Each church is expected to raise twenty-five cents per member for the District Superintendent each quarter.

Each church is assessed one dollar and fifty cents per member for the support of the General Superintendent and other general interests. This is to be sent to the State Treasurer.

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JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST BUSINESS SESSION

Monday Morning, August 11, 1924

The first business session of the assembly opened at 8:45 in the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Napoleon, Ohio, Rev. L. R. Roberts, State Superintendent, presiding. Song, "A Charge to Keep I Have," was sung and Rev. N. O. Stucky led in prayer. Rev. C. C. McNall read the Scripture lesson from II Timothy, the fourth chapter, and made appropriate remarks.

Enrollment of ministers and delegates.

Moved and carried that the first six rows of seats in the two middle sections constitute the Assembly bar.

Moved and carried that Rev. John O. Emrick assist the secretary.

Moved and carried that a copy of the minutes of the last Assembly be placed in the hands of each member of the Assembly.

The chairman then presented the matter of union between the Pentecostal Brethren in Christ and the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and stated their likeness regarding doctrine and practice.

Rev. C. C. McNall was then asked to speak concerning the union. He said that the desire for union between the two bodies had had much consideration and that it had culminated in a joint meeting of the Official Board of the Pentecostal Brethren in Christ and the State Council of The Pilgrim Holiness Church of Ohio. At this meeting an invitation was given to the former to join with us. It was received favorably.

Rev. Joel Harmon was then asked to state his convictions in regard to the union. He said that they had voted at their last church conference to become a part of the Pilgrim Holiness Church if the way was clear to receive them.

Since some of the delegates of the Pentecostal Brethren in Christ had not arrived at the Assembly, it was suggested that we delay any further steps in regard to the union until later in the session. The request was granted and the Assembly proceeded to other business.

Moved and carried that the rules governing the General Assembly be used to govern this Assembly.

Moved and carried that the morning sessions begin at 8:30 and adjourn at 11:30.

Moved and carried that the afternoon sessions begin at 1:30 and adjourn at 4:30.

Moved and carried that we have an evening session and that it begin at 7:30 and close at 9:30.

Moved and carried that the following committees be appointed: Reception, Finance, Publication, and Auditing.

The chairman appointed the following committees: Reception, Revs. C. C. McNall, C. M. Brown and N. O. Stucky; Resolution, Revs. C. B. Raisch, J. L. Kennet and A. A. Haines; Finance, Revs. H. E. Uhrig and T. H. Gaddis; Auditing, Rev. R. D. McNall and A. H. Colliflower.

The following personal reports were read and accepted: Revs. Thomas Zarley, J. L. Dean, M. M. Benner.

Moved and carried that Revs. J. C. Brillhart, E. C. Dundas, Charles Rotroff and R. W. Wolfe be given a seat and voice in the Assembly.

The following personal reports were given and accepted: Revs. B. R. Wetzel, R. D. Brown and H. E. Wilson.

The assistant secretary read the personal reports of Revs. E. C. Martin and R. E. Ross. They were accepted.

Rev. W. R. Cox, General Superintendent, was then invited to the chair, but asked to be excused until a later hour. The request was granted.

The following personal reports were read and accepted: Revs. C. B. Raisch, Helena Saneholtz, Grace Schneider, Celia Bradshaw, T. H. Gaddis, C. C. McNall, C. D. Fish, J. V. Coleman, H. E. Uhrig, N. O. Stucky, and Deaconesses Ida Green and Edith Zarley.

Moved and carried that the Assembly stand and sing, "Pass Me Not, O Gentle Savior." It was a spiritual refreshing.

The following reports were then read and accepted: Revs. C. L. Boone, Mrs. L. R. Roberts and Oly M. Judy.

Moved and carried that the ministers of the Pentecostal Brethren in Christ be given a seat within the Assembly bar and a voice in the Conference.

The following personal reports were read and accepted: Revs. John O. Emrick, A. A. Haines and P. W. Riley.

The ministers and delegates of the Pentecostal Brethren in Christ were asked to come before the Assembly for reception as members into the Pilgrim Holiness Church. The song, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds," was sung, and amidst tears and rejoicing they were received into our church fellowship. All felt that God put His seal upon this union and that we would unitedly be better able to press the battle for Him.

Moved and carried that we offer an apology to the laymen of the Pentecostal Brethren in Christ who were present but were overlooked at the time of the reception.

Moved and carried that the members coming late into the Assembly be supplied with a copy of the minutes.

Adjourned. Singing of Doxology.

SECOND BUSINESS SESSION

Monday Afternoon

The Assembly convened at 1:30 by singing "More About Jesus," followed by quotations of Scripture by various members of the Assembly. Prayer was then offered by Rev. H. C. Walker.

Moved and carried that the calling of the roll be suspended and that the late coming ministers and delegates be seated.

Moved and carried the reading of the minutes be deferred until the evening session.

Moved and carried that Mrs. C. M. Brown be given a seat in the Assembly and a voice on the Conference floor.

The following personal reports were then read and accepted: Revs. C. M. Brown, J. A. Smith, H. C. Walker, James Blankenship, J. L. Kennet and Mrs. Floreine Strohl.

The following church and Sunday School reports were then read and accepted: Marion, Cincinnati, St. Marys, Athens, Jackson, Toledo, Port Clinton, Youngsville, Nelsonville, West Carrollton and North Dayton.

Moved and carried that the reports of the ministers and delegates of the Pentecostal Brethren in Christ be read before the Assembly and be spread upon the minutes.

Rev. Everett Arthur, Secretary, read the reports of the following: Revs. Joel Harmon, J. A. Schell, Charles Marshall, Everett Arthur, Emery Maddox, Charles Patterson, Lydia Swick, Elizabeth Craner and Giles Snider.

The following church and Sunday School reports were then read and accepted: Bevis, Mulberry, New Floodwood, Chillicothe, Sidney, Columbia College, Oakland and Oakley.

Moved and carried that the reports of Springfield and Goose Run be tabled and corrected.

Personal reports of Revs. L. H. Wright and L. W. Standley were then read and accepted.

Adjournment. Benediction by Rev. C. M. Brown.

Monday Evening Session

Session opened at 7:00 o'clock by singing, "Take the Name of Jesus with You." Rev. W. R. Cox led in prayer.

By request Rev. J. A. Schell played on his violin and sang.

General Superintendent Rev. W. R. Cox was introduced as chairman for the session. He then addressed the Assembly regarding the conditions and outlook for our church in a general way. He said that our church was growing in revival spirit and fire as well as numerically. He pressed the need of revivals as the solution for many of our problems. Also that we exercise such brotherly spirit and kindness that our church will be a real home for any who are seeking a place of worship.

Roll was called and the minutes of the morning and afternoon sessions were read and approved.

The personal report of Rev. W. P. Goodman was read and accepted.

The report of the Resolution Committee was then read and received.

It was moved and carried that the resolution regarding Advisory Board meetings being illegal when held without the consent of the pastor, "be tabled."

Moved and carried that we adopt the resolution that "No assistant pastor shall be called or retained against the protest of the pastor."

Moved and carried that the resolution regarding the offer of the First Church in Cincinnati to give room, rent, heat and light, etc., free to our publishing plant be adopted.

Moved and carried that the resolution relating to the deeds of tem for Ohio be tabled indefinitely.

Moved and carried that we extend the time until 10:00 o'clock.

The resolution regarding the Foreign Missionary Superintendent was referred back to the Committee on Resolutions for revision.

Moved and carried that the resolution relating to the deeds of church property be approved.

Moved and carried that the resolution requiring pastors to consult the District Superintendent before building or repairing church property be adopted.

Moved and carried that the resolution placing the responsibility of planning and raising the support of the District Superintendent be tabled.

Moved and carried that the resolution making the ministerial delegates to the General Assembly to be chosen at the ratio of one to every seven instead of every five be adopted.

Moved and carried that an amendment to an amendment to a resolution regarding the sale of church property where a class is abandoned be adopted.

Adjourned. Benediction by Rev. Helena Saneholtz.

Tuesday Morning Session

The Assembly convened at 8:30 by singing, "There Is a Fountain Filled with Blood." Prayer by Rev. J. A. Schell.

On motion the calling of the roll was suspended.

Minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

Report of District Treasurer was read and submitted to the Auditing Committee.

Moved and carried that we set the hour for the ordination service at 3:00 o'clock on Tuesday afternoon.

Moved and carried that Rev. R. L. Roberts be given fifteen dollars for postage and stationery.

The District Foreign Missionary Treasurer read report and books were submitted to the Auditing Committee.

Moved and carried that all Foreign Missionary money be sent or reported to the Foreign Missionary Secretary-Treasurer.

Appointed hour for the election of officers.

Tellers appointed: Revs. J. L. Dean, B. R. Wetzell, L. R. Wright and H. E. Wilson.

The following officers were elected: District Superintendent, Rev. C. C. McNall; Assistant Superintendent, Rev. L. R. Roberts; Secretary, Rev. F. C. Saneholtz; Treasurer, Rev. C. D. Fish. Additional members of the Council, Revs. Joel Harmon, J. V. Coleman and John O. Emrick. District Foreign Missionary Secretary-treasurer, Mrs. L. R. Roberts.

Moved and carried that we suspend the rules and elect Rev. L. R. Roberts as a member of the Examining Board by acclamation.

Adjourned. Benediction by Rev. A. A. Haines.

Tuesday Afternoon Session

The Assembly convened by singing, "Redeemed." Rev. C. B. Raisch offered prayer.

On motion the roll call was suspended.

Minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

Report of the Home Missionary Treasurer was read and books submitted to the Auditing Committee.

Moved and carried that we suspend the rules and elect the same Home Missionary Board as served this year.

Moved and carried that the following act as a Camp Meeting Committee to arrange for and supervise our next annual Camp Meeting for 1925: Revs. Joel Harmon, J. Snyder, E. Arthur, G. W. Ulery, N. O. Stucky, C. M. Brown, C. C. McNall.

Moved and carried that we elect five district trustees.

Moved and carried that they be elected by acclamation.

Moved and carried that they be elected for the terms of five, four, three, two and one years.

Moved and carried that the re-elections be in the same manner.

The following were elected trustees: Revs. Joel Harmon, H. E. Uhrig, L. R. Roberts, Joel Berry and J. L. Kennet.

Moved and carried that we elect the delegates to the General Assembly by acclamation.

Personal report of Rev. W. A. Lockwood read and accepted.

The following lay members were elected to the General Assembly: Jeanette Lawson, Hugo Saneholtz, G. W. Ulery, A. H. Colliflower, Arthur Brestol, Henry Dearth and William Bradberry.

Moved and carried that we elect ten alternates among the ministry to the General Assembly and that the first elected delegate fill the first vacancy.

The following were elected: Revs. L. W. Wright, H. E. Uhrig, Ida Green, Mrs. Coleman, N. O. Stucky, P. W. Riley, Paul Coleman, R. D. McNall, J. T. Maffin, J. T. Smith.

Moved and carried that we rescind the action of the morning session and that the hour for the ordination service be deferred.

Moved and carried that we elect seven laymen for alternates to the General Assembly.

The following were elected: William Heilman, Mrs. B. Rutherford, Mrs. William Ziebold, Glen Jones, Bertha Ward, Ed Adam and Mrs. P. W. Riley.

Moved and carried that a committee be appointed to ascertain the expense of delegates to the General Assembly and that the district raise one-half of that amount.

The committee appointed was as follows: Revs. J. L. Kennet, J. V. Coleman and C. M. Brown.

The following reports were read and accepted: Rev. J. R. Edwards, Kate Putman, E. E. Smith, Rossburg Church and Sunday School report, R. D. McNall, E. E. Connin and the Defiance and Dupont and Napoleon Church and Sunday School report.

The Auditing Committee reported the books of the District Treasurer and the District Missionary Treasurer approved.

Ordination service at 4:00 o'clock. The ordination council consisted of Revs. W. R. Cox, C. C. McNall, C. M. Brown, J. V. Coleman and R. L. Roberts.

The ordination address was given by Rev. W. R. Cox and Revs. H. E. Wilson and C. L. Boone were ordained to the ministry.

Moved and carried that we change the date of the district Camp Meeting and that it convene on the Friday before the third Sunday of August and continue over the third and fourth Sundays of August, 1925, and that the District Assembly be held just prior, on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Moved and carried that the Assembly year close with the last Sunday before the Assembly.

Adjourned. Benediction by Rev. C. C. McNall.

Tuesday Evening Business Session

The Assembly convened at 7:15 with a song by Rev. J. A. Schell. Prayer by Rev. T. H. Gaddis.

Moved and carried that we dispense with the roll call.

Minutes of the previous session were read, corrected and approved.

The Committee on Expense to the General Assembly reported that after estimating all costs, it would require fifty cents per member for the entire district.

Moved and carried that the report be accepted and that the above be raised by each church as per membership.

Report of District Superintendent Rev. L. R. Roberts was read and accepted.

Moved and carried that we rescind the action of the last annual Assembly regarding the making of an honorary list of all churches and ministers and deaconesses who pay their allotted sum to the District Superintendent promptly.

Moved and carried that we rescind the action of the afternoon session and make the church year close July 31, as heretofore.

Moved and carried that no one speak more than two minutes on any one question.

Moved and carried that we suspend rules regarding the time any one is to speak.

Report of the Resolutions Committee read and received.

Resolution to have the General Assembly convene at 10:00 o'clock of the first Wednesday of October of each second year adopted.

Resolution regarding the organizing of a new church only by the District Superintendent or a member of the State Council tabled.

Resolution regarding members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in good standing who desire to move their membership from one Pilgrim Holiness Church to another was adopted.

Resolution eliminating missionaries from raising money for independent work in our churches adopted.

Resolution regarding paragraphs 45 and 40 adopted.

Resolution regarding commissioning evangelists adopted.

Resolution regarding change of pastors tabled.

Resolution regarding the interference of pastor's work adopted.

Resolution on memoirs adopted.

Resolution regarding location of the Assembly lost.

Resolution that our next annual Assembly be held at Sugar Grove Camp Ground adopted.

Resolution to adopt same financial plan for next year as was in force last year was adopted.

Moved and carried that we extend time to finish business of the Assembly.

Moved and carried that we grant Joseph White license to preach the Gospel.

Moved and carried that we grant Mrs. Ida Leach license to preach.

Moved and carried that we grant Charles Rotroff license to preach.

Resolution appealing to the General Assembly to define our stand on the doctrine of divorce adopted.

Moved and carried that the publishing committee publish 1000 copies of the minutes and that they be sold at ten cents per copy.

Moved and carried that the Assembly approve of the Treasurer paying ten dollars to Rev. W. R. Cox for traveling expenses.

Moved and carried that the Publishing Committee be authorized to draw on the Treasurer for printing the minutes.

Moved and carried that the Treasurer be reimbursed for this amount as the minutes are sold.

Moved and carried that the Publishing Committee be authorized to request the Editor of the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate to advertise the sale of the minutes in the paper.

Adjourned.

RESOLUTIONS TO BE PRESENTED TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY CONVENING AT GREENSBORO, N. C., OCT. 7, 1924

1. **Resolved**, That the ministerial delegates to the General Assembly shall be selected at the ratio of one to every seven ministers in the state instead of one to every five ministers.

2. **Resolved**, That no assistant pastor shall be called or retained against the protest of the pastor.

3. **Resolved**, That where new churches are bought or lots purchased for building purposes, that all pastors be required to have the same deeded to the Pilgrim Holiness Church according to the manual, and where the above is not done, that no church shall be recognized as a Pilgrim Holiness Church.

4. **Resolved**, That the General Assembly convene at 10:00 o'clock on the first Wednesday of October of each second year.

5. **Resolved**, That none of our people permit our churches or camp meetings to be used to raise money for independent missionary work.

6. **Resolved**, That when any one presenting a transfer duly signed, he shall be received and his name placed on the roll by the Secretary.

7. **Resolved**, That when members in good standing in any Pilgrim Holiness Church desire to move their membership from one church to another, they shall be given a transfer by the pastor signed by the Secretary.

8. **Resolved**, That licensed and ordained ministers in the Pilgrim Holiness Church who give clear evidence of possessing evangelistic gifts and ability be commissioned as regular evangelists and that said commission be granted by a majority vote of the Assembly of which the applicant is a member. The applicant is to be recommended by the District Council and his credentials are to be signed by the District Superintendent and Secretary.

9. **Resolved**, That no pastor shall proceed to build, repair or buy a church house where more than one thousand dollars is involved until having consulted with the District Superintendent concerning the same.

10. **Resolved**, That where a class has failed and has been abandoned so as to necessitate the sale of church property, it shall be the duty of the District Superintendent in connection with the District Council to proceed legally to dispose of said property, money received from sale of same to be placed in the District Treasury to be disposed of by the following District Assembly.

11. **Resolved**, That any ordained or licensed preacher of the Pilgrim Holiness Church interfering with the work of, or influencing anyone against any pastor, shall be answerable to the General Council for his conduct.

12. **Resolved**, That we appeal to the General Assembly to decide and place in the manual a statement of our position regarding doctrine on the question of divorce and remarriage.

13. **Resolved**, That paragraph forty-five be stricken from the manual and that paragraph forty be made to read thus: The General Council shall be elected by ballot at every General Assembly and shall serve throughout the Assembly period for which they are elected and all the sessions of the following Assembly.
