The New Financial Plan.

Every pastor is to tithe into the local church treasury and this is to be forwarded monthly and separately to the District Treasurer for the support of the District Superintendent.

All other church receipts, except foreign missionary money and offerings for building purposes are to be tithed and this tithe to be sent also to the District Treasurer to be used as follows: 40 percent for Home Missions, 55 percent for General church work and 5 percent for District expenses.

II. PROCEEDINGS

The Ohio District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened at Springfield, Ohio, Aug. 23, 1926.

FIRST BUSINESS SESSION, MONDAY MORNING.

The first business session of the Assembly opened at nine o'clock in the Camp-meeting tabernacle at Springfield, Ohio, with Rev. J. V. Coleman, District Superintendent, presiding. After singing "The Solid Rock," Brother Coleman read a Scripture lesson and made appropriate opening remarks and admonitions. Brother J. O. Emrick led in prayer.

Moved and carried that the Chair appoint an assistant to the secretary Rev. T. H. Gaddis was appointed.

Enrollment of ministers and delegates was ordered.

Moved and carried that O. W. Barnes, Harry Hays, Mr. and Mrs. Earl Baldwin, B. H. Pugh, I. J. Snider, Chas. Hill, Inez Hill, V. D. Webb, Mrs. C. M. Brown be enrolled as members of the Ohio District and admitted into the Assembly bar.

Our General Superintendent, W. R. Cox, coming at this time, the chair was given to him and after some words of greeting, the Assembly proceeded with business with Brother Cox as chairman.

Moved and carried that the hours of the Assembly be from eight-thirty to eleven thirty in the morning; from one-thirty to four-thirty in the afternoon; from seven to nine at night.

Moved and carried that we adopt the rules laid down in the Church Manual for regulating the Assembly.

Moved and carried that we have reports read without any comment.

Brother Earl Baldwin and Charles Henderson were appointed by the Chair as a committee on statistics.

The following reports were read and accepted; Ansonia and Rossburg, Bevis.

Moved and carried that Brothers Childs and Dickinson be admitted into the Assembly bar and given a voice in the Assembly.

The following report was read and accepted: Columbus.

Wright, C. A. Marshall; **Ways and Means**—A. H. Colliflower, J. L. Kennett, Henry Uhrig; **Auditing**—J. O. Emrick, E. G. Marsh.

On motion the Assembly adjourned with benediction by Rev. J. L. Kennett.

SECOND SESSION OF ASSEMBLY—MONDAY AFTERNOON.

The Assembly convened at one-thirty by singing "Pentecostal Power." Brother Cox then read a Scripture lesson and made some timely and helpful admonitions. Rev. J. R. Edwards then led in prayer.

Roll of ministers and delegates was called.

The minutes of the first session were read, corrected, and approved.

The following reports were read and accepted: Cincinnati, First; Dayton, First; Dayton, Second; Deer Creek; East Canaan.

A report of the Resolution Committee was received and accepted.

A report of the Home Missionary Committee was received and referred back to committee.

Moved and supported that the Secretary send our dear brother, W. A. Lockwood a message of condolence and sympathy in his great sorrow because of the death of his companion.

The following reports were read and accepted: Jackson, Logan, Marion, McLuney, Morgan Center.

A report of the Resolutions Committee was received. The first portion of the resolution was referred back to the Resolution Committee. The latter part was referred to Ways and Means Committee.

Moved and carried that reports mailed in be referred to Committee on Statistics without being read before the Assembly.

Then District Superintendent Coleman gave a brief report of the fifteen new churches being organized in the District during the past year.

The following reports were read and accepted: Murray City; New Richmond; Cincinnati Second, Toledo.

Rev. A. R. Shirk, who has lately come to us from the Church of the Nazarene, was introduced to the Assembly and given place in the Assembly bar.

In the absence of District Treasurer, C. D. Fish, it was moved and carried that the District Superintendent appoint an acting Treasurer. Rev. A. H. Colliflower was appointed.

Adjourned by motion. Benediction by Brother Harmon.

THIRD BUSINESS SESSION, MONDAY EVENING.

The third session convened by singing, "In the Service of the King". The Assembly then stood and recited the Twenty-third Psalm, after which Sister Brown led in prayer.

Moved and carried that the roll call be dispensed with.

Minutes of last session were read and approved.

A report of the Resolutions Committee was received and acted on as follows:

Resolved that Tuesday morning, August 24, at eight-thirty A. M. the order of business be the electing of officers. Carried.

We recommend that a time be designated for the bringing forward of memorials to our deceased brethren, Rev. L. W. Standley, Rev. J. A. Smith, Rev. Mrs. Lockwood, Rev. P. F. Sanders and other members of our District. Carried.

Resolution No. 7, regarding changing name of Pilgrim Junior Band to Pilgrim Holiness Young People's Society. Carried (See Resolutions).

Resolution No. 8, regarding considering changing the location of our District Camp was carried.

Election of officers proceeding. The Home Missionary Board was re-elected. Moved and carried that Brother and Sister Stites be given an honorary seat within the Assembly bar.

Resolution No. 9 regarding the District Superintendent giving all his time to the work of the District. Carried.

Resolution No. 10, regarding the time of the General Assembly, referred back to Committee on Resolutions for redrafting.

Resolution No. 12 regarding Scripture references in the Manual. Carried

Resolution No. 13, regarding a system of finances for the District. Carried.

Resolution No. 14, regarding three General Superintendents. Carried.

Resolution No. 15 regarding a General Board to replace our eight General Boards. Lost.

Resolution No. 16 regarding the term of office of District Superintendent. Lost.

A report of the Ways and Means Committee was received and the resolution tabled.

It was moved and carried that all unread reports be placed in hands of Committee on Statistics at the close of the session.

The report of the District Superintendent was read and accepted.

Assembly adjourned with benediction by Rev. N. O. Stuckey.

FOURTH SESSION, TUESDAY MORNING

The Fourth Session convened at 8:30 Tuesday morning, by singing "Let the Lower Lights Be Burning," followed by a healing service.

By motion the reading of the roll call was dispensed with.

Minutes of previous session read and approved.

After silent prayer the Assembly proceeded to the election of officers.

Brothers L. H. Wright, R. W. Wolf, Floyd Bostick and Albert Selbee were appointed as tellers.

The following officers were elected: District Superintendent, J. V. Coleman; Assistant District Superintendent, Joel Harmon; District Secretary, F. C. Saneholtz; District Treasurer, A. H. Colliflower; Additional members of the Council, C. M. Brown, J. O. Emrick, L. R. Roberts; Examining Board, F. C. Saneholtz, L. R. Roberts, Harry Hays.

Brother W. A. Lockwood, recently bereaved of his companion, came into the Assembly at this time and was called forward and given the sympathy of the Assembly.

The Assembly ruled to consolidate the Home Missionary Board and Church Extension Board. Rcv's. J. V. Coleman, C. M. Brown, L. R. Roberts were appointed.

It was moved and carried that the District Superintendent appoint the Camp Meeting Board.

Foreign Missionary Secretary-Treasurer was re-elected—Sister L. R. Roberts.

Rev. J. L. Kennett, his term expiring, was re-elected as District Trustee.

It was moved and carried that the District Council nominate delegates to the General Assembly to be voted on by the District Assembly.

The report of the Home Missionary Board was received and accepted.

Moved and carried that our Treasurer be instructed to pay our Editor, W. C.

Stone, the balance pledged to him from the last Assembly.

Report of the Church extension Board received and accepted.

Adjourned by Motion. Closing prayer by Rev. O. W. Barnes.

FIFTH SESSION, TUESDAY AFTERNOON

The Fifth Session of the Assembly convened at 1:30, Tuesday afternoon by singing "Down at the Cross," followed by prayer by Rev. Harry Hays.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

A report of the Resolution Committee was received.

Resolution No. 17 regarding ladies' dress referred back to Resolution Committee for redrafting.

Resolution No. 18 regarding the reading of the location of pastors. Carried

Resolution No. 19 regarding limiting District Superintendent's time of service to five years. Lost

Resolution No. 20. regarding equalization board. Carried.

Rev. Metzger and Rev. Overman of the Mennonite Brethren in Christ Church were introduced to the Assembly and were granted a seat in the Assembly bar.

Resolution No. 21 regarding moving the General Missionary Headquarters to Cincinnati, Ohio. Carried.

Resolution No. 22 regarding limiting the number of institutions in our Church. Carried.

Resolution No. 23 regarding divorced persons. Lost.

Resolution No. 24 regarding a financial plan for the Church. Adopted.

Resolution No. 25 regarding Young Peoples' Society officers. Passed.

Ways and Means committee reported a regulation for District finances. Adopted.

The report of the Secretary-Treasurer of Foreign Missions was read and accepted.

The report of the District Council on delegates to the General Assembly received and adopted.

It was moved and carried that the District Superintendent be empowered to fill vacancies in the delegations to the Gen. Assembly, should they occur.

An ordination service was held in this session at which time Rev. L. H. Wright was ordained.

On motion the Assembly adjourned, with benediction by Brother C. A. Marshall.

MEMORIAL SERVICE

A Memorial Service was conducted Tuesday evening at 6:45 P. M. for four of our deceased ministers who departed this life triumphantly in the faith in the past year. The hymn "The Eastern Gate" was sung by the congregation after which Brother Edwards led in prayer. Mrs. F. C. Saneholtz sang very effectively "No Night There," after which suitable memorials were presented as follows: Brother Coleman represented Rev. P. F. Sanders; Brother Gaddis represented Rev. L. W. Standly; Brother Stucky represented Rev. J. A. Smith; and Brother Wolfe represented Sister W. A. Lockwood. In closing the leader made mention of several deceased lay members: Mrs. M. B. Saneholtz, James Saneholtz, the mother of Grace Schneider and Mrs. R. E. Ross. Benediction was pronounced by Brother Barnes.

SIXTH SESSION, TUESDAY EVENING

After the Memorial Session business was resumed.

A report of the resolution committee was received.

Resolution No. 25 with paragraph 3 omitted was adopted for the District.

Resolution No. 26 regarding a plan of finance for the District, submitted by the Ways and Means Committee, after being amended was adopted. (See list of Resolutions.)

Moved and carried that we accept the new Church at Martin's Ferry as one of our Churches.

It was moved and carried that the proper clause to be used in conveying Church property be supplied by the second Church, Cincinnati, Ohio, and be recorded in the minutes. (See page)

It was moved and supported that the District Board of Trustees be empowered to take steps to establish our Church in the State of Ohio, so that the title to our property will be cleared and a deed can be given to others.

By motion, Sister C. M. Brown was elected as Chairman of the Young People's Society of the District.

By motion Sister Dobie was elected Secretary of the Young People's Society of the District.

The Examining Board reported L. A. Robison, Ora A. Huff, Joe Callender, W. H. Dickerson, Bertha Morgan, R. A. Moon, A. R. Shirk, Herrold Osborn, Fred Wolf, Rose T. Grant, Elmer Moon, C. A. Rutherford, B. H. Pugh, Melvin Rickner, J. D. Webb, A. H. Kessler, Harry Holtzapple, R. P. Baumgardner as candidates for preacher's license and Margaret Fisher for Deaconess' license. These were passed by the Assembly.

Moved and carried that the names of Mattie Buchanan and Louise Haskell, which had been in some way omitted, be placed upon the list of Ordained Deaconesses.

Moved and supported that minutes be sold for 10c each and that 1000 copies be printed.

Report of Auditing Committee reported the books of the District Treasurer, the Home Missionary Treasurer, and Foreign Secretary-Treasurer, were audited and approved as correct according to the credit and debit sheets thereof. This report accepted.

Moved and carried that in event the General Assembly does not make provision for the Editor of the Advocate that our District will pay \$150.00 toward his salary.

The District Superintendent appointed the District Council as a Camp-Meeting Board.

Moved and carried that the Camp-Meeting Board be vested with power to seek a suitable location for a Camp and to call a meeting of Assembly to consider same if necessary.

Brother Jacob Schell, being recommended by the Examining Board and by the District Council was approved for license to preach.

The Licensed Preachers were passed on for renewal of license.

The list of stationed preachers was read to the Assembly by the District Superintendent.

On motion the Assembly adjourned by rising vote, and united in a closing prayer by Rev. J. O. Emerick. This closed one of the best Assemblies ever held by the Ohio District.

With profound gratitude for the past and bright hopes for the future we go forward in the Name of our All-conquering Christ, knowing that our labor is not in vain in the Lord.

III. RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that hereafter in order to expedite business that all delegates be required to register their names with the secretary before the opening of the Assembly. Carried.

2. Resolved that a fund be raised as a Home Missionary fund. This fund to be raised from the Churches of the District according to their resident active membership at the rate of 75c per member. The money raised by home missionary evangelists while employed in the District work shall be turned into the Home Missionary treasury. All expenses of this work shall be paid from this fund. Carried.

3. Be it resolved that we authorize our secretary to send our dear Brother, W. A. Lockwood a message of condolence and sympathy in his great sorrow in the death of his companion. Message to be sent at once to Circleville, Ohio c. o. Owens Zeits. Carried.

5. Resolved that on Tuesday morning, August 24, 8:30 A. M. the order of business be the election of officers. Carried.

6. We recommend that a time be designated for the bringing forward of memorials to our deceased brethren—Rev. L. W. Standley, Rev. J. A. Smith, Rev. Mrs. Lockwood and Rev. Sanders, members of our District. Carried.

7. Memorial to General Assembly. Resolved that we, the Ohio District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, petition the General Assembly to change paragraph 137 of the Manual to read "The Pilgrim Holiness Young People's Society" instead of "Pilgrim Junior Band." Carried.

8. Inasmuch as our District camp has outgrown our present accommodations, resolved that this Assembly consider securing a more suitable location. Carried.

9. Inasmuch as the work of our District has increased to such proportions as to necessitate the full time service of a District Superintendent, we therefore request this Assembly to take the above into consideration in the election of a District Superintendent. Carried.

10. Memorial to General Assembly. Since a General Assembly costs thousands of dollars, be it therefore resolved that we recommend that our General Assembly be held every four years. Referred back to the Committee for redrafting.

11. Memorial to General Assembly. Since there is general complaint concerning our Report Blanks, be it therefore resolved that our General Assembly provide uniform and simplified Report Blanks. Carried.

12. Memorial to General Assembly. Since there is so much unnecessary space taken in our Manual by the many Scripture references in connection with our statement of doctrine, be it therefore resolved that only two references be used; and also the Rules of Order be left out and the statement "All business meetings shall be conducted on regular parliamentary rules as laid down in Roberts Rules of Order," be inserted. Carried.

13. As there is need of a uniform financial system in our Church which will take care of all the financial necessities of our Church, be it therefore resolved that a committee be appointed to draft such system and present it to this Assembly for adoption. Carried.

14. Memorial to General Assembly. The fact that our Church has become too large for one General Superintendent to give the needful attention, be it therefore resolved that we recommend the election of three General Superintendents whose duties and powers shall be equal, and who shall give attention to all the interests of our Church. Carried.

18. We recommend that our District Superintendent, at the close of each Assembly, read the known location of pastors for the coming year. Carried.

20. Memorial to General Assembly. We recommend that an Equalization Board be created for the purpose of equalizing the financial interests of the various institutions of the Church in general, such as the Orphanage, Rescue work, Foreign Missionary work, School, and any other work that may come under this head. Carried.

21. Memorial to General Assembly. Inasmuch as Cincinnati is more centrally located and our publishing interests are located there, we therefore recommend that our General Missionary Headquarters be transferred from Kingswood, Ky., to Cincinnati, Ohio. Carried.

* 22. Memorial to General Assembly. Considering our present financial strain as a Church we therefore recommend the discouragement of the building up of any new institutions. Carried.

24. Memorial to General Assembly. We recommend to the General Assembly for its consideration the following resolution for the financing of our general work and its institutions: That all of our members tithe into local treasury of the Church in which their respective memberships are held. That all of our pastors place their tithes into their local Church treasuries to be forwarded monthly and separately to their District Treasurer for the support of their District Superintendent. The tithe of all Church receipts except the tithe of the pastors be distributed as follows: 55 per cent for the General Church Treasury; 40 per cent for Home District missions; and the remaining 5 per cent to be used for District expenses. The amount by the General Treasurer to be distributed monthly as follows 25 per cent to Home Missions; 14 per cent to the Educational Department; 17 per cent to the Orphanage; 12 per cent to Rescue Homes; 16 percent to Publishing interests; and the remaining 16 per cent to the General Superintendent. Carried.

25. Memorial to General Assembly. Resolved that there be instituted a Young People's Dist. Board of three, the chairman of said Board be elected by the District Assembly. (2). Resolved that the chairman of said Board shall appoint the other two members. (3). Resolved that the chairman of the Young People's District Board shall become a member of the District Council. (4). Resolved that the duties of the Young People's Board shall be: first, to help formulate workable plans and programs for the individual societies and conventions; second, to counsel with the Young People's District Secretary relative to the Young People's work. (5). Resolved that the Young People's Secretary be elected by the District Assembly. (6). Resolved that the duties of said Secretary shall be to confer with the various pastors relative to organizing the Young People of their respective Churches; second, to organize the individual societies. (7) Resolved

that the Young People's District Secretary shall be remunerated by free-will offerings from the societies to whom he or she ministers either by organizing or by visiting. Carried.

26. "The Ways and Means Committee recommends that the Ohio District adopt the following plan of Finance which is to substitute all former regulations.

That all our members tithe into the Treasury of the local church of which they are members. The pastor's tithe to be paid into the local church treasury, and to be forwarded monthly and separately to the District treasurer for the support of our District Superintendent.

The tithe of all church receipts, except the tithe of the pastor to be forwarded monthly to the District Treasurer to be distributed as follows: Forty per cent for Home District missions, fifty-five per cent to the General Church Treasurer for general Church work and the remaining five per cent to District expenses, out of which the District Treasurer and the District Secretary shall receive forty dollars each per annum for their services.

Amended to read "That we exempt foreign missionary offerings and offerings for building purposes from being so tithed." Carried.

27. Resolved, that we express our appreciation of the faithful services rendered by our District Superintendent, Rev. J. V. Coleman, during the past year.

Resolved, that we as an Assembly recognize the faithfulness of our Camp Meeting Committee in arranging the splendid accommodations that we have enjoyed. Also that we recognize the services rendered by our secretary, Rev. F. C. Saneholtz, and his assistant, Rev. T. H. Gaddis, and our State Treasurer, Rev. C. D. Fish, also Mr. and Mrs. Hulse, who served as cooks.

Resolved, that we especially thank the Almighty God for the harmony and Christian Spirit that has been manifest throughout the Assembly; also for His hand of providence that has been upon us, and do hereby pledge our loyalty to Him and to our churches until Jesus comes. Carried.

IV. REPORTS

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the Annual Assembly of the Ohio District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, at Springfield, Ohio, we beg to submit the following report of our work as District Superintendent for the past year. God has been pleased to bless us in soul and body for which we praise Him. This work being somewhat new to us and our former District Supt. leaving the State for other fields, so we did not have his advice and counsel, it was somewhat of a drawback in getting an outlay of the work. We want to give credit where it is due. The success of the work has been largely due to the co-operation of the pastors and evangelists of our District. There has not been an opportunity of placing a meeting near many of their Churches but they have availed themselves of it and have kept us informed as to the progress so that we could follow up their work by organizing so as to conserve it. We, as a District, have organized fifteen new Churches and one Mission. All of these have reported a growth in membership, some of them doubling their membership since the date of their organization which is encourag-

ing as to growth and spirituality. The increase in membership during the year is 412. A number of our Churches have remodeled and decorated their places of worship until they are a credit to the community. Several have bought or built new Church Homes which we think is very commendable as it shows zeal and indicates permanence to the community. It inspires faith and creates love in the hearts of our members for their local Churches. We have in our possession at this time four openings for Pilgrim Holiness Churches, some already having their buildings and strong congregations in territories where we have been praying earnestly for openings.

We have received as support from the District to the amount of \$1150.08; \$326.25 of this amount from the preachers, and \$823.83 from Churches. Our expenses have been \$477.02 thus giving us the sum of \$673.46.
