MINUTES OF THE**SIXTEENTH ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE****PENNSYLVANIA AND NEW JERSEY DISTRICT OF THE****PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH****Monday Forenoon Meeting**

Moved and carried that the District Secretary be paid \$25.00 for his Secretary work.

Moved and carried that the District Council provide a home for the District Superintendent.

Sister B. Hatcher and Sister F. Lishman, Bro. F. Lishman and Bro. J. S. Hankins were elected as members of the Foreign Missionary Board by the first ballot.

Moved and carried that the District Supt. by virtue of his office be a member of the Foreign Missionary Board.

Moved and carried to set aside the ruling of the Manual and adopt the Financial Plan, amended to lift one offering per month from each Church for District work.

By motion the District Council is allowed to divide the money that comes in from the Churches for District Work, between Home Missions, General work, District work.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

We are assembled in another annual meeting. The reports as they are read will cause us to reflect upon our year's work, and as we do, there will be reasons to rejoice, because of the battles that have been fought and victories won. Undoubtedly there have been some experiences through which we have passed that if we were privileged to go through them again we would do better than we did do. Experience is a good teacher, but rather expensive and often times causes some tears and heartaches.

As a District of churches, the Lord has helped us to move forward and the reports will show that progress has been made. We should rejoice and be very grateful to the Lord for His love and mercy so richly bestowed upon us. We have not gone by great strides and it is a fact that slow and steady growth is by far the best. It takes years to grow an oak while a squash will mature in three months, but the value of the nature of the oak in comparison with the squash is well worth the time required for its growth. We pray that the Lord will give us more of the oak-like in Christian experience, then will our churches move forward as never before.

During the past year three new churches were organized. In the already organized churches there has been a gain numerically, advancement financially, and we trust a healthy growth spiritually. It is indeed gratifying to know that revivals, tent meetings and special efforts for the furtherance of the cause in the salvation of souls is the burden resting upon the pastors and churches.

The churches have been visited twice during the year. Some have been visited more often as their need seemed to require, that we might do something to help them. For two weeks a meeting was conducted in a new and opportune field, but there was apparently no visible results. However, we still feel that Millersburg should have a regularly organized church to give that town and community a Full-Salvation station.

Approximately six thousand miles were travelled by rail and around twelve thousand by auto. Preached 151 times; conducted Chapel services in the School, 36 times; led the School prayer meeting 9 times. There were a few who sought the Lord for either pardon or purity in these services.

Received in offerings from the churches in visitation work, \$577.24; from the District Treasury, \$982.80; from the School, \$570.00. The travelling expenses for the year were \$127.77. The amount received above expenses was \$2002.27. We are grateful to the Lord and His people for all the kindness shown to us throughout the year. We are praying that the Lord will wonderfully bless this Assembly, giving us a mighty outpouring of His Spirit.
