Minutes of the Assembly, April 16-21, 1929

The eighth annual Assembly of the New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church was held at Gloversville, N. Y., April 16 to 21, 1929.

First session called to order by District Supertendent Rev. A. H. Wilson. After singing the Assembly was led in prayer by the Assistant District Superintendent Rev. A. E. Blann.

Moved and carried that the time for opening and closing sessions of the Assembly be as follows: 9 A. M. to 12 M.; 2 to 4 P. M.

Bro. I. A. Gwynn of Cambridge, Mass., was introduced and voted seat in Assembly.

Reading and passing on reports.

Moved and carried that the report of the Binghamton church be returned to delegate for correction.

Adjourned to 2 P. M.

TUESDAY, 2 P. M.

Devotional exercises, A. H. Wilson, presiding.

Roll call of delegates and workers.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Moved and carried that the preachers wives be given seat in conference bar.

Reading and passing on reports.

The chair ruled that pastors on charge should be reported in church report with other licensed and ordained preachers who are members of local church.

Moved and carried that the report of the Skaneateles church be returned to delegate for correction.

Moved and carried that each preacher of our church, whether stationed or not, be admonished to become a subscriber to our church paper.

Moved and carried that we extend the time to 4:30 and proceed with

Rev. T. S. Dixon, Superintendent of Eastern District, Rev. Cola Hope, Rev. R. O. Musser, all of the Eastern District, were introduced and voted seats in Assembly,

Adjourned to 9 A. M.

WEDNESDAY, 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises, A. H. Wilson presiding. Scripture lesson by Rev. H. J. Olsen of Trappe, Md. Roll call of delegates and workers. Minutes of last session read and approved.

The name of Florence Fairbank was presented to Assembly with recommendation for license to preach, which was favorably passed upon by the Assembly.

Rev. H. J. Olsen was introduced and voted seat in Assembly.

Reading and passing on reports.

Several resolutions were presented by the Resolution Committee.

Rev. Seth C. Rees, General Superintendent of Pasadena, Cal., arrived during the morning session and was introduced to Assembly.

Adjourned to 2 P. M.

WEDNESDAY, 2 P. M.

Devotional exercises, Rev. Seth C. Rees, presiding.

Voted to dispense with roll call during the remainder of the Assembly. Minutes of last session read and approved.

Several resolutions were presented by the Resolution Committee.

The following reports were read and accepted: District Treasurer, Secretary-Treasurer of Church Extension Board, Secretary-Treasurer of the Binghamton Camp Meeting.

Moved and seconded that we proceed with the election of Officers. Lost. Motion made and carried that we proceed with the election of Officers at the Thursday morning session.

Adjourned to 9 A. M.

THURSDAY, 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises, Rev. Seth C. Rees, presiding.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

The Assembly proceeded with the election of Officers. The following Officers were elected for the coming year:

District Superintendent, Rev. A. H. Wilson; Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. A. E. Blann; District Secretary, Rev. Alvin Young; District Treasurer, Rev. W. J. C. Vanoss; Advisory Members of District Council, Rev. H. J. Felter, Rev. George J. Becker, Rev. Oscar W. Lawrence; Member of Board of Trustees for three years, Rev. W. J. C. Vanoss; Member of Board of Examiners for three years, Rev. D. E. Wilson.

Voted to suspend the rules and the Secretary cast one vote for the reelection of the present Foreign Missionary Board. The Foreign Missionary Board re-elected as follows: Rev. A. E. Blann, Augusta Engwer, Verna Hamlin.

Moved and carried that District Superintendent Rev. A. H. Wilson be a member of the Church Extension Board as a courtesy of the Assembly.

Church Extension Board for two years, Rev. H. J. Felter, Rev. Alvin Young.

Voted to suspend the rules and the Secretary cast one ballot for the reelection of the present Orphanage Representative. Rev. S. N. Bennett was re-elected Orphanage Representative.

Adjourned to 2 P. M.

THURSDAY, 2 P. M.

Devotional exercises, Rev. Seth C. Rees, presiding.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Several delayed reports were read and passed upon by the Assembly.

Resolution presented by the Resolution Committee in favor of accepting members in the New York District on six months probation was carried but was later declared out of order by the Chair.

Recommendation regarding raising money for church extension work was lost on vote of Assembly, but was later reconsidered.

Moved and carried that the time be extended to 4:10 to continue discussion of church extension work.

Resolution was passed for the advancement of church extension work. Adjourned to 9 A. M.

PRIDAY, 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises, Rev. Seth C. Rees presiding.

Minutes read, corrected and approved.

After the reading of the minutes Bro. Rees spoke in the interest of the church paper, the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate. The preachers and workers responded stating that they would endeavor to secure 302 new subscriptions for the coming year from the New York District.

Rev. H. A. Saneholtz of Allantown, Pa., District Superintendent of the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District, also President of Beulah Park Bible School, and Rev. W. C. Stone of Cincinnati, Ohio, Editor of the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate, were introduced to Assembly. Bro. Stone spoke briefly regarding the Advocate and Sunday School literature, urging all Sunday Schools to use the Light and Life publications.

Bro. Saneholtz and Bro. Stone were voted seats in conference bar.

Invitations received from the following churches for 1936 Assembly: Albany, Gloversville, Syracuse, Lake Placid. Voted by Assembly to accept the invitation of the Albany church for 1930 Assembly.

Voted to call the Assembly to prayer for Bro. Frank Carroll at this time and that Bro. Carroll be notified of this action.

Adjourned to 2 P. M.

FRIDAY, 2 P. M.

Devotional exercises, Rev. Seth C. Rees presiding, who spoke briefly on tithing.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Rev. A. Mores of the Canada Holiness Movement Church was introduced and voted seat in Assembly.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

Resolution presented regarding holding semi-annual ministerial conventions. Resolution was amended to read "Annual ministerial conventions," which was carried as amended.

Voted that the District Council set time for such conventions,

\$102.56 was raised in pledges and cash for the perpetual care of the lot in the Chenango Valley Cometery at Binghamton, N. Y. Adjourned to 9 A. M.

SATURDAY. 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises, Rev. Seth C. Rees presiding. In his opening remarks Bro. Rees compared the sanctified to the tree 500 years old, who, during the years, had withstood the storms and had developed better fibre and a richer green.

Rev. W. C. Stone, Editor of the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate, was introduced and spoke regarding the work of the General Home Missionary Board. stressing the deplorable conditions, spiritually, in many sections of our great country, and urging our church to go forward with a spirit of discontent as to our present attainments.

The Pastors extended an invitation to Bro. Stone to visit their churches in the near future in the interest of Home Missionary work.

The statistical report was read and with the understanding that errors be corrected as far as possible, the report was accepted.

Adjourned to 2 P. M.

SATURDAY, 2 P. M.

Devotional exercises, Rev. Seth C. Rees presiding. Minutes of last session read and approved.

The report of the Skaneateles church was accepted by the Assembly. Committee on Minutes appointed by District Superintendent A. H. Wilson: Alvin Young, Oscar Lawrence, W. J. C. Vanoss.

As we come to the closing hours of the Assembly it is with reluctance that we contemplate the ending and the seperating as we return to our homes and fields of labor. Surely we can claim the privilege of having sat together in heavenly places, the complete absence of anything that would sound like friction or contention has been noticeable during the entire Assembly. The outlook for the coming year seems freighted with possibilities of advancement equal to the expectations and desire of the most energetic and optimistic. Let us return with the report that Caleb and Joshua brought back to the children of Israel (We are abundantly able to go up and possess the land). In leaving the City of Gloversville we would feel entirely undeserving of the hospitality which we have received if we did not give some token of appreciation for the generous and adequate entertainment that has been accorded us. Let us each one feel the personal responsibility of rendering to those under whose roof we have been sheltered our heartfelt gratitude and appreciation. To the Church and Pastor and to all who have contributed in a temporal way we desire to call down upon you God's rich blessing that is promised to those who give even a cup of cold water in His name. We feel that to attempt to measure the extent of benefit and blessings of the sermons and exhortations of Our Beloved General Superintendent are not within our power of expression. To God be all the glory. May He be spared to us for many years, and may we each one endeavor to make use of the same in proportion to our ability to comprehend and absorb. We bid good bye to the people of the Church at Gloversville with hearts rejoicing for this privilege that we have been permitted to enjoy.

Moved and carried that 700 copies of the Minutes be printed and dis-

tributed as heretofore.

The following poem written by Rev. S. N. Bennett was read and it was voted to spread same on the Minutes and a copy be sent to the Advocate for publication:

Do we love, revere and honor,
Those who do a blessing prove?
Do we heed the admonitions

That are brought to us in love?

It was moved and carried that we extend to Bro. Rees, our General Superintendent, a rising vote of thanks for his efficient service in the business sessions, his helpful spiritual advice, as well as his unctious messages during the evangelistic services.

There being no further business the Assembly adjourned in due form. The Assembly is history. Unity prevails. The work is progressing. Christ is exalted.

REV. ALVIN YOUNG, District Secretary

Resolution No. 1—Resolved: That our class leaders give a report of their activities on the blank provided for the same, and that the same be read and included with the other church reports at our District Assembly.

Resolution No. 2—Resolved: That we recommend that our churches of the New York District observe the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper at least once every three months. Due notice to be given from the pulpit on the previous Sunday, or not less than a week in advance.

Resolution No. 3—Because of the ever growing menace to vital Salvation of the divorce and remarriage evil, we feel that some definite position should be taken by the Pilgrim Holiness Church regarding the same, that honest hearts may be protected and warned, and inasmuch as the Manual does not declare itself definitely on the subject; therefore, be it

Resolved: That until such time as the General Church does take such definite position, that people who are divorced and remarried, except to be remarried to the one from whom they were divorced, shall be denied membership in our Pilgrim Holiness Churches of the New York District.

Resolution No. 4—Recognizing that missionary interest is vital to the deepest spirituality of a church, we recommend and urgently request that each Pastor see that a freewill offering be taken once each month and that the congregation be notified a week in advance that said offering will be taken. The day and date of offering to be determined by the local Church. This offering to be sent before the 20th of each month with the report to the District Secretary of the Missionary Board. This offering shall not be taken from the Pastor's support.

Resolution No. 5—Resolved: That all moneys intended for District Secretaries, Treasurer, etc., of the various departments of the District be sent them so as to reach them not later than April 10th.

Resolution No. 6—Resolved: That the New York District be subdivided by the District Council so as to include small groups of Churches, which shall meet together for conventions, same to be in charge of the District Superintendent or his assistant, or some one appointed by him.

Resolution No. 7—Resolved: That all monies given to Missionaries visiting our local Churches be reported to our District Foreign Missionary Treasurer, by means of a receipt showing amount given them; and be it further

Resolved: That all other moneys intended for the various mission fields etc., be sent through the District Foreign Missionary Treasurer, either specified or unspecified.

Resolution No. 8—Resolved: That all activities for the benefit of the Bethel Orphanage work be reported direct to the representative of the orphan work for the District, and that a report be sent in from each Church at the end of each quarter of the Conference year; and be it further

Resolved: That each Church give at least one service during the year to the interest of the orphanage work at which the representative of the same shall be invited to have charge.

Resolution No. 9—We recommend that each Sunday School in the District establish a birthday box for the benefit of the Bethel Orphanage work, the contents of which shall be sent at the end of each quarter of the Conference year to the District Representative.

Resolution No. 10—Resolved: That our Church Extension work be continued for another year, and the evangelist so engaged and supported by the District as heretofore.

Resolution No. 11—Resolved: That an offering be taken by each Church to help defray the expenses of the District Assembly, the same to be brought to Assembly by delegate.

Resolution No. 12—Resolved: That each Church throughout the New York District, if possible, shall have a Young People's Society, as set forth in the Manual, and that same shall report at Annual Assembly.

Resolution No. 13—Because of the fact that the Pastor's conference year closes with the Annual Assembly, be it

Resolved: That said Pastor's farewell service will be on the Sunday following Conference.

Resolution No. 14—Resolved: That each Church sending a delegate or delegates to the District Assembly pay the traveling expenses of said delegates and Pastor. The same to apply to this Assembly and hereafter.

Resolution No. 15—Resolved: That the Treasurers of the various departments of our work carry their accounts at the bank in the name of the department they represent and not in their personal names.

Resolution No. 16—In as much as it is impossible according to State law for the District Council to borrow money for any purpose unless a special corporate meeting is called, therefore be it

Resolved: That this Assembly authorize said Council to borrow at its discretion not to exceed \$2,000.00 if need require.

Resolution 17—Resolved: That one half of the Conference claims shall be sent to the District Treasurer by January 1st and that the District Treasurer be authorized to notify each Church.

Resolution No. 18—Sensing the confusion existing today in the so-called religious world because of the repeated attacks of the enemy of souls on the fundamentals of Christian religion, and because we realize the need of the day to be ministers of the Gospel, alive to the situation and competent under God to cope with the assault being made against Christianity and feeling that by confering with ministers of like mind a more concerted and efficient campaign may be promulgated, therefore be it

Resolved. That an annual three day ministerial convention for the discussion of subjects relevant to the situation be held. The subject matter to be discussed to be determined by the District Superintendent.

Resolution 19—Realizing the need of keeping our cemetery lot in proper condition we hereby

Resolve: To enter into a contract with the Chenango Valley Cemetery Association for perpetual care of the same. The financial help for the expense of the same to be provided for at this Assembly.

Resolution No. 20—Resolved: That we of the New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church assume the responsibility of the tuition and clothing of Allen Reed, son of Brother Reed, Missionary in Africa, while he is completing his high school education in the United States.

Resolution No. 21—Since our Manual provides that a representative shall visit our Churches once a year in the interest of the various departments of our Church, and since it is our desire to contribute to the support of these departments, but with a proper proportion, and as we have our District and local obligations to take care of, be it therefore

Resolved: That none of our Churches shall make arrangements with said representatives nor respond to solicitations by mail or for such services without the indorsement and co-operation of the District Superintendent.

Resolution 22—Resolved: That children under the age of 14 years who are members of our Church be excused from conference claims.

Resolution No. 23-Resolved: That each Church take monthly offerings for Church extension work, said offering to be sent to Secretary-Treasurer of Church Extension work.

Resolution No. 24 -Since the support of the Foreign Missionary Department needs constant and regular attention and that occasions of great enthusiasm do not last, be it therefore

Resolved: That each local Church organize some definite and systematic plan by which regular monthly offerings shall be given to the support of Foreign Missionary.
