STANDING RULES OF THE DISTRICT ASSEMBLY

Rule No. 1

Each minister, ordained or licensed, shall pay fifty per cent. of his tithes to the support of the District Superintendent from all his earnings received from ministerial work, and all the ministers failing to do so shall not, together with their families, be entertained free at our District Camp-meeting.

The tithes shall be paid to the local church treasurer who shall forward them to the District Secretary with other church funds on the first of each month.

Rule No. 3

Thursday afternoon of our District Camp-meeting shall be devoted to the interest of Foreign Missions.

Rule No. 4

A Bible School service shall be conducted the last Sunday afternoon of our District Camp-meeting.

Rule No. 5

The first seven seats and forward shall constitute the conference bar.

MINUTES OF THE 1935 ASSEMBLY OF THE PENNSYLVANIA-NEW JERSEY DISTRICT

Friday Meeting

In the good providence of God our lives have been spared to assemble again in our Annual Assembly without the loss of one of the Ministerial members through death. While many of us have suffered physically, most of us have been able to carry on under God and take new territory.

As a district we have gained some ground. The Statistical charts will show an increase in members and churches.

Being a new man in your midst, but by no means a stranger, I assure you that it has largely been a pleasure to work with you and for you. I received throughout the year a cordial welcome by both the pastors and the laity. Of course not being acquainted with your ways of procedure, it took me quite some time to become adjusted. I shall not soon forget the kindness shown me by most everyone during that period.

During the year I have traveled 26,000 miles in the interest of the district, 6,000 of which was in the interest of Home Missionary work, 232 sermons, 89 calls to pray in homes were made, 136 business meetings were held, assistance was given in one funeral service, 35 anointed for healing, 39 subscriptions were taken for the Advocate and what was doubtless best of all 1,481 souls seeking God.
