Minutes of District Assembly, April 15-20, 1930

The ninth annual Assembly of the New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Albany, N. Y., April 15-20, 1930.

First session Tuesday, April 15, at 9 A. M. was called to order by District Superintendent Rev. A. H. Wilson.

After singing the Assembly was led in prayer by Rev. W. J. C. Vanoss. Rev. A. E. Blann read the 13th chapter of Hebrews and exhorted the Assembly to a practical application of salvation to daily life.

Reading and passing on reports.

Brookdale report was returned to delegate for correction.

H. N. Parsons of Syracuse was introduced and voted seat in Assembly.

Financial report of Monticello returned to delegate for correction.

North Troy financial report returned to delegate for correction.

Moved and seconded that an adding machine be secured for use of the Auditing and Statistical Committees.

Moved and seconded that the name of Kenneth Peck be placed on the roll as regular delegate from Lake Placid, as the Church is entitled to two delegates according to their membership.

Adjourned to 2 P. M.

TUESDAY, APRIL 15, 2 P. M.

Devotional exercises. Roll call of delegates and workers.
Minutes of last session read and approved.

On recommendation of the Syracuse church it was voted by the District Council to receive H. N. Parsons as a member of this Assembly, and that he be given license to preach. It was also recommended that Clifton Berg of Finch Hollow be received as member of Assembly and he be given license to preach. Both were favorably passed upon by the Assembly.

Reading and passing on reports.

Moved and carried that each pastor be given the privilege of changing his report with reference to preaching services.

Syracuse financial report returned to delegate for correction.

Brushton financial report returned to delegate for correction.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 16, 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises. Session called to order by Assistant Superintendent Rev. A. E. Blann. After the devotional exercises General Superintendent Rev. Seth C. Rees arrived and was introduced to Assembly by District Superintendent Rev. A. H. Wilson.

Brother Rees in his introductory remarks stressed the importance of our call as a church, stating that there was but little competition in the field. Called to sonship, holiness and heaven, to be co-workers, co-heirs, co-sufferers and co-reigners with Christ. We are glad to have Brother Rees with us and thankful that the Lord has permitted us to enjoy his splendid ministry again this year.

Moved and carried that the auditors audit all books before reports are submitted.

The Auditing Committee reported having audited the Treasurer's book of the Binghamton Camp Meeting and their report was accepted.

An offering of \$10.00 was raised to meet a deficit in pledges taken last year for perpetual care of lot in Chenango Valley Cemetery.

Several resolutions were read by the Resolution Committee.

The Committee on Manual reported several resolutions to be presented to General Assembly.

Voted to accept the Auditors' report on Foreign Missionary Treasurer's book.

Foreign Missionary Treasurer's report read and accepted.

Moved and carried that the order of the day for Thursday morning session be the election of officers.

Adjourned to 9 A. M. Thursday.

THURSDAY, APRIL 17, 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises. Rev. Seth C. Rees presiding.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Rev. W. A. Shoemaker and Carl Shafer were introduced and voted seat in Assembly.

The Assembly proceeded with the election of officers and the following were elected for the coming year:

Devotional exercises. Rev. Seth C. Rees presiding.

Minutes of last session read, corrected and approved.

Moved and carried that the conference bar be extended to include seven rows of seats.

Assembly proceeded to the election of delegates to General Assembly. Nine ministerial and three lay delegates to be elected. The following ministerial delegates were elected: Rev. Lorrin Wilson, Rev. H. J. Felter, Rev. W. J. C. Vanoss, Rev. O. W. Lawrence, Rev. Lee Lawrence, Rev. George J. Becker, Rev. M. R. Blann, Mary Berg, Rev. Henry Shoemaker.

Voted to extend time one hour.

Moved and carried that we suspend the rules and that D. E. Wilson be chosen alternate delegate to General Assembly because of withdrawal of his name in the election of regular delegates. Two other alternate delegates to be elected.

Motion made and carried that the former action regarding D. E. Wilson be rescinded and that we proceed to election of three alternate delegates to General Assembly.

The following alternate delegates were elected: Rev. David E. Wilson, Rev. Jasper Hamm, Ethel Wilson.

Moved and carried that the alternate delegates be called in the order elected.

Assembly proceeded to election of three lay delegates to General Assembly.

Adjourned to 9 A. M. Friday, April 18.

FRIDAY, APRIL 18, 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises. Rev. Seth C. Rees presiding.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Moved and carried that the nine highest of yesterday's vote for lay delegates be selected and that we proceed to the election of three lay delegates to General Assembly one only to be voted upon from each church.

The following lay delegates were elected to General Assembly: Peter Sharp, Floyd E. Lepper and Mary Bacher.

Moved and carried that Henry Davie, Sr., and Ector Fountain be chosen alternate lay delegates, they being the two highest following the election of regular lay delegates.

Several late personal and church reports were read and passed upon by the Assembly.

On recommendation of Examining Board Doris Berg was voted Deaconess license by the Assembly.

Resolution passed by Assembly to equalize the work of District Superintendent and Assistant District Superintendent rescinded by vote of the Assembly.

FRIDAY, APRIL 18, 2 P. M.

Devotional exercises. Rev. Seth C. Rees presiding.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Rev. and Mrs. T. Howard Jones of Sheffield, Mass., were introduced to the Assembly.

Auditors' report on Orphanage Treasurer's book accepted.

The financial report of the Orphanage Representative read and approved.

Moved and carried that the District Superintendent appoint a committee on minutes.

The District Superintendent appointed Alvin Young, H. J. Felter and W. J. C. Vanoss.

Moved and carried that 700 copies of the Minutes be printed for free distribution.

Moved and carried that a committee of three be appointed by the District Superintendent to present to the Assembly some feasible plan relative to the support of the District Superintendent.

Revs. D. E. Wilson, S. N. Bennett and S. S. Tompkins were appointed to this committee.

Voted to accept the invitation of the Binghamton Church for the 1931 Assembly.

Adjourned to Saturday, April 19, at 9 A. M.

SATURDAY, APRIL 19, 9 A. M.

Devotional exercises. Rev. Seth C. Rees presiding.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Report of the Statistical Committee read and accepted.

Moved and carried that the Committee on Minutes be authorized to correct a mistake in statistics regarding valuation of property.

Report of Memorial Committee read and accepted. Memorial to be printed in minutes to include poem read.

Moved and carried that the delegates of the New York District to the General Assembly use all their authority and power to retain our present General Superintendent.

There were 327 subscriptions to the Advocate pledged for the coming year by the workers and friends of the Assembly.

Moved and carried that the District continue one half month support for the editor of the Advocate.

It was voted to extend a rising vote of thanks to our General Superintendent for his faithful services in the chair, in so efficiently handling the business of the Assembly, for his high standard of spiritual advice and the messages of truth which were a blessing to all.

The Ninth District Assembly of the New York District will soon be a matter of history, and we feel that to separate without attempting to express our feeling of appreciation and gratitude for the blessings that have been ours would prove us indeed unworthy. We have no desire to be partial, for we feel that in every particular our needs and comfort have been most generously supplied. The blessing of the Lord has attended our deliberations. The presence of our beloved General Superintendent has been a source of blessing to all. His words of wisdom cannot have fallen on barren ground, but must bring forth fruit in the tomorrows of our life. So to the good people of Albany good bye. May we ever keep the bond of unity and love in the Holy Ghost.

No further business. Assembly adjourned in regular form. The ninth Assembly is past. Praise God for the splendid harmony and marks of progress during the past year. God is blessing.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the Annual Assembly of the New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church:

The following is my report as District Superintendent for the year ending April 15, 1930:

The past year has been one of the busiest and in some ways hardest of my life, but through it all God has given victory, for which we are very thankful. Our hearts have been saddened by death entering our ranks and taking from us two of our consecrated workers, but I believe our loss has been Heaven's gain. We must fill the breach and push on.

I have visited nearly all of the Churches twice and find that our Church interests as a whole have been well taken care of. Especially do I wish to urge the District to greater activities in Church extension work. We are being appealed to very frequently for workers and funds to help push this work. May the Lord help us to do our duty and push this work as never before.

I received for my services as District Superintendent \$206.79, and for evangelistic work \$225.00.

RESOLUTIONS

Resolution No. 1—Resolved: That our class leaders give a report of their activities on the blank provided for the same, and that the same be read and included with the other church reports at our District Assembly.

Resolution No. 2—Resolved: That we recommend that our churches of the New York District observe the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper at least once every three months. Due notice to be given from the pulpit on the previous Sunday, or not less than a week in advance.

Resolution No. 3—Because of the ever growing menace to vital Salvation of the divorce and remarriage evil, we feel that some definite position should be taken by the Pilgrim Holiness Church regarding the same, that honest hearts may be protected and warned, and inasmuch as the Manual does not declare itself definitely on the subject; therefore, be it

Resolved: That until such time as the General Church does take such definite position, that people who are divorced and remarried, except to be remarried to the one from whom they were divorced, shall be denied membership in our Pilgrim Holiness Churches of the New York District.

Resolution No. 4—Recognizing that missionary interest is vital to the deepest spirituality of a church, we recommend and urgently request that each Pastor see that a freewill offering be taken once each month and that the congregation be notified a week in advance that said offering will be taken. The day and date of offering to be determined by the local Church. This offering to be sent before the 20th of each month with the report to the District Secretary of the Missionary Board. This offering shall not be taken from the Pastor's support.

Resolution No. 5—Resolved: That all moneys intended for District Secretaries, Treasurer, etc., of the various departments of the District be sent them so as to reach them not later than April 10th.

Resolution No. 6—Resolved: That the New York District be subdivided by the District Council so as to include small groups of Churches, which shall meet together for conventions, same to be in charge of the District Superintendent or his assistant, or some one appointed by him.

Resolution No. 7—Resolved: That all monies given to Missionaries visiting our local Churches be reported to our District Foreign Missionary Treasurer, by means of a receipt showing amount given them; and be it further

Resolved: That all other moneys intended for the various mission fields etc., be sent through the District Foreign Missionary Treasurer, either specified or unspecified.

Resolution No. 8—Resolved: That all activities for the benefit of the Bethel Orphanage work be reported direct to the representative of the orphan work for the District, and that a report be sent in from each Church at the end of each quarter of the Conference year; and be it further

Resolved: That each Church give at least one service during the year to the interest of the orphanage work at which the representative of the same shall be invited to have charge.

Resolution No. 9—We recommend that each Sunday School in the District establish a birthday box for the benefit of the Bethel Orphanage work, the contents of which shall be sent at the end of each quarter of the Conference year to the District Representative.

Resolution No. 10—Resolved: That we, as the New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, go on record as opposed to dropping the word "Holiness" from our Church name and that it remain as it is at present.

Resolution No. 11—Resolved: That an offering be taken by each Church to help defray the expenses of the District Assembly, the same to be brought to Assembly by delegate.

Resolution No. 12—Resolved: That each Church throughout the New York District, if possible, shall have a Young People's Society, as set forth in the Manual, and that same shall report at Annual Assembly.

Resolution No. 13—Resolved: That the Pilgrim Holiness Church is opposed to divorce and remarriage, and that all persons who are divorced and remarried, except to be remarried to the one from whom they have been divorced, be denied membership in the Church.

Resolution No. 14—We recommend that the Pilgrim Holiness Church adopt a probationary system for receiving members into our Church, the period of probation to be determined by Advisory Board of local Church.

Resolution No. 15—Resolved: That the District Superintendent visit all of the independent Churches and Missions on the District who are supplied by preachers who are members of this Assembly. Visits to be made as regularly as to our organized Churches.

Resolution No. 16—Resolved: That inasmuch as the cemetery lot in the Chenango Valley Cemetery at Binghamton, N. Y. is the property of the New York District and that money has been paid by said District for its perpetual care and that the same lot has been looked upon as a burial place for our workers, ministers and children who may desire to be buried there, and whereas the number of vacant lots have decreased greatly, therefore be it Resolved that none but our workers, ministers, their wives and children be granted burial privilege there, except by the authority of the full Board of Trustees and then only in exceptional cases.

Resolution No. 17—Owing to the fact of the conflicting dates of our several District Assemblies, be it resolved, that we recommend to the next General Assembly that the General Council be requested to confer with the District Superintendents of the Districts to arrange for a more suitable adjustment of the District Assemblies, to make possible attendance of the General Superintendent.

Resolution No. 18—We recommend that section 49 and paragraph 6 of the Manual be carried out strictly.

Resolution 19—Resolved: That we memorialize the General Assembly to continue the present plan of having General Assembly every four years.

Resolution No. 20—Resolved: That our Churches be requested to take an offering for the expense of the delegates to the General Assembly, the same not to be less than 50 cents per member reported at the 1930 District Assembly, the offering to be forwarded to the District Treasurer on or before August 1, 1930.

Resolution No. 21—Resolved: That inasmuch as there is no provision in the Manual for the support of the District Superintendent, that some adequate provision be made for the same at this Assembly.

Resolution No. 22—Resolved: That resolution No. 23 in our minutes of last year be amended to read as follows:

Resolved: That each Church of the New York District take a monthly offering for the support of the State Church Extension Work, said offering to be sent monthly to the Secretary-Treasurer of this Department, and be it further Resolved that we continue the State Church Extension work.

Resolution No. 23—Because of the fact that the Pastors' conference year closes with the Annual Assembly, be it

Resolved: That said Pastor's farewell service will be on the Sunday following conference.

Resolution No. 24—Resolved: That each Church sending a delegate or delegates to the District Assembly pay the traveling expenses of said delegates and Pastor. The same to apply to this Assembly and hereafter.

Resolution No. 25—Resolved: That the Treasurers of the various departments of our work carry their accounts at the bank in the name of the department they represent and not in their personal names.

Resolution No. 26—Inasmuch as it is impossible according to State law for the District Council to borrow money for any purpose unless a special corporate meeting is called, therefore be it

Resolved: That this Assembly authorize said Council to borrow at its discretion not to exceed \$2,000.00 if need require.

Resolution No. 27—Resolved: That one half of the Conference claims shall be sent to the District Treasurer by January 1st and that the District Treasurer be authorized to notify each Church.

Resolution No. 28—Since our Manual provides that a representative shall visit our Churches once a year in the interest of the various departments of our Church, and since it is our desire to contribute to the support of these departments, but with a proper proportion, and as we have our District and local obligations to take care of, be it therefore

Resolved: That none of our Churches shall make arrangements with said representative nor respond to solicitations by mail or for such services without the endorsement and co-operation of the District Superintendent.

Resolution No. 29—Resolved: That children under the age of 14 years who are members of our Church be excused from Conference claims.

Resolution No. 30—Resolved: That each Church take monthly offerings for Church Extension work, said offering to be sent to Secretary-Treasurer of Church Extension work.

Resolution No. 31—Since the support of the Foreign Missionary Department needs constant and regular attention and that occasions of great enthusiasm do not last, be it therefore

Resolved: That each local Church organize some definite and systematic plan by which regular monthly offerings shall be given to the support of Foreign Missionary.

Resolution No. 32—Resolved: That resolutions Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 21, 22, 23 and 24 of the Minutes of 1929 of this District be readopted.

SUPPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Following is a report of the committee appointed to adjust the matter of District Superintendent's support:

After considering the matter of a just and fair remuneration for the District Superintendent, so long as he retains a pastorate, and recommend that he be remunerated for his official visits to the different local Churches on a percentage ratio of the support of the Pastor in charge as of report of previous, and your committee suggests a 4 per cent. ratio. This not to apply to Independent Churches visited by the District Superintendent. This report adopted by the Assembly.
