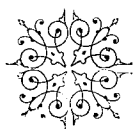

MINUTES OF THE FIFTH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE  
PENNSYLVANIA AND NEW JERSEY DISTRICT OF THE  
PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH.

TUESDAY A. M. SESSION

The Members of the Fifth Annual Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at the hour of 9.30 A. M. on March 11th, 1924 in the Meeting House of the Sunbury Church, Sunbury, Penna.

The first Session was called to order by the District Supt. Rev. W. J. Crider. "Close to Thee" and "Jesus is All the World to Me" was sung after which Bro. Wm. Heslop led in prayer. 1 Thess. 4th Chapter was read by the Supt. with remarks and admonitions for the assembly. Prayer was offered by Bro. H. A. Saneholtz.

Roll Call and the Registration of Preachers and Delegates was next in order. The first five rows of seats were fixed as the Assembly bar.

By motion Bros. O. E. Whipple and J. H. Mease and Sisters Garver and Baker were granted honorary seats in the Assembly bar.

The Minutes of the last session of the 1923 Assembly were and approved.

It was moved and carried that we have a reporter for the local papers and for the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate.

By motion the time of the sessions was made 9.00 to 11.30 A. M. and from 2.00 to 4.30 P. M.

Bro. W. R. Cox the General Supt. is given charge as the presiding officer of the Assembly.

It was decided that the chair appoint all the Committees. Bro. W. R. Cox delegates this authority to the Dist. Supt. W. J. Crider.

Bro. Paul D. Ford, chairman of the Charter Committee reported to the Assembly. By motion the report was accepted with special commendations for having the Bible put in the center of the Seal instead of the Male Coat of Arms.

It was moved and carried that a Railroad Secretary be appointed for the equalization of Railroad fares of all Preachers and Delegates (they being rated separately) with the exception of the local Pastor, Bro. Clough and the lay delegate of the Sunbury Church.

IT was decided to govern the Assembly by the rules of Order as found in the Manual.

Bro. McIntyre, chairman of the Committee on Minutes of the 1923 Assembly reported, which was accepted by motion.

## TUESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION.

MARCH 11th, 1924. 2P. M.

The Session was called to order by the General Supt. Bro. W. R. Cox by singing, "Down at the Cross". Psalms 1 was read for a Scripture lesson with an exhortation emphasizing "Soul Prosperity" and prayer by Bro. O. E. Whipple of New York District.

Roll call and further registration of Preachers and Delegates.

The Minutes of last session were read and approved.

Augustaville reported. Bro. P. D. Ford as Pastor, Bro. H. D. Wolfe as Ch. Delegate and Sr. Aleda B. Conrad as S. S. Delegate. By motion the reports were accepted.

Bethlehem reported. Bro. S. J. McIntyre as Pastor, also read the Ch. report and the S. S. report, the Ch. Del. Sr. Siglin unable to be present and the S. S. Del. Sr. H. B. Young absent. Reports accepted by motion.

Report of tellers on first ballot for Foreign Missionary Board declares Bro. Heslop, Sr. Heslop Sr. Ferguson and Sr. Hatcher elected. The second ballot shows Sr. Lishman elected.

# *REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT.*

To the Annual Assembly of the Penna. and N. J. district of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Greetings:

Another busy Assembly year has slipped by and we have met here in this annual gathering for a few days of fellowship, worship and thanksgiving to our Heavenly Father for his many blessings of the past year, to hear reports from the battle field and to make plans for a more efficient warfare for the ensuing year. May the dear Lord help us.

We want to thank God for the privilege of laboring with a people who stand for a holy ministry and a clean in preference to a large membership. While we detest a spirit of bigotry yet we do not believe we should appreciate the standards of our church, and endeavor to live true to our name, leaving those who do not care to take the plain pilgrim way (after faithfully warning them) to take the path of their choice. We cannot afford to sacrifice our principles and convictions for the sake of human feelings and ties or let down the bars to increase our membership.

We believe we as a Pilgrim Holiness Church are on the right side of all fundamental doctrines of the Bible, that we are reasonably progressive, and have a sphere to fill, a mission to accomplish and by the Grace of God purpose to occupy until Jesus comes.

We are thankful for the co-operation of our beloved pastors and workers which has greatly helped to make this year of advancement on practically all lines. It has been our purpose as we have gone over the district to agitate more of a concern in our churches regarding their local interests, to rally to the support of their pastor and co-operate with him, we hope our efforts have not been in vain. We have endeavored to be true to our covenant relations and give admonition with meekness where we believed it was needed and though in some instances our advice and decisions were not received favorably we have kept sweet.

We believe our churches have enlarged vision on mission-

ary lines both foreign and home, and while a few of our churches do not have the vision they should relative to the Home Missionary work yet we hope for better things in the future. This is not only necessary for the future good of our Home work, but also or that of our Foreign interests and while we would not ask any church to do, less than they are for the Foreign work, we do believe that some of them should do more for the Home Work than they have been doing, thus we help to bear one another's burdens.

We appreciate the evangelistic spirit of our pastors and workers and with few exceptions our churches have enjoyed good revivals and the tent meetings held by our Home Missionary worker and others have not been without results and in these revivals, tent meetings and the Camp Meetings there has been a spirit of solidity which we have longed to see and which we believe will contribute largely to the future welfare of our work.

There have been new churches organized in the following places: Helfenstein by Bro. Saneholtz, New Brighton by Bro. Pridgen, Armbrust and Hollidaysburg by myself and Easton by Bro. King. Helfenstein, Hollidaysburg and Easton have come as a result of the work done by our Home Missionary Workers.

It would take too much time and space to go into details as to the advancement made by our several churches along the line of improvements, paying off indebtedness, erecting and buying buildings: all this will be noticeable in the reports of the delegates,, but we will say it has been a pleasure to note the progress made on these lines; it indicates that our churches are preparing to live and do business for God, and that they do not consider the Pilgrim Holiness Church a mere project but that it has come to stay. While we are erecting buildings, paying off debts and improving our property, let us not forget to keep the glory and fire prayed down so that when we get our buildings up and debts cleared off we will not need to write "Ichabod" over the door.

The Beulah Park Bible School and Camp Meeting ground which has been a source of grave concern and to some extent more so perhaps than need be it is in shape now we believe to

enable us to unload some of its cumbersomeness which will be further explained by the reports that will be given on this floor by those who have that work in hand. The School itself has made marked advancement along all lines.

Our Ministerial Convention held last fall at the Milton Church was well worth while and we believe should be repeated. We would recommend that if possible some provision be made to reimburse the preachers who feel they can hardly afford to bear their own expenses to these conventions and thus encourage attendance as a convention of this kind will prove a blessing to any church and to all attending.

We have discharged our duty to the best of our ability the past year and while there is room no doubt for criticism we would rather have your prayers. By the help of the Lord we have visited each church in the district twice with the exceptions of Zerby, Colyer and New Brighton, being at these places but once each. We have preached about 188 times, held three meetings on the district and two elsewhere, dedicated three children, held business meetings, met church boards, been misunderstood, falsely accused a few times, have had good refreshing times with the brethren and got blessed all over the district. We have received for our support from the district including all sources \$1596.51. Paid out for traveling expenses \$228.74, for postage \$7.47 and typewriter repairs \$2.50.

The Lord has been very gracious to us for which we are very grateful. He has blessed our family and we have had but very little sickness in the home. My being away from home so much has thrown the greater part of the problems and duties of the home and family on Sister Crider's shoulders and while her lot has not been any too pleasant she has sacrificed and borne her part nobly and has in no way thrown a straw of hindrance in the way of our looking after the work trusted to our hand.

We thank God for all that has been accomplished over the district and believe it is the desire and aim of every member of this district to accomplish more if Jesus does not come this next year than in the just passed. To this end may the dear Lord bless us all and keep us on fire.

No.1. *Whereas* there has been considerable trouble in locating certain important papers belonging to the District, be it therefore

No.5. *Whereas*, Bros. Straub and Dubendorf, after having labored faithfully as pastors and evangelists in our district for over seven years, and having been instrumental in the organizing of several churches and are now leaving the district bounds to open up new work in Oregon, be it,

*Resolved* that we as a District Assembly extend to them our heart-felt appreciation for their labors wrought and bid them God speed in their new field of labor.

No.6. *Whereas*, our last Annual Ministerial Convention proved to be such a great spiritual blessing, be it,

*Resolved* that we have a ministerial convention again this year: the date to be Nov. 25-29. The place to be determined by the Assembly and the assignment of subjects by the District Council.

No.7. *Whereas*, the Beulah Park Bible School is the property of the District, be it,

*Resolved* that the Bible School Board be composed of nine members, seven of whom shall be the District Council, the other two to be elected by the Assembly out of four who are to be nominated by the Dist. Supt.

No.8. *Whereas*, our Dist. Supt. is expected to devote his whole time to the district work, be it,

*Resolved* that our Supt. visit each church at least twice a year in accordance with our Manual, expenses to be paid upon each visit, and that each church in the district invite him for a special meeting and during that meeting a free-will offering be lifted for his support.

No.9. *Whereas*, there is a tendency among our people to cater to the world and wearing apparel and unnecessary adornments, be it,

*Resolved* that we ask all our men and women that are wearing gold watch chains and wedding rings, etc., to prayerfully refrain from wearing them, and that we ask our workers in particular to make their wearing apparel exemplary.

No.10. *Whereas*, there is a pressing need of some financial plan for our District, be it,

*Resolved* that each church raise funds to the extent of \$4.00 per member for our requirements, the same to be distributed as follows: General work, except Bible Schools \$1.00 per member, Dist. Supt. and Dist. general expenses \$2.00 per member and Home Missions \$1.00 per member. The same to be raised in any way satisfactory to the local church.

No.11. *Whereas*, our General Supt. Bro. W. R. Cox has so faithfully assisted us again in the deliberations of another Annual Assembly, be it,

*Resolved* that we by a rising vote extend to him our heartfelt appreciation of his presence with us and a cordial invitation to our next Assembly.

No.12. *Whereas*, the Preachers and the Delegates of this Assembly have been so kindly entertained, be it,

*Resolved* that we extend our hearty appreciation to the pastor, Bro. E. R. Clough for his untiring efforts to make everything a success, to the Pilgrims of the local church for their kind labors and to the friends and neighbors for their loving hospitality in the opening of their homes for the entertaining of the delegates. This is to be read in the evening service.

No.6. On page 9 paragraph 4 in line 2, drop the word "Holiness" from the expression "The Pilgrim Holiness Church" so that it will read "The Pilgrim Church."

No.7. On page 46 and paragraph 117 in sub-section 2. Strike it all out as provision is fully made on page 51 and paragraph 128.

No.8. On page 51 and paragraph 128. Strike out the words "Pastor, Superintendent and Secretary" and substitute "The Sunday School Board."

No.9. On page 51 and paragraph 128 include the words, "Except the Superintendent."

No.10. On page 74 and paragraph 193, section 3, Delete the words, "He shall select" etc or, Drop the last sentence of the paragraph (Provided for on page 23, paragraph 41a).

No.11. That provision be made in our Manual for a Church letter to be given to a member from one P. H. Church to another P. H. Church.

No. 12. On page 45 paragraph 117,, sub-section 1, delete the words, "Officers of which" and add "All of Whom."

No.13. That we elect one General Supt. for our Home and Foreign Work and that a Secretary be appointed who shall act under the General Supt.

No.14. We recommend that the General Assembly change our polity for the placing of preachers and that we ask them to present a working plan to meet the supply and demand for pastors.

No.15. On page 62 and paragraph 166. Delete the words, "Their" and substitute "Its" in two places, and drop out the last two clauses.

No.16. On page 64 paragraph 174, Change the paragraph number 153 to 152.

No.17. That all formal prayers printed in the Manual be deleted.

No.18. On page 46. sub-section 8, Delete the number 12 and substitute the number 14.

No.19. On page 47, paragraph 121 Delete note under sub-section 1.

No.20. On page 53 paragraph 135 Delete as the same is covered by page 53 and paragraph 83.

No.21. On Page 24 and paragraph 45, Substitute the word "Biennial" or "Bi-annual" for the word "Quadrennium."
