## MINUTES OF THE FOURTH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE PENNSYLVANIA AND NEW JERSEY DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH.

#### TUESDAY A. M. SESSION

The Members of the Fourth Annual Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at the hour of 9.10 A. M. on March 13th, 1923 at Beulah Park Bible School, Allentown, Pa.
