DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

To the fortieth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Churches of Ohio, greetings:

It is with a feeling of humble gratitude to our Heavenly Father that we assemble at this time to transact the business incident to the carrying on of the work of the church entrusted to our care. It is only natural that we take a retrospective view over the past year. From the political and international standpoint this has been a year of tragic happenings. Wars have been fought and won; kingdoms have arisen and fallen; political changes of such momentous consequences have come which will so effect the way of life in the future that the world will never be again as it has been in the past. Individual initiative and liberty so long cherished by free men, apparently, is almost a thing of the past. It may be that the golden sun of this great dispensation, is about to set, and that these tremendous changes are only the prelude to greater changes which will be the forerunners of the time of trouble referred to in the Word. While the prospects of a quick finish to this horrible war brings much relief to many, there are some who have received a sting which will remain until the morning of the resurrection. Millions will never return to home and loved ones again.

We have gone forward during the past year in much prayer and tearful waiting upon the Lord for His direction in our work of supervising the church. We have felt over and over again that we must lean hard on the strong arm of Christ and depend upon Him for wisdom in all things.

HOME MISSIONARY PROJECTS

The past year has been an unusual one in this field. By the help of the Lord and the aid of the good brethren 10 new projects have been opened.

BOWLING GREEN was opened in the early fall. A fine building was secured in the very heart of this fine northern Ohio City, and Brother D. A. Stuckey took hold of the work. There have been some battles, and today the work is not entirely successful, but there has been much faithful labor on the part of our good brother and Sister Stuckey, and we hope for better things in the future.

LOUDENVILLE was opened through the faithful efforts of Brother and Sister L. F. Knight. He rented a building and in full confidence in the Lord's ability, launched the work. God has blessed this work with several good revivals, and today we have a PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH in Loudenville with several fine, loyal Pilgrims standing by the work.

WHEELERSBURG church came to us through the efforts of Rev. Roy C. Hill. This has been an established work for some few years, but Brother Hill and the saints at Wheelersburg have realized the importance of giving the work a more permanent aspect, and this good work has become a fully organized church.

BELLEFONTAINE. Some few months ago a mission was opened in this good central Ohio city. Through the faithful efforts of Brother Clayton Coulter this work has been carried on. Brother Coulter is a member of Lima Second Church. Entirely at his own expense and effort he has carried the work forward, and we look to the day when we shall have an organized work in Bellefontaine.

MECHANICSBURG. In the late fall Brother William Loy, under burden for a work in this little city, not far distant from Springfield, opened this work. He went forward at once with a building project. A well located lot was purchased, and today we have a building, and a good prospect there.

PERRYSBURG. This work came into being through the efforts of Rev. Brown of Toledo and one of his good licensed ministers of the church, Rev. Dale Jones. Here we organized with seven members. There is a good mission building well located and a very good prospect in one of the cleanest little cities in Ohio up on the banks of the Maumee River.

GALION. It is through the faithful labors of Rev. Albert Hood this work came into being. Brother Hood has gone forward with the assistance of a fine young lad who has been present in this camp and conference. A good mission building has been secured and we hope for good things in Galion in the future.

NEW MAIMI. This new project comes through the faithful efforts of a good member of our Hamilton church, Brother Schell. Brother Schell reports a very good prospect and much encouragement in the work thus far. This work is one of the newest in the District, and we feel there is a good future for it. Rev. Lundy Hill has contributed much to the success of this work also.

HILLSBORO. Sister Amy West is largely to be credited with the success of this new project. Through the long hard winter she carried on in a little upstairs building. Then a fine theatre building was offered for the work. A very good revival has been conducted with the Stuckey Sisters, Sr. Williams and Miss Jacobs and Miss Lewis as workers. This is a promising field, and we expect to hear a good report as Sr. West goes on with the work.

CO-OPERATION

The Lord has given the Ohio District the best council that could be hoped for. These Godly men have planned together for the best interests of the work of the church. They have labored in perfect unity throughout the year. There has not been a single disagreement among us during the year. We praise God for this. The pastors have co-operated in the most pleasing manner. They have opened their homes to us and in every possible way treated us with kindness of a brother. The excellent spirit in this camp will attest the fellowship among the laymen of the District.

Many of our new projects are making excellent progress. Our Zanesville work has doubled within the past year. Our work at Bremen is succeeding splendidly under the able leadership of Rev. Appleman and Rev. Goss. Our work at North Bend has doubled within a year under the direction of Sister Cora Reynolds.

IMPROVEMENTS AND DEBTS

Our churches have made wonderful progress within the past year in paying off old debts and generally improving their properties.

New parsonages have been purchased at LANCASTER, ARCANUM, DANVILLE and COLUMBUS FIRST.

LOTS for new parsonages have been provided at the following places—WILLIAMSPORT, LEIPSIC, MURRAY CITY and MANSFIELD. CHURCH buildings are in process of construction at DESHLER and GOOD HOPE.

Debts have been cancelled on the following churches—Cincinnati First, Dayton First, Dayton Second, Piqua, Port Clinton and Bremen.

Mortgages have been paid off on parsonages at the following places—SPRINGFIELD FIRST, NELSONVILLE, SANDUSKY, and MT. ORAB. Major improvements have been made at Jackson church, St. Marys, Mason, Beulah, Elmwood, New Marshfield, and Circleville and New Madison. Most of these improvements are in the way of furnishings or new roofs, heating systems, etc.

FINANCE AND GAINS

This year has surpassed all the past in finance. The report of our statistician will reveal an increase of \$23,151.58 in our pastors salaries the past year over last year. The Sunday Schools of the District have made a net gain of 437. The District Treasurer has taken in ——— against ——— for last year. Sixty-four of our churches have paid over 90% of their budgets. Our membership will show a gain this year. This gain in spite of the fact that we have consistently urged our pastor to drop from their rolls names of members for many years delinquent. We have dropped from our rolls 197 such delinquents.

PERSONAL REPORT

We have given our heart and soul to the work of the district this past year. The winter was very hard and traveling very difficult, but through the help of the Lord and the strength given by Him we have kept going, and only once were we forced to cancel an engagement because of winter storms. Although allowed two weeks for rest during the year we have not seen fit to take this time off.

The forty-first annual conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Ohio District convened at 8:30 a.m. Monday, August 13, 1945 at the Sugar Grove Camp Grounds, Springfield, Ohio. Following the camp, at which time the Spirit was graciously outpoured upon the saints, and His power was manifested in the salvation of souls.

The session was opened with a call to prayer by our District Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk. Again the presence of the Lord was greatly manifested and a tender unity of the Spirit was noted. Following the congregational singing of "How Firm a Foundation," Rev. Sturk gave a brief exhortation on prayer. He admonished us to keep our reception for prayer clear; have nothing between our soul and the Saviour. Little things can close the channel of prayer. In closing he said we are not fit to do business for the Lord unless our motives are pure.

After prayer, Rev. L. W. Sturk presented our General Superintendent, Rev. W. L. Surbrook who was given a hearty welcome by the conference. Bro. Surbrook gave a brief report concerning the work of the different conferences, after which he read from I. Tim. 4 and gave an inspiring message concerning the practical matters with which pastors have to deal. He chose for his text Moffat's translation of the 16th verse which reads, "Watch yourself, watch your teaching, and stick to your work." He mentioned our worship, our work, and our worth. One must be of sterling worth to be a minister of the Gospel. We should have a wholesome spirit of welcome in our church services. He outlined several practical suggestions for the ministerial workers.

Rev. A. H. Wilson, a member of the General Board, and Rev. L. A. Roberts, Assistant Superintendent, were invited to sit on the platform during the conference.

After the roll call of the ministers, deaconesses, and lay delegates several delegates were authorized by the conference to act in the absence of the regular delegate.

The motion carried that the conference bar constitute the platform and the entire tabernacle with the exception of the corner to the left, which was reserved for visitors.

The motion carried that the time of the Conference Sittings be 8:30 to 11:30 a.m., 2:00 to 5:00 p.m., and 7:30 to 10:00 in the evening.

The motion carried that Rev. R. W. Chatfield replace Rev. W. L. Fisher on the Resolutions Committee.

The Committees were complete as standing.

Ways and Means Committee—H. E. Hill, Charles Hook, B. H. Lucas, Gordon Baumgardner, R. P. Baumgardner.

Auditing Committee—Mrs. H. C. Walker, Helena Sanholtz, Fylenea Beard.

Statistical Committee—Albert M. Hood.

The District Superintendent's report was read and received with a cheery "Amen".

The motion carried that we extend the time twenty minutes.

The statistical report was read by Rev. Albert Hood and was accepted in gratitude with a rising vote of thanks.

This motion carried that we recess until 1:15.

Dismissed with prayer by Bro. Wilson.

Sis. P. F. Elliot and Rev. J. A. Fields were granted honorary seats in the conference bar.

The motion carried that the District Superintendent appoint three tellers to retire from the conference bar to count the ballots cast for the additional Council members.

A motion was made that we have a 10 minute recess. (Carried).

After this brief recess, E. E. Connin led in prayer, after which the secretary gave the District Council's report concerning the Educational Board nominations. E. E. Marsh was renominated for a period of three years, W. L. Fisher was nominated to fill the unexpired term of Rev. Carl Hahn, 1 year. These members were elected by acclamation.

Rev. E. E. Connin was reelected by acclamation for a period of five years to succeed himself as District Trustee.

A motion carried to postpone the election of the trustee of Bible Holiness Seminary until a matter concerning the school is discussed.

A motion carried that the Council nominate thirty actively engaged ministers from which the fifteen ministerial delegates to the General Conference shall be elected.

A motion was made that the fifteen persons receiving the highest number of votes shall act as delegates and the remaining fifteen shall act as alternates in the order of the number of votes received. (Carried).

A motion carried that the District Council be authorized to submit the names of eighteen competent lay members from which the nine lay delegates to the General Conference shall be elected.

Ballots were cast for the ministerial delegates to the General Conference.

Dismissed by expiration of time.

SECOND SITTING

Monday Afternoon

The second sitting was opened with Rev. W. L. Surbrook presiding. Rev. R. Wingrove Ives led the congregation in singing "The Inner Circle." After a number of special requests were made, Rev. R. D. Brown led in prayer.

Rev. Sturk presented four new churches which were accepted by the conference. They are as follows:

Recommendation No. 3 carried.

Recommendation No. 4 carried as amended.

Recommendation No. 5 carried.

Recommendation No. 6 was referred to the Council.

The Resolutions Committee then reported.

Resolution No. 1 was referred to the Committee for redrafting.

A motion was made that we proceed with the election of officers. (Carried).

Bro. Sturk appointed the following as tellers: A. E. Houck, Keith Krockner, Norval Rickner, John Dean, Albert Hood, Ray Sturch, and Melroy Ward. Melvin Stiverson.

Rev. L. W. Sturk was overwhelmingly elected on the first ballot as District Superintendent. Bro. Sturk gave a few words of appreciation for the vote of the conference, after which Sis. Sturk gave her testimony and together they sang "Sweeter Than Them All."

A motion carried that Sis. Sturk be seated within the conference bar and to be granted all privileges of same.

The ballots were cast for Assistant District Superintendent. Rev. L. R. Roberts was overwhelmingly elected. He cheerfully accepted the office.

A motion was made to reelect the District Secretary by acclamation. (Carried). Rev. B. A. Awe was reelected unanimously.

A motion to reelect Rev. O. E. Rutledge as District Treasurer by acclamation carried. He received unanimous vote.

THIRD SITTING

Monday Evening

The conference was called to order by Rev. Surbrook. The congregation joined in singing "Where He Leads I'll Follow," led by Sis. Saneholtz.

A motion carried that we dispense with the roll call.

Minutes of the previous sittings were read and approved after a slight correction. Melvin Stiverson's name was previously omitted from the list of tellers.

Nominees for lay delegates to the General Conference were presented and the vote cast. The superintendent excused six tellers to count the ballots.

A report was read by C. M. Brown concerning the Home Missionary Extension Fund. The conference gave Bro. Brown a rising vote of thanks for his untiring services as treasurer of this department. Bro. Brown expressed his desire to resign from this office because of failing health. This vacancy will be filled at the discretion of the Council.

A motion was made and seconded that the District pay the amount we owe Bro. Roberts for his services that were rendered when he was District Superintendent, at which time there was lack of funds in the treasury. This matter was referred to the Council.

The General Conference Memorials Committee then reported:

The Resolutions Committee then reported.

A motion was made and carried to extend the time 30 minutes.

Resolution No. 3 was referred to the committee for redrafting.

Resolution No. 4 was referred to the committee for redrafting.

The results of the ballot for lay delegates to the General Conference were read. Those elected were as follows: Margaret Jones, Alice Higgins, Robert McCoppin, F. W. Overman, A. H. Colliflower, C. Ward, Joel Beery, George Ulery, Roland House. Alternates are: George Delk, Ida Van Horn, Floyd Walker, V. L. Deckrosh, Wm. Jackson, Duff McNew, A. E. White, H. Flougher, J. Irby.

In closing the congregation sang the Doxology and were dismissed with prayer by Bro. Roberts.

FOURTH SITTING

Tuesday Morning

The conference was called to order by Rev. L. W. Sturk who led the congregation in singing "Glory to Jesus." He then admonished the saints to keep well anointed with the Spirit. This was followed by a season of prayer.

Rev. Surbrook continued his message concerning the work and worth of the ministers. He mentioned that a man's worth depends upon the type of person which he is. "He that winneth souls is wise." He said consecration means we are God's first, last and always. At the close of this message the congregation joined in singing "When the Saints Go Marching In," and showers of blessing fell upon the conference.

Rev. Paul Elliott was invited to sit on the platform.

Rev. Sturk then read the names of the Young People's Zone Chairmen and other committees which had been appointed.

Announcements were made and a motion carried to recess until 2:00.

Dismissed with prayer by Rev. Awe.

FIFTH SITTING

Tuesday Afternoon

The conference was called to order by Bro. Surbrook. The congregation sang "O How I Love Jesus." Prayer was offered by Joseph Brown.

Bro. Sturk again presented the plan of re-zoning the Owosso Bible School. After considerable discussion of the matter, a motion was made and seconded that we postpone action until some future date. (Carried).

A motion carried that we re-elect Bro. Pridgen as trustee to Owosso Bible School by acclamation.

A motion was made and carried that we authorize Bro. C. M. Brown to retain \$50 for his services rendered as treasurer of the Church Extension Fund.

The General Conference Memorials Committee reported:

Resolution No. 10 carried.

Resolution No. 11 carried.

The Ways and Means Committee reported:

Recommendation No. 7 carried.

The Council presented recommendations for licensed and ordained ministers and one deaconess. A motion carried that these credentials be granted.

It was moved and carried that the number of minutes to be printed be left to the discretion of the Council.

Bro. Paul Elliott then made an announcement concerning the next Sunday School Rally which is to be held October 7.

Moved and carried that the District Council read and approve the last sitting of the minutes.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

Resolution No. 5, a vote of thanks was accepted cheerfully.

A brief but sacred ordination service followed. Rev. John Sturk led the congregation in singing "A Charge To Keep I Have." Prayer was offered by Rev. B. A. Awe. Rev. Joel Harman, Rev. L. R. Roberts and Rev. L. W. Sturk read scripture pertaining to the marks and certifications of the ministry. The candidates for the Ministry, Earl Wachenschwanz, W. F. Crum, Amos Hoover and Nota Higgins, deaconess, were duly ordained by the laying on of hands by the Council members.

In closing, the congregation joined in singing "What a Friend We Have In Jesus."

Pastoral arrangements were then read by Rev. L. W. Sturk.

A motion was made and carried that the matter of time and place of the ministerial convention be left in the hands of the District Council.

A motion was made and carried to have the Council take care of any unfinished business.

A beautiful spirit of harmony was sensed throughout the entire camp and conference.

RULES FOR CAMP MEETING WORKERS

Resolutions relatives to Rules and Regulations of Camp Meeting.

No. 1

Resolved that all workers who come to work their way for their board shall, if possible, be members of some Pilgrim Holiness Church and bring recommendations from their pastors.

No. 2

Resolved that such workers must come for the interests of the camp and their own spiritual uplift and not for a social time and outing.

No. 3

Resolved that such workers must wear dresses with full length sleeves and unbobbed hair.

No. 4

Resolved that all men and boy workers also dress modestly and be of clean habits.

No. 5

Resolved that all such workers, when possible, must attend services and not be lounging about on the ground or off the grounds.

No. 6

Resolved that all such workers must report to the Camp Management, president, or to the one in charge of them, before leaving the ground or place of work.

No. 7

Resolved that all platform workers be fully dressed, without bobbed hair and without jewelry, meeting all other requirements of the Manual.

No. 8

Resolved that each pastor must instruct each worker in reference to these rules before coming.

**REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS
ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE**

No. 1

Withdrawal

Be it resolved that resolution No. 10 be expunged from our minutes.

No. 2

Housing Facilities

Inasmuch as our treasurer's report shows that there is \$4,500 surplus in the Tithe fund, be it resolved that we set aside \$2,500 for the creation of a fund toward a district parsonage. The same ratio to apply the coming fiscal year.

No. 3

Home Missions

Be it resolved that one dollar per member in addition to all birthday offerings be raised annually to constitute our District Home Missionary Fund.

No. 4

District Superintendent's Salary

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent's salary for the coming year be \$3,700 with an allowance of 5c per mile for traveling expenses together with parsonage.

No. 5

District Treasurer's and Secretary's Salary

Be it resolved that the District Treasurer's salary be \$600 and the District Secretary's salary be \$300.

No. 6

Insurance

We recommend that the District Council be requested to have our District Treasury insured.

No. 7

Minutes

Because of the increase in the expense of printing, be it resolved that the price of the District Minutes be 25c per copy, the same to be paid for 30 days after received.

No. 8

Remuneration for Labors

We recommend that the District Council be requested to properly remunerate every person who has by labor or service helped to prepare our grounds and to carry on the camp so far as reason and consistency would permit.

No. 9

Young People's Expense

Be it resolved that all the young people shall be urged to place all their tithe in their own local church, in the usual way. All money sent the Y.P.S. District Treasurer must be over and above their tithe.

That each Y.P. zone contribute the amount equivalent to \$13.00 per church or society annually—\$10.00 of said amount to be sent to the District Church Treasurer for the Y.P. State Rally Expense, \$3.00 of same amount to be sent by the local Y.P. Treasurer to the District Y. P. Treasurer for the publishing of monthly paper, subscriptions to religious periodicals, stationery, stamps, incidental expense, etc.

Payment to be made monthly, the same to be raised at the discretion of the individual zone.

No. 10

Statistician's Salary

Be it resolved that the Statistician's salary be \$50.

No. 11

Education Committee and Expenses

Be it resolved that the Educational Committee's salary be \$50.00 per member per year.

No. 12

Auditing of Treasurer's Books

Be it resolved that we employ a certified public accountant to audit the books of the District Treasurer. The audit to be made after the books have been closed on July 20, and prior to the convening of the District Conference.

No. 13

General Conference Expense

Be it resolved that we raise 10 cents per member per year to take care of General Conference Expense.

No. 14

Housing Facilities

Be it resolved that we set before the people our need of housing facilities on the Camp Ground and we urge them to build their own cottages under the supervision of the District Council.

No. 15

Church Extension Loans

Inasmuch as many of our churches are struggling to enlarge and improve our buildings, be it resolved that our Church Extension Board loan from their funds, at 6 per cent interest, such loans not to exceed 5 years.

No. 16

Camp Meeting Expense for Workers

Be it resolved that we authorize our Camp Meeting Committee to charge not more than ten cents per night for lodging to workers and this be left to the discretion of the committee.

No. 17

Pastoral Duties

Resolved that no preacher be privileged to pastor a Pilgrim Holiness Church of this District until he has promised to include the various financial activities of the District in the program of his local Church.

No. 18

General Budget

Be it resolved that we request the General Board to send a deputation worker to visit our local churches and assist the pastors in raising District Home Missionary and General Budget funds.

Tithe**No. 19**

Be it resolved that all persons generally support the interests of the church by their tithes and offerings, and that all gross receipts of the local church excepting foreign missionary funds, district home missionary funds, general church budget, and evangelistic support, and building funds, be tithed, the same to be forwarded to the District Treasurer.

No. 20**Bible School Trustee Expense**

Be it resolved that the District Treasurer shall pay from the District funds the fare of the Bible Holiness Seminary Trustees from Ohio, to and from trustee meetings.

No. 21**Camp Ground**

Inasmuch as no provision has been made to care for financial obligation of the camp ground, be it resolved that we ask the local churches to raise the equivalent of 25 cents per member per year to be forwarded to the District Treasurer. The same to be applied on the building of a new Tabernacle.

No. 22**General Budget**

We recommend that the General Budget be raised monthly in the Sunday School or Church, taking any Sunday thought best for the offering.

No. 23**District Conference Expense**

We recommend that all visitors attending the District Conference be charged a reasonable sum for meals, the price to be set by the committee in charge. This does not apply to ministers nor their wives. Amendment—that each church and Young People's Society take a good liberal offering to provide for the expense of the delegate while attending the Annual Conference.

No. 24**Division of the General Budget**

We recommend that the Manual provision for the division of the General Budget be adopted. \$1.90 for foreign missions; \$.60 for general home missions and \$.50 to administrative costs. "If the local church does not properly divide the money, the District Treasurer is authorized to do so."—Sec. 127, Par. 12, "No church is permitted to specify funds until its monthly quota for General interests is paid."

No. 25**District Superintendent's Traveling Expense**

If any church calls the District Superintendent for more than his regular visits during the Conference year, the church calling him is required to pay the actual expense of such trips.

No. 26**Offering for Bible Holiness Seminary**

Resolved that we adopt the method as presented by a representative from Bible Holiness Seminary, that we take second offering in the Sunday School the third Sunday of each month for Bible Holiness Seminary.

Provision for Camp**No. 27**

Resolved that each local church be asked to bring the District provisions or an offering to alleviate the financial obligations of the camp.

**REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED
BY THE CONFERENCE**

No. 1

Educational Requirements

We recommend in order to save the Educational and Examining Board a great deal of time and labor that our licensed ministers in so far as possible take the correspondence course leading to ordination from Owosso or some other school approved by the Educational Committee.

No. 2

Ministerial Benefit

Be it resolved that each local church or charge in the Ohio District shall enroll its pastor and wife in the Ministerial Benefit Association and pay from the local treasury their membership and call fees, also that it shall be the duty of the pastor to turn over to the church board each call as it is presented to him, the District Secretary to notify the churches with application blank.

No. 3

Be it resolved that an Annual Sunday School convention be held in each Zone, the same to be under the supervision of the District Superintendent. Furthermore that the District Sunday School Committee shall appoint committees in the various zones of the District to work under the supervision of the District Superintendent.

No. 4

Whereas the Manual provides that our people pay their tithes into the church in which they hold their membership—therefore we strongly urge that the matter be called to the attention of our people who wish to move to other communities.

No. 5

Report blanks shall be sent to all licensed, and ordained ministers, and deaconesses by July 15. That all reports of the same be sent to Statistician by July 25. If any fail to send this report by August 1, he must answer to the District Council and give reasons why he failed to do so.

No. 6

Be it resolved that all officers receiving a salary for said office, when necessary to have assistance to care for their work, shall select help only from those already holding complimentary tickets or pay for the needed help during camp and conference out of his own salary.

No. 7

We recommend that all matters of salaries of District officers be settled before the election of officers, inasmuch as it is embarrassing to discuss these matters after election.

No. 8

Be it resolved that all who rent rooms or a cot at Camp furnish their own linen.

No. 9

Resolved that congregations be encouraged to conduct Daily Vacation Bible School in their churches.

No. 10

Resolved that every church in the Ohio District grant its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay, if the pastor so desires.

No. 11

Whereas there is a growing need for concerted effort in our District with respect to Sunday School work, the General Sunday School Committee recommends that the District conferences provide for a District Sunday School Committee or Board to promote Sunday School interests in the District, and to cooperate with the General Committee. We further recommend that said committee or board be appointed by the District Council, and that the District Superintendent be a member of said board.

No. 12

Resolved that the Conference Year end July 15, and the Treasurer's books close July 20, and all churches, in order to get their credit, must have their moneys in by that date.

No. 13

Only active and associate members of local Young Peoples' societies and young people in our churches shall be invited to attend, with free entertainment, our State Young Peoples' Convention. Only active members are permitted to vote in the business meeting.

No. 14

The District Treasurer shall send a statement to all churches that are in arrears with their budgets six weeks prior to the close of the conference year.

No. 15

Each church is requested to erect at its place of worship the name of the church and the name and address of the pastor.

No. 16

The District Council shall appoint two or more ladies to act as matrons in the girls' dormitory, and two or more men to act as deans in the boys' dormitory, during the Young People's Rally and the District Camp Meeting.

No. 17

That all money raised in the local church for District or General budget be sent by the local church treasurer directly to the District Treasurer, so the local church may receive due credit.

No. 18

Because of the necessity of the pastors and others getting in personal touch with the District Superintendent, be it therefore resolved that the District Superintendent have a telephone, the same to be paid for from District Funds.

No. 19

Be it resolved that the District Treasurer have cards printed designating what each church is required to raise for the District and General interests, and the cards be forwarded to each pastor as soon after the Conference as possible.

No. 20

Be it resolved that District Superintendent, the District Young People's Secretary, the District Young People's Treasurer and the Editor of the District Young People's paper constitute a District Young People's committee. That the District Superintendent be the chairman of said committee.

No. 21

Be it resolved:

A. That we extend to our General Superintendent, a vote of thanks for his Christ-like spirit and labors, and the efficient manner in which he has conducted the business of this conference.

B. That we extend to our District Superintendent a vote of thanks for his untiring labors and spirit of sacrifice during this conference.

C. Also that we extend a vote of thanks to the District Secretary, District Treasurer, Statistical Committee, Camp Meeting Committee, the Educational and Examining Board, the cooks, and all others who have helped in any way to make the camp and conference the success and blessing that it has been.

D. Above all do we reverently offer thanks to our Heavenly Father for His blessing upon us during the Camp and Conference.

PROPOSED MEMORIALS TO THE GENERAL CONFERENCE

No. 1

Be it resolved that after a minister has served as pastor of a church for a period of five years it shall be necessary for him to receive at least 75 per cent of all ballots cast to constitute a call.

No. 2

Be it resolved that no person shall serve as District Superintendent for a longer period than eight consecutive years, and after having served five year, it shall be necessary to have two-thirds of all ballots cast to constitute an election. It was amended that the Council members be included in this limited period of five consecutive years.

No. 3

Be it resolved that section 110, article 2, page 78 of the manual which has to do with delegates to the general conference read as follows: One for every 10 ordained ministers and one for every 500 lay delegates.

No. 4

Be it resolved that the local Young People's president be a member of the local church board by virtue of his office.

No. 5

Be it resolved that the Ohio District Conference go on record as recommending that the General Conference adopt the proposed general plan for Pilgrim Ministers Benevolent Fund as recommended by the general board.

No. 6

Whereas we appear to have no proper certificate form to present to ministers who unite with our denomination, therefore be it resolved that a fitting and proper credential for this purpose be provided.

No. 7

Whereas the general Sunday School work of our church is a growing and expanding department and whereas this department's specific weakness appears to be in a lack of delegated general supervision, therefore be it resolved that the general conference provide for a full time supervisonal officer and general Sunday School department.

No. 8

Be it resolved that the Pilgrim Holiness Church have a General Executive Secretary of its Young People's Societies who shall serve under the direction of and work only with the approval of the General Superintendent. This office shall be filled by appointment by the General Executive Committee and the duties shall include plans needed to help the District organizations now existing to grow, and to encourage our other districts to organize and develop a Young People's District organization.
