It was ruled by the Chair that all preaching services, including sermons preached by evangelists, be reported at annual Assembly.

Moved and carried that the statisticians insert "incomplete" in their report regarding subscriptions to Advocate.

In regard to reporting subscriptions to Advocate Chair ruled that pastors are to give new subscriptions only in personal reports.

Motion carried that church reports include all subscriptions to Advocate.

Adjourned to 2 P. M.

Motion made and carried that the District Secretary notify the General Secretary regarding the action of this Assembly on the budget system.

Moved and carried that the resolution adopted at the 1925 Assembly at Lake Placid regarding divorce and remarriage be redrafted by Resolution Committee and presented to this Assembly for action.

Adjourned to 9 A. M.

Roll call.

Minutes read and approved.

Moved and carried that the election of officers be held this afternoon at 2 o'clock.

Moved and carried that the matter of invitations for place for next Assembly, which was laid on the table at an earlier session be considered at this time.

Moved and carried that the matter of invitations for place of next Assembly be deferred until later as all invitations have not been presented to the Assembly.

Rev. M. G. Standley of Cincinnati, Assistant Gen. Supt. of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, was introduced to the Assembly.

Bro. Standley addressed the Assembly briefly.

Moved and carried that the report of the Secretary-Treasurer of Binghamton Camp be accepted.

Moved and carried that pledges to home missionary work by individuals be reported through church of which they are a member.

Moved and carried that the report of the Home Missionary Secretary-Treasurer be accepted with corrections.

Moved and carried that the churches be granted the privilege of having included all moneys sent direct to the mission fields in District Foreign Missionary Report.

Moved and carried that the report of the Foreign Missionary Secretary-Treasurer be accepted with corrections.

Report of Auditors read and accepted.

Moved and carried that all delinquent churches pay all claims against them and proper accounting made and books corrected.

Moved and carried that the report of the Brookdale church be returned to delegate for correction.

Adjourned.

Rev. W. A. Shoemaker, pastor Reformed Methodist Church of Otisco was introduced and voted seat in Conference bar.

Rev. Colson of Niagara church introduced and voted seat in Conference.

Motion made and carried that the name of Rev. S. N. Bennett be placed in the 1927 minutes as District Representative of the Kingswood Orphanage.

The following names were presented and received as members of this Assembly. Howard Bennett as licensed minister; Reemer Hess as ordained minister; Theodore Chidester as ordained minister; Oscar Lawrence as licensed minister.

Adjourned.

#### **SATURDAY, APRIL 23, 9 A. M.**

Devotional exercises, A. H. Wilson presiding.

Rev. M. G. Standley spoke at length to Assembly concerning "The Preacher and His God, the Preacher and Himself, the Preacher and His People." His remarks were very appropriate and to the point.

Robert Dyer of the Reformed Methodist church, was introduced and voted seat in Conference.

Assembly adjourned until 2 P. M. in order to allow meeting of Conference Branch.

## **SATURDAY, 2 P. M.**

Devotional exercises, A. H. Wilson presiding.

After roll call minutes of previous session read and approved.

Bro. E. H. Hill of Monticello, N. Y., was recommended to the Assembly for license to preach. The recommendation was favorably passed upon.

Moved and seconded that a committee of two be appointed to visit Bro. Fuller and convey to him our greetings as an Assembly. Carried.

Chair appointed Bros. Bennett and Vanoss.

Statistical Report read and accepted.

Motion made and seconded that each church take monthly offerings for church extension work, said offering to be sent to Secretary-Treasurer of Church Extension work Board. Carried.

Moved that Rescue Home at Troy, N. Y. be taken over and financed by the District. After much discussion this motion was tabled.

Motion made and seconded that names of pastors and delegates to next year's Assembly be sent to pastor at Schenectady at least ten days before convening of Assembly. Carried.

Motion made and carried that Secretary write Sister Lena Roy extending our greetings.

Moved and seconded that we, as a District Assembly, express our appreciation to the city papers for courtesies extended. Carried.

Assembly adjourned to meet next year in Schenectady.

The following resolutions were adopted:

### **Resolution No. 1**

Resolved, that our class leaders give a report of their activities on the blank provided for the same, and that the same be read and included with the other church reports at our District Assembly.

### **Resolution No. 2**

Resolved, that we recommend that our churches of the New York District observe the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper at least once every three months. Due notice to be given from the pulpit on the previous Sunday, or not less than a week in advance.



### **Resolution No. 3**

Because of the evergrowing menace to vital Salvation of the divorce and remarriage evil, we feel that some definite position should be taken by the Pilgrim Holiness Church regarding the same, that honest hearts may be protected and warned, and inasmuch as Manual does not declare itself definitely on the subject; therefore be it

Resolved, that until such time as our General Church does take such definite position, that people who are divorced and remarried, except to be remarried to the one from whom they were divorced, shall be denied membership in our Pilgrim Holiness Churches of the New York District.

### **Resolution No. 4**

Recognizing that missionary interest is vital to the deepest spirituality of a Church, we recommend and urgently request that each Pastor see that a freewill offering be taken once each month and that the congregation be notified a week in advance that said offering will be taken. The day and date of offering to be determined by the local church. This offering to be sent before the 20th of each month with the report to the District Secretary of the Missionary Board. This offering shall not be taken from the Pastor's support.

### **Resolution No. 5**

Resolved, that all moneys intended for District Secretaries, Treasurer, etc., of the various departments of the District be sent them so as to reach them not later than April 10th.

### **Resolution No. 6**

Resolved, that the New York District be so subdivided by the District Council as to include small groups of churches, which shall meet together for conventions, same to be in charge of the District Superintendent or his assistant, or some one appointed by him.

### **Resolution No. 7**

Resolved, that all moneys given to Missionaries visiting our local churches be reported to our District Foreign Missionary Treasurer, by means of a receipt showing amount given them, and be it further

Resolved, that all other moneys intended for the various mission fields, etc., be sent through the District Foreign Missionary Treasurer either specified or unspecified.

#### **Resolution No. 8**

Resolved, that all activities for the benefit of the Bethel Orphanage work be reported direct to the representative of the orphan work for the District, and that a report be sent in from each church at the end of each quarter of the Conference year, and be it further

Resolved, that each church give at least one service during the year to the interest of the orphanage work at which the representative of the same shall be invited to have charge.

#### **Resolution No. 9**

We recommend that each Sunday Schol in the District establish a birthday box for the benefit of the Bethel Orphanage work, the contents of which shall be sent at the end of each quarter of the Conference year to the District representative.

#### **Resolution No. 10**

Resolved, that our church extension work be continued for another year, and the evangelist so engaged and supported by the District as heretofore.

#### **Resolution No. 11**

Resolved, that our next annual Assembly be held at Schenectady, N. Y., April 17-21, 1928.

#### **Resolution No. 12**

Resolved, that we express our thanks and appreciation to the people of Binghamton church and their Pastor and his wife for the kind hospitality and splendid entertainment accorded us as an Assembly, also to the friends of the Church who so kindly opened their homes for our entertainment, be it further

Resolved, that we express our appreciation of the presence of Rev. M. G. Standley, and his heart stirring messages given, May God continue to bless his labors for Him. We also wish to remember our officers, who have so faithfully and patiently presided during this Assembly. Also the cook and helpers for their splendid food and excellent service, and all others who have helped to make this Assembly one of great blessing and long to be remembered.

**To the annual Assembly of The New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church:**

The following is my report as District Superintendent for the year ending April 19, 1927.

I have visited all of the churches throughout the District once and most of them twice during the year. I believe the District as a whole is in the best spiritual condition it has been in for some time. Many of the churches report the best revivals held in years, with many seekers and much definite work done.

The camp meetings were made a great blessing to our District. Several tent meetings were held through the southern part of the District by our Home Missionary. There are certainly great opportunities of branching out on this line of work. We organized the church at Afton, N. Y., and while the battle has been a hard one there things are looking better and I believe a good work can be established there.

The majority of the Pastors have been faithful in looking after the Foreign Missionary interests. Two missionary conventions were held during the year, one at Binghamton and one at Albany, which were made a great blessing in stirring up a Missionary interest.

In addition to my work of visiting the churches, I had charge of the camp meetings at Victory Grove and Binghamton, and did part of the preaching at Vermontville.

Greetings in Jesus' name! I can not tell how much it means to me not to be able to be with you at this time, but I am so glad that wherever we are, we can have Jesus with us. He does save, sanctify and keep me just now.

There have been some dark days since last I met with you—who has not had them—but just when there has seemed to be no way through, God has always stepped in. In fact, when I am sometimes almost discouraged, God opens a way, and one of my kind neighbors then says, "I knew something would come," so she sees God's hand too.

It seems I have done very little for the Master, yet God seems to hold me right here in Netcong.

Lately I have substituted for several teachers in our schools. Have given several talks about Africa to the pupils of eight grades and all the children, including those I have not taught, are getting to know me. I sometimes wonder whether perhaps God's hand is in this too.
