Journal of Proceedings

FIRST SITTING

The Thirty-first Session of the Annual Assembly of the Ohio District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9 a. m., Monday, August 14, 1935, on the Sugar Grove Camp Meeting Grounds, Springfield, Ohio, with Assistant General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, Chairman.

After singing we were led in prayer by the Secretary, Rev. D. C. Shearer.

The District Superintendent, Rev. L. R. Roberts, read a Scripture Lesson from Colossians, the third chapter.

Rev. L. W. Sturk then gave an instructive address. The subject was "The Success of Our Church."

The roll was called by the Secretary.

A motion was moved and seconded that the first six seats in front of the platform and the two sections of seats to the right, comprise the Conference Bar. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the Secretary appoint his assistant. Mrs. Alma Shearer was appointed.

Rev. Paul Greeson and Rev. Mrs. Lillian R. Lash were received into the Assembly as members. Each gave a brief testimony.

Moved and seconded that the hours of assembly be from 8:30 a. m. to 11:30 a. m., from 1:30 p. m. to 4:30 p. m. and the evening sitting from 7:00 p. m. to 10:00 p. m. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that the District Superintendent appoint the committees at this time. The following committees were appointed:

Ways and Means—C. P. Pridgen, H. C. Walker, and C. M. Brown.

Statistical—H. S. Harrold, Harold Osborn, and A. A. Haines.

Auditing—A. H. Colliflower and J. O. Emerick.

Reception—H. L. Holtzapple and M. C. Kittle.

Editing—D. C. Shearer.

Moved and seconded that all the reports be turned over to the statistical committee at once. Carried.

Moved and carried that we recess five minutes to turn in the reports. After the recess, a motion prevailed that the District Superintendent read his report. His report which was read was unanimously accepted by motion.

A motion was made and seconded that we extend to Brother Roberts a rising vote of thanks for his untiring efforts during the year. Carried.

The following new churches were by motion received into the Assembly: Troy, Bucyrus, New Madison, and Mt. Olivet.

Rev. O. L. King and wife were introduced to the Assembly and each gave a testimony.

It was moved and seconded that Brother King tell his experience when he took charge of a ship at sea. Carried. This was given and proved quite interesting.

Carried that we extend the time 15 minutes.

Rev. C. M. Brown read his Home Missionary report. Moved and seconded that his report be accepted. Carried.

The assembly stood and sang the chorus "When We All Get to Heaven."

Adjourned with benediction by Brother F. C. Saneholtz.

SECOND SITTING

The Second Sitting of the Annual Session was called to order by the chairman, Rev. L. W. Sturk. The Scripture lesson from Second Timothy, the second chapter was read by D. C. Shearer. This was followed by prayer by Sister Celia Bradshaw.

The roll was called by the secretary.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

Rev. C. A. Farthing of the Indiana Assembly was introduced to the assembly. He spoke briefly.

It was moved and seconded that Brother Farthing be granted a seat within the Conference Bar and be granted the privilege of the floor. Carried.

The Ways and Means Committee report was read.

No. 2. An amendment was offered as follows:

A motion was made and seconded that the election of officers be held to-night. An amendment was offered that the election be held tomorrow afternoon. The amendment was lost.

A substitute motion prevailed that the election be held tomorrow morning and the hour be set by the chairman.

Moved and carried that no member leave the assembly without its consent. The District Treasurer read his report, which on motion was accepted. (See printed report.)

The chairman announced that tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock the business of the day will be the Election of Officers.

The Assembly stood and sang "Praise God from Whom all Blessings Flow" and dismissed by shaking of hands.

THIRD SITTING

Monday Evening

The Third Sitting of the Assembly was called to order by the Chairman, Rev. L. W. Sturk. After song and Scriptural Quotations by the members of the Assembly, we were led in prayer by Rev. Jacob Swisher. Brother Sturk then gave a pointed message relative to the Ministerial Benefit Association.

A motion was made and seconded that we dispense with the roll call for the remainder of the Assembly. The minutes of the previous sitting were read and accepted. The Chairman read a letter from Brother Chatfield, relative to the improvement of Headquarters' Building. The letter and matter were referred to the Ways and Means Committee. At this time Rev. Esther Close and Rev. Francis St. Clair and Rev. Earl Dustman were introduced to the Assembly. They were welcomed and each gave a testimony which was appreciated.

A motion prevailed that these three be invited within the Conference Bar and given the privilege of the floor.

The Committee on Resolutions reported as follows: (1) Adopted. (2) Adopted. (3) Adopted. A motion prevailed that Sister P. H. Sanders be excused. Moved and seconded the Sister be granted the privilege of leaving a sealed vote. Carried.

Rev. John McNurlin of the Kentucky Conference was introduced to the Assembly. He was welcomed by the Assembly.

C. M. Brown, Joel Harmon and J. A. Fields were appointed members of the Memorial Committee. Moved and seconded, we adjourn. The Assembly stood and sang "Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow." Benediction by the chairman.

FOURTH SITTING

Tuesday Morning

The Fourth Sitting was called to order with Rev. L. W. Sturk in the chair. After a song the chairman read a Scripture lesson from the fourteenth chapter of Romans, and brought a splendid message from verse 19: "Follow the things that make for peace."

1. We should be kindly, courteous and considerate toward each other.
2. We should manifest a spirit of Divine Love.
3. We should manifest a forgiving spirit.
4. We should not judge one another.

The Assembly then entered into prayer and a splendid spirit of intercession prevailed. The minutes of the previous sitting were read and accepted.

The names of Philip Overstreet, John Currens, Henry Kelley, Merrit Stevens, James Miller and Rowan Messerschmidt, who came recommended by the Examining Board and District Council, were duly received as Licensed Ministers of this Assembly. Rev. Mrs. Brandenburg of the Nazarene Church and Rev. Dittmar of the Mennonite Church were presented to the Assembly. These were welcomed by the Assembly and each spoke briefly. A motion prevailed that we extend the courtesy of the Bar to these visitors.

The following tellers were appointed: Harold Osborn, John Powell, John McClain, Richard Powell, M. C. Kittle and William Brown. The chairman asked us to engage in prayer after which the ballot was cast for the election of a District Superintendent.

A motion prevailed that the counting of the ballots for the election of the District Superintendent be conducted publicly and the counting of the ballots for the other officers be done privately by the tellers. The first ballot resulted in no election.

A motion prevailed that the four receiving the highest number of votes be declared nominees. The nominees were L. R. Roberts, C. P. Pridgen, J. O. Emerick and E. E. Connin.

The second ballot was cast but resulted in no election.

A motion prevailed that the two receiving the highest number of votes be declared nominees. L. R. Roberts and C. P. Pridgen were the nominees. The ballot was cast and L. R. Roberts was duly elected District Superintendent. He made a speech of acceptance. The ballots were cast for an Assistant District Superintendent and the tellers retired to count the ballots.

A motion prevailed that the District Superintendent nominate two for trustees. He nominated E. E. Connin and J. O. Emerick. The tellers reported the result of the balloting for the Assistant District Superintendent. It resulted in no election.

A motion prevailed that the two receiving the highest number of votes be declared nominees. J. O. Emerick and C. P. Pridgen were the nominees. The ballot was cast again for the election of the Assistant District Superintendent and J. O. Emerick was duly elected Assistant District Superintendent. He made a speech of acceptance.

The ballot was cast for the election of a District Trustee. E. E. Connin was elected for a term of five years.

A motion prevailed that the rules be suspended and D. C. Shearer be elected Secretary. D. C. Shearer was by acclamation elected District Secretary. The

same motion prevailed relative to the election of a District Treasurer. C. P. Pridden was by acclamation elected District Treasurer.

Moved and seconded that the election of the Camp Meeting Board be referred to the District Council. Carried.

Moved and carried we recess for ten minutes. After recess the tellers reported the result of the balloting for first additional members of the District Council. No election.

A motion prevailed that the two receiving the highest number of votes be declared nominees. Brother Saneholtz and Brother Connin were the nominees.

Moved and carried we extend the time long enough to take this vote. Carried.

C. P. Pridden made a speech of acceptance having been re-elected District Treasurer. By request he sang a song, "I'll Be Gone."

The tellers reported the result of the balloting for an additional member of the District Council. E. E. Connin was elected.

The Assembly adjourned with benediction by L. R. Roberts.

FIFTH SITTING

Tuesday Afternoon

The Fifth Sitting was called to order with Rev. L. W. Sturk in the chair. After singing "Many Mansions Home Over There," several Scriptural Quotations were given and prayer was offered by Rev. F. C. Saneholtz. At this time H. J. Furstenberger, Pastor of local U. B. Church was introduced to the Assembly and extended the courtesy of the Bar.

The chairman declared the previous motion under which two councilmen were elected to be out of order.

Moved and seconded that each member of the Assembly vote for one councilman on first ballot. Any receiving the majority of all votes cast is elected. That the ten receiving the highest number of votes be declared nominees from which the remainder of the councilmen shall be elected. Carried. The ballots were cast for the councilmen and on the first ballot there was no election.

The following became the nominees: Brother Houck, E. E. Connin, Joel Harmon, Harold Osborn, F. C. Saneholtz, Paul Greeson, H. C. Walker, Brother Qualls and C. M. Brown.

The Auditing Committee read its report which was accepted. (See report.)

Moved and seconded we have a standing Resolutions Committee for the year. Carried.

Moved and seconded we have a standing Ways and Means Committee for the year. Carried.

A motion prevailed that the District Superintendent appoint these two standing committees.

The second ballot for the councilmen showed there was no election.

A motion prevailed, the four receiving the highest number of votes be the nominees for the election of one member. The four nominees were Brother Houck, E. E. Connin, Joel Harmon, and F. C. Saneholtz.

The Ways and Means Committee offered Recommendation No. 8. Moved and carried that it be adopted.

Resolution No. 9 was offered. Moved and seconded it be adopted. Amended to read as follows: That each church and Young People's Society take a good, liberal offering to provide for the expense of the delegate, while attending the Annual Assembly.

The balloting declared no election. Moved and seconded the rules be suspended. The four receiving the highest number of votes be elected. F. C. Saneholtz, A. E. Houck, Joel Harmon and E. E. Connin were elected.

The ballots were cast again. The nominees were Brother Osborn, Brother

Greeson, Brother Qualls and Brother C. M. Brown. No election on this ballot. Brother Osborn, Brother Qualls and Brother Brown withdrew. A motion prevailed that Brother Greeson be declared elected.

A motion prevailed that we re-elect the same brethren as members of the District Examining and Educational Board. Carried.

At this time the Assembly took an offering to defray Assembly expenses, the offering amounting to \$79.20. Moved and seconded we adjourn to meet at 6:30 p. m. After singing the chorus of "When We All Get To Heaven," the benediction was pronounced by Brother Paul Greeson.

SIXTH SITTING

Tuesday Evening

The Sixth Sitting was called to order by the Chairman, Rev. L. W. Sturk.

A Memorial Service was conducted in memory of Rev. J. A. Schell who went to Heaven during the past year. The song service was led by Helena Saneholtz. The Secretary led in prayer. Sister Fred Saneholtz then sang "The Pearly White City." Rev. Paul Greeson read a Scripture lesson from Saint John, the fourteenth chapter, from 1 Corinthians, fifteenth chapter and from Revelation, twenty-first chapter.

Brother Harmon then spoke affectionately concerning our departed brother. He mentioned his holy walk here in this evil world. He had fought a good fight and kept the faith and is now with the King.

The following Resolution was unanimously adopted by the Assembly:

Inasmuch as it has pleased Almighty God in wisdom and in love to take from our midst some of our beloved Ministers, we humbly bow our heads and hearts in submission to His Divine Will.

We, as a District, recognize the great loss that we have sustained, and offer a tribute to their memory, for their Godly lives, inspiring messages, and untiring efforts in the Kingdom of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, be it resolved, that the names of our departed brethren be listed in the Minutes annually.

This concluded the Memorial Service. The congregation joined in singing "Down at the Cross." The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved. The names of the Ministers as appear under first, second, and third years, Licentiates were approved and the following were duly received as first year Licensed Ministers, Helen Francis and Ethel Bennett.

Two were received as Deaconesses, Viola Lawrence and Violet Thorn and the other Licensed Deaconesses' names were approved.

The following candidates were approved by the Assembly for Ordination:

Ben Awe, A. W. Corwin, M. C. Kittle, W. E. Manning, Pauline Kernan, and Billy Holstein. Ruth Ditmar to be ordained as a Deaconess. The candidates presented themselves for the Ordination Service. The song "A Charge to Keep I Have" was sung. Prayer was offered by Rev. L. R. Roberts. The song "Rock of Ages" was sung after which Rev. L. R. Roberts read a Scripture Lesson.

Rev. J. O. Emerick followed with a Scriptural Lesson from Titus. The Rev. Joel Harmon followed with a Scripture Lesson from the third chapter of Timothy. Rev. L. W. Sturk delivered the Ordination Address. He very carefully pointed out to the candidates: First, the need of a first rate Christian Experience. He should be a diligent student of God's Word. He should maintain a clean record. He should live above reproach. He should not engage in secular employment, unless absolutely necessary. You are to look after your personal appearance. You are called to be a soul winner. You are to keep the anointing on your heart and life.

The candidates were duly ordained with the laying on of hands.

Moved and seconded that the exact time and program be referred to the District Council and that we are open for invitations now. Amended that Pastors and delegates send invitations after returning home.

Carried that we ask our Pastors to announce now the number of Minutes they desire. Moved and seconded that we have 600 copies printed and they be sold at \$.10 each. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the date of our camp next year be July 31—Aug. 9, and Aug. 10-11 be the Assembly date. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the Statistical Committee complete their work and compile the totals. Moved and seconded that the treasurer rent and bring an adding machine to be used at the next Annual Assembly. Carried. Moved and seconded we extend the time until we get through. Carried.

The following Resolution was adopted:

Inasmuch as the General Board has laid upon us the obligation of \$3.00 per member per annum for General Budget and Foreign Missions; therefore, be it resolved that we heartily accept this obligation and send a portion of this money to the District Treasurer monthly. Carried. Carried that Brother Greeson and the delegates from the Columbus church be excused.

A motion prevailed that those who have business with the Council remain over and meet them in the morning.

Moved and seconded that any matters that might have been omitted by this Assembly be handled by the District Council. Carried. Moved and seconded we adjourn. Carried.

The Assembly stood and sang "Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow." The benediction was pronounced by Rev. L. W. Sturk.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

In making my report for the conference year just passed I am glad that I can truthfully say that it has been a wonderful year in many respects. It has been a year of blessed and unbroken fellowship with our heavenly Father. And He has wonderfully helped me as I have gone up and down the District attending to the affairs of the Kingdom. Also the fellowship with the saints has been indescribably sweet and the entertainment more than one could ask.

With the exception of several weeks of illness I have been busy telling the great, glad story of saving grace, of the marvelous power of our God to keep from day to day and striving to care for the affairs of the District that naturally fall to the lot of the Superintendent.

During the year our good pastors and their people have been greatly helped of the Holy Spirit in their efforts to not only hold the ground already gained but also to extend their boundary lines on many a field of battle. Looking forward and upward I see great prospects for the future and so "I press."

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE ASSEMBLY

No. 1

General Assembly Expenses

Under our present set up our District is entitled to 4 delegates by virtue office, viz., District Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent, District Secretary and District Treasurer. Eleven ministerial delegates and 6 lay delegates. Total 21.

Be it resolved that we adopt a 3 year plan for the payment of General Assembly expenses whereby each local church pay to District Treasurer the equivalent of 21 cents per member over the period of 3 years.

No. 2

District Home Missions

Be it resolved that Sunday Schools take birthday offerings and that all licensed and ordained ministers and deaconesses give in addition to their regular

birthday offering one dollar per annum, the same to be sent monthly to the District Treasurer to be used for District Home Missions.

No. 3

Tent

Because of the great need of tents to do Home Missionary work, be it resolved that each Sunday School give the equivalent of 10 cents per Sunday or \$5.20 per year, the same to be sent quarterly to the District Treasurer.

No. 4

Tithe

Be it resolved, all members generously support the interests of the church by their tithes and offerings, and all gross receipts of the local church, excepting Foreign Missionary funds, Gen. Church Budget, Building fund and Evangelistic support be tithed. The same to be forwarded monthly to the District Treasurer. 70 per cent of which is the support of the District Superintendent. The 30 per cent to be used on the District. The superintendent is to pay his own expenses excepting to District council meetings. All cash offerings received by him are to apply on his support and to be credited on the local church tithe.

No. 5

Tabled.

No. 6

Camp Ground

Inasmuch as no provision has been made to care for the financial obligation of the Camp Ground; be it resolved that we ask the local churches to raise the equivalent of 25 cents per member per annum, the same to be forwarded to the District Treasurer.

No. 7

Salaries

In consideration of the work done by our District Secretary and District Treasurer; be it resolved that we pay the following amounts for the year: District Secretary, \$25.00; District Treasurer, \$100.00.

No. 8

Headquarters' Repairs

In regard to the necessary repairs now in progress at our Headquarters in Indianapolis, Indiana, we recommend that each of our churches in the very near future take a very liberal free will offering and forward the same to the District Treasurer.

No. 9

Assembly Expense

With the ever increasing expense of our District Assembly, we recommend their meals and lodging, the amount to be fixed by the committee in charge, that each visitor **excepting** all ministers and their wives be asked to pay for and not to exceed the charges made during the Camp. Amended—That each Church and Young People's Society take a good, liberal offering to provide for the expense of the delegate while attending Annual Assembly.

REPORT OF RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE ASSEMBLY

1.

Inasmuch as our District is entitled to nine members on the District Council, and has but seven; be it resolved that this Assembly elect nine members.

2.

Inasmuch as it has pleased God in recent years to remove from our midst a number of our ministerial brethren; be it resolved that a committee be appointed by the District Superintendent to secure a list of the names of our beloved dead and that a Memorial of same be placed in the Minutes annually.

3.

Resolved that Resolution No. 2 in our last Minutes relative to borrowed District money be carried over again this year, including money borrowed since that time.

Inasmuch as we are yet in the throes of the depression and many corporations have taken losses, and that several of our churches have District monies borrowed;

Resolved that District Home Missionary money be handled by the District Treasurer; the same as all other money.

c. That we extend a vote of thanks to our District Secretary for his untiring work of the year and also to his assistant for her manifold labors throughout this Assembly.

d. That we express our appreciation to our District Treasurer and his wife for the efficient and splendid manner in which they have taken care of the financial records of the District and the work pertaining thereto.

e. That we recognize the untiring labors of our Statistical Committee in compiling the records for the District.

f. That we thank the Camp Meeting Committee, especially its able president and corps of workers for their efficient and hospitable manner with which they provided for the entertainment of the Camp Meeting and Assembly.

g. We also extend a vote of thanks to the committee who worked so faithfully in the concreting of the dining and lunch stands and to Bro. R. A. Moon who at considerable sacrifice assisted in the same.

h. Inasmuch as our cooks have been faithful and fed the Assembly and Camp so well; be it resolved that we give a vote of thanks to them as well.

i. Above all do we reverently offer thanks to our Heavenly Father for His blessings upon us during the Camp and Assembly.

5.

Inasmuch as the present minister's report must be recopied in order to be in a proper form to present to the publishers for the printing of the Minutes, and in order to eliminate the tedious, tiresome, strenuous work of the Statistical Committee from having to copy word for word every report sent in (minister's, statistical, financial, Sunday School, and Young People's reports); resolved that we mimeograph other report blanks in a paragraph fashion, containing the same material as is on the present report blanks, and that these blanks be sent annually to each minister and evangelist in place of the present report blanks. The above No. 5 was referred to the District Council for action.
