PROCEEDINGS

First Day-Monday, July 22, 1940-Morning Meeting

The twenty-seventh Annual Session of the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:00 a. m., in the spacious tabernacle located on the campus of the Allentown Bible Institute, Allentown, Penna., formerly known as Beulah Park. The opening of the meeting was in charge of the District Superintendent, Rev. R. G. Flexon. The members of the Assembly joined in singing "My Jesus I Love Thee" and "There is a Fountain Filled with Blood" led by Mr. Ward Printz, after which the Assembly was led in prayer by Rev. David Gorman and Rev. Mrs. Thomas Ferguson.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook, the General Superintendent, was introduced to the Assembly by the District Superintendent, Rev. R. G. Flexon and was asked to take the chair.

The General Superintendent read a Scripture lesson from 1 Corinthians the sixth chapter and delivered a very interesting message from the subject "Approving ourselves as the ministers of God." He emphasized what a minister's life should be, his qualifications for leadership, and his loyalty to the church.

The roll of ministers and licensed workers and of lay delegates was called.

The following newly organized churches were received into the District: Bush Hollow, Carlisle, Jersey Shore, and Juniata.

Mr. H. W. Miller, who has local license, was granted privileges of the conference bar, inasmuch as he is at present pastoring our church at Juniata, Pa.

The following hours were set for the Assembly meetings: 9:00 a. m. to 11:30 a. m.; 2:00 p. m. to 4:30 p. m.; 7:00 p. m. to 9:00 p. m.

The District Superintendent presented his report to the Assembly. It was received with appreciation. (See reports.)

The totals of the Statistician's report were read to the Assembly and received with thankfulness for the goodness of the Lord during the year. An offering was taken from the Assembly floor for the statistician.

The following were introduced to the District Assembly and granted honorary seats within the Conference Bar: Rev. and Mrs. J. S. Hankins, West Virginia District; and Rev. and Mrs. Robert Finch of the Virginia District.

The Auditing Committee reported on the books of the District Treasurer and the Home Missionary Treasurer. The report was accepted.

The report of the District Treasurer was read and accepted. (See reports.)

The meeting adjourned by expiration of time.

The closing prayer was offered by the District Superintendent.

Afternoon Meeting

The afternoon meeting was opened at 2:00 p. m. by the Assembly joining in singing "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" and "Close to Thee." Rev. Raymond Simpson and Rev. W. F. Bubb led the Assembly to the throne of grace.

The roll of ministers and licensed workers and of the lay delegates was called.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Home Missionary Treasurer's report was read and accepted. (See reports.)

The report of the Ways and Means Committee on the General Budget apportionments was read and accepted.

The Resolutions Committee presented Resolution #1 which was referred for redrafting.

The Auditing Committee reported on the books of the District Treasurer of the Young People's Society.

The treasurer of the Young People's Society read his report. It was accepted. (See reports.)

The Committee on Compilation of Resolutions reported. They recommended that the following resolutions be discontinued: Ways and Means #2, 1931; Resolution #5, 1935; Resolution #8, 1935; Resolution #2, 1933; Resolution #7, 1931; Resolution #8, 1931; Resolution #2, 1930; Resolution #3, 1933; Resolution #2, 1924; Resolution #4, 1924; Resolution #1, 1921; and Resolution #3, 1920. The report was accepted.

The following resolutions were rescinded: Resolution #2, 1938; Resolution #3, 1938; Ways and Means #7, 1938; Resolution #2, 1937; Resolution #4, 1935; Resolution #6, 1935; Resolution #3, 1929; and Resolution #1, 1925.

The following were recommended for continuance: Resolution #1, #2, #4, 1939; Resolution #2, 1938; Ways and Means #1, 1938; Resolution #3, 1937; Ways and Means #3 and #4, 1937; Resolution #2 and #10, 1935; Ways and Means #5, 1935; Resolution #4, #11, and #14, 1933; Resolution #7, 1930; Resolution #1, 1924; and Resolution #1, 1920.

The following resolutions were considered covered by the Church Manual: Resolution #1 and #8, 1937; Resolution #3, 1936; Resolution #7, 1933; Resolution #6 and #12, 1932; Resolution #6 and #10, 1931; Resolutions #5, #6, #7, 1930; Resolution #2 and #5, 1932; Resolution #2, 1927; Resolution #2, 1925; Resolution #9, 1924; Resolutions #3, #6, #7, #8, #9 and #14, 1923; Resolutions #1, #3, and #6, 1922; Resolution #2, 1920; and Resolution #1, 1919.

The District Council was empowered to decide which of the resolutions still in effect from previous years and unaltered by this Assembly, shall be printed in this year's District Minutes. The Home Missionary Treasurer was instructed to make a correcting entry in his books to remove the deficit due to the discontinuation of the Church Loan Fund.

The meeting was adjourned by motion. The closing prayer was offered by Rev. Harold D. Dieter.

Evening Meeting

The evening meeting was opened at 7:00 p. m. by singing "O Happy Day." Scripture quotations were offered by different members of the Assembly and followed by a gracious season of prayer.

The roll call was dispensed with for the remainder of the Assembly.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Resolutions #2 and #3 of Ways and Means Committee were adopted.

The Resolutions Committee presented Resolutions #1, #2, #3, and #4.

Resolutions #1 and #2 were adopted.

Resolutions #3 and #4 were referred.

The time for the election of officers was set for Tuesday morning at 9:00 a.m.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Rev. R. H. Heckart.

Second Day—July 23—Morning Session

The meeting was opened at 9:00 a.m. Brother Ward Printz led in singing "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes" and "Footsteps of Jesus."

Rev. H. A. Saneholtz led the Assembly in prayer.

Rev. H. F. Felter read a Scripture lesson from Philippians 2:1-8.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The order of the day was postponed that a report from the Ways and Means Committee might be heard.

Albert Massey transferring from the Virginia District and Liden Adams transferring from the Pittsburgh District were received as members of this District.

The order of the day was taken up and the following were appointed as tellers: J. F. Lint, Raymond Hoffman, Philip Doyle, J. H. Sherwood, and Armand Doll.

After a gracious season of prayer the Assembly proceeded to vote for a District Superintendent.

A ballot resulted in the election of Rev. R. G. Flexon as District Super-intendent.

A ballot was cast for Assistant District Superintendent resulting in the election of Rev. R. H. Heckart.

A ballot was cast for District Secretary resulting in the election of Rev. H. J. Felter.

A ballot was cast for District Treasurer resulting in the election of Rev. W. R. Fitch.

A ballot was cast for the election of two ministerial advisory members of the District Council resulting in the election of Rev. Harold D. Dieter and Rev. H. E. Uhrig.

The following were nominated from the floor for the election of one lay member to the District Council: Irvin Crissinger, Grant Bertolet, and Ward Printz. A ballot was cast resulting in the election of Irvin Crissinger.

The following were nominated by the District Council for the election of one member to the Examining Board for three years: Rev. H. E. Uhrig, Rev. R. H. Heckart, and Rev. H. A. Saneholtz.

There was no election on the first ballot cast to fill the vacancy on the Examining Board.

A vote on one of the two receiving the highest number of votes resulted in the election of Rev. H. A. Saneholtz.

The following laymen were nominated for the election of one member of the District Trustee Board: Charles Maas and M. E. Kleppinger.

The time was extended to cover the balloting to fill the vacancies on the District Trustee Board.

M. E. Kleppinger was elected to fill the unexpired term of H. D. Wolfe.

A ballot was cast for the election of one ministerial member to the District Board of Trustees resulting in the election of Rev. S. L. Adams, for seven years.

The meeting was adjourned by expiration of time.

The closing prayer was offered by the District Superintendent, Rev. R. G. Flexon.

Afternoon Meeting

The meeting was opened by the Assembly joining in singing "All the Way My Saviour Leads Me." Rev. J. S. Hankins read a Scripture lesson from Ephesians the sixth chapter after which Rev. S. L. Adams and Rev. Frank Schweitzer led in prayer.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A financial report from the Allentown Bible Institute was presented by the Land Fund Treasurer, Rev. W. R. Fitch. The report was accepted. Rev. Harold D. Dieter, president of the Allentown Bible Institute, brought a very interesting address on the subject of Bible Schools which afforded much valuable information as to the Allentown Bible Institute.

The Ways and Means Committee was instructed to bring in a Resolution on the raising of funds to retire indebtedness and cover cost of improvements in property of Allentown Bible Institute.

Rev. and Mrs. William C. Allshouse of Wollaston, Mass., were introduced to the Assembly.

The chairman made a stirring appeal for the wholehearted support for our Bible School reminding us of its necessity and great value to our church.

The Resolutions Committee presented a memorial to the memory of Henry Wolfe who departed this life Sept. 16, 1939.

The Resolutions Committee presented resolutions #3 and #4.

Resolution #3 was adopted.

Resolution #4 was adopted.

Recommendation was passed for the renewal of the following District Licenses: Fred Bertolet, Mrs. Grant Bertolet, Mrs. W. F. Bubb, William Bloom, Armand Doll, Jason H. Felter, James Heise, Oliver Holden, J. L. Johnson, Mrs. Edna Kunkle Chandler, J. H. Mease, Catherine Palsgrove, Walter Schaltenbrand, Mrs. Walter Schaltenbrand, Edwin Stetser, Benjamin Sheckels, William Welch, J. E. Wolfe, and Lester Zehner.

Recommendation was passed for the renewal of the following Deaconesses Licenses: Harriet Bruchlacher, Mrs. Armand Doll, Mrs. Harry Felter, Mrs. Robert Finch, Elenora B. Key, Mrs. Herbert Moser, Mrs. Dennison Snyder, and Alice Spatz.

New District License was granted to Leonard Leitzel.

Rev. Robert Finch transferring from the Virginia District was received as a member of this District.

The recommendation of the District Council that Russell D. Gunsalus be received as a member of this district with the same credentials as when he withdrew to Evangelical Church was accepted.

The number of minutes to be printed was left to the District Council.

The time was extended to 4:55 p. m.

The following Committees were appointed: Resolutions Committee, Ways and Means Committee, Auditing Committee, Equalization of Carfare, Publicity Committee, Reception Committee, Editing Committee, and Statistical.

A motion to reconsider resolution #4 was lost.

The meeting adjourned to reconvene at 6:00 p. m.

Prayer was offered by Rev. W. F. Bubb.

Evening Meeting

The meeting was opened by all joining in singing "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" after which the Assembly was led in prayer by Rev. J. A. Byrd and Rev. Paul Sawdy.

The Ways and Means Committee presented Resolutions #4, #5, and #6. All were adopted.

Resolution #1 of Ways and Means of 1938 minutes was rescinded.

A resolution from the floor was presented as follows:

"Be it resolved that the equivalent of 7% of total church receipts, excepting General Budget, money for indebtedness, Building Fund, Sunday School, Young People's Society Funds, and Special Funds raised for the departments covered by the District Budget, be paid monthly through the local church treasurer to be apportioned as follows: 60% Bible School, 20% Home Missions, and 20% District Expense."

The appointment by the District Council of Rev. Richard Powell, Rev. Raymond Hoffman and Rev. W. F. Bubb as a Home Missionary Committee was ratified by the Assembly.

The Council was authorized to set the date for the next campmeeting and assembly.

A Committee on Memorials to the General Assembly was appointed by the District Superintendent.

Rev. R. G. Flexon expressed the appreciation of the Assembly to the chairman, W. L. Surbrook for his wise chairmanship and helpful advice throughout the Assembly.

The meeting was adjourned by motion.

RESOLUTIONS

- #1. RESOLVED that none of our churches receive into its membership anyone who has been recognized as a minister, without the approval of the District Council.
- #2. RESOLVED that the District Superintendent be empowered to call a closed meeting of the ordained ministers whenever he deems a situation is sufficiently serious to warrant it.
- #3. RESOLVED that Official District Stationery be furnished for all actively engaged ministers.
- #4. WHEREAS, there are certain conditions obtaining in our District, which seemingly, make it impossible for a large majority of our ministers to attend the District Camp for the full time, therefore, resolved:
- 1. That our District camp begin on Tuesday night and continue over the following Sunday.

- 2. That the District Assembly convene at nine a. m. on the Monday following the camp, with two sittings each day for the transaction of business with an evangelistic service each evening.
- 3. That in the interest of loyalty each pastor shall be present for the first service and shall not leave until after the last service without a valid excuse.
- 4. That no business meetings shall be held by any committees while devotional services are in progress in the tabernacle except in the case of emergency.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

#1. RESOLVED that the General Budget Apportionments be as follows:

#2. WHEREAS there is a sum of money in a certain fund; to be used in needy fields with certain restrictions that would be hard to comply with, and

WHEREAS the objective is quite in harmony with our Home Missionary projects,

RESOLVED, therefore, that these funds be released to the Home Missionary Department.

#3. WHEREAS there is a fund of \$50.62 known as a District Building Loan Fund, and

WHEREAS this fund is of no value as it stands,

RESOLVED that it be turned over to the Home Missionary Department.

#4. RESOLVED: first, that we require our ministers who are actively engaged to pay 60% of their tithe received from ministerial work through the local treasurer to the District Treasurer to be pro-rated as follows: five-sixths of said tithe to be paid to the District Superintendent and one-twelfth to Home Missions, and one-twelfth to a reserve fund until \$175.00 has accumulated and then it shall go to the Home Missionary Department.

Second, that the District Superintendent's rent, telephone, postage and telegrams be paid from the District Treasury, and that each pastor be responsible for raising a special offering upon his visit, the same to be applied on his expenses.

#5. RESOLVED, that the following apportionments be paid monthly through the District Treasurer to the Home Missionary Department:

#6. INASMUCH as Allentown Bible Institute is making a special appeal for \$5,000.00 by November 1st to be applied on property improvements and indebtedness.

RESOLVED, that we raise an average of \$1.00 per member over and above the District Budget in each church of the District.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Upon coming into office as District Superintendent of the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church I found my predecessor had done excellent work and had left the District in the best of condition. It was very easy to take hold where he left off and go forward. Although handicapped at the beginning of the year by illness, God has made it one of the best years of my fifteen years as a District Superintendent.

A spirit of harmony and cooperation has prevailed in the district surpassing anything I have ever seen. The spiritual tide has run high with most of the churches enjoying good revivals and with some the best revivals in their history. The finances have come easy with most all of our pastors seemingly being perfectly satisfied with their support, while the money for district and general work has come in systematically and the amount has exceeded our highest hopes considering the organization of the Pittsburgh District last year.

While the forced idleness because of illness along with other unforeseen developments greatly retarded the work in our Home Missionary program, I am glad something has been accomplished in that department; and through its efforts we can present the District with three new churches and the ground work laid for the fourth. These churches have small beginnings. We find this is the case with most of our new churches unless they are stolen from others, but to this method we refuse to stoop.

During the year I have traveled approximately thirty-four thousand miles. I have preached two hundred seventy-eight times, visited each church in the District twice with the exception of one and there I sent a proxy. I have held ninety-eight business meetings; presided over two District Assemblies and one ministerial convention; held one three-day missionary convention; have spoken in several other missionary meetings; have held five revivals and five campmeetings; held ten week-end conventions in the District churches; dedicated two churches, one campmeeting tabernacle, and rededicated two other churches; and have had the privilege of burning the mortgages on two of our largest churches. I visited and prayed in ninety-one homes, annointed and prayed with for healing, sixty-one; and have seen 2068 souls seeking God.

My support from the pastors tithes was \$1,789.84, from my evangelistic work, \$1,239.34, for presiding over District Assemblies \$100.00, and from the churches \$486.68. I have paid out for traveling expense, postage and telegrams \$402.02, which does not include wear and tear on my car.

I bow my head in humble thanksgiving to Him for all His manifold goodness to me.
