

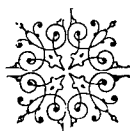

MINUTES OF THE THIRTEENTH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE PENNSYLVANIA AND NEW JERSEY DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

Monday Forenoon Session

The members of the Thirteenth Annual Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at the hour of 9:15 A. M. on July 5th, 1926, in the Tabernacle on the Beulah Park Camp Grounds, Allentown, Pa.

The first session was called to order by the Dist. Supt., Rev. H. A. Saneholtz. "The Solid Rock" was sung, after which Bro. Floyd Baker led in prayer. By motion the rules were suspended and a vote cast for two out of five highest.

Moved and carried that we have two Home Missionaries in the District.

Second ballot for Foreign Missionary Board showed the following elected to the Board: Brothers Hankins and Joppie.

Beech Creek Pastor reports. Reports accepted by motion.

Moved and carried that we accept the Minutes of the Bible School Board, in determining whose term on the board expires.

First ballot showed no election to School Board.

By motion the rules were suspended and a ballot was cast for one out of three highest.

By motion the time was extended 15 minutes.

Reading Pastor reports. Reports accepted by motion.

Second ballot showed no election to School Board.

Auditing Committee brings in a report as to the correctness of the District Secretary and Treasurer's books.

Third ballot showed Brother G. L. Helsby elected to Bible School Board.

By motion the Secretary cast a unanimous ballot for Bros. Straub and Dubendorf for our Home Missionaries.

By motion the Secretary and Treasurer reports of their District Books were accepted.

By motion the time was extended five minutes.

Moved and carried that we express our sorrow by rising, as to the report that has gone out over the District in behalf of our District Treasurer of his being dishonest.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Fifteen more months has become history in the activities of our Church in this district. Great has been the battles and greater has been the victories. Our mighty Captain has been leading in with a Conqueror's tread. Conflicts have been waging and along the battle line there has been some real engagements with our arch enemy, but after the smoke of the skirmishes has cleared away with a retrospective view we can see several places where the devil has been defeated and churches established, with a company of saints who are now testifying to the experience of full salvation. In the very beginning of the Assembly year the Church at Cherryville was organized. The Saints at this place were especially favored in getting a place of worship because they were the sole heirs of a property which had been used by another denomination, but at this time abandoned for about eight years, and without costing them anything outside of repairs which was not so much, they have a nice commodious meeting house in which to worship.

The next Church to be organized was upon the Pocono Mountains. Several tent meetings were conducted there and the faithful labors of the pastor of the Stroudsburg Church with his co-workers resulted in the organization of the church. They now have their own church building, practically completed before the close of the Assembly year, but dedicated just a few days after. Donora in the western part of the State was the third place to have a church organized during the year. Bro. Wm. Joppie who came from the Michigan district to Mc Keesport as their pastor was successful in getting together the saints in Donora and effecting an organization. They are having regular services worshipping in a rented church building. The prospects are good for more churches in the western end of the state.

Revivals during the colder weather and tent meetings in the summer have been the order of the workers and churches throughout the district. And our next year's report will show the organization of two churches that resulted from the faithful labors of the pastors in New Jersey and our Home Missionaries.

The churches were organized just a few days after the close of the Assembly year, while the work that brought them to the point of organization was done before the year closed.

In spite of every onslaught that the devil makes in these awful days to hinder the church and impede her progress, we are keenly conscious of the fact that the only hope of victory for our church to fill the place that God wants us to fill in the world, is to cling tenaciously to that line of truth, that brought us into existence in our beginning as a church. Oh, for more laborers in the vineyard that would follow the footsteps of the sainted Martin Wells Knapp. Worldliness is creeping in on every hand and there is such a tendency to look with favor upon that character of christianity so-called that can be so congenial to that that comes around to lower the standards of real Bible Holiness. Let us pray the Lord to give us an abundance of the Spirit of Jesus that when it becomes necessary to take a firm stand for the principles of righteousness we will have grace sufficient and backbone to do so, and when the occasion arises to help the fallen, we will be able to "Weep o'er the Erring One" and "Rescue the Perishing."

From the District Fund we received \$200.01. Above the travelling expenses in visiting the churches we received \$82.62. The churches were visited in the interim between Assemblies two times and some received three visits. The Blood still covers and the Holy Ghost abides and more determined than ever to go through on the Blood and Fire Line.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE.

MEMORIALS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY (Frankford Ind., September 8, 1926)

No. 1 Since it appears needful and desirable that the volume of the matter of our Discipline be reduced to a smaller size;

Be it resolved, that there be but one Scriptural reference givento substantiate each article of faith.

That the listing of the various districts be eliminated.

That the rules of order be also eliminated and substituted in its place, the words that "All business meetings be conducted on regular Parliamentary Rules as set forth in "Roberts' Rules of Order."

That the editing of the New Manuel be supervised by a Committee in order to eliminate the mistakes or errors which at present appear, Page 34 (Paragraphs 11-12) Page 33 first.

We do not recommend abbreviating our articles of faith nor scriptural reference, but the committee does recommend the reduction otherwise.

No. 2 Be it further resolved that the General Assembly shall elect three General Superintendents, who shall have equal power and authority, who shall council together over matters pertaining to the interests of the church at home and abroad; Their duties shall be outlined by the General Council and their respective districts assigned by the General Assembly.

No. 3 We recommend that our General Assembly be held as centrally as possible and be held every fourth year instead of every two years as at present.

No. 4 In order to facilitate matters to the advantage of all the departments of our church, and that all these departments may receive their relative attention and support, be it therefore resolved that

All our General Boards composed of forty or fifty members, be consolidated into one General Consolidated Board consisting

of about eighteen men elected by the General Assembly, and whose duties shall be to meet at least once a year, and who shall be empowered to look after and attend to all matters of General interests of our Church during the interium of our General Assemblies.

No. 5 Be it further resolved that in the event of electing a Co-ordinate Board, they shall be elected - Representively from the various districts.

No. 6 Be it further resolved that the General Assembly promote some plan whereby our home missionary work or department be given consideration comparing favorably with other departments of the Church.

No. 7 Be it further resolved that in as much as no form of a letter of transfer is in the discipline we recommend that such forms be placed therein both for our own transfer from church to church and to other denominations.

No. 8 Be it further resolved that our report blanks be simplified, so that the pastor's report blank shall be separate from all others, likewise the Sunday School and Church to eliminate repetition.

No. 9 Resolved that the clause in our Manual, Page 34, Article 76, relating to the protest of the Dist. Sup't. against pastors being called outside the District, that it be supplemented so as to read that - "He shall state the reason of his protest."
