CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SESSION

The Twenty-fourth Annual Conference of the Ontario District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9 a.m., Monday, July 18, 1949, in the Camp Meeting Tent, Proton, Ontario.

Bro. C. B. Grassie conducted the opening song, "Lead Me Higher Up the Mountain", then Bros. J. W. Bray and Alvin Jackson led the Conference in prayer.

The District Superintendent, Rev. H. W. Hobbs, introduced and welcomed as leader of the Conference Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary of Home Missions and Church Extension. Bro. Beltz read a Scripture lesson from Acts 15:1-31, and then brought a helpful and practical message on the subject, "Facing and Solving Our Problems".

The speaker dealt first with the general attitude in which problems should be met. They should not be run from, not ignored, not attacked impulsively, but rather they should be faced, studied, and solved in the spirit manifested in the early church (Acts 15).

The messenger then enlarged upon the minister's responsibilities in connection with some particular problems, as follows:

Where spiritual lethargy exists, the minister is responsible to stir his people.

Where standards are wavering, though unscriptural extremes should be avoided, it is the minister's responsibility to instruct in the teaching of God's Word concerning outward conduct, and especially to emphasize the sanctity and authority of the Moral Law.

Financial problems can be solved by systematic planning as opposed to haphazard lack of method.

The difficult problem of human relations can be solved by considering all the facts, in the right spirit, with the aim to heal rather than to hurl out as "rubbish", and by following the policy of "masterful inactivity" until the Holy Spirit may have time to do His work.

In view of all these responsibilities, the worker should pray that he himself might become "not a part of the problem but a part of the answer".

Bro. Beltz announced the appointment of Sister Gladys White as Conference Secretary pro tem.

Fifteen members responded to the ministerial roll call.

The Chairman drew attention to the fact that Rev. Grace Kellaway's name had inadvertently been omitted from the Conference list in last year's Minutes.

In response to Sister Kellaway's request, the motion was passed that Sister Kellaway's letter of transfer to the Pittsburg District be issued and forwarded.

After the information was given that Bro. and Sister G. B. Carroll had requested their transfer, the motion was passed that the Secretary write Bro. and Sister Carroll a letter expressing our sympathy in view of Sister Carroll's illness, and our great

appreciation for their splendid service in the Ontario District.

A motion was passed that the following names be added to the Conference roll:

Sister Irene Tanier, ordained minister from Ohio District;
Sister Darlene Zimmerman, holding second-year license from Ohio District;

Bro. Alvin Jackson, ordained minister from the Virginia District;

Bro. Moreland Yundt, ordained minister from the Indiana Conference; and

Bro. C. B. Grassie, ordained minister from the Church of the Nazarene.

Bro. Beltz introduced these new members to the Conference and called up each for a brief word of testimony.

The roll call of lay delegates from the churches was taken and the list completed.

By motion the Conference bar was set to include the first three rows across the tent.

The District Superintendent announced the Committees appointed, as follows:

Resolutions—Bros. J. W. Bray, Alvin Jackson, and Sister Irene Tanier;

Statisticians—Bros. Earl Bray and Fred Wagner.

Auditing Committee—Bros. S. D. Short and Alvin Jackson;

Reception Committee—Bros. J. W. Bray and Alvin Jackson.

The Reception Committee at this time presented Rev. J. E. Crites, Pastor of the Church of the Nazarene, Owen Sound, who was welcomed by Bro. Beltz, called for a word of testimony, and was given an honorary seat at the Conference bar.

By common consent the next order of business was reports.

The District Superintendent's Report was called for.

Bro. Beltz reported that the office had been held by three people this year. Rev. F. A. Hobbs, the appointed Superintendent, had held office until November; upon his resignation, the responsibility of supervision had reverted to Bro. Beltz, until the appointment by the General Board at the May meeting, when Rev. H. W. Hobbs was appointed. Bro. Beltz further reported that he had made three trips to the District, one for the Ministerial Convention, one for the Bible School Commencement, and a third for Annual Church Meetings.

Rev. H. W. Hobbs reported that during his brief tenure of the office, he had made a trip to Oshawa, and another to Massey, conducting these Annual Meetings, and that after his accident the remaining time was taken in preparations for Camp.

By motions these oral reports were accepted.

The Treasurer's Report was next in order.

Bro. Beltz reported that Bro. G. B. Carroll, appointed Treasurer, had completed his report up to five days before the close of the Conference year, at which time he had left his books with the District Superintendent. Bro. Beltz stated that a notable achieve-

ment of the year's financing was the repayment of funds borrowed from one department for use in another, until now only one hundred dollars remains to be paid.

The Treasurer's Report was read by Bro. H. W. Hobbs.

By motion the report was accepted.

The Financial Report of Pilgrim Bible College was read by the Treasurer, Sister Florence White.

The Auditors' Report was read by Bro. S. D. Short.

Moved, seconded and carried that the Pilgrim College Financial Report and the Auditors' Report be accepted.

A partial report from the Resolutions Committee was read by the chairman, Rev. J. W. Bray.

A motion prevailed to consider each item separately.

By motion Resolution number 1 was adopted.

By motion Resolution number 2 was adopted.

It was moved and seconded to adopt Resolution number 3 that asked for the deletion of Standing Resolutions, numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 9, 13, 16, 20, 21, and 22 from the Minutes.

A motion prevailed to consider each item of Resolution number 3 separately.

A motion prevailed that Standing Resolution number 1 be referred to the Ways and Means Committee.

By a motion that carried, the Statisticians were excused from the Conference to complete their report.

A motion prevailed that Standing Resolution number 2 be amended to read, "Resolved that the Conference appoint Rev. Moreland Yundt as Editor of the District paper and that one page be devoted to Sunday school promotional work."

It was moved and seconded that the amended Resolution be adopted. This motion carried.

A motion prevailed that Standing Resolutions number 3 and number 4 be referred to the Ways and Means Committee.

A motion to delete Standing Resolution number 5 carried.

A motion prevailed to delete Standing Resolution number 9.

A motion to delete Standing Resolution number 13 was defeated.

A motion to delete Standing Resolution number 16 was voted by the Conference.

A motion to amend Standing Resolution number 20 to read, "That the District Treasurer forward to the Editor of the District paper a monthly report revealing each church's standing regarding their payments on their District Budget assessments", was successful.

The motion to adjourn the Conference until 2 p.m. passed. The session was dismissed with prayer.

SECOND SESSION

The second session of the Conference opened at 2 p.m., with Brother Yundt conducting the song "They Are Covered by the Blood", and Sister Irene Tanier led the Conference in prayer.

A portion of the minutes of the first session were read by the Secretary pro tem, Miss Gladys White, and stood approved as read.

Action upon the recommendations of the Resolutions Committee continued.

A motion prevailed deleting Standing Resolution number 21.

A motion to delete Standing Resolution number 22 carried.

A motion prevailed to adopt Resolution number 4, amending Resolution number 6.

A motion prevailed adopting Resolution number 5, amending Standing Resolution number 11.

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was read by Rev. Robert Gordon.

A motion prevailed to consider each item of the report separately.

A motion prevailed amending Resolution number 1 by adding the words, "to be paid monthly at the rate of fifty cents per member".

By motion, Resolution number 1, as amended, was adopted.

A motion prevailed adopting Resolution number 2.

A motion to adopt Resolution number 3 carried.

A motion to adopt Resolution number 4 was passed by the Conference.

A motion prevailed to adopt the Ways and Means Committee's Resolution number 5.

The Statistical Report was read by Bro. Earl Bray.

By motion the report was accepted.

The joint reports of the Examining and Educational Boards were read by Bro. J. W. Bray.

By motion the report was received.

It was agreed that the report be voted upon in its entirety. By motion the report was adopted.

Sister Audrey Cole, thus granted credentials, was invited within the Conference bar.

The Financial Report of the 1948 Camp Meeting was read by the Treasurer, Bro. Fred Wagner.

By motion the report was accepted.

The next order of business was the election of officers.

Bro. Beltz announced that he had been delegated authority by the General Board to appoint the District Treasurer and the District Secretary. He then announced his appointment of Rev. Alvin Jackson as District Treasurer and Rev. Moreland Yundt as District Secretary.

The District Superintendent appointed Bro. Crites and Bro. Arthur Watson as tellers.

On the first ballot the two additional members of the District Council were elected, namely, Bro. C. B. Grassie and Bro. J. W. Bray.

As the third member of the Examining Board, Sister Irene Tanier was elected for three years.

As the third member of the Educational Board, Sister Gladys White was re-elected for three years.

It was moved that we re-elect by acclamation the members of the Trustee Board. Seconded and carried.

It was moved and seconded that the committees be appointed by the District Superintendent.

An amendment was made and seconded that the committees be appointed by the District Council. The amendment carried.

By ballot for the lay member of the Bible College Board, Bro. Earl Vessie was elected.

On the ballot for two ministerial delegates to General Conference (1950) Bro. C. B. Grassie and Bro. J. W. Bray were elected.

By ballot on the two highest remaining names, Bro. F. A. Hobbs was declared first alternate and Sister Irene Tanier as second alternate ministerial delegate to General Conference.

A motion was passed that the District Council make nominations for lay delegate to General Conference.

The nominations of the District Council for lay delegates were read by the District Superintendent as follows: Bros. Clarence Watson, William Bowden, and E. G. Rossiter.

On the first ballot for lay delegate, Bro. Clarence Watson was elected.

It was moved and seconded that the one having the second highest number of votes be declared alternate lay delegate. The motion was passed and Mr. E. G. Rossiter was declared elected.

The matter of Memorials for General Conference was referred to the District Council. The Superintendent announced that the District Council had decided to submit no Memorials.

It was moved and second that a rising vote of thanks be tendered to the General Secretary of Home Missions and Church Extension for his efficient services in conducting this Conference. The Conference responded by a rising vote of thanks.

A motion prevailed that the Conference adjourn.

The closing prayer was offered by Bro. C. B. Grassie.

- No. IV. Resolved that our District Superintendent be paid seventy-five dollars per month, fifty dollars to be paid from the District Budget account and twenty-five dollars from the Bible School account.
Be it further resolved that his travelling expense be set at four cents per mile, to be paid half from the District Budget and half from the School account,—all offerings received for travelling to be applied on the four cents a mile.
- No. V. Resolved that each church raise the equivalent of seventy-five cents per member for General Conference expense, and that these funds be sent to the District Treasurer not later than May 15, 1950.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that the local church shall take up a special offering previous to Camp-meeting for the support of the pastor during Camp and Conference and for the support of the delegates during Conference.
2. Resolved that the District Council appoint a Camp-meeting Secretary-Treasurer, whose duties shall be to take care of all correspondence and publicity for the Camp; and to receive and disburse all funds of the Camp and Conference, keeping a complete record of same.
3. Resolved that all stationed preachers come, send someone, or pay the equivalent of two days' labor for the preparation of the District Camp and Conference, when called by the District Superintendent.

4. Resolved that twenty-five cents be set as the fee for each examination of the Study Course, plus expense of postage and questions.
5. Resolved that each local church supply the parsonage with cooking and heating equipment.
6. Considering the importance of Sunday School work relative to the future, be it resolved that the Conference elect a District Committee, comprising three members.
7. Whereas Missionary vision and prayer are of even more vital necessity that the raising of finances, and are an aid to the raising of the same, and whereas information and inspirations are indispensable to that end, we recommend that our pastors diligently continue the monthly missionary meetings, alternating between Home and Foreign Missions.
8. Resolved that the District Superintendent and the District Council comprise our District Home Missionary Committee.
9. Resolved that all money raised for District Funds be forwarded to the District Treasurer at the end of each month.
10. Resolved that a remuneration of ten dollars (\$10.00) per annum be paid to the District Secretary-Treasurer.
11. Resolved that before calling an evangelist, the pastor shall consult with and act on the advice of the District Superintendent.
12. Resolved that the District Treasurer forward to the District paper a monthly report revealing each church's standing regarding their payment on the District Budget assessments and their pastor's payments of his tithe.
13. Whereas we have a number of young people attending Camp, be it resolved that the District Council appoint two supervisors, one for the boys and one for the girls, and have posted a set of rules to govern the conduct of the young people, the rules to be enforced by the supervisors.
14. Resolved that each church grant their pastor a two weeks' vacation (including two Sundays) with pay; if the pastor is not on a stated salary, the holiday pay shall equal his average weekly offerings.
