DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the thirty-eighth Conference of the Ohio District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, greetings:

It is through the tender mercies of our wonderful Lord that we are permitted to be gathered. Therefore, we trust our every heart is humbled and submitted to Him so that He may be able to help us accomplish His purpose in our coming together at this time.

The worst war that has ever cursed humanity is now in progress threatening to destroy Christian civilization and our democratic way of life. Hundreds of our people have already been called into the service of our country, many more are being called, and still others will be called.

God's grace and power are given and suited for emergencies and hard places. We dare not, we must not, lower our standards or compromise our doctrines. If we will stand by them in these strenuous times, God will give us a greater place in the reconstruction days after the war.

We have enjoyed a year of friendly co-operation and Christian fellowship, and the results have been shown in revivals, increased attendance and membership, and the greatest financial year of our history. However, the year has not been without its burdens, heartaches and problems, which, without Divine wisdom and strength, we could not have borne.

In watching our evangelists' slates, we have observed that generally they have been kept busy, which speaks well for them, and their reports are not to be ashamed of.

Our missionary interest was stirred by the visitation and ministry of Brother Deal, Miss Slater, and our General Secretary, P. W. Thomas. At heart our people are missionary. They preach, pray and support missions. So far as I know, this District has never until this year succeeded in paying its missionary budget in full. This year we paid it 132%. But of our General Budget we paid only a little more than 72%. We trust next year that our General Budget, too, may be overpaid.

The total receipts were more than 51% over last year. Truly the blessing of the Lord is upon this growing District.

"They that honor me I will Honor." If we were faithful to tithe during depression days, how gladly should we give God His portion in these days of greater prosperity. This is the year we should pay off our individual and congregational debts, and where possible, make improvements and build parsonages. Several of our churches have paid off their indebtedness and burned their mortgages. These churches included Port Clinton, Marion 2nd, Toledo and Springfield 1st. Many others are rapidly cutting their indebtedness down.

We have just closed one of the greatest camp meetings ever conducted on this hill for the depth of spirituality and power for which we praise the Lord.

A new lunch stand was built which met a real need. The camp

the district completely out of debt and all arrangements have been made to build a new tabernacle as soon as government restrictions are lifted.

During the year I have traveled 31,000 miles in the interest of the District; preached 165 times, made more than 300 calls on churches, held 19 Annual Meetings, 129 Board Meetings, attended 12 Young Peoples' Zone Rallies and held two revivals at Williamsport and Dayton churches, had one funeral, three weddings, attended one Ministerial Meeting, one District Superintendent's Meeting and the General Conference, besides many other meetings and duties too numerous to mention, also cared for an ever-increasing volume of mail. I am still saved and sanctified and pressing on, out and up for God.

We dedicated three parsonages and four churches. The parsonages are at Hamilton, Arcanum and Marion 1st. The Churches are Carbondale, Berrysville, Grand Rapids and Sandusky. Many churches have remodeled and redecorated. And, too, we have several lots purchased; plans are drawn for some churches, while some are already under construction. At least four will be ready for dedication within the next few weeks.

The Marion 2nd, Toledo, Elmwood and perhaps other churches, have become self-supporting.

Our Ministerial Meeting in April was one of the greatest ever held for depth of spirit, attendance and state-wide interest.

Churches have been organized this year as follows:

January 18, Sandusky, 30 members, Rev. J. B. Zeits, 620 Reese St., Sandusky, Ohio.

March 15, West Manchester, Rev. W. W. Wilcke, W. Manchester, Ohio.

April 26, "West End" Cincinnati, 16 members, Rev. Irene Remy.

Rev. J. B. Zeits led the forces in Sandusky, they bought property, for church and parsonage and have it on a good working basis financially.

Through the vision, faith and perseverence of Miss Irene Remy, the West End Cincinnati Church has become a reality.

West Manchester church is coming to us through the faithful efforts of Rev. W. W. Wilcke.

As a people, we should band together as one big family and pull as if the only hope of the world were in what we are doing. As a holy people the world is against us, but let us remember, the harder the world presses, the closer to us the Lord walks.

I have tried to be just and fair to all and partial to none.

Journal Of Proceedings

FIRST SITTING

The Thirty-eighth session of the Annual Conference of the Ohio District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:30 A. M. Monday, August 10, 1942, at the Sugar Grove Camp Ground, Springfield, Ohio.

The Conference was opened with the congregational song, "Blessed Assurance," led by Rev. Marcella Dean. The devotional service was led by Rev. C. P. Pridgen, District Superintendent. He read Malachi 3 and gave a brief exhortation to keep our minds stayed on God.

Prayer was offered by Rev. L. R. Roberts, Assistant District Superintendent.

Rev. C. P. Pridgen, District Superintendent, then introduced to the conference, the General Superintendent, Rev. W. L. The motion carried that the time of the Conference Sittings be from 8:30 to 11:30 A. M., from 1:30 to 4:30 P. M. and from 7:30 to 10:00 in the evening.

The District Superintendent's report was read and heartily received by the conference.

The Resolutions Committee then reported.

Resolution No. 1 was declared out of order.

Resolution No. 2 was ignored.

A motion was made and carried to recess until the afternoon sitting. Dismissed with prayer by Rev. Pridgen.

SECOND SITTING

Monday Afternoon

The Conference was opened by singing the hymn, "The Solid Rock," led by Rev. Irene Tanier.

Dr. C. E. Moran then led in prayer.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook, chairman, called the conference to order and the report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

The Treasurer's report was then read and heartily accepted with a rising vote of thanks to the Lord and to the treasurer for his work.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the following delegates into the conference bar, Carried.

The Ways and Means Committee reported. Recommendation No. 6 lost.

A motion was made and seconded that we have the Ministerial meeting Tuesday night until Thursday afternoon, April 20, 21, 22, 1942, Carried. This date was finally made flexible.

An invitation was extended to this Ministerial meeting by the Columbus 1st Church. The motion carried to accept.

Suggestions were made as to the securing of speakers for the program of this Ministerial Meeting. After motions were made and amended the matter of the program was left to the discretion of the Council.

A motion carried that the election of Officers be held at the evening Sitting.

A motion was made and seconded that the Pastors' phone number be entered in the District Minutes. Carried.

A motion was carried that we adjourn. Dismissal by Rev. C. M. Brown.

THIRD SITTING Monday Evening

The Evening Sitting was called to order by the Chairman, Rev. W. L. Surbrook. Rev. Irene Tanier led in the singing of "Amazing Grace." A very sacred spirit prevailed while Rev. L. W. Sturk led in prayer.

The devotional was led by Rev. Wm. Beirnes, who read II Thess. 2 and gave a brief message from the prophetic word and a timely admonition to be ready for the Coming of Christ. "Occupy until I come."

The Roll of Ministers and Lay delegates was then called.

A motion was made and seconded to dispense with the roll call for the remainder of the Session. Carried.

The Minutes were read and approved as corrected.

A motion was made and seconded that the date of the Ministerial Convention be left flexible. Carried.

The recommendation of the District Council concerning the receiving of Licensed Ministers and Deaconesses was read and accepted. These were granted seats in the Conference bar.

Before the election of officers, the Conference engaged in silent prayer for a short time, then was led by Rev. W. L. Surbrook.

A motion carried that the Superintendent appoint tellers. Those appointed were: A. O. Skillings, Edwin Moran, Carl J. Hahn, Wm. Whitmore, A. E. Houck, Albert Hood, Leonard Longfellow and Hurley

Ballots were cast for the District Superintendent. There was no election on the first ballot.

A motion was made and seconded to vote for the two highest. Rev. C. P. Pridgen was elected, but he asked for a time to pray concerning the matter before accepting.

The next ballot was cast for Assistant District Superintendent. There was no election on the first ballot.

A motion carried that we vote for the two receiving the highest number of votes.

Rev. L. R. Roberts was elected.

A motion was made and seconded that we vote for Rev. B. A. Awe for Secretary by acclamation, Carried. He was re-elected.

The motion carried that we extend the time until the election is completed.

The District Council presented three nominations for District Treasurer, O. E. Rutledge, H. E. Osborn and A. O. Skillings.

The ballot declared O. E. Rutledge as District Treasurer.

At this time Rev. C. P. Pridgen gave his decision concerning his accepting the Superintendency. He tenderly admonished us to cooperation and to going forward in the Lord's work.

The ballot was cast for the three additional members to the Council. The results to be read at the next sitting.

A motion was made and seconded that Bro. Marsh be re-elected to the Educational and Examining Board for a period of three years. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that we ask the District Council to appoint the members to serve on the Camp Meeting Board. Carried.

The motion carried that the District Church Extension and Home Missionary Board remain the same as is already established.

It was moved and seconded that A. H. Calliflower succeed himself as trustee for a period of five years.

Rev. C. P. Pridgen, District Superintendent, was then authorized to appoint the standing Resolutions, Ways and Means, Statistical, and Auditing Committees.

On motion the District Superintendent was asked to appoint an Auditing Committee of three members. Carried.

Motion was made and seconded that Rev. L. R. Roberts be reelected as Trustee of Bible Holiness Seminary. Carried.

A motion prevailed that we adjourn until the morning sitting.

Dismissed with prayer by Rev. Pridgen.

FOURTH SITTING

Tuesday Morning

The Sitting was opened by the singing of the hymn, "All the Way My Saviour Leads," led by Rev. Albert Hood.

After requests for prayer were offered, Rev. M. C. Kittle led in

Rev. W. L. Surbrook, the Chairman, gave an inspiring exhortation from I Peter 5. Some of the points which he expressed were: We are partakers of the glory which shall be revealed. All should be subject one to another and be clothed with humility. Feed the flock of God, don't be too hasty in our decisions. The spirit of man touches the spirit of man. Do not administer correction until you are calm. Many of your problems will adjust themselves under the blessing of God, Time will adjust many others.

The minutes of the previous Sitting were read and accepted as corrected.

The results of the election of the additional members to the District Council were: E. E. Connin, Joel Harmon, L. W. Sturk.

Resolution No. 3, which was referred to the committee, was revised and carried.

Resolution No. 6 was referred to the committee for re-drafting.

No. 8 was lost.

The Statistical Report was read and accepted with gratitude to God and to the Committee for his work. This report showed that an average of \$54.22 per member was given this past year.

A motion was made and seconded that Resolution No. 17 of the Ways and Means Committee of 1941 relative to the Camp Ground be amended to read:

In as much as no provision has been made to care for the financial obligation of the camp ground, be it resolved that we ask the local churches to raise the equivalent of twenty-five cents per member per year to be forwarded to the District Treasurer. The same to be applied on the building of a new tabernacle.

Rev. C. P. Pridgen, District Superintendent, announced the standing Committees for the year as follows:

A motion carried to recess until next sitting.

Dismissed by the singing of the "Doxology."

FIFTH SITTING

Tuesday Afternoon

The sitting was opened by singing the hymn, "Hold the Fort," led by Rev. Irene Tanier.

Rev. Bertha Kienbaum led in prayer.

A letter from Rev. Celia M. Bradshaw was read to the Conference. A motion carried that the Conference send Sister Bradshaw greetings.

Rev. C. P. Pridgen gave an inspirational message that the larger churches sponsor and help to support the weaker churches by taking up donations, offerings, and visiting for encouragement.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook, chairman, continued this thought in an in-

spirational exhortation that we encourage our pastors, and he emphasized the fact that we should not be afraid to boost our church.

The Educational and Examining Board reported thirteen ministers to be ordained as follows: W. P. Goodman, G. L. Keene, Watson Goodman, Hurley Hill, Edwin Moran, W. W. Wilcke, Melvin Rickner. Paul Harris, Alonzo Hill, E. E. Boggs, and Paul Lucas. James Myers, Harley Cartright and Harry Hays were accepted on their credentials and received by the Conference as Ordained Ministers.

The list of recommendations for renewal of license was presented, and accepted by the conference.

A motion carried that any matters overlooked should be taken care of by the Council.

It was moved and seconded that 1200 copies of the Minutes be printed and sold at 10 cents each. Carried.

The resolution of Appreciation to workers, officials, and committees was accepted.

The motion carried that the Council read and approve the Minutes that have not yet been approved.

ORDINATION SERVICE

After the candidates were seated, the conference sang "A Charge to Keep I Have," and Rev. Joel Harmon led in prayer.

The Lord's characteristic qualifications of a minister were given by Scripture reading by the following: Rev. B. A. Awe, Titus 3; Rev. L. R. Roberts, II Timothy 4:1-8; and Rev. C. P. Pridgen, I Timothy 3:1-13

Rev. W. L. Surbrook delivered a very inspirational message, emphasizing these standards as are given in the Scripture. (1) The husband of one wife. (2) Be Vigilent. The secret of many a pastor's success is his calling. (3) Be sober. To be serious without sadness. (4) Be of good behavior. "You can grow a pumpkin in a few months, but it takes a lifetime to grow an oak. You can build a reputation in a few years, but it takes a lifetime to build a character." (5) Keep out of debt. (6) Given to hospitality, be courteous, congenial, and not hard to please. (7) Apt to teach, be a student of the word. (8) Given to sound doctrine, declare the whole council of God.

The candidates all knelt at the altar and were duly ordained by the laying on of hands. This ordination was especially honored by the Holy Spirit.

The motion carried that the matter of distributing the District Minutes to the various churches be left to the discretion of the Secretary.

Adjourned on motion.

RULES FOR CAMP MEETING WORKERS

Resolutions relative to Rules and Regulations of Camp Meeting.

No. 1

Resolved that all workers who come to work their way for their board shall, if possible, be members of some Pilgrim Holiness Church and bring recommendations from their pastors.

No 2

Resolved that such workers must come for the interests of the camp and their own spiritual uplift and not for a social time and outing.

No. 3

Resolved that such lady workers must wear dresses with full length sleeves and unbobbed hair.

No. 4

Resolved that all men and boy workers also dress modestly and be of clean habits.

No. 5

Resolved that all such workers, when possible, must attend services and not be lounging about on the grounds or off the grounds.

No. 6

Resolved that all such workers must report to the Camp Management, president, or to the one in charge of them, before leaving the ground or place of work.

No. 7

Resolved that all platform workers be fully dressed, without bobbed hair and without jewelry, meeting all other requirements of the Manual.

No. 8

Resolved that each pastor must instruct each worker in reference to these rules before coming.

No. 9

Resolved that the workers who become unwilling to be subordinate to these rules become subject to dismissal at once.

No. 10

Resolved that no person under 14 years of age be engaged to work during Camp and Conference.

No 11

Resolved that only members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, in good standing, are permitted to work their way through Camp Meeting.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS ACCEPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

No. 1

District Superintendent's Salary

Be is resolved that the District Superintendent's salary for the coming year be \$2400, with an allowance of \$600 for traveling expenses.

No. 2

District Treasurer's Salary

Inasmuch as the duties of the District Treasurer have increased with rising finances, be it resolved that his salary be \$300 per year.

No. 3

District Secretary's Salary

Be it resolved that the District Secretary's salary be \$100.

No. 4

Statistician's Salary

Be it resolved that the Statistician's salary be \$50.

No. 5

Education Committee and Expenses

Be it resolved that the Education Committee's salary be \$35 each per year.

No. 6

General Conference Expense

Be it resolved that we raise 10 cents per member per year to take care of General Conference Expense.

No. 7

Housing Facilities

Be it resolved that we set before the people our need of housing facilities on the Camp Ground and we urge them to build their own cottages under the supervision of the District Council.

No. 8

Church Extension Loans

Inasmuch as many of our churches are struggling to enlarge and improve our buildings, be it resovled that our Church Extension Board loan from their funds, at 6 percent interest, such loans not to exceed 5 years.

No. 9

Camp Meeting Expense for Workers

Be it resolved that we authorize our Camp Meeting Committee to charge not more than ten cents per night for lodging to workers and this be left to the discretion of the committee.

No. 10

Bathing Facilities

Inasmuch as we have no bathing facilities on the Camp Ground, be it therefore resolved that plans be made for shower bath equipment before next camp.

No. 11

Pastoral Duties

Resolved that no preacher be privileged to pastor a Pilgrim Holiness Church of this District until he has promised to include the various financial activities of the District in the program of his local church.

No. 12

General Budget

Be it resolved that we request the General Board to send a deputation worker to visit our local churches and assist the pastors in raising Ditrict Home Missionary and General Budget funds.

No. 13

District Home Missions

Be it resolved that fifty cents per member in addition to all birthday offerings be raised annually to constitute our District Home Missionary Fund.

No. 14

Tithe

Be it resolved that all persons generously support the interests of the church by their tithes and offerings, and that all gross receipts of the local church excepting foreign missionary funds, district home missionary funds, general church budget, and evangelistic support, be tithed; the same to be forwarded to the District Treasurer.

No. 15

Bible School Trustee Expense

Be it resolved that the District Treasurer shall pay from the District funds the fare of the Ohio Bible Holiness Seminary Trustees to and from Trustee meeting.

No. 16

Camp Ground

Inasmuch as no provision has been made to care for the financial obligation of the camp ground, be it resolved that we ask the local

churches to raise the equivalent of twenty-five cents per member per year to be forwarded to the District Treasurer. The same to be applied on the building of a new tabernacle.

No. 17

Foreign Missions

We recommend that the General Foreign Missions and the General Budget be raised monthly in the Sunday School or Church, taking any Sunday thought best for the offering.

No. 18

District Conference Expense

We recommend that all visitors attending the District Conference be charged a reasonable sum for meals, the price to be set by the committee in charge. This does not apply to ministers nor their wives. Amendment—that each church and Young Peoples' Society take a good liberal offering to provide for the expense of the delegate while attending the Annual Conference.

No. 19

Division of General Budget

We recommend that the Manual provision for the division of the General Budget be adopted: \$1.90 for foreign missions; \$.60 for general home missions; and \$.50 to administrative costs. "If the local church does not properly divide the money, the District Treasurer is authorized to do so."—Sec. 127, Par. 12. "No church is permitted to specify funds until its monthly quota for General interests is paid.

No. 20

Y. P. S. Finance

Be it resolved that all the young people shall be urged to place all their tithe in their own local church, in the usual way. All money sent the Y. P. S. District Treasurer must be over and above their tithe.

That each Young People's zone or area contribute the amount equivalent to \$13.00 per church or society annually—\$10.00 of said amount to be sent to the District Church Treasurer for the Young People's State Rally expense; \$3.00 of same amount to be forwarded to the Young Peoples' District Treasurer for the publishing of monthly paper, subscriptions to religious periodicals, stationary, stamps, incidental expense, etc.

Payment to be made monthly, the same to be raised at the discretion of the individual zone.

The maximum sum to be held by the District Young Peoples' Treasurer at any time shall not exceed \$40.00. At such time as \$40.00 is on hand, not less than \$15.00 shall be forwarded to the District Treasurer of the church, the same to be disposed of at the discretion of the District Council.

No. 21

District Superintendent's Traveling Expense

If any church calls the District Superintendent for more than his regular visits during the Conference year, the church calling him is required to pay the actual expense of such trips.

No. 22

Offering for Bible Holiness Seminary

Resolved that we adopt the method as presented by a representative from Bible Holiness Seminary, that we take second offering in the Sunday School the third Sunday of each month, for Bible Holiness Seminary.

No. 23

Provision for Camp

Resolved that each local church be asked to bring the District Camp provisions or an offering to alleviate the financial obligations of the camp.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

No. 1

Report Blanks

Be it resolved that report blanks be sent to all pastors, evangelists, and deaconesses by July 15. That all reports of the same be sent to the Statistician by July 25. If any pastor, evangelist, or deaconess fails to send this report by August 1, they must answer to the District Council and give reason why they failed to do so.

No. 2

Complimentary Meal Tickets

Due to the great amount of complimentary meal tickets given annually, be it resolved that everyone receiving such ticket, be subject to the call of the authorities managing the work of the camp, for various kinds of work which needs to be done during camp and conference.

No. 3

Rooms

Be it resolved that the Secretary of the Camp will not reserve rooms for anyone after July 15, unless it has been paid for on or before said date. After said date, all unengaged rooms will be subject to the management.

No. 4

We recommend that all matters of salaries of District officers be settled before the election of officers, inasmuch as it is embarrassing to discuss these matter after election.

No. 5

Resolved that every church in the Ohio District grant, its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay, if the pastor so desires.

No. 6

Part 1. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent, the District Zone Chairmen, the District Young Peoples' Secretary, the District Young Peoples' Treasurer, and the Editor of the District Young Peoples' paper constitute a District Young Peoples' Committee. That

the District Superintendent be the chairman of said committee.

Part 2. Be it resolved that said committee meet once every three months.

Part 3. Be it resolved that the Zone Chairmen's expenses be met by the zone he or she represents and the other members be paid out of the Young Peoples' District Treasury.

No. 7

Resolved that all who furnish their own rooms at camp furnish their own linen and all others who can.

No. 8

Resolved that the District Council see that several signs are made and erected to advertise the Camp Meeting next year, one large sign to be erected across State Route 40 at the entrance of the Camp Ground.

No. 9

Resolved that the Conference year end July 15, and the Treasurer's Books close July 20, and all churches, in order to get their credit, must have their moneys in by that date.

No. 10

Only active and associate members of local Young Peoples' societies and young people in our churches shall be invited to attend, with free entertainment, our State Young Peoples' Convention. Only active members are permitted to yote in the business meeting.

No. 11

The District Treasurer shall send a statement to all churches that are in arrears with their budgets six weeks prior to the close of the conference year.

No. 12

Each church is requested to erect at its place of worship the name of the church and the name and address of the pastor.

No. 13

The District Council shall appoint two or more ladies to act as matrons in the girls' dormitory, and two or more men to act as deans in the boys' dormitory, during the Young Peoples' Rally and District Camp Meeting.

No. 14

Our Camp Meeting Evangelist shall preach Thursday night at Young Peoples' Annual Rally, as well as Friday night, that the young people may have the advantage of such ministry.

No. 15

That all money raised in the local church for District or General budget be sent by the local church treasurer directly to the District Treasurer, so the local church may receive due credit.

No. 16

Because of the necessity of the pastors and others getting in personal touch with the District Superintendent, be it therefore resolved that the District Superintendent have a telephone, the same to be paid for from District funds.

No. 17

Be it resolved that the District Treasurer have cards printed designating what each church is required to raise for the District and General interests, and the cards be forwarded to each pastor as soon after the Conference as possible.

No. 18

Be it resolved:

- a. That we extend to our General Superintendent a vote of thanks for his Christ like spirit and labors, and the efficient manner in which he has conducted the business of this conference.
- b. That we extend a vote of thanks to our beloved District Superintendent for the spirit of sacrifice, his labors and heartfelt example set before the church as he has journeyed throughout the District the past year.
- c. That we extend a vote of thanks to our District Secretary for his untiring work of the year, and also to his assistants for their manifold labors throughout the Conference.
- d. That we express our appreciation to our District Treasurer and his wife for the efficient and splendid manner in which they have taken care of the financial records of the District and the work pertaining thereto.
- e. That we recognize the untiring labors of our Statistical Committee in compiling the records of the District.
- f. That we thank the Camp Meeting Committee, especially its able Chairman and corps of workers, for the efficient and hospitable manner with which they provided for the entertainment of the Camp Meeting and Conference.
- g. Inasmuch as our cooks have been faithful and fed the Conference and Camp so well, be it resolved that we give them a vote of thanks, as well.
- h. That we extend a vote of thanks to our Educational and Examining Board for their labors throughout the year.
- i. Above all do we reverently offer thanks to our Heavenly Father for His blessing upon us during the Camp and Conference.
