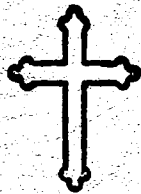


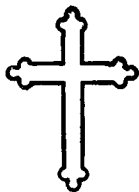

STANDING RULES OF THE DISTRICT ASSEMBLY

Minutes of the 1937 Assembly of the Pennsylvania-New Jersey District

The twenty-fourth Annual Session of the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District Assembly opened July 15, 1937 at 9:00 A. M. in the Tabernacle on the camp grounds at Beulah Park.

The service was in charge of the District Superintendent, Rev. R. G. Flexon, and was opened by the Assembly joining in singing, "There is a Fountain Filled with Blood," and "A Charge to Keep I Have." Rev. S. L. Adams and Rev. H. D. Dieter led the Assembly in prayer, after which Brother Dieter read a Scripture lesson from I Corinthians the third chapter.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook, the General Superintendent was introduced to the Assembly and presided over the business as follows:

By motion the following hours were set for the Assembly meetings: 9 to 11:30 A. M., 2 to 5:30 P. M., 7 to 9:00 P. M.

The District Superintendent announced the following new churches: Gipsy, Shillington, Bentleyville, and Oil City, they were accepted by motion.

By motion H. E. Uhrig, J. E. Guill, Alexander Passmore, and Ruth Bowman were introduced to the Assembly and then received as members of the District.

By motion it was decided to post the Statistician's Report instead of having it presented orally.

The Auditing Committee reported having audited the following books and found them to be correct: The District Secretary, The District Treasurer, The Home Missions Department, and The General Assembly Sinking Fund.

By motion the report of the District Superintendent was accepted as read.

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and resolutions 1, 2, 3 were presented.

Upon a second reading Resolution 1 was adopted by motion.

Upon a second reading Resolution 2 was referred back to the Committee until the pastors could confer with them relative to the Budget Apportionments.

Upon a second reading Resolution 3 was adopted by motion.

By motion the report of the District Treasurer was accepted as read.

By motion Liden Adams, Lindley Adams, and Ivan Watts were granted voice and vote in the Assembly by virtue of being regular pastors of organized churches.

The Rev. E. R. Clough and Rev. Gear Baker of the Eastern District were introduced to the Assembly and granted honorary seats within the Conference Bar.

By motion the Home Missionary Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

Motion made and carried that the order of the day at 3:00 P. M. this afternoon be the election of officers.

Adjourned by motion.

July 15, 2 P. M. Meeting

The Assembly was called to order by the General Superintendent, who presided as chairman.

A period of devotions was entered into after which Rev. H. E. Uhrig led in prayer.

The chairman read a Scripture lesson from I Corinthians the ninth chapter, especially emphasizing verse 16, and brought a stirring address on the "Minister's Preaching," his "Practice, and his "Punctuality."

The roll call being completed was dispensed with by motion for the remainder of the Assembly.

The minutes of the morning session were read and approved.

Sister L. L. Koder, returned missionary from India, was introduced to the Assembly; also Sister Maria Frost, outgoing missionary to Africa.

At the request of the chairman, the District Superintendent appointed J. Franklin Lint, Mark Bowman, J. Artemas Byrd, Harley Hoffman, Lawrence Neff, and J. H. Sherwood as tellers; and the Assembly proceeded with the order of the day, the election of officers.

A season of earnest prayer was engaged in, which was led by Rev. W. L. Surbrook.

The first ballot was cast for District Superintendent. 102 votes were cast, 88 of which were for Rev. R. G. Flexon, electing him to the office of District Superintendent.

After his election, Brother Flexon briefly addressed the Assembly assuring the brethren of his appreciation of their past cooperation, also the splendid vote of confidence given him: but declared he felt the Lord leading him into other fields; therefore, must decline the office.

A period of prayer was engaged in after which a second ballot was cast for District Superintendent. 104 votes were cast but there was no election. A motion was made to vote on one of the two highest. Lost.

By motion the Assembly proceeded to vote on one of the three highest. They were: H. D. Dieter, 39; R. H. Heckart, 16; and H. A. Saneholtz, 12.

H. D. Dieter received 64 votes, electing him to the office of District Superintendent.

The first ballot was cast for Assistant District Superintendent, resulting in 104 votes being cast, but no election.

By motion the Assembly proceeded to vote on one of the three highest. They were R. H. Heckart, 47; H. A. Saneholtz, 20; and S. L. Adams, 11. R. H. Heckart received 64 votes, electing him to the office of Assistant Superintendent.

The first ballot was cast for District Secretary, 100 votes being cast. H. J. Felter received 78 votes, electing him to the office of District Secretary.

The first ballot was cast for District Treasurer, 93 votes being cast, but no election. By motion the Assembly proceeded to vote on one of the three highest. They were: W. R. Fitch, 24; S. L. Adams, 17; W. F. Bubb, 17. There was no election.

By motion a ballot was cast on one of the two highest. They were: W. R. Fitch, 46; S. L. Adams, 34. The total number of votes cast was 103, W. R. Fitch receiving 60, electing him to the office of District Treasurer.

By motion the Assembly proceeded to vote for the three advisory members of the District Council on one ballot. 100 votes were cast, R. G. Flexon receiving 70; S. L. Adams, 74; and F. H. Schweitzer, 53; electing them to the District Council.

The motion was made and seconded to elect two members to the Examining Board. This was amended to read as follows: that the one receiving the highest number of votes be considered elected for the three year term and the next highest to fill the unexpired term of Rev. Floyd Baker.

The motion as amended was carried and the meeting proceeded to the election of these two officers.

Adjourned by motion.

July 15, 7 P. M. Meeting

The meeting was opened with singing led by Mrs. C. J. Reiff, after which Rev. Harley Hoffman led in prayer.

Rev. E. E. Watts read a Scripture lesson from the 16th chapter of The Acts.

The minutes of the afternoon meeting were read and approved.

The regular order of the day was taken up and it was found that a ballot cast in the previous meeting had resulted in 93 votes being cast. Chas. A. Brown receiving 57, electing him to fill the unexpired term of Rev. Floyd Baker on the Examining Board.

By motion the meeting then cast a ballot for one of the two highest. They being: S. L. Adams, 23; H. A. Saneholtz, 22. 95 votes were cast, S. L. Adams receiving 64 electing him to the Examining Board for the three year term.

The following resolution was presented to and adopted by the Assembly: "RESOLVED THAT this Assembly elect three of its members to serve on the Home Missionary Board. The one receiving the highest number of votes to be considered elected to a three-year term, the second highest a two-year term, and the third highest a one-year term; each one to receive at least a majority of the votes cast."

The first ballot was cast for the members of this board, resulting in 93 votes being cast; W. F. Bubb receiving 66; Lawrence Neff, 61; and R. H. Heckart 53 votes, electing them to the Home Missionary Board for 3 years, two years and one year, respectively.

Lawrence Neff declined his election to the Home Missionary Board stating he would be leaving the District, and would not be able to serve.

By motion a ballot was cast for one of the two highest names from the "Western Zone" of the District. They were Mark Bowman, 11; and Chas. A. Brown, 8. 100 votes were cast, Chas. A. Brown receiving 57, electing him to The Home Missionary Board for the two year term.

The first ballot was cast to fill the vacancy on the Board of Trustees, resulting in David W. Dieter receiving 98 out of a total of 101 votes cast, electing him to the 7 year term on the board.

The Committee on Resolutions reported to the Assembly presenting resolutions 1, 2, 3, and 4.

Resolution 1 was adopted upon a second reading.

Resolution 2 was adopted upon a second reading.

Resolution 3 was adopted upon a second reading.

Resolution 4 was tabled.

The Ways and Means Committee reported on Resolution 2 which had been referred to them for redrafting. The resolution was adopted.

Motion made and seconded that the Assembly meet one hour later tomorrow.

No. 7. We, the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District, wish to express to our Beloved Brother, Rev. R. G. Flexon, our heart felt thanks and appreciation for his devoted service to our District as Superintendent, and we bid him God speed in his future labors in the work of the Lord.

No. 8. Whereas, there seems to be a tendency of lowering the standards of our Church Covenant in regards to modest apparel, sabbath desecration, hair dressings, etc., be it,

Resolved that all our Ministers abide by the Church Covenant.

No. 9. Lost.

Whereas, there is a Joint Resolution No. 285 commonly called the "Sirovich Proposal," having been brought before the Congress, proposing that permission be granted for the erection of a monument at the nation's Capitol to the memory of the noted infidel, Bob Ingersoll, we hereby petition you to use your influence against this Anti-Christian measure, be it,

If for any reason a local church does not divide their apportionment according to above specifications the District Treasurer is hereby authorized to divide the same.

No. 5. BE IT RESOLVED that we create a church property extension fund from which a church having continued over a period of five years shall be eligible for a loan of not more than eighty per cent of the total cost of the building at the rate of 4% interest, and that the loan be paid back in monthly installments.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

1936-1937

It is with a deep sense of gratitude to God, and a feeling of sincere appreciation for my brethren in the ministry that I view my labors of the past year. Many have been the problems and varied has been the labor, but God has never failed to come to our help. The sympathetic understanding and the unity of action by the District Council and other District Boards with whom we have labored has lifted many a load and made the going much easier.

During the year I have traveled approximately thirty-five thousand miles, preached two hundred forty-six times, visited and prayed in seventy-

eight homes, prayed with and anointed for healing seventy, with the exception of one church, have visited each church in the District twice, some three times and a number four times, conducted one hundred twenty-nine business meetings beside District Council and Home Missionary Board Meetings, presided over three District Assemblies in the West Indies and South America, and saw over two- thousand souls seeking God under my own ministry. For my support I received in tithes from the District one thousand eight hundred fifty-six dollars and seventy cents, from offerings as I visited the churches, four hundred thirty-nine dollars and fifty-four cents, from revivals, five hundred ninety-eight dollars, from week-end conventions, forty-three dollars, gifts and donations twenty-six dollars, making a total from all departments of two thousand nine hundred sixty-three dollars and twenty-four cents, and paid out for traveling expenses, telephone, telegrams and stationery, five hundred fifteen dollars, and to my assistant for caring for the District in my absence one hundred fifty dollars, making a total expense of six hundred sixty-five dollars.

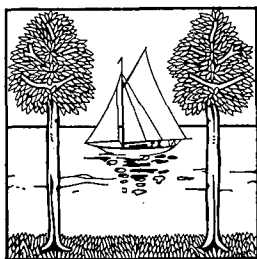
