JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

Morning Session — July 8, 1946, 9:00 a. m.

The Twenty-fifth Annual Conference of the New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Victory Grove Camp Ground, Albany-Schenectady Road, July 8, 1946 at 9:00 a. m.

Bro. J. N. Jump led the Conference in song.

Rev. W. A. Way led in prayer and the Conference sang, "Wonderful Story of Love."

Our District Superintendent, Rev. A. E. Blann, introduced Rev. L. W. Sturk, General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, to the Conference.

Bro. Sturk read from Acts the second chapter and spoke on the subject "Keeping the Church Spiritual." Bro. Sturk gave some data that indicated the trend away from orthodoxy and spirituality. He also stated the fact of a drift among holiness people and that our only hope was in our church maintaining deep spirituality. A word picture was ably drawn of the contrast between a spiritual and a backslidden church. A rugged ministry, spiritual demonstration, unworldliness and burning altar fires, was stated as being fundamental to a spiritual church.

Bro. Sturk requested Bro R. G. Flexon, First Assistant General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, to speak to the Conference. R. G. Flexon endorsed the old standards of our Church and cited us to the necessity of constant continuance in old paths.

L. W. Sturk pledged the Conference to the best service possible by the leaders of the Pilgrim Holiness Church and asked an interest in our prayers. Bro. Blann responded to Bro. Sturk by pledging our District to the best co-operation with the General Officers of our church.

The Secretary called the roll.

Motion made and seconded that the two center sections of seats and the first three rows of seats on each wing of the tabernacle and the platform constitute the Conference bar. Motion carried.

The District Superintendent made the following corrections in the various committees:

Reception—Earl Watts was substituted for C. F. Berg.

Auditing—W. E. Shaltenbrand was substituted for G. Lindley Adams.

In the absence of R. N. Raycroft, George Culver was asked to act as chairman of the Ways and Means Committee.

Bro. and Sister O. L. King, missionaries of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and Bro. Otto Jeannings, Acting President of the Allentown Bible Institute, were introduced to the Conference and voted honorary seats within the bar.

Thomas Weir addressed the Conference very enthusiastically in the interest of the Headquarters project.

Both Bro. Weir and Bro Sturk spoke very commendably of the work of Bro. Halt in the Publishing Department of our church.

R. G. Flexon asked for an expression of this Conference as to whether or not our publishing house should sell literature of other denominations.

Motion made and seconded that the time of the business sessions be from 9:00 a. m. to 12:00; from 2:00 p. m. to 5:00 p. m. and from 7:00 p. m. to 10:00 p. m. Motion carried.

The District Superintendent's report was read and accepted.

Motion made and seconded that we adjourn until the afternoon sitting. Motion carried.

Second Session — July 8, 1946, 2:00 p. m.

Rev. Garry Boel led the Conference in singing "Near the Cross."

Bro. Otto Jennings led in prayer.

The minutes of the morning sitting were read and accepted with corrections.

The secretary called the roll.

Motion made and seconded that we discontinued the calling of the roll. Motion carried.

Motion made and seconded that Mrs. Bertha Roys be seated in Conference as delegate from the Campville Road Church. Motion carried.

The Statistician's report was read. Motion made and seconded that the word's 'no report' be inserted in the statistician's report in the column calling for number of seekers and this column be deleted from the printed report. Motion carried.

Motion made and seconded that the statistician's report be accepted with corrections. Motion carried.

The resolution committee presented two resolutions, both of which were adopted by vote of the Conference.

Moved and seconded that we recess until 4:00 p. m. Motion carried.

Third Session — July 8, 1946, 4:00 p. m.

Rev. Alvin Young led the Conference in singing, "Unsearchable Riches." Bro. Sturk asked for a few brief testimonies.

The Ways and Means Committee presented to the Conference a resolution dealing with the District Expense Fund.

A substitute motion for the resolution presented by the Ways and Means Committee was offered to the Conference.

The substitute motion was lost by a standing vote.

Ajourned by expiration of time.

Fourth Session — July 8, 1946, 7:00 p. m.

The Conference was led in song by Kenneth Masterman.

W. E. Reed led in prayer.

Otto Jennings, Acting President of the Allentown Bible Institute, addressed the Conference in the interest of the Allentown school. Bro. Jennings cited us to some of the outstanding needs of the Institute and asked that we pray that God will help them to a successful, financial and spiritual construction.

The minutes of the two previous sessions were read and accepted.

A resolution from the Ways and Means Committee concerning the District Expense Fund was presented and lost by a standing vote.

The Auditor's report was read and accepted.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The Church Extension Treasurer's report read and accepted with corrections.

District Trustees report read and accepted.

Victory Grove Camp Treasurer's report read and accepted.

Binghamton Camp Treasurer's report read and accepted.

Vermontville Camp Treasurser's report read and accepted.

Foreign Missionary Treasurer's report read and accepted with corrections.

District Young People's Treasurer's report read and accepted.

The Foreign Missionary Treasurer was given a rising vote of thanks for her splendid work.

The resolution committee presented a resolution dealing with ammending resolution no. 17 on page 18 of the minutes. The previous question

was called for and carried by a vote of 49 to 20. A recount was called for and by recount of 41 - 33 the motion was lost.

Motion was made and seconded that the resolution under discussion be tabled. Motion carried.

Motion made and seconded that the Missionary reports be read as received from the following: Grace M. Robinson, Beatrice Dodge, Bro. and Sister C. F. Berg, Bro. and Sister D. K. Ault and Bro. and Sister George Gilmore.

Motion made and seconded that the Secretary respond to each of the Missionary letters. Carried.

Bro. L. W. Sturk favored the Conference by singing "When I Get to the End of the Way."

We adjourned by expiration of time.

Fifth Session — July 9, 1946, 9:00 a. m.

J. N. Jump led the Conference in singing two devotional numbers.

L. W. Sturk read from the Songs of Solomon, chapter 2, verses 9-17 and spoke very encouragingly on Christ and His Church as they are revealed in the foregoing scripture.

M. E. Pierpoint led in prayer after which the Lord met us in a special visitation of blessing.

Minutes of the previous sitting were read and accepted with corrections.

The following were recommended for admission to this District on the strength of their credentials and by motion of the Conference were received: C. J. Knupp, Leroy Warner.

The following were recommended by the Council for Preacher's License: Mrs. Anna Pratt, Esther Shafer, and the recommendations were accepted.

Mrs. Elizabeth Masterman was recommended to the Conference for Deaconess' License and the recommendation was accepted.

The Resolution Committee presented three resolutions. The first one concerned Home Missionary work and was lost. The second dealt with Preacher's Benevolent Fund and carried by vote of the Conference. The third resolution was to the effect that our Publishing House be allowed to handle all literature that is fundamental to Evangelical teaching, and this carried by vote of the Conference.

Upon request, Bro. Sturk explained the pension plan as passed by the last General Conference.

It was moved and seconded that the order of the day be the election of officers. Motion carried.

The following tellers were appointed by the District Superintendent: J. N. Jump, H. L. Twining, George Culver, Kenneth Masterman.

The Secretary chose Sister Evelyn Whitney to assist him during the balloting.

The Conference proceeded to elect a District Superintendent. Ninety-two votes cast: A. E. Blann—64; R. N. Raycroft—17; M. E. Pierpoint—9; G. Helsby—1; G. E. Lamb—1. Rev. A. E. Blann declared elected.

The resolution was offered to the Conference to the effect that when no election was secured on the first balloting that the five receiving the highest number of votes be placed in nomination and in the succeeding balloting the one receiving the lowest number of votes be dropped until there is an election. The above resolution was adopted.

The Conference proceeded to elect an Assistant District Superintendent. 93 votes cast: M. E. Pierpoint—70; J. N. Jump—11; O. L. Fay—8; R. N. Raycroft—2; G. L. Helsby—1; Alvin Young—1. Declaring M. E. Pierpoint elected.

First Ballot for District Secretary 94 votes cast. O. L. Fay—72; Robert Smith—7; J. N. Jump—4; Philip Doyle—3; Donald Hardy—2; O. W. Lawrence—1; R. N. Raycroft—1; Francis Olsen—1; Lindley Adams—1; Alvin Young—1; Evelyn Whitney—1. Rev. O. L. Fay declared elected.

The Conference proceeded to elect a District Treasurer. 92 votes cast. O. W. Lawrence—62; J. N. Jump—29; Francis Olsen—1. Rev. O. W. Lawrence declared elected.

We proceeded to elect three Advisory men to the Council.

It was moved and seconded and carried that we vote for three names on one ballot.

It was moved and seconded that we call the afternoon sitting for 1:30 p. m. Motion carried.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

Sixth Session—July 9, 1946, 1:30 p. m.

D. E. Babcock led the Conference in song.

G. L. Helsby led in prayer.

The balloting of the previous sitting follows:

Ninty-one votes cast: J. N. Jump—68; Alvin Young—56; G. L. Helsby—47; Donald Hardy—30; Robert Smith—15; R. N. Raycroft—14; G. Lindley Adams—10; Philip Doyle—8; F. T. Finch—7; H. L. Twining—3; Francis Olsen—3; Floyd Baker—2; Earl Watts—3; Garry Boel—3; M. R. Blann—2; A. H. Wilson—2; Kenneth Masterman—1.

J. N. Jump, Alvin Young, G. L. Helsby declared elected.

The motion was made and seconded that all names receiving any number of votes for any office appear in the minutes. The motion was lost by a standing vote.

R. N. Raycroft was elected to the Board of Education by acclamation.

First ballot for District Trustee for three years: Ballots cast 86. Alvin Young—74; G. L. Adams—2; Garry Boel—2; Donald Hardy—3; Francis Olsen—1; F. T. Finch—1; G. E. Culver—1; W. A. Shoemaker—1; H. L. Twining—1. Alvin Young declared elected.

Miss Blanche Avery was elected as Treasurer of Foreign Missions by acclamation.

The following committees were appointed by the District Superintendent:

Auditing: J. Francis Olsen, W. E. Schaltenbrand, Philip R. Doyle.

Editing: O. L. Fay, Arthur L. Shafer, J. Francis Olsen.

Reception: M. R. Blann, Earl Watts.

Resolution: F. T. Finch, Garry Boel, Robert Smith, A. J. Whitney, Floyd Baker.

Statistics: A. L. Shafer.

Ways and Means: H. L. Twining, George E. Culver, D. J. Hardy, R. N. Raycroft, Donald E. Babcock.

The resolution committee presented the following and it was adopted by a standing vote.

"Whereas, God in His mercy did grant us the privilege of meeting in another Conference, Be it resolved that we extend a rising vote of thanks to the following:

Rev. L. W. Sturk, General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, for his inspiring and helpful messages and fine work in presiding over the Conference, Rev. A. E. Blann, District Superintendent, for his faithful and untiring labors during the last Conference year, the District Council for its efficient work, Sis. Blanche Avery for her willing service as Secretary-Treasurer of Foreign Missions, Rev. Arthur Shafer for his splendid work as District Statistician, Francis Olsen and his assistants for their commendable work in auditing, the dining room and kitchen staff,

Rev. Bernard Barton for his efficient handling of the entertainment problems, and Sis. Evelyn Whitney for her fine assistance to the Secretary.

The Secretary called a roll of the churches to determine the number of minutes to be printed and delivered to each church.

Invitations for the Ministerial Convention were received from Oakdale, Binghamton and Lake Placid.

It was moved and seconded that we vote by secret ballot for a place for the Ministerial Convention. Carried.

First ballot for place of Ministerial Convention: Lake Placid—32; Binghamton—25; Oakdale—21. There was no decision on the first ballot for Ministerial Convention. Oakdale and Binghamton withdrew their invitations and the Conference decided by acclamation to go to Lake Placid for the Ministerial.

Motion made and seconded that we hold our Ministerial Convention April 8-10, 1947. Carried.

By motion of the conference, we recessed until 4 o'clock.

Seventh Session—July 9, 1946, 4:00 p. m.

Motion made and seconded that a letter of greeting be sent to Bro. Woodrow Harmon and his credentials be sent in the letter. Carried

Motion made and seconded that the Council take care of minor matters that arise after Conference is adjourned. Carried.

The appointments were read by the Secretary.

The minutes of the previous sittings were read and accepted.

A motion was made and seconded that a letter of appreciation be sent to Bro. A. H. Wilson for his many years of faithful service to the New York District. Motion Carried.

Bro. L. W. Sturk favored the Conference by singing "I'll Not Have to Cross Jordan Alone." Then the Conference sang "God Be With You," after which we adjourned in due form.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

Finance

No. 1. Resolved, that each church sending a delegate or delegates to the District Conference, pay the traveling expenses of said delegates and pastor.

No. 2. Resolved, that when the District Council deems any licensed minister unable to meet the expense of taking the study course as directed in Education Resolution No. 2, they may pay all or part of the cost of such course. The Licensee in such case shall agree to finish a year of such course in the Conference year.

No. 3. Resolved, that when money is sent direct to any fund, the church treasurer shall obtain a receipt for same and forward this to each District representative.

No. 4. Resolved, that all departments of our church shall, upon receipt of monies, immediately forward receipt for same to sender.

No. 5. Resolved, that the District Treasurer shall maintain two funds, to be known as the District Expense Fund and The Church Extension Fund.

The ministers and workers of the District shall pay all their tithe into the church where they hold membership.

Each month the local church shall forward to the District Treasurer, the pastor's tithe and 50% of other ministerial member's tithe. These amounts shall be specified for the District Expense Fund.

The Church Extension Fund shall be provided for by an assessment of \$1.50 per member. This money shall be forwarded by the local treasurer to the District Treasurer, specified for the Church Extension Fund.

The churches shall be assessed \$1.10 per member for General Budget as provided by the manual.

The Foreign Missionary obligation shall be met by monthly offerings in our churches. This money shall be forwarded by the local treasurer to the District Treasurer of Foreign Missions.

No. 6. Resolved, that in order to receive due credit in the current year, any church must have all money in the mail on or before June 5. The District Treasurer shall keep his books open until June 10 so that proper credit may be given for monies mailed on or before June 5. All monies mailed after June 5, shall be entered in the following year.

No. 7. Resolved, that we as a District, adopt the system of contributing to the Allentown Bible Institute the equivalent of 25c a month per member; said funds to be paid through the District Treasurer and that we put forth a whole hearted effort to raise our quota in support of the school. This plan to continue for five years.

No. 8. Resolved, that the District Superintendent's support shall be as follows:

Salary—\$200.00 per month; Travel expenses—four cents per mile by automobile and actual expense by train or bus. In addition, the District shall provide a parsonage furnished with telephone, electricity, gas, heat, and water.

Education

No. 1. Resolved, that the New York District go on record as favoring a permanent representative of Allentown Bible Institute for visiting the churches of our school zone, and that we will stand back of such a program and will open our churches for the raising of funds for liquidating the debt on the school property and for securing the proper facilities for the advancement of the school.

No. 2. Inasmuch as Allentown Bible Institute provides correspondence courses for ministerial students, be it resolved that all our workers desiring license to preach or ordination be required to take such course, and that the Board of Education be governed in its recommendations for license to preach or ordination by a report from the Bible Institute upon the work done by the applicant; provided, however, that due credit may be given by the Board, at its discretion, to said applicants, for any equivalent work done in any other school acceptable to it.

No. 3 Inasmuch as the majority of the Minister's of the New York District have by action of the last Ministerial Convention put themselves on record as favoring the establishment of a Minister's Book Club, or circulating library, be it therefore;

RESOLVED that the conference take such action as is necessary to the foundation of such a library, and for the operation of the same, also be it

RESOLVED that the conference, before deliberate action on the matter, consider the plan suggested in a paper entitled "Some Benefits of a Minister's Book Club," which was read at the last Ministerial Convention, and which is in part as follows:

a. That the board of education, in conjunction with the District Council select suitable books.

b. That the library be so selected as to provide a well rounded reading course, sound in doctrine and true to christian experience.

c. That the finances be provided by contributions to a book fund, and that each minister as far as possible contribute an amount equal to the average price of one book.

Miscellaneous

No. 1. Resolved that no properties such as churches, parsonages, or other buildings or land shall be sold of any of our incorporate churches without first conferring with the trustees of the district corporation.

No. 2. Resolved that section 16 of article 2 of the religious corporation law be enforced in our district in regard to churches who have discontinued holding services and where there are less than 7 resident attending members.

That such temporalities and property be managed by the District Council of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Inc., our ecclesiastical governing body, or may, in pursuance of the provision of law relating to the disposition of real property by religious corporations, sell or dispose of the same, and apply to proceeds thereof to any of the purposes to which the property of such governing religious body is devoted, and shall not divert such property to any other object.

In no case shall property be sold or disposed of to support the preacher who may claim this as an out appointment.

Due notice shall be given by the District Secretary, regarding the action of the District Assembly in declaring a church extinct, within thirty days to the remaining members, if any.

No. 3. Resolved, that inasmuch as there seems to be a lack of interest in our district concerning our Sunday School work, we recommend that all our pastors put forth a desperate effort to greater activity and make it a point to be present at every session if at all possible.

No. 4. Resolved, that inasmuch as the resolutions contain matters of vital importance to our lay members and inasmuch as not everyone reads the resolutions, we recommend that our pastors read the resolutions before the church as soon as possible after the distribution of the minutes.

No. 5. Resolved, that we, the New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, place ourselves on record as being unalterably opposed to, and deplore the present sale and use of intoxicating beverages throughout the nation, and furthermore we advise and strongly urge our people not to encourage the sale or use of said liquors by patronizing such places where these intoxicating liquors are sold.

No. 6. Inasmuch as our Manual declares itself against the wearing of jewelry; Be it resolved that none of our preachers shall use the ring ceremony in marriages, or in any way encourage the use of it. Any minister who uses such ceremony shall be dealt with by the District Council.

No. 7. Resolved that all our local churches in the district open their doors to Allentown Bible Institute at least once a year, and that said institution be allowed to take an offering for its maintenance.

No. 8. Resolved, that all reports regularly sent to the District Statistician be in his hands by June 15 and that all books and records that are to be audited shall be sent to the chairman of the auditing committee by June 15.

No. 9. Resolved, that each pastor attend the Binghamton, New York District Camp, and be required to remain over one Sunday. Due exception shall be made to this rule. All the pastors residing in the extreme northern part of the District, namely, Massena, Brushton, Ogdensburg, Russell, Madrid, Bloomingdale and Lake Placid, are urged to attend and push the Camp at Vermonville which is now the property of the District.

No. 10. In view of tendencies detrimental to the spiritual effort of our camp meetings, we recommend that the following rule be adopted for all our camps. All persons resident on the grounds shall respect a curfew

hour of ten o'clock and lights shall be out by ten-thirty p. m. with due exception to be made for any person engaged in legitimate camp meeting activities.

No. 11. Resolved that an Editing Committee be appointed to consist of the District Secretary, the District Statistician, and the Secretary of the Auditing Committee.

No. 12. Resolved, that the telephone numbers of the ministers be published annually in the Minutes and that the address of the church also be published.

No. 13 Resolved, that the District Council set up a District Young People's Organization as provided for in Section 82 of the Manual.

No. 14. Resolved, that following the election of officers, the District Superintendent shall appoint the committees which are to function under the District Council for the ensuing year.

No. 15 Resolved, that a Ministerial Convention be held within the next year at a time and place set by the District Council.

No. 16. Resolved, that the New York District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church is opposed to divorce and remarriage, and that all persons who are divorced and remarried, except to be remarried to the one from whom they have been divorced, be denied membership in said church.

No. 17. Resolved, that the New York District Conference go on record as fully supporting the Head Quarters Building Committee in their drive for liquidating the debt and equipping the building.

No. 18. Resolved, that each pastor be given freedom to hold at least two revivals each conference year.

No. 19. WHEREAS we have no laymen on the District Council, and WHEREAS we have competent laymen, BE IT RESOLVED that the District Council include in their nominations for District Treasurer at least one layman.

No. 20. INASMUCH as the problem of what type of literature our General Church shall publish and circulate has been presented to us; BE IT RESOLVED that this conference go on record as being opposed to our printing or handling anything but such literature as is in harmony with the fundamental doctrines of evangelical christianity, and that this resolution be sent to the General Board to help guide them in their decision.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the New York District Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church:

Another year has passed and God has permitted us to again meet together in our Annual Conference. As we look back over the past twelve months, only a few things are different from those of previous years. Our progress has not been such as would engender pride, and the difficulties and disappointments encountered should only spur us on to greater endeavor and faithfulness.

In material things we have made some gains. Binghamton, Fultonville, and North Troy church buildings have been freed from debt during the past year. The Lake Placid church is ready to burn the mortgage on their parsonage. A parsonage has been purchased at Fultonville and at Ogdensburg the old parsonage has been sold and a building by the side of the church has been re-modeled and is now occupied by the pastor. This change made possible by the sacrificing labor of the pastor and his helpers has resulted in freeing the Ogdensburg Church of their parsonage debt. At Cherry Valley, preparations are being made to erect a new Church building and lots have been purchased at both Massena and Brushton for the purpose of building new places of worship. At Grand Gorge, N. Y. where Rev. O. E. Whipple and wife have labored for many years we secured another field in which to minister. There we have a small church building, a tabernacle and campground, together with a congregation of earnest, holiness loving people. Bro. and Sister Whipple, after having a well-earned and needed rest expect to engage in evangelistic work.

Because of the serious illness of the worker sent to Voorheesville last year and due to the fact that we had no one to take his place the work there had to be turned over to others. Our effort to establish a work in Cassadaga failed. The Finch Hollow congregation voted to discontinue as an organized church and unite with the church at Oakdale.

We must be on the alert to enter new fields and not let any opportunity to extend our borders slip by us. Local pastors will find it stimulating to their membership to push out in outlying districts where there is the possibility of an opening for a soul-saving work.

We must not lag in our interest and support of the Foreign Missionary work. From the New York District we now have on the field twelve missionaries. In South Africa we have Donald Ault and wife; Bertha Joy and Magdalen Blann. George Gilmore and wife are laboring in St. Croix, Beatrice Dodge in Barbados, Alice Coone in Trinidad, while Clifton Berg and wife are busily engaged in British Guiana. We dare not fail these who have gone from us. Our prayers and money must follow them and in the coming day, we shall share in their reward.

The Allentown Bible Institute is yet in urgent need of our continued support. I urge our pastors to see that their churches contribute their share and more if possible. It is of interest to note that over twenty of our District ministers and workers are graduates of A. B. I. Let us support our Zone School.

In April our Brother G. Lindley Adams had his home destroyed by fire, losing practically all of his personal effects. The response to a need

thus created was indeed heart-warming. The churches and workers of the District contributed over \$1500.00 to help our brother and his family in the hour of trial so that we feel like singing with renewed emphasis—

"Blest be the tie that binds
Our hearts in Christian love,
The fellowship of kindred minds
Is like to that above."

and

"We share our mutual woes;
Our mutual burdens bear;
And often for each other flows
The sympathizing tear."

I have preached 135 times, officiated at one wedding and assisted in another, baptized four babies, and ministered at three funerals. I have been present at 32 Church board meetings, presided at four camps, 15 annual meetings and travelled over 10,000 miles.

Our greatest need is revival. The out-pouring of the Holy Ghost on our churches will do more to check the tide of worldliness and produce holy living than all the rules that can be formulated. "Now unto Him that is able to keep you from falling and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy, to the only wise God, our Saviour be glory and majesty, dominion and power both now and ever. Amen."
