In Memoriam

The 45th Annual Conference of the Ohio Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church wishes to honor the memory of those whose death occurred during the past year.

Rev. J. A. Rigel, an ordained minister of the Ohio District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, was instantly killed on the morning of October 5th, 1948, in a traffic accident while returning from Georgia, where he had been holding a revival meeting, in a Home Missionary Project. Through several years of faithful service he labored to gain eight new churches to our denomination.

At the time of his death Brother Rigel had served the Lord for some sixteen of the sixty years of his life. He leaves to mourn their loss his wife and eight children.

The last days for Brother Rigel were victorious ones in which he saw a number of conversions under his ministry. In his last public testimony he is quoted as saying, "I feel the Lord is soon going to take me out of this old sinful world."

We have lost a friend and the cause of holiness has lost a soldier from its ranks. We rejoice, however, that he has made the landing safely and we can meet him just inside "The Eastern Gates," which was the appropriate closing hymn at his funeral, held at the Lima Market Street Church.

Mrs. Mary Catherine Ives, a faithful servant of God, departed this life January 6, 1949, being at the time of her death 51 years of age.

At the early age of 19 years she gave her heart to God and soon after her marriage to Rev. R. W. Ives, she accompanied him in 1922 to their field of labors on Barbados, on which field they spent two terms.

Upon returning to the states she faithfully assisted her husband as he pastored in various districts.

While pastoring at Madisonville Church, God again called them to the Mission field, then early in the year of 1948 they bade farewell to friends at home and sailed to West Bay, Grand Cayman, B. W. I. It was while on this field she contracted pneumonia, and after a brief illness was laid to rest in the field of labor, that was dearest to her heart, to await the coming of her Saviour, Lover and Friend. Mrs. Danta Sullivan, wife of Rev. William Sullivan, departed this life February 16, 1949, at Mercy Hospital, Columbus, Ohio, at the age of 31 years.

She was converted early in life and later sactified, then joined the Pilgrim Holiness Church at Chillicothe, Ohio.

She was married to Rev. William Sullivan in October,

1937. To this union four children were born. She lived true to Jesus and labored faithfully for Him unto the end.

Charles Everett West, son of Mr. and Mrs. John West, was born December 19, 1888, at Wellston, Ohio. He departed this life May 6, 1949, aged 60 years, 4 months, and 18 days. He was married to Miss Amy Bingham, Feb. 19, 1913. He leaves his wife, two sisters, and other relatives and friends to mourn their loss.

He was a devoted custodian of the First Pilgrim Holiness Church in Columbus, Ohio, where he entered whole-heartedly into his work. He is well remembered on the camp grounds, as one who helped much with work on the

buildings, as well as many camp duties. He was a kind and loving husband and very consid-erate of his wife, always faithful in taking her to any appointment and helping in other ways, where his help is missed today.

Mrs. Myrtie Dean Chatfield, wife of Rev. Ralph W. Chatfield, went to be with Jesus at 5:10 p. m. Sunday, August 7, 1949, in the Lima Memorial Hospital. Just before she slipped away from this life with its

Brother and Sister Chatfield were united in marriage Nov. 24, 1914, and to this union was given four children, one who died in infancy, the remaining three, Wesley Dean, Fran-ces Katherine Farnsworth, and Dorothy Elizabeth Rout-son, who are all in Christian Service, dedicated to the Lord by their mother and father in their infancy.

Besides her children, she also leaves to mourn her departure five grandchildren, one brother, , with a host of relatives and friends.

Sister Chatfield had served as pastor's wife to her husband in the Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, and Kentucky Districts of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. She also served for many years as District Treasurer of the Indiana Con-ference. She worked by her husband's side, faithfully, whatever the task.

REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the pastors, evangelists and lay delegates of the Fourty-Fifth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Churches, Ohio District, greetings in the name of the ever blessed Trinity.

We wish first to give thanks to our heavenly Father for His indescribable goodness that has been so bountifully bestowed upon us throughout the entire conference year. As burdens and problems have multiplied during the passing months grace has been granted whereby we have been able to continue unto this day. So that we have been able to say with the Apostle James, "He giveth more grace," with which to meet the demands of each passing day.

We also wish to voice our appreciation for each and every kindness that has been ours to enjoy as we have gone in and out among the pastors and members of our Pilgrim Churches. Every possible consideration has been shown us as we have gone from church to church in our endeavor to be the greatest possible blessing to the greatest number of people. I am certain that no greater possible kindness could have been shown to anyone than has been our privilege to enjoy. May heaven's rich blessings continue to rest on all our people.

We are happy to report that the Lord has been pleased to add to our number five new churches this past conference year. Early in the year we were called to Delaware where Rev. J. R. Walter and his good wife had gathered a fine group of consecrated people, and the first church of the year was organized. This new church reports twenty-six members. The next new church was organized on the eighth of May at N. Fairmont, Cincinnati. Here we have a fine group of thirteen members. A good church property has been purchased from a group moving to another part of the city, and the prospects are good for a strong church here. Early in May the the new portable tabernacle was taken to Baltimore, and services begun as soon as the tabernacle was erected. On June the twentysixth, after a revival of nearly four weeks, an organization was affected by the District Home Missionary with ten members. The outlook is good for a strong church here in the near future. Then on Tuesday evening, July twenty-sixth, we were called to Radcliff where Brother L. F. Knight and wife had dug out a group of wellsaved folk which were organized into the fourth new church of the year. We have eight new members in this church. The folk there, helped by the unsaved as well as the Christian people in the community, have a good tabernacle well on the way to completion. This property is deeded to the Pilgrim Holiness Church. The last of the five new churches was organized on Sunday A. M., July 31st at a country place called "Four Corners," in Richland County, some twelve or fifteen miles South of the city of Mansfield. Here we have a fine group of twelve members, all established and experienced Christians. To our God be the praise and glory. We also wish to say that we appreciate the sacrificing labors of the good Pilgrims who made these new churches a possibility. They will receive their rewards in heaven.

Our personal report: Our entire time, with the exception of three weeks lost as a result of illness, was given to the work on the District with the following results:

Conditions: This past year has been a period of intensive activity on the Ohio District in every way. Several new churches have been built; others, are in course of construction; others have been remodeled or redecorated. New churches dedicated are Dayton Second, the most beautiful church in the District, without doubt, was dedicated on the 12th of December. Wellston: here a group of consecrated Pilgrims have built a good cement block building that was dedicated in the late Fall of 1948. On March 20th we had the pleasure of dedicating the new church basement at Jacobsburg. This people had looked forward for some time to having a church home of their own, and are delighted to have the basement in which to worship. The small group of faithful Pilgrims at Peebles have a new cement block building also which we dedicated on Sunday, July 3rd, and which takes care of a great need in that small town of two thousand souls. The churches remodeled are: Defiance, where an extensive remodeling program has been carried out whereby much room has been provided in the basement for added classes in the Sunday School. The good Pilgrims at St. Marys have given much time and spent considerable money in putting a full basement under the church, and completely remodeling the interior of the building. The Dayton First church has refinished their floors, installed new pews, also a new lighting system, that greatly adds to the attraction of the building. The Good Pilgrims at Liberty have put in new oak floors as well as redecorating the walls. The new group at N. Fairmont have painted their new property both inside and outside. The New Miami Pilgrims have purchased a block building which they have converted into a fine place of worship. Other churches making added improvement are McLuney, Salt Creek, Danville, Marion First, and others. The Pilgrims at Perrbysburg are building a new church as are also the Pilgrims at Perrbysburg are building a new church as are also the Pilgrims at Leesburg. The Troy Pilgrims also have

Spiritual State: I do not believe that we have a pastor or evangelist on the District that doesn't continue to preach the gospel of a full and free salvation. And so far as we have been able to discover, the laity still enjoys this type of ministry. So it is not unusual to sense the presence of the Lord in the different services. A number of very good revivals have been reported from time to time by the different pastors. A goodly number of persons have sought and found victory in either pardon or purity, many of them uniting with the church.

Possible improvements: We are living in a day of progressive thinking along all lines. We are in the midst of a New Deal politically and industrially. Some of it is bad, but much of the trend of this modernistic age is of material advantage. Personally I feel that the church of Christ can learn something from this progressive attitude so much in evidence during the past several years. I do not mean that we should streamline the church program, nor try to modernize the work of the Holy Spirit in Bible religion. But I do fear that many of the holiness churches of this age have gotten into more or less of a rut, and that something should be done to launch us out into a more intensive program for the lost all about us. If the holiness church is God's instrument by which He proposes to win the masses unto Himself in this last day period we have a greater responsibility than most folk realize. I believe that the Apostle Paul must have felt this great responsibility when he wrote in his epistle to the Corinthian Christians, "I am made all things to all men, that I might by all means save some," and it seems to me that the holiness churches of today must be moved by this same holy zeal if the lost of earth are to be won for Christ. Opportunities do not seek us, we must seek them. If we do not, someone else will.

In conclusion: As we close the books on another conference year, and the actions of yesterday become the history of tomorrw, we turn ur faces toward the rising sun, praying that the blessed Holy Spirit will lead on as we enter into the labors of another conference year. May the dear Lord protect and make each of us the profitable servant we ought to be these next twelve months.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

SALARIES

No. 1 District Superintendents

- A. Be it resolved that each District Superintendent be paid the salary of \$3,000.00, plus 5 cents per mile traveling expenses, together with a parsonage and telephone.
- B. If any church calls the Superintendent for more than his regular visits during the year, the church calling him is required to pay the actual expense of such trips.
- C. We recommend that the Superintendent, when in need of additional help in the administration of the District work, be authorized to secure the services of his assistant. Further, we recommend that the Assistant be paid \$10.00 per day, plus 5 cents per mile traveling expense for his services.
- No. 2 Conference Treasurer's and Secretary's Salary Be it resolved that the Conference Treasurer's salary be \$600.00, and the Conference Secretary's salary be \$200.00.
- No. 3 Statistician's Salary Be it resolved that the Statistician's salary be \$50.00.
- No. 4 Education Commite Expense Be it resolved that the Education Committee be given the amount of \$50.00 per member per year.

Young People's Financial

No. 5

- A. Be it resolved that all the Young People be urged to place all their tithe in their own local church, in the usual way. All money sent the District Y. P. S. treasurer must be over and above their tithe.
- B. That each Zone contribute the equivalent of \$10.00 per church or society annually, to be applied on the expense of the State Y. P. Rally.
- C. That our State Pilgrim Youth News Bulletin be placed on a subscription basis. Single copies at 50c per year, 10 copies to one address 35c per copy per year.

Camp and Conference

No. 6

- A. Be it resolved that each local church be asked to bring provisions or an offering to alleviate the financial obligations of the Camp Meeting.
- B. We recommend that the District Council be requested to properly remunerate every person who has by labor or service help to prepare our camp grounds and to carry on the camp, so far as reason and consistency will permit.

General Budget

No. 10

- We recommend that the Manual provision for the division of the General Budget be adopted by our conference. A.
- \$2.00 for Foreign Missions. \$1.00 for General Home Missions. \$1.00 For Administration.

"If the local church does not properly divide the money, the Conference treasurer is authorized to do so." — Sec. 127, Paragraph 12. "No church is permited to specify funds until its monthly quota for general interest is paid."

We recommend that all matters of salaries of Conference officers be settled before the election of officers, inasmuch as it is embarrassing to discuss said matters after election.

Further, that all officers receiving salary for said office, when necessary to have assistance to care for their work, shall select help only from those already holding complimentary tickets, or pay for the needed help during camp and conference out of his own pocket.

No. 4

We recommend that in order to save the Educational and Ex-amining Board a great deal of time and labor, that our licensed ministers, in so far as possible, take the correspondence course leading to ordination from Owosso, or some other school approved by the Educational Committee.

Inasmuch as there is so much disturbance on the Camp Ground during camp, be it resolved that some one who is acquainted with our people be sworn in as an officer of the law with authority to keep the peace, and that he be paid for his services. He shall be appointed by the District Council. His duties shall be to enforce the rules laid down by the Camp Ground Committee.

No. 6

The Council shall oppoint two or more ladies to act as matrons in the girl's dormitory, during the Young People's Convention and Camp Meeting,

A. Be *i*t resolved that if a room is furnished and rent paid by the pastor, he shall have full authority of that room. If he does not intend to occupy the room during the camp it shall be turned over ot the Camp Secretary, unless he has authorized other campers to occupy the room.

B. Further, that all who rent a room or cot at camp furnish their own linen.

No. 8

Be * esolved that the Conference Council and the Camp Ground Board meet in joint session and the duties of the Camp Ground Committee be outlined to them and they be subject to the Council.

No. 9

A. Be it resolved that young people attending the Young People's State Convention must be approved by their local church board and a statement be issued and signed by the church secretary and pastor, and a meal ticket be issued by the Y. P. Executive Secretary, otherwise they pay full fare for their entertainment.

B. Only active and associate members of local Y. P. Societies and young people in our churches shall be invited to attend with free entertainment our State Y. P. Convention. Only active members are permitted to vote in the business meeting.

C. Be it resolved that Conference Superintendents, the Y. P. Executive Secretary, the Y. P. Executive Treasurer and the Editor of Pilgrim Youth constitute a Conference Young People's Committee.

No. 10

A. Whereas there is growing need for concerted effort in our A. Whereas there is growing need for concerted effort in our Conference with respect to Sunday School work, the General Sun-day School Committee recommends the state conference provide for a Confrence Sunday School Committee or Board to promote Sunday School interests in the District, and to cooperate with the General Sunday School Committee. We further recommend that said committee or board to be appointed by the council, and that the superintendents be members of said board. B. Be it resolved that an Annual Sunday School Convention be held in each Zone the same to be under the supervision of the Superintendent. Furthermore, that the Conference Sunday school Committee shall appoint committees in the various zones of the Conference to work under the supervision of the superintendent.

Conference to work under the supervision of the superintendent.

No. 11

Whereas the Manual provides that our people pay their tithe into the church in which they hold their membership — therefore we strongly urge that this matter be called to the attention of our people who wish to move to other communities.

No. 12—A.

Be it resolved that each pastor or charge in the Ohio Dis-trict shall enroll its pastor and wife in the Ministerial Benefit Association and pay from the local treasury their membership and call fees. That it shall be the duty of the pastor to turn over to the local church board each call as it is presented to him. That the Conference Secretary notify the secretaries of the local Churches of the above action and send application blanks.

R.

Resolved that every church in the Ohio Conference grant its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay, if pastor so desires.

C.

Be it resolved that no pastor shall hold fore than two revivals outside of his local church during the church year.

No. 13

Each church is requested to erect at its place of worship the name of the church and the name and address of the pastor.

No. 14

A. Be it resolved that the conference treasurer have cards A. Be it resolved that the conference treasurer have cards printed designating what each church is required to raise for the Conference and General Interests, and said cards be forwarded to pastors as soon after conference as possible.
B. That all money raised in the local church for District or General Budget be sent by the local treasurer directly to the Conference Treasurer, that the local church may receive due credit.
C. The Conference Treasurer shall send a statement to all churches that are in arrears with their budgets, six weeks prior to the close of the confuser event.

to the close of the configence year.

No. 15

Resolved that the conference year end July 15th, that the Conference Treasurer's books close July 20th, and all churches in order to get their credit, must have their monies in by that date.

No. 16

Report blanks shall be sent to all licensed and ordained min-isters and deaconesses by July 15. That all reports of same be sent to the Statistician by July 25. If any fail to send this report by August 1, he must answer to the Council and give the reasons why he failed to do so.

No. 17

Be it resolved that when the District Superintendent perpares his schedule for visiting the church, that he send a copy of said schedule to each pastor in the district.

No. 18

Whereas Bible Holiness Seminary of Owosso, Michigan, is the Bible School for our zone; and in order that we may better ac-quaint our people with our Bible School, and that we give due recognition to it:

Be it resolved that the 2:30 P. M. service on the second Fri-day of the Camp be given over to the president of the Bible Holi-ness Seminary, during which he shall present the work and the needs of the Bible School.

No. 19

Be it resolved that our Conference go on record as favoring the Pilgrim Pension Plan as presented. We leave it optional with each church as to whether they wish to participate or not, and for further study.

No. 20

Resolved that churches be urged and encouraged to conduct Daily Vacation Bible School in their churches.

No. 21

Be it resolved that upon the death of a minister of the Conference, that the Conference Secretary be given the information immdiately, and that he notify the other pastors of the District.

No. 22

Be it resolved that no person be given or hold license to preach, who is not a member of a local Pilgrim Holiness Church.

No. 23

Be it resolved that the District shall enroll the Superintendent in the Pilgrim Pension Plan, as per the plan for local churches and their pastors.

No. 24

Whereas the present provision for Conference Home Missionary work has not proved workable, be it resolved that the Council call upon some qualified pastors to carry on the Home Missionary Work.

No. 25

Be it resolved that the Ohio District become the Ohio Conference with the Eastern and Western Districts of same, having one camp and one conference to be held at Springfield. Each District to have their respective Superintendent and Assissant Superintendent, each Superintendent to be paid an equal salary.

No. 26

Be it resolved that the Eastern and the Western District shall elect their own Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent.

No. 27

Inasmuch as there is Manual provision, be it resolved that our council consist of the elected officers and seven advisory members, to be elected at each conference.

No. 28

Be it resolved that the Ohio Conference have a Ministerial Convention this conference year. The time and place to be determined by the Council.

No. 29

Be is resolved that a committee of local men visit the proper officials relative to supplementing our present water supply for the Camp Ground.

No. 30

Be it resolved that our Ohio Churches in extending a call for their pastor, shall give first consideration to the members of the Ohio Conference.

No. 31

Be it resolved:

A. We extend to our General Superindent a vote of thanks for his Christ-like spirit and the efficient manner in which he labored as he conducted this conference.

B. We extend a vote of thanks to the District Superintendent, the District Secretary, the District Treasurer, members of the District Council, the Statistician, the Camp ground committee, the Educational Committee, the cooks, and all others who have helped in any way to make the camp and conference the success and blessing they have been.

C. Above all, we do reverently offer thanks to our Heavenly Father for His blessings upon us during this camp and Conference.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON MEMORIALS TO GENERAL CONFERENCE AS ADOPTED BY THIS CONFERENCE

No. 1

To take the place of Section 42, paragraph 3, page 38 of the 1946 Manual:

(A) Prior to the annual church meeting the local church board shall nominate one or more persons qualified for the office of Sunday School Superintendent, one or more persons qualified for the offices of local Treasurer, and one or more qualified pers-ons to be elected as delegate to our annual State Conference. (Sec-tion 42, Pgf. 3, one or more persons for Young People's President (Sec. 85, Pgf. 5e), and one or more persons for the president of the Foreign Missionary Society. (Sec. 89, Pgf. 1.)

No. 2 --- Page 60, Section 86

All the work of the Young People's Society, whether State, Zone or Local, shall conform to the spirit and teaching of the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. All persons taking part The Council has the right to remove or cause to be removed any officer or any Young People's Society, who in the judgment of the council, are not in harmony with the teaching and practice of the Manual.

No. 3 (A) Be it resolved that the General Board of our Church consist of the following: General Superintendent, First and Second Assistant General Superintendents, General Secretary, General Treas-urer, Secretary of Foreign Missions, Secretary of Home Missions, Secretary of Sunday Schools. and Young People's Work, Editor of the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate, the Superintendents of all organized districts in the United States and Canada, and two men to be elected by the General Conference from among the presidents of our Bible Schools, wno are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, one of whom the General Board shall appoint to serve on the Exerutive Council.

(B) Be it further resolved that in those districts where there is more than one superintendent, the District Conference shall elect one from among the superintendents to serve on the General Board.

No. 4

Resolved that we look forward to establish a Senior College and Seminary to be owned and controlled by the General Church, the detail to be worked out by the General Board and that we include in the General Budget a certain amount for the establishing of said institution.

No. 5

Whereas our General Board has requested that our respective zone schools be placed in their district budget; Be it resolved that the Districts comprising school zones include within their District Budget a certain amount for the support of said schools, comparable to their relationship to the District, and that the budget be set by the General Board.

No. 6

Whereas many ministers have felt the need of a longer marriage ceremony, be it resolved that the following form be placed in our Manual in addition to our present form:

(At the day and ime appointed for the solemnization of matrimony, the persons to be married, having been qualified according to law, standing together, the man on the right hand and the woman on the left hand, the minister shall say:)

"Dearly Beloved: We are gathered together in the sight of God, and in the presence of these witnesss, to join together this man and this woman in holy matrimony, which is an honorable estate, instituted of God in the time of man's innocency, signifying the mystical union that exists between Christ and His Church; which holy estate Christ adorned and beautified by his first miracle that He wrought in Cana of Galilee and is commended of ISt. Paul to be honorable among all men; and therefore it not to be entered into unadvisedly, but reverently, discreetly, and in the fear of God.

Into this holy estate these persons present now come to be joined. Therefore, if any can show just cause why they may not be lawfully joined together, let him now speak, or else forever hold his peace.

(Speaking to the persons who are to be married, the minister shall say:)

I require and charge you both that if either of you know any impediment why you may not be lawfully joined together, you do now confess it; for be ye well assured that as many as are united otherwise than as God's Word doth allow are not joined together by God.

(If no impediment is alleged, then someone besides the officiating minister may pray.)

Almight and ever blessed God, whose presence is the happiness of every condition, and whose favor hallows every relation; we beseech Thee to be present and favorably look upon these Thy servants, that they may be truly joined in in the honorable estate of marriage in the covenant of their God. As Thou hast brought them together by Thy providence, sanctify them by thy spirit, giving them a new frame of heart fit for their new estate; and enrich them with all grace, whereby they may enjoy the comforts, undergo the cares, endure the trial, and perform the duties of life together as becometh Christians, under Thy heavenly guidance and protection; through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

(Then the minister shall say:)

Who give h this woman to be married to this man?

(The Father, or Guardian, or friend of the woman shall answer:) I do.

The minister, calling the man by his Christian name, shall say:)

wife, to live together after God's ordinance in the holy estate of matrimony? Wilt thou love her, comfort her, honor and keep her in sickness and in health, and forsaking all others, keep thee only unto her as long as ye both shall live?

(The man shall answer): I will,

(Then the minister, calling the woman by her first name, shall say:)

wilt thou have this man to be thy wedded husband, to live together after God's ordinance, in the holy estate of matrimony? Wilt thou love, honor and keep him in sickness and in health, and forsaking all others, keep thee only unto him as long as ye both shall live? (The woman shall answer): I will.

(The minister shall cause the man with his right hand to take the woman by her right hand, and say after him as follows:)

I, _____, take thee, _____, to be my wedded wife and I do promise and covenant before God and these witnesses to be thy loving and faithful husband, in plenty and in want, in joy and in sorrow, in sickness and in health, as long as we both shall live.

(Then shall the loose their hands; the minister shall cause the woman to take the man by his right hand, and say after him as follows:)

I, _____, take _____, to be my wedded husband, and I do promise and covenant before God and these witnesses; to be thy loving and faithful wife; in plenty and in want; in joy and in sorrow; in sickness and in health, as long as we both shall live.

(Then the minister shall say): Let us pray.

Most merciful and gracious God, of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named, bestow upon these Thy servants the seal of Thine approval and Thy Fatherly benediction, granting unto them grace to fulfill with pure and steadfast affection the vow and covenant between them made. Guide them together, we beseech Thee in the way of righteousness and peace, that loving and serving Thee with one heart and mind all the days of their life, they may be abundantly enriched wih the tokens of Thy everlasting favor, grant unto them and this company a place hereafter at the marriage supper of the Lamb, and unto Thee we will ascribe the praise and the honor, and the glory now and evermore through Jesus Christ. Amen.

(Then shall the minister say unto all present:)

By the authority committed unto me as a Minister of the Church

of Christ, I declare that ______ and _____ are now husband and wife, according to the ordinance of God and the law of the state; in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

(Then causing the husband and wife to join their right hands, the minister shall say:)

Whom God hath joined together, let no man put asunder.

(It is fitting that the bride and groom kneel to receive this benediction:)

The Lord bless you, and keep you: the Lord make His face to shine upon you, and be gracious unto you: the Lord lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace; both now and in life everlasting. Amen.
