PROCEEDINGS

First Day-Monday, July 24, 1939-Morning Meeting

The twenty-sixth Annual Session of the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:00 a. m., in the tabernacle located on the campus of the Allentown Bible Institute, Allentown Pa., formerly known as Beulah Park. The opening of the meeting was in charge of the District Superintendent, Rev. Robert H. Heckart. The members of the assembly joined in the singing of "Must Jesus Bear the Cross Alone" and "Jesus Lover of My Soul" after which the District Secretary, Rev. Harry J. Felter and the Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. Harold D. Dieter led in prayer. Rev. Frank H. Schweitzer read a Scripture lesson from 1 Peter 4:1-11.

Rev. R. G. Flexon, First Assistant General Superintendent, was introduced to the assembly. He explained that due to the death of Rev. George B. Kulp, a former, beloved General Superintendent and honored veteran of the Cross, Rev. W. L. Surbrook, General Superintendent, could not be present, and had instructed him to act as chairman of the assembly.

The roll of ministers and licensed workers was called and also the roll of lay delegates.

Rev. Raymond Simpson and wife, transferring from the Eastern District and Rev. Richard Powell and wife, transferring from the Ohio District were received as members of the assembly.

The recommendation of the District Council that Walter Schaltenbrand be received as a member of this district was accepted.

The newly organized church at East Bangor, Pennsylvania, was received into the district.

The following hours were set for the assembly meetings: 9:00 a. m. to 11:30 a. m., 2:00 p. m. to 4:30 p. m., and 7:00 p. m. to 9:00 p. m.

The Reception Committee presented the following: Miss Ethel Jordon missionary from South Africa; G. H. Schull, minister from the Pittsburgh District; and R. Lewis Adams, also of the Pittsburgh District.

The Auditing Committee reported the District Treasurer's and Home Missionary Treasurer's books to be correct. The report was accepted.

The District Treasurer submitted his report to the assembly. See reports. It was received unanimously with gratitude to God for His provisions during the past year.

The report of the Home Missionary Treasurer was read and accepted. See reports.

The assembly adjourned until $2:00\ p.\ m.$ The closing prayer was offered by the Chairman.

Afternoon Meeting

The afternoon meeting was opened at 2:00 p. m., with singing "Praise Him" and "Redeemed." Rev. Bessie F. Hatcher led the assembly to the throne of grace.

A Scripture lesson was read from Rev. 2:1-5 by the Chairman, Rev. R. G. Flexon, after which he brought a very timely and instructive message on "Things that will Backslide a Church"—declaring that over-emphasis on legitimate things may result in confusion and neglect of others and the lowering of spiritual standards.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The secretary was instructed to send a telegram of sympathy to the family of Rev. George B. Kulp. See "In Memoriam."

The Reception Committee presented Rev. Given Kutz, fraternal delegate from the Pittsburgh District, and Rev. Russell Gunsalus of the Evangelical Church. The assembly granted them honorary seats within the conference bar.

The District Statistician spoke briefly on the statistical report.

The Resolutions Committee presented resolutions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5. Upon a second reading Resolution #1 was adopted. Upon a second reading Resolution #2 was referred for redrafting. Upon a second reading Resolution #3 was adopted. Upon a second reading Resolution #4 was adopted. Upon a second reading of Resolution #5 a substitute motion was offered, "Be it resolved that we elect two laymen to our District Council." The substitute carried.

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and accepted. See reports.

The meeting adjourned. The closing prayer was offered by Rev. H. A. Saneholtz.

Evening Meeting

The evening meeting was opened at 7:00 p. m. by singing, "Satisfied" and "Having Done All to Stand." Prayer was offered by Rev. John A. Gangaware.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The roll call was dispensed with for the rest of the session.

The substitute motion for Resolution #5 of the Resolutions Committee was rescinded.

Resolution #5 was read again, there was a motion and a second to adopt.

A substitute motion was offered as follows: "Resolved that we elect one advisory member to the District Council from among the men of our laity. Be it further resolved, that this person be elected from nominations made from the assembly floor, of such men as may be deemed qualified for said advisory position." Carried.

Resolution #2 as redrafted was adopted.

The District Council recommended the following for renewal of District License: G. Lindley Adams, Hugh Barton, William Bloom. Mrs. Walter Bubb, Armand Doll, Oliver Holden, J. L. Johnson, Edna Kunkle, J. H. Mease, Catherine Palsgrove, E. A. Patmore, Walter Schaltenbrand, Mrs. Walter Schaltenbrand, Benjamin Sheckels, Edwin Stetser, William Welch, J. E. Wolfe, and Lester Zehner.

For renewal of Deaconess License: Harriet Brucklacher, Mrs. Armand Doll, Mrs. Harry Felter, Mrs. Robert Finch, Mrs. Elenora B. Key, Mrs. Herbert Moser, and Mrs. Dennison Snyder.

Recommended for New District License: Mrs. Grant Bertolet, Fred Bertolet, Elmer Hocking, James Heise, Jason Felter, Miss Grace Rohland, and Walter Fisher.

Recommended for new Deaconess License: Alice Spatz.

Recommended for Song Evangelist's Certificate: Mr. Ward Printz.

The District Superintendent's report was read and accepted.

A motion prevailed that we proceed with the election of officers.

The time was extended to 9:30 p. m

The order of the day was postponed until Tuesday morning.

The following tellers were appointed: J. F. Lint, Walter Schaltenbrand, Philip Doyle, E. A. Patmore, J. Gangaware, and A. Passmore.

The meeting adjourned until Tuesday morning 9:00 o'clock.

The closing prayer was offered by Rev. Frank H. Schweitzer.

Second Day-Tuesday, July 25-Morning Meeting

The meeting was opened at 9:00 a. m. Rev. J. A. Byrd led in singing "Blessed be the Name," "Wonderful Words of Life," and "I Belong to the King."

Rev. H. A. Saneholtz read a Scripture lesson from II Cor. 5:17 and II Cor. 6:1-11.

A gracious season of prayer was engaged in and the presence of the Lord was manifest in blessing upon His people.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Those received for new District License were granted all the privileges of the conference bar.

The order of the day was taken up and the assembly proceeded to vote for a District Superintendent.

The first ballot cast resulted in 93 votes, but no election. Rev. Robert H. Heckart received 41 and Rev. R. G. Flexon 32.

The assembly proceeded to vote on one of the two highest, with the result that Rev. R. G. Flexon was elected District Superintendent. He received 52 votes.

The first ballot was cast for Assistant District Superintendent resulting in 96 votes but no election.

A second ballot was cast for Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. Robert H. Heckart was elected. He received 59 votes.

The first ballot was cast for District Secretary. Rev. H. J. Felter was elected. He received 70 votes.

The first ballot was cast for District Treasurer. Rev. W. R. Fitch was elected. He received 71 votes.

The assembly voted for two ministerial advisory members of the District Council.

By special request Rev. R. W. Ives sang a beautiful song entitled "Pearls by the Way."

The first ballot cast for the two ministerial advisory members of the District Council resulted in no election.

The assembly voted on two of the four highest. This ballot resulted in 96 votes. Rev. Harold D. Dieter received 78 votes.

The assembly voted on one of the two highest for the remaining ministerial advisory member of the District Council. As a result of this ballot Rev. H. E. Uhrig was elected. He received 52 votes.

The following were nominated from the assembly floor for the election of one lay member to the District Council: Irvin Crissinger, Grant Bertolet, Ward Printz, and Gerald Stover. The first ballot cast for the election of one lay member to the District Council resulted in no election.

The time was extended until a second ballot could be taken for election of the lay member.

The assembly voted on one of the three highest: Irvin Crissinger, 38; Grant Bertolet, 17; and Rev. Frank H. Schweitzer, 17 votes. 92 votes were cast, Irvin Crissinger was elected. He received 58 votes.

The meeting was adjourned by expiration of time.

Afternoon Meeting

The afternoon meeting opened at 2:00 p. m. Rev. J. A. Byrd led in singing "We Have an Anchor."

Prayer was offered by Rev. Ruth Bowman.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

The assembly voted to fill two vacancies on the Examining Board, the one receiving the highest majority to serve for the three year period and the second highest the two year period.

This ballot resulted in 87 votes being cast, Rev. Frank H. Schweitzer receiving 55, electing him to the Examining Board for three years.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. E. E. Hostetter and wife from the Virginia District.

An offering was received for the District Statistician.

Rev. R. W. Ives rendered a very beautiful vocal selection entitled "Tell Me His Name Again."

On the second ballot to elect a member to the Examining Board, Rev. Harold D. Dieter was elected. He received 52 votes thus making his term two years.

A ballot was prepared to elect two laymen to the Board of Trustees by placing two names on the ballot. The one receiving the largest majority serve for seven years, and the one receiving the second largest number serve for five years.

Nominations were made from the assembly floor: Henry Laidacker, Gerald Stover, Charles Maas, and Ward Printz.

Mr. Charles Maas of Woodbury, New Jersey, played two solos on his piano accordion which were thoroughly enjoyed by the assembly.

Miss Catherine Palsgrove sang a song entitled "The Changing Time" accompanied at the piano by Rev. Bessie F. Hatcher.

The ballot cast for two members on the Trustee Board resulted in 80 votes being cast. Henry Laidacker was elected for the seven year term and Ward Printz was elected to serve for five years.

Resolution 2 of the Ways and Means Committee was adopted.

Resolution 6 of the Resolutions Committee was adopted.

Resolution 7 of the Resolutions Committee was adopted.

The Auditing Committee reported the books of the Young People's District Treasurer correct.

The report of the District Young People's Treasurer was read and accepted.

The secretary was instructed to send fraternal greetings to the Pittsburgh District.

The secretary was instructed to prepare a memorial to Rev. George B. Kulp, General Superintendent Emeritus for publication in the minutes.

The secretary was instructed to prepare a memorial to Harry Handwerk, deceased member of District Trustee Board and publish the same in the minutes.

The matter of District stationery was left in the hands of the District Council.

The District Council was left to decide how many copies of these minutes shall be published.

The District Council reported the names of the Home Missionary Committee: S. L. Adams, Richard Powell, and Frank Schweitzer.

The meeting was adjourned. The closing prayer was offered by the District Superintendent, Robert H. Heckart.

RESOLUTIONS

#1. RESOLVED, That we discontinue the Home Missionary Board, and

RESOLVED, That we authorize the District Council to appoint a committee of three who are not members of the District Council, if possible, to serve as a Home Missionary Committee. The said committee to give reports to the District Council at their meetings and also to the Annual Assembly. Said Committee to cooperate with District Council and to be presided over by the District Superintendent.

#2. RESOLVED, That the Home Missionary Committee employ a Home Missionary Evangelist to work under the direction of the Home Missionary Committee. The same to give his entire time to District Missionary work, and

RESOLVED, That said Home Missionary be paid a stated salary as set by the Home Missionary Committee. Traveling expenses, and other expenses incidental to the meeting: employing singers, etc., to be paid from the Home Missionary fund. All collections and funds raised by said evangelist shall be turned into the Home Missionary fund.

#3. RESOLVED, That we require our ministers who are actively engaged to pay 60% of their tithe received from ministerial work through the local treasurer to the District Treasurer for the support of the District Superintendent, and

RESOLVED, That his rent, telephone, postage, and telegrams be paid from the District Treasury. And that each pastor be responsible for raising a special offering upon his visit, the same to be applied on his expenses.

#4. RESOLVED, That we elect one advisory member to the District Council from among the men in our laity, and

RESOLVED, That this person be elected from nominations made from the assembly floor of such men as may be deemed properly qualified for said advisory position.

#5. RESOLVED, That our 1940 District Assembly be held immediately following the District Camp, and

RESOLVED, That the District Council set the date for the District Camp.

#6. RESOLVED, That a committee of three be appointed to compile all resolutions appearing in former minutes and binding upon us at present, and that they be printed in the 1939 minutes.

#7. WHEREAS there are those who have labored so faithfully and efficiently for the comfort and necessities of this assembly,

RESOLVED THEREFORE, That we express our appreciation by a rising vote.

#8. WHEREAS our beloved First Assistant General Superintendent, Rev. R. G. Flexon has so ably presided over this assembly,

RESOLVED THEREFORE, That we show our appreciation to him by a rising vote, and that an offering be taken for him.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the twenty-sixth Annual Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Pennsylvania and New Jersey District. Greetings in the name of Jesus!

Another year with its battles, its problems, and its victories has become history. God has very graciously blessed and helped us for which I am grateful.

The Lord has been pleased to bless us with some good revivals with many souls seeking God at our altars. Keep the revival fires burning! Be spiritual! Lift up Bible standards! We dare not compromise! God, the Church, yea, the World is depending upon us. We must not disappoint them!

In spite of the fact that many of our people have been without steady employment, our General Budget and Foreign Missions receipts are the second highest in the history of the District. A number of our Sunday Schools have forged ahead making new records. One school reports an average gain of forty over last year. Another one a gain of twenty-five. Still another a gain of twenty-four. Others have also made splendid progress. Let every preacher boost his Sunday School. Two new churches have been organized. One at Geneva, Pa., with twenty-five members. The other at East Bangor with eleven members. One new church building has been erected during the year. Another is under construction now. Several plots of ground were purchased by different congregations on which to erect church buildings. Quite a few churches and parsonages have been remodeled or redecorated, adding much to the beauty and value of our property.

Since our district has been made smaller our efforts should be enlarged. Let every preacher and every church push out into some neighboring community, have a revival, and if you cannot start a church after the first meeting, you may at least be able to establish a Sunday School or another preaching point. Let us pray to God and work with God to make this the greatest year in the district for His glory.

Let us enter this new year with a godly zeal to push every department of the Church, with a passion for lost souls, with a spirit of cooperation, and our faith in the God who has helped us in the past and who will not fail us now.

Following is a brief statistical report of my labors for the past year. I traveled approximately 30,000 miles, preached 218 times, conducted 123 business meetings, dedicated three church buildings, annointed 17 for healing, had 130 seekers for regeneration or sanctification, conducted 3 revivals, visited each church in the district (excepting one) twice. I visited 29 churches three times and some others more often as the need demanded. I received for traveling expense, telephone, postage, etc., from church \$375.37, from the District \$235.71. Total \$611.08. I received for support in cash from the District Treasurer \$1800.00, from revivals, conventions, and donations \$205.53. Total support \$2005.53.

In closing, I wish to express my appreciation for the support and cooperation given me.
