainly they have proved a real blessing already to our district. Their yearly average was 21.

Out of these twelve churches reporting, we have six showing a total gain of 49 in their schools, and six showing a loss of 31 in their schools. This leaves a district gain of 18 over last year.

I'm sure we all realize the real life line our Sunday School is to our entire church, and my prayer is that next year will prove to be the best year of our district in this department.

West Monroe, under the ministry of Rev. & Mrs. Raymond Kessell is our leading school this year in numerical gains. They show an average weekly attendance of 37, which is a 13 numerical gain. I'm sure we all as a district are proud of this fine gain.
