REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To Doctor R. G. Flexon, General Superintendent, Doctor R. G. Hawkins, Executive Secretary of Church Extension, To the Ministers and the Lay Delegates of this conference, I greet you in the name of our wonderful Savior.

This conference is one of merge and transition which will require the consecrated effort and loyalty of all of its constituency if it is to be the channel of blessing God wants it to be. I am ready to ask myself, "what can I do for the church" rather than ask "what can the church do for me." We must be as dedicated to our church and Christ as the Communist are to Communism. In the past decade our nation has spent a thousand billion dollars in Foreign Aid to stem the tide of this ruthless enemy, almost to the shores of bankruptcy for our nation, while all the time this Godless philosophy has crept steadily on until it now reaches out to the southern boundaries of our own shoreline.

The Pilgrim Holiness Church has spent many thousands of her dollars in districts like ours to stem the tide of sin and to redeem lost humanity; to plant spiritual lighthouses to help point the way. But the masses about us are still untouched by our church here in this district. In short, we are not reaching but precious few; and the few we reach can only become loyal to God and our church as they have loyal men of God as pastors to give instruction and guidance. We must tie the people that we influence to our church or we have left unfinished the task that is rightfully ours.

This year we have organized one new church at Columbus, Mississippi with 13 members and an average Sunday School of 27 for the year. The total numerical gains for the district this year are 14 additional members and an increase of 57 in Sunday School attendance. We have this 14 membership gain despite the fact that four of our churches show a combined loss of 15 in membership.

While all of our churches have not shown numerical gains, I feel that our men as a whole have given Louisiana-Mississippi its best year of solid ministry in many years. This is partly reflected by the fact there is not one pastoral change in the entire district. Most of our men are not just passing by, they are here to do a job.

Following is a partial report of some of the physical progress our churches have made:

ALEXANDRIA - Has installed a public address system which has added considerable to the acoustics. The Killens have given and are continuing to give the type of solid ministry this church needs. Its future is very promising. They closed out the year with every district and General Church obligation paid in full.

BATON ROUGE - Brother Bowman has worked hard to remodel the parsonage and make it liveable. This is a hard field for us and needs our prayers.

BOGALUSA - Has more than doubled its membership; Had a 28% Sunday School increase; has bought an adjoining property for an amazingly low price and developed it into a Sunday School annex. The church has been completely remodeled on the inside and a new roof has also been put on. They plan to pay off the debt on this project in 2 years.

BASTROP - Has had a 50% increase in Sunday School. This church is indebted to the sacrifices of Bro. and Sis. Rodriguez.

COLUMBIA - Is enjoying the fruits of a recent revival that has given new strength to our work there. The Sunday School is now moving forward to new heights.

LAKE CHARLES - Has shown small gains in all departments. Brother and Sister Summers have come to us from the Methodist church and I feel his ministry among us will prove to be a real blessing.

OAKDALE - The Rathbuns, who have given many years of ministry to this district have been handicapped by sickness all year but came through without showing any loss in the church.

PINEVILLE - Has the largest numerical Sunday School gain in the district with 19. They have had growth in every department and closed out their year with every district and general church obligation met.

SIMMS - Has added two restrooms and laid a beautiful new floor in the auditorium.

WEST MONROE - Has bought a new personage and furnished it completely. The Moores, who have come to us from the West coast are proving to be a real blessing here. Since the close of the conference year the highway has bought our church for \$23,544.00. After paying off the mortgage we will have \$14,000.00 for a new building program there.

SHREVEPORT - Has had a good year under the leadership of Brother Simmons. The parsonage has been completely redecorated.

We have two other preaching points which have been opened this past year. One at Effie which is close to Pineville. Brother Carrol Hammack is holding services there with an average attendance of 15. Also we have a work started in Gulfport and have made a property purchase there. We discovered there are three Pilgrim families there along with others that we can reach providing we can get a man to fill the vacancy in this needy field.

With the added strength by the merge with our Alabama churches there is no reason why we should not strive harder than ever to reach the status of a fully organized district by our next General Conference. If we strive together with the singleness of purpose to honor God and to build our district, God has promised to give us the increase.

I propose to you that not a single pastor of the newly formed Gulfstates conference go through this year with less than 10% gains in every department. Secondly, that each of you feel your responsibility to the district and general church by discharging your financial obligations at the end of each month in accordance with the regulations of this conference. Thirdly, that we make PILGRIMS as well as Christians out of the converts that come to our altars.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The first sitting of the first annual conference of the Gulf States District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:00 A.M. June 22, 1961 in the Pineville Church.

The conference was opened by singing "More About Jesus". Rev. Fred Summers led in prayer after which Dr. R. G. Flexon General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church; the chairman of the conference, was introduced.

Dr. R. G. Flexon read from John 1:6, centering his remarks around "There was a man sent from God", as described in the scripture.

The first order of business was the roll call by the conference secretary.

The conference bar was designated to include the first four rows of seats across the front of the church.

The chairman called for the report from the Educational and Examining Board. The motion was moved and seconded that we accept this report.

It was moved and seconded to receive Rev. Fred Summers from Mississippi, Rev. W. C. Killen from West Virginia and Rev. Sherman Moore from Pacific Northwest Conference.

The reception committee introduced to the conference Mr. Allen Killen from Alexandria, La. It was moved and seconded that we give Mr. Allen Killen an honorary seat within the conference bar.

The District Superintendent read his report. It was moved and seconded that we accept our District Superintendent's report with appreciation.

Upon the recommendation of the District Superintendent, it was moved and seconded that we accept the Columbus, Miss. church into the conference.

The Auditing report was read and accepted.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The Statistician's report was read and accepted.

The Ways and Means committee's report was read and after being fully discussed was adopted.

By expiration of time the conference adjourned for the noon meal.

The conference was reopened at 1:30 P.M. by singing "Amazing Grace". Rev. Sherman Moore led in prayer.

It was moved and seconded that we dispense with the roll call.

The chairman of the resolutions committee gave its report which after certain corrections and rejections was adopted.

The business for the afternoon sitting was the election of officers for the coming year.

Dr. R. C. Hawkins read the appointments passed upon by the General Board: District Superintendent, Rev. Arnold Peck; Secretary, Rev. Robert Emmons; Treasurer, Rev. Raymond Kensell.

Those elected as advisory members to the District Council were Rev. C. B. Cox and Rev. J. Wilson Smack. These and other officers elected appear on the page with the official directory.

Those elected as Ministerial Delegates to the General Conference are Rev. C. B. Cox and Rev. W. C. Killen, the alternate is Rev. J. W. Smack.

The Lay delegate to the General Conference is J. M. Hooter, alternate Mr. B. F. Garlington.

Rev. Raymond Kensell was elected for two year term on the Examining Board.

Rev. Arnold Peck was elected for a three year term as Trustee.

The District Superintendent read the committee appointments for the coming year.

It was moved and seconded that we give Rev. Arnold Peck authority to sign legal papers to assume any mortgages for the West Monroe property.

It was moved and seconded that the district set a budget of \$2.00 per member for Bible Schools.

The motion was made and seconded that we have a standing appreciation for Brother B. F. Garlington for being so faithful in his work on the District Council.

It was moved and seconded that the District Council work out any unfinished business that needs to be taken care of after the conference closes.

The business being concluded we were adjourned in prayer by Rev. Arnold Peck.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Resolved that three copies of all reports be made; the monthly reports to be mailed; one to the General Secretary of Church Extension, and one to the District Superintendent. The annual reports to be sent immediately at the close of the year to the District Statistician and District Superintendent. The third copies of the reports to be retained for local files.
2. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his or her report to the District Statistician not later than ten days after the conference year closes.
3. In as much as there are two elected advisory members to the District council; Be it resolved that one may be a lay member.
4. Be it resolved that we have a three day conference, beginning on Wednesday and closing on Friday; Be it further resolved to provide for a youth camp separate from the District Conference, the same to begin on Monday night and close on Friday.
5. Whereas it works a hardship on the churches for the pastors to be gone so long at one time; Be it resolved that the pastor's vacation consist of sixteen (16) days with pay.
6. In as much as the General Board has rezoned our district as a part of the Central Pilgrim College School Zone; Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and one lay member serve as our representative on the school board during the coming year.
7. Whereas the District Superintendent is in closer relation with our ministers of the district and their ministerial standing than the Educational and Examining Board; Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be a standing member of the Educational and Examining Board.
8. Be it resolved that the entire camp fund be placed in a savings account to be used only at the discretion of the district conference.
9. Resolved that this conference adopt a group hospitalization plan to be paid for either by the pastor or by his church, to be worked out between the pastor and his church.
10. Be it resolved that the names of all evangelists be put into the district minutes, providing they are passed on by conference.
11. Be it resolved that any church desiring to call an evangelist of another denomination should first consult the District Superintendent.

12. Resolved that the first Friday of each month be known as a day of fasting, prayer, soul-burden and consecration.

13. Be it resolved that our conference year close on April 30, and that all reports be in by May 15th.

14. Be it resolved that the District Council incorporate the Gulf States District in harmony with the laws of the several states that comprise this district.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that all money from the local churches destined to the General Treasurer be sent to the District Treasurer, and sent not later than the tenth of each month.

2. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$6.00 per month for his services; also that each member of the district council be paid at the rate of five cents per mile when called to district council meetings and the district treasurer and secretary be supplied their stationery and postage for district work.

3. We recommend that the district secretary be paid \$30.00 a year for his services.

4. We recommend that our Sunday School Promotional Secretary and Executive Youth Secretary attend the Worker's Conference held annually at Church Headquarters. Expense for same shall be taken from these separate departmental funds.

5. We recommend a Sunday School fund be adopted by the following plan; (a) The first Sunday of August shall be known as "S.S. Dollar Day" in our churches, wherein adults shall be urged to give one dollar. (b) All Sunday School offerings received this first Sunday of August shall be sent no later than August 15th to the District Treasurer. This is to become a separate S. S. fund which shall further be used to promote district Sunday School work.

6. We recommend that a district youth budget be inaugurated according to the following plan: Each local youth society shall set aside 10% of its weekly offering to be paid monthly to the district youth treasurer, and that 75% of the zone rallies' offerings be sent to the same immediately following such rallies. This fund shall be used to promote district youth work.

7. We recommend that the district pay its portion of the District Superintendent's salary which is \$150.00 a month, also that we pay him 5 cents per mile travel expense, his postage, stationery, telephone expense (as used in connection with his duties in district work) and his utilities.

8. We recommend that the district pay \$100.00 a year on the District Superintendent's Social Security.

9. We recommend that all the churches pay 10% of regular church and Sunday School offerings (all other offerings exempted) to district operations.

10. We recommend that the dime cards be used for raising the General Budget and Bible School offerings.

11. We recommend that each church pay \$20.00 a year for District Conference and Ministerial Convention.

12. We recommend that our conference adopt a home missionary plan: a dollar a year per member for each new church.
