CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

THE FIRST SESSION

The Twenty-fifth Annual Conference of the Ontario District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9 a.m., Monday, July 17th, 1950, in the Pilgrim Holiness Church at Proton, Ontario.

Rev. Earl Bray led the congregation in singing, "Jesus shall reign" and "My Jesus I love Thee", after which Rev. Colin B. Grassie, pastor of the Proton Church, led in prayer. After prayer, Brother Bray led the conference in singing "Satisfied."

The District Superintendent, Rev. H. W. Hobbs being temporarily absent, Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary of Church Extension, introduced the presiding officer of the conference, Rev. L.

W. Sturk, General Superintendent.

Rev. Sturk addressed the conference, taking as the Scripture lesson for his remarks Mark 9:17-29; and as a title for his message, "The Call to Prayer and the Program of Evangelism in our Church."

He suggested that the General Board and the General Conference adopted the church-wide program as a result of definite needs revealed in our day, that the revelation of those needs has driven us to action, and the call to prayer evidences someone has a burden to see these needs met through the abundant fulness of Christ's provision.

A few of his pungent remarks were as follows:

"Our church was founded on the question of the doctrine of entire sanctification." He further stated the need in the experience of our people and gave a short resume of our history, stating the need of a spiritual rebirth in our midst.

"Every preacher is called to win souls, and if they fail, we will fail as a church."

"If we keep the Pentecostal fire burning in our hearts we have every reason to continue along the lines upon which the church was founded."

"The Call to prayer came from God-called men who had a burden for the work of our church and saw the need of fasting and prayer."

"We are doing too little according to the pattern set by the early Pentecostal Church and we are doing too little in comparison with what Christ has done for us."

"To see the attainment of the goal we must pay the price in fasting and prayer."

Rev. Sturk concluded with some encouraging statistics, showing that our denomination was making gains that compared favorably with other holiness groups.

The District Secretary called the roll and twenty members were present.

There was a motion to seat Miss Marjorie Pollard to serve as the Oshawa delegate in the absence of both the delegate and the alternate. The motion carried.

After a few words explaining the change in the status of the licensed deaconesses at the recent general conference, the Chairman suggested that the licensed deaconesses present be seated within the conference bar and be permitted to have voice in the proceedings, but without a vote. The motion to seat the deaconesses prevailed.

The conference bar was set as within the first three front rows of seats in the auditorium.

The District Superintendent, Rev. H. W. Hobbs, gave his report, which was accepted as read.

Rev. C. B. Grassie read the report of the auditing committee,

which was received by the conference.

A motion prevailed that the District Secretary serve as reporter to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate of both the district camp and conference.

The District Treasurer, Rev. Alvin Jackson, read his report to the conference, after mimeographed copies had been passed out to the delegates. The general officers both commended the splendid report, which was accepted by the conference.

Rev. Moreland Yundt, District Promotional Sunday School Secretary, read his report of his activities and the accomplishments of the district in this field. The fine report was received.

This was followed by Brother Yundt's report as Editor of the Canadian Pilgrim. The report which covered both the editing and publishing of the district paper was accepted by the conference.

The District Superintendent appointed Rev. C. B. Grassie and Rev. J. W. Bray to serve as the reception committee during the conference.

The Reception Committee then presented Rev. Cleve Winger and Rev. A. Muir to the chairman, who had Bro. Hobbs present them to the conference. These men each testified of their personal relationship with Christ, and voiced their intention to unite with the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

The conference took a brief respite from business and united in singing "When we all get to Heaven."

The Statistician, Rev. Fred Wagner, gave a partial report of the District statistics.

Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary of Church Extension, explained to the Conference the new standing of the District in their relation to the General Church and the Church Extension Department. He informed the Conference they would be privileged to vote on all their District officials for the coming Conference year.

There was a motion to adjourn the Conference until 1.45 p.m.

THE SECOND SESSION

The second session opened with Rev. C. B. Grassie leading the congregation in singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms", and "Happy Day".

In the interim while waiting upon the delegates to gather, Rev. Sturk gave a short message upon the false teachings and their dangers.

A motion prevailed to omit the roll call for the balance of the conference.

The Pilgrim Bible College Treasurer's report was read by Miss Marjorie Pollard and accepted.

The District Statistician read his completed report and it was accepted.

The District Secretary informed the Chairman that the Dis-

trict Council ratified the Examining and Educational Boards' reports to the Conference.

These Boards reported and their reports were accepted by the conference.

The motion prevailed that we as a conference proceed with the election of officers for the new conference year.

Ballots were cast for District Superintendent and Rev. Moreland S. Yundt was elected. Brother Yundt spoke briefly, paying tribute to the faithful and hard work of Brother Hobbs, and requesting the conference to hold him up in prayer as he accepted the grave responsibilities of the office at this time.

Rev. J. W. Bray was elected as the Assistant District Superintendent. He pledged his best in assisting the District Superintendent.

Rev. C. B. Grassie was elected as District Secretary. He promised to do his best to keep the records straight.

In keeping with the requirements of the Church Manual, the District Council nominated Rev. A. L. Jackson as District Treasurer. Their nominee was elected by the conference.

Advisory members of the District Council were elected. They are Rev. H. W. Hobbs, Rev. C. Winger and Rev. F. Wagner.

Rev. C. B. Grassie was elected for three years to the District Examining Board.

Mrs. A. L. Jackson was elected for three years to the District Educational Board.

A motion prevailed electing the District Trustee Board to serve another year. They are Wilfred McNally, Ernest Robinson and Frank Bain.

The Resolutions Committee reported on the conference. After the reading a motion prevailed to hear the first resolution in its entirety and the Conference adopted it ordering the deletions recommended.

Resolution Number 2 was amended to read, "Inasmuch as our District is exempted from paying the General Budget we recommend —". The resolution was adopted as amended.

Resolution Number 3 was amended to read that the District Treasurer be paid \$25.00 and the District Secretary \$10.00 for their services.

Resolution Number 4 was read and adopted.

Resolutions Numbers five, six, seven and eight were read and adopted in their order by the conference.

A motion prevailed to adjourn immediately and reconvene at 6.30 p.m. and that the Ordination service be conducted at 8.00 p.m.

THE THIRD SESSION

At 6.30 p.m. the Conference came to order and Rev. Earl Bray led the people in singing "Amazing Grace." He sang a solo, "I'll not have to cross Jordan alone." Rev. L. W. Sturk requested Sister Tanier to lead in prayer.

Business commenced with the report of the Ways and Means Committee.

Recommendations Number One, Two and Three were each read and adopted in order by the Conference.

After the reading of Recommendation Number Four the motion to adopt was voted unanimously and hilariously by the delegates standing and giving a hearty "Amen."

A motion passed that we express our appreciation to Rev. R. A. Beltz for the splendid supervision during the past quadrennium he has given the Ontario District. The Conference responded with a rising vote of thanks and singing "God be with you till we meet again." During the singing the delegates and visitors marched around giving Brethren Beltz the right hand of fellowship and wishing him God's blessing on his future labour as the General Secretary of Church Extension.

A vote of appreciation to our General Superintendent for his services as the Presiding Officer and his godly messages and counsel, was expressed by the conference saying a hearty "God bless you."

The conference unanimously expressed the appreciation all felt for our retiring District Superintendent, Rev. H. W. Hobbs, who has blest the entire District by his earnest and faithful labours. The Conference and visitors voted unanimously by a rising vote of thanks.

Rev. R. A. Beltz informed the Conference that the Church Manual provided that retiring District Superintendent be paid one month's salary after their term of office expired, and that the Church Extension Department would pay their share with the District on the August salary of Brother Hobbs.

At 8.00 p.m. an impressive and spiritual Ordination Service was conducted by General Superintendent Sturk. Rev. Cleveland Winger was the candidate. The Council of Ordination consisted of Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary of Church Extension; Rev. H. W. Hobbs, District Superintendent; Rev. Moreland S. Yundt, District Secretary; Rev. A. L. Jackson, District Treasurer; and Rev. J. W. Bray, Advisory Member of the District Council.

After the reading of appropriate Scriptures, Rev. Beltz offered prayer, and Rev. L. W. Sturk gave the charge to the candidate, basing his remarks on Acts 26:12-19; and speaking of the Minister's Responsibilities, Resources and Rewards.

At the conclusion the conference bowed in prayer and the brethren of the Ordination Council laid their hands on Brother Winger while the General Superintendent ordained him to the ministry of the Word. A very precious sense of the Lord's Presence came to our hearts as we waited on Him.

Tears of joy and words of praise were mingled with congratulatory expressions as the assembled people marched to the front of the sanctuary and wished Brother Winger God's blessing. The service closed with the singing of "Blest be the tie that binds."

A motion prevailed to adjourn the Conference.

The General Superintendent closed the Conference with the Benediction.

THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

"To the Twenty-fifth Annual Conference of the Ontario District, Greetings:

Grace be unto you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

I thank my God upon every remembrance of you. Always in every prayer of mine for you all, making request with joy. For your fellowship in the Gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this very thing, that He which hath began a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ.

I would like to preface this report with a few words of personal testimony. I rejoice in the consciousness of the cleansing of the precious blood and the abiding Presence of the Holy Spirit. In spite of some discouragements and problems that have come our way this year, the rest of the soul has never been sweeter, and the call of God to preach the everlasting Gospel burns in our heart.

This year brought the disappointment to our people of the closing of the newly opened High School Department of the Bible College at the end of the first semester. I personally regret my failure to properly evaluate our task in this respect, and attempting that for which we as a District had neither the financial resources nor a sufficient and properly qualified staff. I do not believe that it is proper or right to take any attitude of defeatism with respect to our District because of this. In the light of the fact that we do not have a sufficient number of students to justify the expenditures necessary to operate the school, I feel that we as a District would do well to send our students who desire a Bible training to one of our larger schools, and if necessary help them from a Student Loan Fund.

Let us turn our forces and funds to pushing out and evangelising in Ontario. I am sure that if we will do this that a day will come when our constituency will be so far enlarged as to enable us to successfully operate a Canadian Pilgrim College.

We now cite some of the material improvements on the District properties.

Oshawa, due to the expropriation of our parsonage for the city planning development, has sold the parsonage to the city for sixty-two hundred dollars. This home was bought two years ago for thirty-two hundred and fifty dollars. They have purchased a beautiful brick home east on the same street for seven thousand dollars. Thus they have doubled the property value at an expense, when the former building is sold, of not more than three hundred dollars.

Massey has re-decorated the interior of their church greatly adding to its attractiveness.

Lion's Head have completed the flooring of their church basement and are planning to install a new heating system permitting them to use the basement for Sunday School rooms.

The work at Thessalon and Bruce Mines has made fine progress under the good leadership of Brother Wagner. The Bruce Mines people have pledged over six hundred dollars to put with the five hundred given by Brother and Sister Pratt. They are hoping to see the building begun in the near future.

An eighteen per cent gain has been made in our Sunday School attendance this year. This is due under God to the splendid work and co-operation of Brother Yundt, the Promotion Secretary, and our pastors and people.

The four-year Program of Evangelism launched recently at our General Conference, if followed with a prayerful purpose, can result in a great forward move in Ontario. The holiness message as emphasized by our church is the clear ringing remedy for the need of the hour. I feel more than ever since attending the General Conference, that the Pilgrim Holiness Church has as great, if not greater doctrinal unity, clarity and spiritual aggressiveness of any of the holiness denominations. God is opening doors to our church over the world, and this applies to the Ontario District. May we with an unworldly and aggressive evangelism fulfill God's purpose for us in this great country of Canada.

In closing, may I present a brief summary of labour on the District.

I preached 153 times, conducted 9 Prayer Services, made 16 visits to the churches, conducted 4 Annual Meetings, with 23 seekers in my services.

I prayed with 8 for healing, solemnized 1 marriage, conducted 2 funerals, dedicated 1 child, and travelled 6280 miles in District and School interests.

Report of the Resolutions Committee

Resolution No. 1.

Resolved that we delete from our list of Standing Resolutions numbers 1, 2, 6, 8, 11, 16 and 18.

Resolution Number 2.

Resolved, that we substitute for Standing Resolution number 7 the following: "Inasmuch as the Ontario District is exempt from paying the General Budget, we recommend that we give special emphasis to the three yearly offerings of the General Church interests. These are: the Rally Day Offering for the General Department of Sunday Schools, the November Self-Denial Offering for Foreign Missions and the Easter Offering for General Church Extension."

Resolution Number 3.

Resolved, that Standing Resolution number 10 be amended to read as follows: "Resolved that a remuneration of \$25.00 be paid to the District Treasurer, and \$10.00 to the District Secretary, annually."

Resolution Number 4.

Resolved, that Standing Resolution number 12 be amended to read: "Resolved, that the District Treasurer forward to the District paper a monthly report revealing each church's standing regarding their payment of District and General interests."

Resolution Number 5.

Resolved that Standing Resolution number 17 be amended to read "Resolved that the District Council appoint an Editor of the District paper and that one page of this paper be devoted to Sunday School and Youth promotional work."

Resolution Number 6.

In the light of a laxity which appears to be growing among our people relative to standards of attire, be it resolved that our preachers call attention of our people to this danger by giving a clear exposition of the Scriptures pertaining to this matter."

Resolution Number 7.

Resolved, that 150 copies of the District Minutes be printed and sold for 25c. per copy.

In the light of the difficulties involved in operating the Pilgrim Bible College, be it resolved that the school be closed.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee

Number 1. We recommend that the salary of the District Superintendent be \$200.00 per month, of which \$75.00 is to be paid by his church and \$125.00 by the District.

Number 2. We recommend that travel expense for District officials be 5c. per mile when using automobile and clergy fare when travelling by train.

Number 3. We recommend that the District Budget be \$5.00 per member, to be divided as follows, \$3.00 for District Administration, \$1.00 for a Student Loan Fund, 50c. for District Camp Expense, and 50c. for General Conference Expense.

Number 4. We recommend that we strengthen and consolidate our smaller churches, and after a careful and thorough survey of the field we endeavour to open one new church this confer-

ence year.

We further recommend, in co-operation with the General Program of Evangelism as adopted by the General Conference, that we urge our pastors and people to fasting and prayer on Friday of each week, for the prayerful promotion of at least one good revival in each church during the year.

Report of Educational and Examining Boards

We recommend for Ordination, Cleveland Winger.

We recommend Renewal of Third Year License to the following: Darlene Zimmerman, Fred Wagner and Earl Bray.

We recommend the granting of Third Year License to the following: Viva Atkinson and Marjorie Pollard.

We recommend granting of First Year License to Albert Muir.

Statement for First Semester—July 17, 1949 to December 31, 1949

SUNDAY SCHOOL PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

To the twenty-fifth Annual Conference of the Ontario District, Greetings in the Name of Christ the Child, and Christ the Youth, Who is our Wonderful Saviour.

God the Father, Christ the Son, and the Third Person of the Trinity, has blessed this district with an above average growth in our Sunday Schools. In addition He has increased both the in-

terest of the laymen and ministry in this important educational arm of our church.

An Indiana Conference pastor, in reporting to me when I was the Indiana Promotional Secretary, said, "As the Sunday School grows, so grows the church." Ontario seems to have learned the truth of this maxim.

Every school except two has grown. One of these, Proton, showed a loss on account of the closing of the high school in mid-term. This school would show a gain if it were possible to deduct the students who attended each year and count only the laymen from this community.

OUR GROWTH AND GAINS:

Last year we had eight Sunday Schools, we now have nine. Bruce Mines was added to our number last January first.

This year has been the first year of intensive Sunday School promotion in the District. The financial expenditures of this promotional drive has paid liberal dividends that are most gratifying. On Rally Day there were 481 in attendance in the district Schools and every pastor and his school reported an over-average attendance. In the District's Sunday School revival, which was our first, we have a District average of 401½ in attendance per Sunday for six weeks.

There is one Daily Vacation Bible School being conducted in the District this summer.

Our biggest monthly average was in May when we had an average per Sunday of 399½ pupils in Sunday School.

Our Conference year's average is 312, an increase of 51 over the 261 we reported for last conference year. This is a gain of 19.54 per cent for the year.

DISTRICT SUNDAY SCHOOL ACTIVITIES :

The Secretary visited every church of the District at least once for a special Sunday School service.

The District conducted a Sunday School Institute in conjunction with the Ministerial Convention in the interest of bettering our schools both in organization and operation.

Every month the Secretary had at least one page of reports and promotional material printed in the Canadian Pilgrim.

Much credit for the over-all growth of the Ontario Sunday Schools should go to the District Superintendent for the hearty moral support he gave the Secretary and to the pastors and their lay-workers for their co-operative spirit and for the 100 per cent record in reporting, an accomplishment most likely unequalled in the entire denomination.

Our momentum is ever increasing and we should see greater gains and growth in this next Conference year than we did this past year. Let us unite our efforts for the greatest and biggest Rally Day that is to be held on Sunday, September 24th. If we all labour for the Master, as we should, we will see the best year in our history in the 1950-51 Conference year.

REPORT OF THE EDITOR OF THE "CANADIAN PILGRIM"

TO THE TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE ONTARIO DISTRICT, GREETINGS :

God in His goodness has permitted and helped us to edit, print and publish the District paper that was so ordered by the twenty-fourth Annual Conference.

From all indications the first eleven issues, of the first volume, were received favourably by the District.

We have had the moral support of the District Superintendent and the complete co-operation of each pastor, in the furnishing of news and in promptness in the mailing of news and reports to the publishing office before publication dates. The District Treasurer has been most prompt and co-operative in the furnishing of the financial reports each month for printing, as ordered by last year's conference.

The paper is mailed to many individuals' addresses, including the General Officers of the Church and some Sunday School Promotional Secretaries and District Superintendents, in both the United States and Canada. Many of these are sent upon request to those interested in our district. The requests for the paper are becoming more numerous with each mailing. Each month a large roll of several copies is mailed to each pastor on the district for distribution among their constituents.

The average printing is two hundred and twenty-five copies per month. At Christmas there were three hundred copies and in June five hundred copies of the Special Camp-meeting issue. Altogether there have been eleven issues with an average printing per issue of two hundred and fifty-seven copies.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that all stationed preachers come, send someone, or pay the equivalent of two days' labour for the preparation for the District Camp and Conference, when called by the District Superintendent.

2. Resolved, that twenty-five cents be set as the fee for each examination of the Study Course, plus expense for postage and questions.

3. Resolved that each local church supply the parsonage with cooking and heating equipment.

4. Resolved, that inasmuch as the Ontario District is exempt from paying the General Budget, we recommend that we give special emphasis to the three yearly offerings for the General Church interests. These are the Rally Day offering for the General Department of Sunday Schools, the November Self-Denial Offering for Foreign Missions, and the Easter Offering for General Church Extension.

5. Resolved, that all money raised for District Funds be forwarded to the District Treasurer at the end of each month.

6. Resolved, that a remuneration of \$25.00 be paid to the District Treasurer, and \$10.00 to the District Secretary, annually.

7. Resolved, that the District Treasurer forward to the District paper a monthly report revealing each church's standing regarding their payment on District and General interests.

8. Whereas we have a number of young people attending the camp, be it resolved that the District Council appoint two supervisors, one for the boys and one for the girls, and have posted a set of rules to govern the conduct of the young people, the rules to be enforced by the supervisors.

9. Resolved, that each church grant their pastors a two weeks' vacation (including two Sundays) with pay; if the pastor is not on a stated salary, the holiday pay shall equal his average weekly offering.

10. Resolved, that all ministerial members of this Conference pay tithe from their ministerial labours into the District treasury.

11. Resolved, that the District Council appoint an Editor of the District paper and that one page of this paper be devoted to Sunday School and Youth promotional work.

12. In the light of a laxity which appears to be growing among our people relative to standards of attire, be it resolved that our preachers call attention of our people to this danger by giving clear exposition of the Scriptures pertaining to this matter.

13. Resolved, that one hundred and fifty copies of the District Minutes be printed and sold for 25c. each.

14. In the light of the difficulties involved in operating the Pilgrim Bible College, be it resolved that the school be closed.
