Moved and carried that the one receiving the highest number of votes be elected for seven years, and the next highest for three years.

By motion the following three names were nominated: Brothers H. D. Wolfe, Wm. Easterday, D. W. Dieter.

Brother H. D. Wolfe elected on first ballot to Trustee Board for seven years; Brother Ferguson for three years.

By motion Resolution No. 11 was adopted.

By motion Brother D. A. King was excused from further attendance of the Assembly.

By motion Resolution No. 12 was adopted.

Report of the Committee appointed by the District Council, on The Macedonian Call Band was heard.

By motion the Committee report was adopted.

District Council presents to the Assembly for its consideration the Financial Plan for the year 1926.

Moved and seconded to set aside the ruling of the Manual and adopt the Financial Plan, amended - to lift one offering per month from each Church for District work. Carried.

(Financial plan of 1926 - that we as the preachers of the District send fifty percent of our tithe to the District Treasurer toward the support of the District Superintendent. The Minimum of support to be fixed by the District Council.)

By motion the District Council is allowed to divide the money that comes in from the Churches for District Work, between Home Missions, General work, District work.

Moved and carried that we pay Brother Saneholtz \$100.00 from the District Treasury.

By motion the time was extended 20 minutes.

Moved and carried that all offerings, special and otherwise, shall come thru their proper course.

Home Missionary Secretary and Treasurer reports, Auditing Committee reports on their books. By motion the reports are accepted.

The report of the District Council to the Assembly on renewal of license to preach, new license, renewal of Deaconess' license, Deaconesses for Ordination, preacher for ordination, were accepted by motion.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Another year is history in our District work. As we take a retrospective view of the year that has just closed, we have much for which to be grateful. The Lord has been pleased to smile upon the work by manifestations of Himself. While great strides have not been made, there has been a moving forward. Two new churches have been organized, and another that was formerly one of our churches, leaving us several years ago, has been reorganized. Advancement is being made in church properties; better places in which to worship and parsonages for the pastors. The reports of the pastors will reveal this in detail.

We have enjoyed the fellowship of the preachers and the laity of the churches as we have gone from place to place. Their courtesies and support has more than remunerated us for the ministry which they have received in return. Our efforts were feeble and the results far beneath what we would like to have seen done. However, by the Grace of God and the wisdom we could employ, we endeavored to do our best, with the highest interests of the Church as our objective.

Great questions are before us, and more is expected of us than of any church in history. Without a doubt it would be very profitable for us to study carefully the history of revival churches; noticing especially what it was that robbed them of the power of God in their midst, thus bringing them to the place where they were no longer a channel of blessing to the world. An over desire to have a large roll, to report numbers will hinder the church. We must have quality rather than quantity.

"A Ministry of the World" is the crying need in our churches. As you read your Bibles please note the emphasis that is placed upon this fact. Jesus said to Satan in the Temptation, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." "So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it." The importance of the word is plainly stated in connection with each Bible doctrine.

The early church recognized this fact as we read, "We will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the world."

Not to reflect upon any faithful effort of the past in the least, but allow us to exhort every pastor to be determined to see victory in his or her church. Perseverance is greatly needed. It is so easy when there is not the victory that we would like to see to lay the blame upon some known hindrance, which may all be very true, and sadly so, but why not bring that very matter before the Lord in persevering prayer. We must learn that "We wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." The major realm of the conflict in which we are engaged is not on the plane of this earth, it is above us. May the Lord help us to be men and women of persevering prayer.

During the year we travelled 12,000 miles by automobile and approximately 9,000 miles by rail. Preached 124 times, conducted 34 chapel services and taught on the average of two classes per week in the school. Several knelt at the altar for pardon or purity. Remunerated as follows: from the School \$675.00; from the District Treasury, \$467.98; offerings from the churches \$483.04. Travelling expenses \$177.00. The amount received less the travelling expenses is \$1449.02. Thank the Lord for all His blessings bestowed upon us. May the Lord richly bless every Pilgrim.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE ASSEMBLY

No. 1 — Whereas our Home Missionary Field is large and affords plenty of opportunity for all those who are called of God and have the vision - be it,

Resolved that we as a Church do all we can to aid and encourage all Home Missionaries.

Resolved that we will endorse the following organization to be known as The Macedonian Missionary Band of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, of the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District.

By-Laws — All persons who are Christians may become members of this band, regardless of Church affiliations.

Each member shall have the privilege of stating the amount per month they wish to give.

All money shall pass through proper offices elected by their Board.

The Board shall consist of seven persons - all to be members of Pilgrim Holiness Church, six of which shall be elected at the Annual Assembly after being nominated by the Officers of the Board.

No less than ten names shall be presented for election, the seventh to be a member of the District Council.

The Members of this Board shall elect their own officers.

The Band shall report to the Assembly annually, finances, number of meetings, number of seekers, property in trust.

A paper called "The Macedonian Call" shall be published monthly in the interest of this Missionary Band, controlled by the Board of this Society.

No. 2 — Whereas - there are those among us who are granted licenses to preach and yet in spite of the statements of the Manual relative to the course of study, the annual report to the assembly, etc., continue to ignore all authority, refuse to take up the courses of study and are lax on making reports, etc., and

Whereas - the regular ordained ministers are held to a very strict report and are required to make said report to the Assembly,

Be it resolved - that all leicensed preachers be made to comply with the Manual and make proper use of their licenses to preach, making proper reports to the proper authorities, that their credentials be withheld until they make satisfactory reports and show an appreciation for the privileges and rights conferred upon them by the Assembly.

No. 3 — Whereas, there is a tendency in these last days to lower the standard of Christian faith and doctrine from the pulpits of the land, thus destroying the foundation of our faith, the fundamental doctrines and principles of God's Word; and,

Whereas, the pulpit is the place from which should be sounded out the Bible messages of God's infallable truth, the whole truth and nothing but the Truth; and,

Whereas, the pulpit should never be a "coward's castle," nor occupied by any but those who are divinely called of God, sent of God and endorsed by the Church of Christ, sanctified and filled with the Spirit and true to the good old Bible;

Therefore, be it resolved that with no uncertain sound we will declare the whole council of God. We boldly take our stand for the divine inspiration of the Word of God, the virgin birth of Jesus, His sacrificial death, His glorious resurrection, His ascension and His second coming. We believe in the Creation of man, his fall and consequently his total depravity, his full and complete redemption by Jesus Christ. Justification by faith. Sanctification as a second definite work of grace. Healing for the sick and the complete restoration of all things through the redemption that was blood bought by our Lord.

Therefore, be it resolved that by God's help and grace we will take our stand against the popular sins of the world and a fallen church. We will preach the word relative to the sin of pride and worldliness as manifested in the deplorable undress fads and fancies of the age. We will take our stand against all oath-bound secret lodges and refuse members of the same admittance into our churches. We will give the Word no uncertain sound on the wearing of Gold, divorce and remarriage

as well as any other sin and compromise that may creep in amongst us. We will "earnestly contend for the faith that was once delivered to the saints."

No. 4 — Whereas - God has granted to the Church one of the greatest privileges known to man, that of the evangelization of the world and the spread of Scriptural Holiness through the land; and,

Whereas, God hath said, "He that winneth souls is wise, and they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness, as the stars forever and ever;"

Therefore be it resolved that we make an endeavor on the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District to put on a real, live, intelligent and aggressive Evangelistic and Home Missionary Campaign; be it

Further resolved that our slogan for our District this coming year if Jesus tarries, be at least 5,000 souls and the organizing of as many real, clean Pilgrim Holiness Churches out of our own converts as we possibly can, and,

Be it further resolved that we will encourage our local preachers and all those in our midst who are qualified to push out in the neglected places and open up new preaching points, organize Sunday Schools and thus act as though we really believe the promise of God that we should possess all the land that our feet should tread upon.

Be it further resolved that we as pastors will help our local preachers and workers to look up and open preaching points in the vicinity of our pastorates.

Be it further resolved we will ask God to give us red hot, Holy Ghost, Revivals and consequently many cases of old time convicted, converted and fully saved souls, and those who are converted at our altars will be glad to identify themselves with their spiritual mother and will have a better family resemblance than some whom we merely adopt.

No. 5 — Whereas, lest there be a laxity in any of our District churches to properly take care of the financial support of our pastors, for whom we feel deep Christian love and interest; and,

Whereas, It is the duty of both our District Superintendent as well as the local Advisory Boards to pay strict attention to this matter; and

Whereas Our manual is plain in regards to our people bringing all the tithes into the storehouse or church and the pastor be given first consideration out of the tithe, this consideration not to be stintingly or less than that which covers the needs of the pastor;

Be it resolved, that we stir our hearts upon these lines, and do every thing within our power to make easier the burdens they carry, many of them forever unknown to us, that we see to it that they are well cared for, and instead of pounding them with fault-finding, criticism and discouragement, that we very often give them a good pounding with honey, milk, flour, ham eggs, chickens, potatoes, etc., of which things we know they are worthy. May God bless them all and keep them ever true till Jesus comes.

No. 6 — Whereas - Our District Superintendent has presided over the Assembly in such a manner as to expedite the business coming before us, and,

Whereas - his exhortations have been timely, spiritual and uplifting, his spirit has been such as becometh one professing salvation; be it

Resolved - that we express our hearty appreciation for his service by a rising vote.

No. 7 — Inasmuch as many of our preachers live a great distance from the meeting place of our Annual Assembly and thus putting their respective Churches at a large expense for traveling and in many cases keeping some from coming at all.

Therefore, be it resolved that this Assembly adopt an equalization plan for this ensuing year for taking care of this condition, the above expenses to be based on railroad fare from each Church; clergy rates for pastors and full fare for delegates.

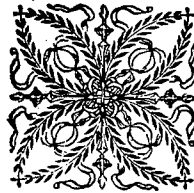
