He asserted that all fortune tellers were full of the devil as were all of those who went to consult them; but when we have Christ we have our "fortune." Paul obeyed though it cost him much suffering. He was stripped, beaten and cast into prison with Silas. His obedience reaped many blessed fruits that brought glory to God. God sent an earthquake and opened the prison. The jailer and his household were saved and baptized before day-break. They, with Lydia and the girl, out of which the devil was cast, and others made up the church at Philippi. Paul wrote this church saying "I have you in my heart," "I carry you around in my heart" and "I long after you in the bowels of Jesus Christ." Bro. Wilson asserted that our church today needs a sacrificing and a humble spirit as well as an obedient mind. He testified that since 1906, when the Spirit of God came into his heart, that he had had a forgiving spirit. A minister should not think on his own things, nor seek position nor the church that pays the most money. Selfishness is telling on our ministry and as a result we are drying up, dying of dry-rot. Do we have the spirit that is willing to confess "I am wrong?"

The roll was called, corrected and substitutions were accepted.

The Conference Bar was established to include the three sections to the right of the platform and from the back center aisle to the platform and including the platform.

The following guests were presented to the conference and granted a seat within the bar of the conference: Rev. and Mrs. Richard Close, Rev. C. P. Pridgen, Rev. Walter Yoh, Rev. Irene Tanner, Rev. Darlene Zimmerman, Rev. W. C. Miller, and Rev. and Mrs. R. E. Ross.

The following ordained ministers were received into the Ohio Conference from other conferences: Rev. Walter J. Yoh, Rev. W. C. Miller, Rev. C. P. Pridgen, and Rev. Max O'Dell who holds first year ministerial license.

The hours of the conference were set: 8:30-11:30 A.M., 2:00-5:00 P.M., and 7:30-10:00 P.M.

The standing committees were ratified.

The superintendent of the Western District, Rev. L. R. Roberts, read his report, which was accepted.

A motion was made and carried that we extend the time sufficient to have the report of Rev. B. A. Awe.

The superintendent of the Eastern Division, Rev. B. A. Awe, then read his report which was accepted.

The sitting expired by expiration of time and at the request of the chair, Rev. Richard Close pronounced the benediction.

Second Sitting, Monday Afternoon

The second sitting of the conference opened by joyfully singing the song "All the Way My Saviour Leads," led by Rev. Charles Armstrong. We were then led in prayer by Rev. Norval Rickner petitioning Divine guidance and blessing upon the session.

A motion prevailed to dispense with the roll call. The conference secretary, however, read the names of the ministers who had been marked absent as a recheck.

The following visiting ministers were introduced to the conference: Rev. John Goon, Rev. Harry Ferguson and Rev. Ray Duncan.

A motion was made and carried that these ministers be accepted within the conference bar.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

The following new churches of the Eastern District were presented to the conference by Rev. B. A. Awe: Gephart, Morgan Center and East Toledo. The pastors and delegates of these churches were invited to the front of the auditorium and each gave a clear and enthusiastic testimony. These churches were accepted and their delegates seated in the conference bar.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read by Miss Margaret Jones and accepted.

The treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

Third Sitting, Monday Evening

The conference joined in singing the song "My Jesus I Love Thee," led by Rev. A. L. Davis. Rev. J. L. Dean led us to the throne of grace in behalf of the needs of the conference.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

The Ways and Means Committee reported.

The statistical report was read and accepted.

The Ways and Means Committee made additional report.

No. 8 Carried.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

No. 7 Carried.

A motion carried that we proceed with the election of officers.

The following tellers were appointed in preparation for the election of officers. The tellers for the Eastern District were: Ray Richards, Melroy Ward, C. E. Jones, Roy Ankrim and W. F. Crum. The tellers for the Western District were: O. M. Awe, Melvin Stiverson, Earl McKinney, Harold Monroe and J. Wilson Smack. The conference secretary, A. O. Skillings, cooperated with the tellers in checking the vote.

The conference was divided and ballots were cast for the superintendents and their assistants.

Rev. B. A. Awe was elected superintendent of the Eastern District.

Rev. A. L. Davis was elected assistant superintendent of the Eastern District.

A motion was made and carried that the conference remain in session until the superintendent and assistant superintendent for the Western District were elected.

After failing to elect a superintendent and assistant superintendent for the Western District, a motion was made and carried that we rescind the previous action that the conference remain in session until such business was transacted and that instead the conference meet at 8:30 A.M. tomorrow morning for this purpose.

Rev. B. A. Awe led in prayer after which the conference adjourned.

Fourth Sitting, Tuesday Morning

With Rev. A. H. Wilson in the chair, the fourth sitting opened with Rev. David Rodgers leading the congregation in singing "Near the Cross" after which Rev. Earl Wacheschwanz led the conference in prayer.

Rev. A. H. Wilson, speaking out of his heart to the conference, gave some practical advice based on the fourth chapter of Ephesians, how we should "Walk worthy of the vocation wherewith we are called." We are a called people. We are a worthy people. We are admonished by St. Paul to walk "with all lowliness and meekness with long-suffering." Divine love suffers long and is still kind. There is no place in the harmony of God for unkindness. Bro. Wilson expressed the thought that we as a conference should "keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace, forbearing one another in love."

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

A motion was made and carried that the Pilgrim headquarters send all pastors of the Ohio Conference a chart depicting The Pilgrim Dollar.

The conference was divided and ballots cast for the superintendent of the Western District.

Rev. L. R. Roberts was duly elected superintendent of the Western District.

Ballots were then cast for assistant superintendent of the Western District.

Rev. R. D. Brown was elected assistant superintendent of the Western District.

The chair then called upon the two elected superintendents to address the conference. Rev. B. A. Awe and Rev. L. R. Roberts each in turn addressed the conference, giving many profitable and encouraging remarks. God blest the assembly in a most unusual manner. Many were moved to shouts and tears. Joyful songs were sung, while all expressed their love and unity by a hallelujah march and the shaking of hands with the superintendents and their wives.

Ballots were cast for the conference secretary, resulting in the election of Rev. A. O. Skillings.

A motion was made that the time be extended until after the election of the treasurer.

The council presented the following nominations for conference treasurer: Rev. O. E. Rutledge and Rev. Earl McKinney.

Ballots were cast and Rev. O. E. Rutledge was elected.

A motion was made and carried that the time be extended until after a vote be taken for an advisory council member at large.

Ballots were then cast for the said council member and collected by the tellers to be counted during the noon hour and reported upon at the afternoon session of the conference.

The conference adjourned by reason of expiration of time. The chair called upon Rev. R. A. Kelly to lead in the closing prayer.

Fifth Sitting, Tuesday Afternoon

Rev. B. W. Awe called the conference to order by leading in the singing of one verse of "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name." He also led the congregation in a good season of prayer.

Rev. Earl McKinney, the Sunday School Promotion Secretary, gave his report. Rev. Roy Ankrim, pastor of the Barberton church, was given a special certificate of award for having the highest average attendance in his Sunday School for the last fiscal year in the Ohio Conference, his gain being 88% above last year.

A motion was made and carried that we accept the report.

The minutes of the preceeding session were read and approved.

Rev. Florence Strohl, mother-in-law of the District Superintendent of the Pennsylvania District, was brought before the conference. She testified and was granted a seat in the conference.

A report was made of the previous vote for the advisory council member at large. Rev. J. R. Siders was declared elected.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

No. 8 Carried.

A resolution was offered from the floor and upon motion was tabled.

A motion was made and carried that Rev. Edward Beard be excused from the conference sitting at his request.

The Ways and Means Committee reported.

No. 9 Tabled.

It was moved and seconded that the Ways and Means Committee bring in a satisfactory resolution to replace No. 9, which was tabled.

A substitute motion was offered as follows: Inasmuch as some services should be rendered without salary, it is moved that the Educational Board be paid \$65.00 according to Resolution No. 4 of the Ways and Means Committee in the conference minutes, but that the Examining Committee serve without charge.

Rev. Max O'Dell, who had already been transferred to the Ohio Conference, was introduced to the assembly.

The following names were presented to the conference by the council:

For Trustee of Owosso Bible College—Rev. L. R. Roberts.

For Examining Board—Rev. John S. Dean, Rev. W. L. Fisher and Rev. Walter Yoh.

For District Trustee—Rev. L. R. Roberts and Rev. Ray Richards.

The conference took the following action:

Rev. L. R. Roberts, by acclamation, was elected Trustee of Owosso Bible College.

Rev. John S. Dean was elected to the Examining Board.

Rev. Ray Richards was elected District Trustee.

The conference then proceeded to vote by ballot for three advisory members of the Council on the Western District and three on the Eastern District. Rev. Paul Lucas, Rev. Earl McKinney and Rev. W. L. Kilwy were elected from the Western District and Rev. B. H. Pugh, Rev. Ray Richards, and Rev. Raymond Simpson were elected from the Eastern District.

Rev. B. A. Awe requested all evangelists present to stand and recommended them to the pastors. Rev. R. A. Kelly of Struthers, Ohio was intro-

duced to the conference and recommended as a good evangelist, after which he gave an encouraging testimony.

A motion prevailed that we adjourn, after which the benediction was pronounced by Rev. L. Russel Enlow.

Sixth Sitting, Tuesday Evening

Rev. Edmond E. Wells led in singing "When We All Get To Heaven," after which the conference was led in prayer by Rev. Melroy Ward.

The minutes of the preceeding session were read and approved.

A motion was made and prevailed that we rescind the action of the previous sitting concerning the Examining Committee.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

No. 9 Carried.

No. 11 Tabled.

No. 12 Carried.

No. 13 Carried.

An amendment was offered to No. 13, and prevailed, that the ordination service be held on Tuesday morning instead of Monday evening of the conference.

No. 14 Carried.

It was moved and carried that the motion in the minutes concerning enrolling the pastors in the Ministerial Benefit Association should also include the district superintendents and their wives and that their insurance should be paid by the conference treasurer.

The Reception Committee introduced Rev. Harold Todds, a visiting minister, to the conference.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

No. 15 Carried.

The Committee on Memorials reported.

A motion was made and passed that all unfinished business be referred to the council for action.

The Resolutions Committee offered a motion which was passed voicing appreciation for the good work done by the Assistant General Superintendent, and the other officers of the conference; the Springfield News and Sun, and above all, to the Heavenly Father for His blessings upon the camp and conference.

Rev. A. H. Wilson appointed the following Council of Ordination: Rev. L. R. Roberts, Rev. Ray Richards, Rev. R. D. Brown, Rev. A. L. Davis and Rev. B. A. Awe.

The following ministers were recommended for ordination: Rev. William Gilkerson and Rev. Arnold Gibson.

Rev. A. H. Wilson then proceeded with the ordination service.

Rev. R. Wingrove Ives led in singing "A Charge to Keep I Have," after which Rev. Ray Richards led in prayer invoking God's blessing upon the service. Rev. Ives then led in singing "Rock of Ages." Appropriate Scriptures were then read by Rev. B. A. Awe, Rev. A. L. Davis and Rev. R. D. Brown. Rev. A. H. Wilson read the fourth chapter of First Timothy, after which he brought the ordination address from the text "Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them; for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself and them that hear thee."

Directing his remarks to the candidates, he stated—We want you to realize that the church is bestowing upon you its highest honor and with that honor comes a corresponding responsibility. I trust that you feel the call of God but never think that the call into the ministry will save you. Take heed to your devotional life. Take heed to your prayer life. If there is anything we fail in, it is because we fail first in our prayer life. Paul said, "You are to be an example, a pattern." You are an example in word, in spirit, in divine love, in fidelity, and in purity. Your conduct, your disposition and your attitude toward things will determine your usefulness. The appearance of your dress, your home and your church will make an impression in your com-

munity. Be faithful to every duty and at last you will hear the words "Well done, thou good and faithful servant, enter thou into the joys of thy Lord."

Rev. Wilson then declared the conference adjourned and called upon Rev. R. D. Brown to lead in closing prayer.

REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

SALARIES

No. 1 District Superintendents

- A. Be it resolved that each District Superintendent be paid the salary of \$3,300.00 plus 5 cents per mile traveling expenses together with a parsonage and telephone. Further, we recommend that the district superintendents arrange their schedules so that their mileage be at a minimum.
- B. We recommend that the superintendent, when in need of additional help in the administration of the district work, be authorized to secure the services of his assistant. Further, we recommend that the assistant be paid \$10.00 per day, plus 5 cents per mile traveling expense for his services.
- C. We recommend also that 5 cents per mile be given each member of the District Council when traveling to council meetings.
- D. Be it resolved that each church raise the equivalent of 50c per member per year to liquidate the district parsonage indebtedness.
- E. Inasmuch as many churches do not pay tithe to the district, we therefore recommend that the District Superintendent check the record of the District Treasurer and then investigate and encourage all delinquent churches to pay tithe. We recommend that any church be omitted from the Gold Star Roll that fails to pay the tithe.

No. 2. Conference Treasurer's and Secretary's Salary

Be it resolved that the Conference Treasurer's salary be \$600.00 and the Conference Secretary's salary be \$200.00.

No. 3. Statistician's Salary

Be it resolved that the Statistician's salary be \$50.00.

No. 4. Education Committee Expense

Be it resolved that the Education Committee be given the amount of \$65.00 per member per year.

No. 5. Young People's Financial

- A. Be it resolved that all the young people be urged to place all their tithe in their own local church, in the usual way. All money sent the District Y.P.S. treasurer must be over and above their tithe.
- B. That each one contribute the equivalent of \$10.00 per church or society annually, to be applied on the expense of the State Y. P. Rally.
- C. That our State Pilgrim Youth News Bulletin be placed on a subscription basis. Single copies at \$50c per year, 10 copies to one address 35c per copy per year. All subscriptions are to expire at the end of the conference year.

No. 6. Camp and Conference

- A. Be it resolved that each local church be asked to bring provisions to alleviate the financial obligation of the Camp Meeting.
- B. We recommend that the District Council be requested to properly remunerate every person who has by labor or service helped to prepare our camp grounds and to carry on the camp, so far as reason and consistency will permit.

No. 7. Ways and Means Committee

- A. Be it resolved that all ministers' wives shall be subject to call to give one day's work in the kitchen or dining room.
- B. That our active minister's children under the age of 14 be entertained free. Those over 14 to be subject to call for work in any department.

- C. We recommend that all visitors attending the Annual Conference be charged a reasonable sum for meals, the price to be set by the committee in charge.

This does not apply to ministers or their wives.

Each church and Y. P. Society should take a good liberal offering to provide the expense of the delegate when attending the conference.

No. 8. Pastoral Duties

- A. Resolved that no preacher be privileged to pastor a Pilgrim Holiness Church of this district until he has promised to include the various financial activities of the district in the program of his local church.
- B. Be it resolved that all ministers except pastors pay 50% of their tithe into their local church. Pastors are expected to place all their tithe into their local churches.

No. 9 General Budget

- A. We recommend that the Manual provision for the division of the General Budget be adopted by our conference.

\$2.00 for Foreign Missions
1.00 for General Church Extension
1.00 for General Administration Expense
.25 for General Sunday School Extension
.75 for Senior College
.50 for General Church Extension Loan Fund

"If the local church does not properly divide the money, the conference treasurer is authorized to do so." Sec. 127, Paragraph 12.

"No church is permitted to specify funds until its monthly quota for general interest is paid."

- B. Be it resolved that we raise 15 cents per member per year to take care of the General Conference Expense.
- C. Be it resolved that each church raise at least 25c per member per year for our zone school.
- D. We recommend that the general budget be raised monthly in the Sunday School or church, taking any Sunday thought best for the offering.
- E. Be it resolved that we request the General Board to send a deputation worker to visit our local churches and assist the pastors in raising Conference Home Missionary and General Budget funds.

No. 10. District Budget

- A. Be it resolved that all persons generally support the interests of the church by their tithes and offerings, and that all gross receipts of the local church, excepting General Church Budget, Conference, Home Missionary funds, evangelistic support, and building funds, be tithed, the same to be forwarded to the conference treasurer.
- B. Be it resolved that one dollar and a quarter (\$1.25) per member, per year, in addition to all birthday offerings, be raised annually to constitute our Conference Home Missionary Fund.
- C. Inasmuch as the provision to date is inadequate to care for the financial obligations of the camp grounds, be it resolved that we ask the local churches to raise the equivalent of one dollar (\$1.00) per member, per year, to be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer, the same to be applied on the upkeep of the camp grounds.

No. 11. Auditing of Treasurer's Books

Be it resolved that we employ a certified public accountant to audit the books of the Conference Treasurer. The audit to be made after the books have been closed on July 20, and prior to the convening of the Annual Conference.

No. 12. Insuring the Treasurer

We recommend that the Council be requested to have the Conference Treasurer insured.

No. 13. Cost of Minutes

Because the printing expense has increased, be it resolved that the price of the Conference Minutes be 50c per copy.

No. 14. Preparing Minutes for Publication

Be it resolved that a stenographer be employed to help the Conference Secretary in preparing the minutes that they may be ready at the close of the conference and that we pay the stenographer \$25.00 for his services.

No. 15. Bible School Trustees Expense

Be it resolved that the treasurer shall pay from conference funds, the fare of the Owasso Bible College Trustees, from Ohio, to and from the Trustee meetings.

No. 16. Church Improvement Fund

Inasmuch as many of our churches are struggling to enlarge and improve their buildings, be it resolved that our Church Board loan from their funds at 5 per cent interest, such loans not to exceed five years.

No. 17. Church Extension Fund

Whereas sufficient funds are not available as needed for the Church Extension Fund; Be it resolved that the District Council take steps necessary to secure additional monies for this fund.

No. 18. Additional Land

Be it resolved that the District Council be authorized to investigate and if arrangements can be made, to acquire additional land to be added to our present camp grounds. Further, that this additional land project be financed on the same plan as the district parsonage was.

**REPORT OF YOUNG PEOPLE'S WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS
ADOPTED BY THE OHIO CONFERENCE Y. P. CONVENTION
BUSINESS SESSION**

Resolution No. 1.

Be it resolved that an executive fund, out of which the expenses incidental to the functioning of the executive committee in their official duties be maintained.

Be it further resolved that each church pay \$2.50 a year to maintain this fund.

Be it further resolved that the executive secretary be reimbursed six cents a mile for traveling expenses.

Resolution No. 2.

Be it resolved that a special project fund be maintained to finance the special projects approved by the Young People's Conference, this fund to be maintained by an assessment of \$2.50 to be paid by each church.

Resolution No. 3.

Be it resolved that a fund of fifty (50) dollars be set up from which the editor of the Pilgrim Youth may pay incidental expenses.

**REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY
THE CONFERENCE**

No. 1. Appreciation

Be it resolved:

- A. That we extend to our General Superintendent a vote of thanks for his Christ-like spirit and the efficient manner in which he labored as he conducted this conference.

- B. That we extend a vote of thanks to the District Superintendents, Assistant Superintendents, the District Secretary, the District Treasurer, members of the District Council, the Statistician, the Camp Ground committee, the Educational Committee, the cooks, and all others who have helped in any way to make the camp and conference the success and blessing they have been.
- C. That we wish to express our appreciation to the Springfield News and Sun and Rev. E. R. Overman for the splendid cooperation that they have given us in their paper for this camp meeting and conference.
- D. Above all, we do reverently offer thanks to our Heavenly Father for His blessings upon us during the camp and conference.

No. 2. Budgets

- A. Be it resolved that the conference treasurer have cards printed designating what each church is required to raise for the Conference and General Interests, and said cards be forwarded to pastors as soon after conference as possible.
- B. That all money raised in the local church for District or General Budget be sent by the local treasurer directly to the Conference Treasurer, that the local church may receive due credit.
- C. The Conference Treasurer shall send a statement to all churches that are in arrears with their budgets, six weeks prior to the close of the conference year.

No. 3. Camp Meeting Committee

Be it resolved that the Conference Council and Camp Ground Board meet in joint session and the duties of the Camp Ground Committee be outlined to them and they be subject to the council.

No. 4. Conference and Districts

- A. Be it resolved that the Ohio District become the Ohio Conference with the Eastern and Western Districts of same, having one camp and one conference to be held at Springfield. Each District to have their respective Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent, each Superintendent to be paid an equal salary.
- B. Be it resolved that the Eastern and Western District shall elect their own Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent.

No. 5. Conference Year

- A. Inasmuch as our District Statistician needs more time to prepare his report for District Conference, be it resolved that our church fiscal year close June 30th and that all reports be sent to the District Statistician not later than July 10th.
- B. Inasmuch as the conference year closes June 30th, be it resolved that the District Treasurer's book close July 5th.

No. 6. Council

Inasmuch as we have one council representing two districts, in order to have equal representation on our council: Be it resolved, that we elect the council as follows—Each district shall elect its respective superintendent and assistant. The entire conference will then elect the secretary and treasurer and one advisory member at large. Each district will then elect three additional advisory members, making a total of thirteen persons on the Advisory Council.

No. 7. Daily Vacation Bible School

Resolved that churches be urged and encouraged to conduct Daily Vacation Bible School in their churches.

No. 8. Decease of Pastors

Be it resolved that upon the death of a minister of the conference, that the conference secretary be given the information immediately, and that he notify the other pastors of the district.

No. 9. District Superintendents

- A. Be it resolved that when the district superintendent prepares his schedule for visiting the churches, that he send a copy of said schedule to each pastor in the district.
- B. Be it resolved that the district shall enroll the superintendent in the Pilgrim Pension Plan, as per the plan for local churches and their pastors.

No. 10. Dormitories

- A. Be it resolved that if a room is furnished and rent paid by the pastor, he shall have full authority of that room. If he does not intend to occupy the room during the camp it shall be turned over to the camp secretary, unless he has authorized other campers to occupy the room.
- B. Further, that all who rent a room or cot at camp furnish their own linen.
- C. Be it resolved that any person who is transferred from our district to another district, or otherwise becomes disqualified, shall be automatically dispossessed of his room. These persons whose claims have been relinquished shall be immediately notified by the camp secretary.
- D. The council shall appoint two or more ladies to act as matrons in the girls' dormitory, during the Young People's Convention and Camp Meeting.

No. 11. Home Missions

- A. Whereas the present provision for Conference Home Missionary work has not proved workable, be it resolved that the council call upon some qualified pastors to carry on the Home Missionary work.
- B. In consideration of the need of District Home Missionary work, be it resolved that each pastor in the Ohio Conference be subject to a call by the Home Missionary Committee for a two weeks' revival.

No. 12. Law Enforcement

Inasmuch as there is so much disturbance on the camp ground during camp, be it resolved that some one who is acquainted with our people be sworn in as an officer of the law with authority to keep the peace, and that he be paid for his services. He shall be appointed by the District Council. His duties shall be to enforce the rules laid down by the Camp Ground Committee.

No. 13. License

- A. Be it resolved that no person be given or hold license to preach, who is not a member of the local Pilgrim Holiness Church.
- B. Whereas the last General Conference made a new set up in the Course of Study; therefore be it resolved that the local preachers are to be under the supervision of the Examining Board in regard to their Course of Study, also that pastors encourage the local preachers in pursuing their Course of Study. We strongly urge the local preachers to attend their District Conference.
- C. We recommend that in order to save the Educational and Examining Board a great deal of time and labor, that our licensed ministers, in so far as possible, take the correspondence course leading to ordination from Owosso, or some other school approved by the Educational Committee.
- D. Be it resolved that our unstationed licensed ministers shall present a duplicate of their annual conference report to the district examining board before or during the Annual Conference.

No. 14. Ministerial Benefit Association

- A. Be it resolved that each pastor or charge in the Ohio District shall enroll its pastor and wife in the Ministerial Benefit Association and pay from the local treasury their membership and call fees. That it shall be the duty of the pastor to turn over to the local church board each call as it is presented to him. That the Conference Secretary notify the secretaries of the local churches of the above action and send application blanks.
- B. Be it resolved that the district superintendents and their wives be enrolled in the Ministerial Benefit Association and that the dues be paid by the conference treasurer.

No. 15. Ministerial Convention

Be it resolved that the Ohio Conference have a Ministerial Convention this conference year. The time and place to be determined by the Council.

No. 16. Name of Church

Each church is requested to erect at its place of worship the name of the church and the name and address of the pastor.

No. 17. Ordination Services

Be it resolved that the ordination service be held on Tuesday morning.

No. 18. Owosso Bible College

Whereas Bible Holiness Seminary at Owosso, Michigan, is the Bible School for our zone and in order that we may better acquaint our people with our Bible School, and that we give due recognition to it:

Be it resolved that the 2:30 P.M. service on the second Friday of the camp be given over to the president of the Bible Holiness Seminary, during which he shall present the work and the needs of the Bible School.

No. 19. Pastor

- A. Be it resolved that our Ohio churches in extending a call for their pastor, shall give first consideration to the members of the Ohio Conference.
- B. Since it requires a two-thirds majority vote at the election to call a pastor, when two or more names are voted on at the same time, the vote is divided so that no one has the necessary two-thirds vote, Be it resolved that no church vote on more than one pastor at a time.
- C. Inasmuch as our two districts still form only one conference, be it resolved that the superintendents recommend to the churches changing pastors, all available Ohio ministers without differentiation as to the district to which they belong.
- D. Inasmuch as some of our pastors do not receive adequate salary to meet the high cost of living, Be it resolved that the district superintendents take more interest in the support of the pastors, when the superintendents meet with the local church boards.

No. 20. Pension Plan

Be it resolved that our conference go on record as favoring the Pilgrim Pension Plan as presented. We leave it optional with each church as to whether they wish to participate or not, and for further study.

No. 21. Salaries

We recommend that all matters of salaries of conference officers be settled before the election of officers, inasmuch as it is embarrassing to discuss said matters after election.

Further, that all officers receiving salary for said office, when necessary to have assistance to care for their work, shall select help only from those already holding complimentary tickets, or pay for the needed help during camp and conference out of his own pocket.

No. 22. Standards

- A. Be it resolved that the workers on our camp ground be required to maintain the standards of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.
- B. Be it resolved that this conference go on record as agreeing with the action of the General Conference as taking our stand against the use of the wearing of all rings.

No. 23. Sunday School

- A. Whereas there is growing need for concerted effort in our conference with respect to Sunday School work, the General Sunday School Committee recommends the state conference provide for a Conference Sunday School Committee or Board to promote Sunday School interests in the district, and to co-operate with the General Sunday School Committee. We further recommend that said committee or board be appointed by the council, and that the superintendents be members of said board.

- B. Be it resolved that an Annual Sunday School Convention be held in each zone the same to be under the supervision of the superintendent. Furthermore, that the Conference Sunday School Committee shall appoint committees in the various zones of the conference to work under the supervision of the superintendent.

No. 24. Tithe

Whereas the Manual provides that our people pay their tithe into the church in which they hold their membership—therefore we strongly urge that this matter be called to the attention of our people who wish to move to other communities.

No. 25. Voting

- A. Inasmuch as there is some dissatisfaction with officials receiving office by acclamation, be it resolved that henceforth all officials be elected to office by secret ballot.
- B. Be it resolved that the council nominate two or more candidates for the office of conference treasurer.

No. 26. Youth

Whereas many of our churches have no knowledge of our youth work, Be it resolved that space be provided in our District Minutes for the financial and statistical reports of zone and district youth activities. Same reports to be turned in to district statistician.

No. 27. Y. P. Convention

- A. Be it resolved that young people attending the Young People's State Convention must be approved by their local church board and a statement be issued and signed by the church secretary and pastor, and a meal ticket be issued by the Y. P. Executive Secretary, otherwise they pay full fare for their entertainment.
- B. Only active and associate members of local Y. P. Societies and young people in our churches shall be invited to attend with free entertainment our State Y. P. Convention. Only active members are permitted to vote in the business meeting.
- C. Be it resolved that conference superintendents, the Y. P. Executive Secretary, the Y. P. Executive Treasurer and the editor of Pilgrim Youth constitute a Conference Young People's Committee.
- D. Be it resolved that space in the Conference Minutes be given for the business transacted in the Young People's Convention.

**REPORT OF THE YOUNG PEOPLE'S RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE AS
ADOPTED BY THE OHIO CONFERENCE Y. P. CONVENTION
BUSINESS SESSION**

Resolution No. 1.

Inasmuch as we feel the visits of our executive secretary to our Zones during the past year have been a great blessing,
Be it resolved that this visit be a part of our permanent program.

Resolution No. 2.

In order to enlist the greatest degree of cooperation in our Zone work,
Be it resolved that each Zone chairman arrange a meeting with the district superintendent or superintendents and the pastors of his Zone as soon after conference as possible, to plan the program for his Zone for the year.

Resolution No. 3.

Be it resolved that this body request the annual conference to grant space in the district minutes for the Young People's Convention Business.

Resolution No. 4.

Be it resolved that we request our council to give careful and prayerful consideration to providing for a separate youth convention to be held at a different time other than just before Camp.

Resolution No. 5.

We recommend that the executive committee and Zone chairmen be kept in the age limit of 35 so far as it is practical.

Resolution No. 6.

Be it resolved that the resolutions committee and the ways and means committee be standing committees to be appointed by our Executive Committee as soon after the Y. P. Annual Business Meeting as possible.

Resolution No. 7.

Be it resolved that the Ohio Pilgrim Youth be published monthly, ten months out of the year, the two months excepted be determined by the editor.

Resolution No. 8.

Be it resolved that we make our youth project for the coming year the decoration of the tabernacle, details of such project to be worked out by the Y.P. Executive Committee.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

WESTERN DISTRICT

To our beloved Chairman, Rev. A. H. Wilson, and the ministerial and lay delegation of this forty-eighth Annual Conference of the Ohio District, Pilgrim Holiness Church; greetings in the name of the one and only God, our Creator and Redeemer.

With each passing year we are constantly confronted with the fact of the unworthiness and inefficiency of mankind, and our dependence for grace and wisdom on the loving heart and never-failing arm of our gracious Redeemer. Therefore for blessings, both spiritual and material, we reverently bow our head and give Him thanks. In times of weakness He has been our strength; when wisdom was needed He has supplied; in the long, wearing drives of the night seasons, on roads made dangerous because of rain or ice, He has been our constant companion and protector. Health has been granted throughout the year so that we have been able to keep our appointments from time to time. And a disposition of heart and mind to be true to God and the church has been our ever present source of encouragement in every test and disappointment.

The fellowship with the saints has been more than heart could ask. We continue to find our people, both ministers and laymen, serving with the thought of giving only their best to the Master in every possible manner. Our visits with our good Pilgrims on the Western District of Ohio this past conference year have been as pleasant as humanly possible. Every kindness has been shown, every consideration manifested, that we might be made comfortable and helped to feel at home while among them. The one word that seems to cover the ground most completely is, "Wonderful," with all that one word can express.

State of the District: It is indeed a pleasure to say that the Lord has been pleased to visit a number of the churches on the Western District this past conference year with exceptionally good revival meetings. A goodly number of men and women, as well as young folk, have found the Lord in either pardon or purity as a result. This means that the membership in those churches so visited by the Holy Spirit have been enriched and increased. And, as we realize, new blood means new life, and new life means new energy, and new energy means a greater effort for the salvation of lost humanity. And wherever a spirit inspired effort is put forth in the name of the Christ, our God does bless with victory.

In the Sunday School department we find a continued interest manifested in those localities where special effort began to be put forth during the past to enlarge the attendance. Our people in such cases are learning that a real effort, backed up by the help of the Holy Spirit, pays real dividends.

Both youth and adults are being gathered in from the streets and homes to the effect that some of our schools have shown a remarkable growth in recent months. Our most earnest prayer is that the Holy Spirit will inspire all our pastors and Sunday School superintendents to put forth a like effort to reach the multitudes still not under the influence of the teaching of the Word of God. We are confident that what a number of our Sunday Schools have done, all can do, if we put forth the same effort to make our Sunday Schools a success. May the dear Lord help us to remember that in thousands of boys and girls that never attend a Sunday School are the leaders of tomorrow. And the type of leaders they are to be is largely up to us who are supposed to be the teachers of the true Faith. One reason we have so much infidelity and wickedness in the United States of America today is because the church has failed to sense its responsibility in connection with its divine call to go out into the highways and byways, seeking the lost for whom Christ died, and lead them to the fountain of life. In all of our larger cities, and in many of the rural communities, there are vast untouched fields of golden opportunity,

awaiting the coming of consecrated men and women to whom the Holy Spirit has given a vision of the great need and our privilege for rendering real and lasting service to our God and lost humanity. Those of us to whom God has given this great vision, may it be increased. To those pastors and Sunday School workers who have not as yet gotten the picture, may the blessed Holy Ghost stir us to do something really worth while in the months that lie ahead.

Improvements: On the ninth of December the Elmwood Pilgrims dedicated their beautiful new basement church with a splendid crowd in attendance. This fine building is the result of much prayer and sacrificing labor on the part of both pastors and congregation over the past several years. The Greenville Pilgrims have put a new ceiling in their church and re-decorated the whole interior. Also a new porch and cement walks at the parsonage. The West Carrollton Pilgrims have also re-decorated their church, adding much to the beauty of the interior. The church at Defiance has purchased an additional property next door to the parsonage, and has converted the small cottage on same into a place of worship for the young people. The good Pilgrim at Liberty Center have purchased a badly needed parsonage, that is much appreciated by the pastor and his family. The Delphos church has also gotten a neat little parsonage, and all paid for during the conference year, which proves that where there is a will to do something worth while, the Lord will provide a way. The Pilgrims at Richwood have gotten a new place of worship which will add much to the pleasure of the hour of service there. Also the Piqua Pilgrims have provided new rooms for their growing Sunday School, as well as other improvements, all of which will aid them in their effort to continue to grow. The First Church at Springfield has made considerable improvement at the parsonage, which is greatly appreciated by the pastor's good wife. Also the Springfield Second Church has gotten into their new basement and are enjoying it much as they labor for the lost of that section of the city. And the one year old church at Washington C. H. has been forced to rent a larger building to care for its fast growing Sunday School. This Sunday School has grown from zero to a high of seventy in the twelve months since organization. Thanks be to God for hard working Pilgrims that are satisfied only when going forward. The congregation at Peebles has also made extensive improvements in the past conference year. All of these are an inspiration to the rest of us to plan great things for the future, and that we will not be satisfied until those plans become a reality.

Home Missionary Efforts: Immediately following the Annual Conference of last year a district tent was pitched in the small town of Dola which resulted in a small class being organized, but because we were unable to secure a building in which to worship, it was impossible to continue and the class broke up. During the winter months, under the direction of the District Home Missionary Committee, we again presented the need of a more extended Home Missionary effort to the churches on the Western District with the result that better than seventeen hundred dollars were raised above the regular Home Missionary budget. As a result of this extra help we have been able to put on four tent campaigns this summer in four different parts of the district. The first of June one tent was pitched in Amelia, a small town in the southern end of the district, but nothing was accomplished toward an organization. The other tent was placed in the town of Wapakoneta at about the same time, and this effort proved fruitless also. The first of July a tent was placed in the city of Xenia where it seems we may be able to get a church later. Several persons in that city are looking our way, and we hope to secure a building in the near future and start regular services. At the same time the other tent was pitched in Van Wert, and has continued for six weeks. The prospect here is very good, and we are expecting to be able to organize a good group into a P. H. Church in the near future. Broader plans are being made for Home Missionary activities this year than ever before in the district.

At this point in our report we would like to make mention of the needs of our worthy pastors. A few of them are getting a reasonable support for their labors, but the majority of these consecrated men are trying to make ends meet on a salary far beneath that which they should be getting. I am

of the opinion that if our people would consider more carefully the needs of the men that are bringing them their spiritual food from Sunday to Sunday the Lord would more richly bless our churches with a greater outpouring of the Holy Spirit. I trust the lay delegates will return to their respective churches with this message to our good people. The pastor should have as nice a home, as good clothes to wear, and as good food on his table as his congregation. Forget that new television and fix up the parsonage and see how much better the pastor will preach, and the Lord will bless us for so doing.

Personal Report: During the year I have driven twenty-five thousand miles in the interest of the district.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

EASTERN DISTRICT

Brother Chairman:

To the pastors, evangelists, delegates and friends of the forty-eighth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Churches of the Ohio District on Sugar Grove Hill, Springfield, Ohio.

Greetings in the precious name of Jesus!

We thank God for the great plan of salvation, and the gift of His dear Son for our redemption, His mercy, love and grace, that He so graciously extended to us. It is with a deep sense of gratitude that we come to this hour. Through the providence of God we have been privileged to meet again to do business for God and the church. How good God is. In Him we live and move and have our being, and without Him we are a failure. Without divine help we could not carry on the great program that is before us.

When we sense our great responsibility we feel our utter dependence is in God. For it is "not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit saith the Lord" which enables us to go forward. The Lord has revealed Himself in many ways. This has been one of the most fruitful years we have experienced since we have been on the district. To Him we give all the praise.

We wish to thank every pastor and church for their fine spirit of co-operation. Through this combined effort we feel every department of the work of the church has gone forward. We believe we have as spiritual a people as you will find anywhere.

We do not have words to express our appreciation for the kind reception the pastors and the churches have given us. We have enjoyed the Christian fellowship with the saints everywhere, and we are praying the Lord will reward everyone for their kind words and deeds.

New Churches Organized: On September 16, we were privileged to organize a new church in the city of Columbus on the corner of Oakwood and Kosseth Sts., where Rev. Jacob Swisher has labored faithfully and as a result, we organized with fifteen members and six new members have been added since (Makes a total of 21 members). This group worships in a fine church building, which costs them \$100.00 per month rent. Rev. Swisher has accomplished all of this while laboring with his hands for a livelihood. They have a fund started to purchase said church and let us pray that this fund will continue to grow as well as the church, that the Lord will enable them to buy the building in which they worship and go forward.

On March 15 we were privileged to organize a new church in Gephart, a little village about 15 or 20 miles northeast of Portsmouth. Last winter the Lord laid it on the heart of Reverend Frank Williams of the Wheelersburg church to hold a revival there, and through his faithful labors and prayers the result was we organized with 10 members and 4 more members have been added since (Makes a total of 14 members). Brother Williams is the pastor there and they have approximately 50 in attendance in Sunday School. They worship in a one room school house which has been converted into a splendid church building, located in a beautiful grove in the village of Gephart.

On May 2 we were privileged to organize the church at Morgan Center. This church had been abandoned but through the noble effort and faithful labor of Reverend N. L. Russell, reopened the church and preached faithfully there, and then his brother, Noble, succeeded him who continued with the work and as a result we organized with 12 members. The day of organization was surely marked by the presence of the Lord. Reverend Noble Russell is pastor and the work is going forward.

On June 8 we were privileged to organize a new church in East Toledo with 15 members. This work was made possible by faithful labors and

prayers of Reverend and Mrs. Edwin Brown. This is the second church the Browns have brought to the Pilgrims in the City of Toledo. The day of organization was a great day, the Lord met with us in a wonderful way. They have a splendid Sunday School and they worship in a nicely decorated and equipped hall, and just recently they have purchased a fine lot not far from the present place of worship where they intend to build a new church. Reverend Edwin Brown is the pastor.

It is indeed a privilege to present these four new substantial churches to the conference with a total of 62 members. To God we give the praise.

Our Home Missionary Committee are Godly men and it is a pleasure to work with them.

Dedication Services: On September 9 we dedicated new additional Sunday School rooms to the Wheelersburg Church where Rev. Roy Hill, Sr., is pastor. This new addition was greatly needed for its fine growing Sunday School.

On October 8, it was our pleasure to dedicate new additional Sunday School rooms to the Nelsonville Church where Rev. Simpson is pastor. A great day was enjoyed and this addition is a fine asset to this splendid Sunday School.

On May 18 we had the privilege to dedicate a splendid lot in the village of Baltimore where Rev. King is pastor. This lot is free from debt and was dedicated for the purpose of erecting a new church building on the same. A special manifestation of the Spirit of God came on the service that day and the people gave liberally of their means amidst tears and shouts of praise for a new church.

CHURCH ACTIVITIES, MATERIALLY

The Akron Church, where Bro. Watters is pastor, has been redecorated, new seats installed, also pulpit and other improvements, besides new Sunday School rooms in the basement.

The Resolutions Committee Reported.

Resolution No. 1

Inasmuch as we feel the visits of our executive secretary to our zones during the past year have been a great blessing, be it resolved that this visit be a part of our permanent program.

Resolution No. 2

In order to enlist the greatest degree of cooperation in our zone work, be it resolved that each zone chairman arrange a meeting with the district superintendent, or superintendents, and the pastors of his zone as soon after conference as possible to plan the program for his zone for the year.

Resolution No. 3

Be it resolved that the Young People's Convention request the Annual Conference to grant space in the Conference Minutes for the Young People's Convention business.

Resolution No. 4

Resolution No. 8

Be it resolved that our youth project for the coming year be the decoration of the tabernacle, details of such project to be worked out by our Y. P. Executive Committee.

Ways and Means Committee

Resolution No. 1

A. Be it resolved that an executive fund, out of which the expenses incidental to the functioning of the Executive Committee in their official duties, be maintained.

B. Be it further resolved that each church pay \$2.50 a year to maintain the fund.

C. Be it further resolved that the Executive Secretary be reimbursed .06 per mile for traveling expenses.
