PROCEEDINGS

Monday, June 19, 1944

The thirty-first Annual Session of the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 2:00 p. m. in the Auditorium on the campus of the Allentown Bible Institute, Allentown, Pa.

The Conference was called to order by the District Superintendent, Rev. H. E. Uhrig.

The members of the Conference joined in a helpful song service led by Rev. Walter Schaltenbrand, accompanied at the piano by Mrs. Paul Uhrig.

The opening prayers were offered by the Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. Robert H. Heckart and Rev. Raymond Simpson.

After a brief introduction by the District Superintendent, the General Superintendent took the Chair.

The General Superintendent made appropriate remarks based on a scripture lesson from II Cor. 4:1-10 and Col. 4:17. He spoke briefly relative to "Some Pungent Points for Ministers", bearing particularly on the importance of a clean, godly ministry.

The Secretary called the roll.

The Conference bar was established according to the standing rule.

The time for the Conference sittings was set at 9:00 to 11:30 a. m. and 2:00 to 5:00 p. m.

The time for meals was set at 7:00 a. m., 12:00 noon, and 5:30 p. m.

The District Superintendent's report was called for and read. By motion the report was accepted with gratefulness to God and to our faithful superintendent.

The Statistician's report was called for. The report was presented by the statistician who was requested to read only the totals. After reading the totals on the Financial Reports, by motion he was instructed to dispense with reading the rest of the report, with the exception of the totals of the Membership Statistics.

The Statistician's report was accepted by motion.

The customary love offering for the Statistician was received from the Conference.

The District Superintendent presented a new church organized at Mt. Holly, N. J. In his remarks he gave special credit to Rev. J. L. Johnson, pastor of the Trenton, N. J. church for being instrumental in getting the work under way. The church was organized with eight members. By motion the organization was accepted by the Conference.

The following persons were received on transfer: Rev. Calvin Bradley, ordained minister from the Eastern District; Rev. C. W. Robb, elder from the Methodist Church; Rev. Robert Dettmer, ordained minister from the Pittsburgh District; Rev. C. B. Grassie, ordained minister from the New York District; Rev. Robert Gould, ordained minister from the Illinois District; and Rev. M. E. Stockman, ordained minister from the Kansas District.

All of these men, with the exception of M. E. Stockman who was not present, were introduced to the Conference by the District Superintendent.

The Conference stood and sang, "Blest be the Tie that Binds".

The Ways and Means Committee reported Resolutions 1, 2 and 3.

Resolution 1 was adopted.

Resolution 2 was adopted as amended.

Resolution 3 was adopted by motion (amending 9 of 1943).

The Conference was adjourned by motion.

The closing prayer was offered by the District Superintendent.

Second Day—Tuesday, June 20, 1944—9:00 A. M.

The meeting was called to order by a song service led by Rev. J. Artemas Byrd, then a hymn, "My Jesus I Love Thee" was sung with feeling.

Rev. Mrs. Walter Schaltenbrand was at the piano.

The Conference was led in prayer by Rev. Thomas Ferguson.

The General Superintendent read a scripture lesson from I Peter 5:1-9. He continued his address to the Conference on, "Pungent Points for Ministers", based on Col. 4:17. He spoke particularly of the danger of getting into ruts and the great need of working for revivals.

The Secretary called the roll.

By motion the following lay-members were seated with the full privileges of the Conference bar: Beech Creek—Mrs. Robert Dettmer; Pocono Lake—Mrs. Jack Campbell; Port Matilda—Mrs. Harry Daniels; Woodbury, N. J.—Mrs. Oliver Holden; Bridgeton, N. J.—Mrs. Alexander Passmore.

The minutes of the June 19 meeting were read and approved.

Ways and Means Committee presented Resolutions 4 and 5.

By motion the time was extended fifteen minutes.

It was moved and seconded to adopt resolution 4, dealing with the support of the Allentown Bible Institute.

By motion the Conference recessed until 1:30 p. m.

The closing prayer was offered by the Secretary.

Second Day—Tuesday, June 20, 1944—1:30 P. M.

The Conference was called to order with a song led by Rev. Oliver Holden. The song entitled, "Down at the Cross" was used.

Rev. William R. Munson led the Conference in prayer.

The Ways and Means Committee re-read Resolution 4 on which final action was pending.

The resolution was amended by striking out "25¢ per member, per month" and inserting "a Penny-a-Day per member". The main resolution as amended carried unanimously.

After certain complimentary remarks were made by the General Superintendent with reference to the services rendered by the President of the School, the Conference showed its appreciation by a rising vote.

By motion it was requested that the General Superintendent's remarks and a copy of the resolution be presented to the other District Conferences in the Eastern School Zone.

Ways and Means Resolution 5, dealing with General Conference Sinking Fund was adopted by motion.

By motion the hour for the election of officers was set at 3:00 p. m.

Ways and Means Resolution 6, dealing with the specifications intended to govern and purchase of a District parsonage was adopted by motion.

The Examining Board presented the names of Dean Phillips and Margaret Kovacic for new District License. By motion both were approved.

The auditors' report was presented and adopted by motion.

The District Treasurer read his report. It was adopted by motion.

At the time set for the election of officers the District Superintendent named five tellers: J. Arthur Depew, Edward J. Shemelia, Harold R. Crosser, J. Franklin Lint, and E. Liden Adams.

After a brief season of silent prayer, and an audible prayer by the General Superintendent the first ballot was cast for District Superintendent.

Rev. H. E. Uhrig was elected on the first ballot as District Superintendent receiving 95 out of a total of 107 votes.

The Conference was favored with a song by Rev. Bessie Hatcher.

Rev. Robert H. Heckart was elected on the first ballot as Assistant District Superintendent receiving 79 out of a total of 108 votes.

Rev. Harold D. Dieter was elected District Secretary on the first ballot receiving 96 out of a total of 108 votes.

Additional tellers were appointed by the District Superintendent: Walter E. Schaltenbrand, J. Artemas Byrd, and Paul Uhrig.

The Secretary read the names of the persons nominated by the District Council to be voted upon for the office of District Treasurer: W. R. Fitch, J. Artemas Byrd and J. Franklin Lint.

Rev. W. R. Fitch was elected on the first ballot as District Treasurer receiving 70 out of a total of 105 votes.

By motion nominations for the election of a layman to the District Council were received.

Nominations were closed on motion after I. L. Crissinger was named.

The first ballot was cast for three advisory members to be elected to the District Council.

On motion the Conference was instructed to place the name of two ministers and one layman on the ballot.

By motion the District Council was instructed to bring in nominations to fill vacancies on the Board of Trustees.

The District Council named E. E. Hostetter, Jack Campbell, and Harold D. Dieter, as nominees to fill the vacancy on the Examining Board.

Rev. Harold D. Dieter was elected on the first ballot, receiving 77 out of 107 votes.

The Conference was favored with a special song by Rev. Oliver Holden.

The District Council named the following laymembers as nominees to fill vacancies on the Board of Trustees: Mr. Ward F. Printz, Mr. William Wheatley, Mr. Ed Metzger, Mr. Fred Bechtel, and Mr. Edward Harper.

It was moved and seconded that the person receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for seven years; second highest, six years; and the third highest, four years.

The first ballot for the District Trustees was cast.

Rev. Floyd Baker, pastor of the Dover, Delaware church, of the Eastern District, was introduced to the Conference and granted an honorary seat within the Conference Bar.

The report of the first ballot cast for advisory members to the Council showed the following result: Rev. Walter F. Bubb was elected receiving 58 and Mr. I. L. Crissinger was elected receiving 104.

By motion another ballot was cast voting for one of the three highest named: H. A. Saneholtz, Frank H. Schweitzer and S. Lewis Adams.

The Resolution Committee presented Resolutions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6.

By motion Resolution 1 was adopted. The Conference stood at attention in a moment of silent prayer after which a few words of appreciation were spoken by the General Superintendent for the lives of the good laymen who have passed on.

Resolutions 2, 3, 4, and 5 were adopted by motion.

The time was extended fifteen minutes.

The report on the ballot for District Trustees showed the following result: A total of 104 votes were cast. Ward F. Printz received 81; William Wheatley received 74; and Ed. Harper received 58.

Report on the second ballot cast for ministerial advisory member to the District Council showed no election.

By motion a ballot was cast for one of the two highest.

By motion the evening evangelistic service was set aside for a brief session of the Conference and an ordination service.

The time for the Ordination Service was set at 7:30.

The report on the ballot cast for ministerial member to the District Council showed Rev. H. A. Sanholtz elected with 62 out of 101 votes.

The Conference recessed until 7:00 p. m.

The closing prayer was offered by the District Treasurer.

Second Day—Tuesday, June 20, 1944—7:30 P. M.

The Conference was called to order by the General Superintendent who presided in the meeting.

The following names with a recommendation that they be approved for ordination were presented by the Secretary: Verino G. Gattone, Edward J. Shemelia, Harry J. Daniels, Homer J. Hain and Marlin Hain.

The recommendation was approved by motion.

The Ordination Council consisted of the following men: Rev. W. L. Surbrook, General Superintendent; Rev. H. E. Uhrig, District Superintendent; Rev. Robert H. Heckart, Assistant District Superintendent; Rev. Harold D. Dieter, District Secretary; Rev. W. R. Fitch, District Treasurer; and Rev. Walter F. Bubb, advisory member of the District Council.

THE ORDINATION SERVICE

Rev. Kenneth Masterman sang with deep feeling, "He Will Not Fail Me Now". Prayer was offered by the District Treasurer, Rev. W. R. Fitch.

Scripture lessons were read by Rev. Robert H. Heckart, Rev. Harold D. Dieter and Rev. H. E. Uhrig from Titus 3:1-11, and II Tim. 4:1-18, I Tim. 3:1-13, respectively.

A forceful message on the need of the ministry to prove itself blameless in three things: (1) Demeanor, (2) Duty, (3) Doctrine, was delivered very ably by the General Superintendent.

The General Superintendent exhorted the candidates to take the ministry of the Word very seriously and to labor faithfully to adorn the gospel throughout their lives. He emphasized the fact that the purpose of the ministry chiefly is to win souls.

With the awarding of the ordination credentials the service was brought to a close.

Prayer offered by the District Superintendent.

The Conference adjourned by motion at 8:30 p. m.

Third Day—Wednesday, June 21, 1944—9:00 A. M.

The Conference was called to order by a Song service in which the hymns, "Hiding in Thee", and "All that Thrills My Soul" were sung with Oliver Holden as song leader. The District Superintendent, Rev. H. E. Uhrig, presided.

Rev. J. Franklin Lint read a scripture lesson from I John the first chapter.

Prayer was offered by Rev. C. B. Grassie.

The roll call was dispensed with by motion.

The minutes of the June 20th: morning, afternoon, and evening sittings were read and approved as corrected.

The District Council reported the re-appointment of Raymond Hoffman, C. F. Kresge, and J. Franklin Lint to the Home Missionary Committee. The appointments were approved by motion.

The District Council reported the re-appointment of Rev. J. Artemas Byrd as Executive Secretary of Young People. The appointment was approved by motion.

By motion the Secretary called the roll of churches to determine the number of Conference Journals required, and the District Council was instructed to determine the total number to be printed.

By motion Jersey Shore is to appear in the Minutes as heretofore and the Secretary is authorized to make reference in a proper place to the independent churches at Mabel and Chillisquaque all in Pennsylvania and being pastored with our approval by members of our Conference.

By motion the second paragraph, Ways and Means Resolution 5, 1943, was amended to read: *RESOLVED*, That all other members of the District Conference be requested to pay at the rate of \$1.00 for each day, or any portion thereof during the Conference Sessions.

The Resolution Committee presented Resolution 7. It was adopted by motion.

By a motion the pastors were requested to prepare a list of the names on blanks provided by the Secretary, of men and women who are in the Service of our Country, and return the list to the Secretary no later than the first of July to be published in the Conference Minutes.

By motion the District Council was requested to prepare a tribute to our Service Men and Women and have it printed together with a list of the names of the persons in the Service of our Country in a pamphlet form for distribution among our people.

The Examining Board presented the following names for *Renewal of District Licenses*: Mrs. Grant Bertolet, William C. Bloom, Mrs. Walter F. Bubb, Lodge Chappell, Arthur Davies, Oliver G. Holden, Deborah Hoover, Ward F. Printz, Joshua Slimmer, Edwin S. Stetser, Albert Snader, and J. E. Wolfe. They were approved by motion.

The following names were presented for *Renewal of Deaconess Licenses*: Mrs. Esther G. Hibshman and Alice Spatz. They were approved by motion.

Since Harley McKee was not present during the conference sittings, the chairman of the Examining Board requested that the Conference authorize issuing of a new district license, with the approval of the District Council, in the event he should appear before the close of the week.

By motion the permission was granted.

By motion paragraph 6, page 14, 1943 Conference Minutes was made standing rule 5.

The District Superintendent, Rev. H. E. Uhrig, made appointment of committees for 1944-45 as follows:

Hostetter, Chairman; Edward Crosser, Vice Chairman; J. Franklin Lint, Secretary; Jack Campbell and Floyd F. Fehr. *Auditing*: W. E. Schaltenbrand, Chairman; John A. Gangaware, Vice Chairman; Paul Sawdy, Secretary. *Equalization of Carfare*: Alexander Passmore, Chairman; Harold R. Crosser, Vice Chairman; J. Arthur Depew, Secretary. *Publicity*: Robert H. Heckart. *Reception*: William R. Munson and Edward J. Shemelia. *Editing*: Harold D. Dieter. *Statistician*: J. Artemas Byrd.

By motion the District Council was authorized to arrange for the printing of district stationery.

The closing prayer was offered by the Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. Robert H. Heckart.

The Conference adjourned by motion.

The Conference disbanded after singing, "God Be With You, 'Till We Meet Again".

2. *RESOLVED*, That the Council be authorized to make a special appeal to the churches for funds to meet deficits which might develop in the District Expense Fund at any time.

No. 4, 1943 Amended

3. *WHEREAS*, A generous gift of \$500.00 has been received by the District Council with which to establish a fund from which loans may be made to new and needy churches, be it

RESOLVED, That we maintain a Church Building Loan Fund. The fund is to be held in trust by the District Council, and

That 5% of the total Home Missionary Offerings be appropriated by the District Treasurer to the increase of said Church Building Loan Fund.

Loans can be made from said fund by the Council to congregations endeavoring to erect new church buildings, but only after a thorough investigation of the financial status of the congregation by the Council.

When a loan is granted, the congregation to which the loan is made shall give a note to the District Treasurer signed by the local trustees.

The principal shall be paid back in installments, with interest at 5% in advance, monthly, except that the minimum charge for interest shall not be less than 50¢ per month. The amount of the monthly installments shall be determined by the District Council.

The District Treasurer shall mail a statement of the amount due on the 20th of each month to each church that has a loan from said Fund.

In the event that a congregation which has made a loan according to this plan, fails to meet its installments for a period of three months, its financial standing shall be investigated by the District Council.

4. *INASMUCH*, as the prayers of God's people have been so definitely answered down through the years in the Allentown Bible Institute, and

INASMUCH, as generous gifts by God's people during the past winter have made the liquidation of our entire indebtedness possible at the rate of \$150.00 a month, without interest, and

INASMUCH, as these generous gifts have been inspired largely by the Zone-wide participation in the Penny-a-Day plan during the past two years, and

INASMUCH, as there is now probably sufficient cash in hand to complete the auditorium and dining hall, and

INASMUCH, as the School Board now proposes to raise sufficient funds during the next five years to meet maintenance costs and taxes on the school property and to accumulate enough money during the same period to build a much needed dormitory and library building without going into debt, be it

RESOLVED, That we as a District continue the use of the Penny-a-Day plan, and that we put forth a wholehearted effort to raise our quota for five years on said basis in support of the School.

5. *INASMUCH*, as there is no provision to raise the funds for the delegates' expense to the General Conference, be it

RESOLVED, That we deduct 10% from the District Expense Fund for this purpose.

6. *INASMUCH*, as we have no permanent location for the District parsonage, be it

RESOLVED, That we authorize the District Council, if they deem it advisable, to purchase a property in the City of Reading or Allentown,

The price shall not exceed \$7500.00. This project may be financed in whatsoever way the District Council may deem advisable.

7. *RESOLVED*, That each church provide the District Conference with no less than \$4.00 each for the pastor and delegate, or delegates who attend the District Conference, and

RESOLVED, That all other members of the District Conference be requested to pay at the rate of \$1.00 for each day, or for any portion thereof during the Conference sessions.

No. 5, 1943 Amended

8. In accordance with the regulation of the Manual, page 77, section 109, paragraph 2, and, page 91, section 133, paragraphs 12 and 13, be it

RESOLVED, That we hereby apply the same ratio of payment to the District Budget and the Penny-a-Day Bible School financial plan in the newly organized churches in this District.

No. 6, 1943

9. *WHEREAS*, There is no provision to meet the obligation of paragraph 2, chapter 5, page 68, of the Manual, be it

RESOLVED, That we establish a Retirement and Emergency Fund, and

RESOLVED, That said fund be provided for by requiring our ministers who are actively engaged to pay 10% of all of their tithes received from ministerial work through the local treasurer to be forwarded to the District Treasurer for this purpose.

No. 7, 1943

10. *RESOLVED*, (1) That we require our ministers who are actively engaged to pay 50% of their tithe received from ministerial work through the local treasurer to the District Treasurer for the support of the District Superintendent, and

(2) That each pastor shall raise an offering upon the visit of the Superintendent for his expenses and that the rent, telephone, postage and telegrams shall be paid from the District Treasury.

No. 4, 1942

1. *RESOLVED*, That 7% of the total church receipts, excepting General Budget, money for indebtedness, building fund, Sunday School, young people's society funds, and special funds raised for the departments covered by the District Budget, be paid monthly to the District Treasurer to be apportioned by him as follows: 50% Bible School, 20% Home Missions, and 30% District Expense.

No. 5, 1941

12. *WHEREAS*, The General Board has ruled that each church should raise a minimum of one dollar per member for General Budget and all Foreign Missionary money to be raised separately, be it

RESOLVED, That each local church divide its apportionment: one-third for General Budget and two-thirds for Foreign Missions. All money raised for general work above the apportionments may be designated as the local church desires. If for any reason a local church does not divide its apportionment according to above specifications the District Treasurer is hereby authorized to divide the same.

13. *RESOLVED*, (1) That the carfares to the District Conference be equalized on the basis of 1½ (one and one-half) cents per mile, using road mileage;

such mileage to be worked out by the Committee on Equalization using official American Automobile Association maps and information to determine shortest routes over paved main and connecting highways; and

(2) That the mileage thus determined shall be put on permanent record, such record to be used as a basis of equalization from year to year, and

(3) That the Committee from year to year shall determine the mileage of the new churches in the same manner and from the same sources of information.

Bertolet, brethren who were loyal laborers in their local churches and who were deeply interested in the affairs of the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church and whose merit qualified them for the trustee board of the District by the vote of the Conference, be it

RESOLVED, That we stand in reverent acknowledgement of our loss and that this resolution be recorded in our Conference Minutes as a memorial.

2. *INASMUCH*, as our Brother and fellow-minister in the gospel, Rev. Robert Finch, has been permitted in the unquestionable providence of God to suffer affliction and hospitalization, be it

RESOLVED, That the District Secretary send him greetings by telegram and bid him Godspeed along the road to recovery.

3. *INASMUCH*, as the Allentown Bible Institute, in cooperation with the Selective Service System has adopted an accelerated Program of study, which conflicts with our camp and conference date, be it therefore

RESOLVED, That our Conference year close May 31, 1945, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the District Camp be held at the Allentown Bible Institute June 9 to June 17, 1945 and that the Conference begin Monday, June 11 at 2:00 p. m. and continue with morning and afternoon sessions, until business is concluded.

4. *WHEREAS*, our General Superintendent, Rev. W. L. Surbrook has so honorably and ably presided over these conference sessions, be it

RESOLVED, That we give him a rising vote of thanks to show our appreciation.

5. *RESOLVED*, That we express our appreciation for the fine work done by our District Superintendent and District Secretary by having the Conference give them a rising vote of thanks.

6. *INASMUCH*, as the management of the camp meeting has done such splendid work and ministered to our comforts by entertaining the Conference and camp meeting so efficiently, be it

RESOLVED, That to all those responsible we give a rising vote of thanks.

7. *RESOLVED*, That our District Treasurer have prepared suitable receipts to correspond with local treasurers' monthly remittance blanks, and that a receipt be mailed to each person making a remittance to the District Treasurer, said receipt to be mailed within thirty days of time of receiving the remittance.

8. *WHEREAS*, The Honorable Edward H. Martin, Governor of the State of Pennsylvania is using the influence of his good office in the interest of the moral welfare of our young men and women, both in Army Training Centers and elsewhere throughout the State of Pennsylvania, and

WHEREAS, The Governor's activities in this regard are deeply appreciated by the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the said Conference offer our unanimous and wholehearted commendation to the Governor of our State in appreciation for his noble and successful efforts in safeguarding the interests of our people.

THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Thirty-first Annual Conference of the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now convened at Allentown, Pennsylvania:

Greetings in the Name of Him who loved us and washed us in His own precious blood.

Without question, scripture prophecy is being rapidly fulfilled. We are living in a titanic age; in the very end time. The words of Jesus are being realized more and more as the days pass, "All these are the beginning of sorrows." It seems that there is hardly a home untouched by sadness of some description.

We are facing the darkest hour in the world's history. With the sun of this Gospel Day setting behind storm clouds, it is encouraging to know that Jesus said, "Upon this Rock will I build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it."

The Lord has been very gracious to us this past year. While there has been some very serious illness among the Ministry, yet the Lord has withheld

the hand of death for which we give Him praise. However, we regret to report that death has claimed two of our District Trustees, Grant R. Bertolet and William Gallagher. Brother Bertolet was also a member of the General Conference.

We feel that the blessing of God is resting upon the District. The Brethren are pulling together, and there is a splendid spirit of unity and cooperation. The kindness shown by all the Brethren towards me is indeed beyond description.

The Home Missionary Department

Because of the many pressing duties in the district, such as the changing of Pastors, (which has continued for about nine months) and the filling in where Evangelists have cancelled meetings, we have not seen accomplished what we had desired. However we are grateful for the new church organized at Mt. Holly, New Jersey.

The church at Williamstown, Pa., has been reopened. Rev. Homer Hain is conducting the services here in connection with his work in Armstrong Valley.

The work at Jersey Shore is being pastored by Deborah Hoover.

Recently I visited the city of Scranton, Pa., where there is a nucleus for a new work. Plans are under way for a campaign in the near future.

Our preachers are supplying the independent churches at Chillisquaque, and Mabel, Pa.

Church Property

On Sunday, June 4, we had the privilege of dedicating a splendid church building at Allenwood, Pa. The indebtedness of \$800.00 was all provided for in cash and pledges. There was a gracious spirit of giving upon the service, which resulted in a cash offering amounting to \$514.00.

A very nice brick and block basement church was opened February 6 at Salem, N. J.

A long felt need has been supplied by the purchase of property at State College.

The church at North Rome has purchased property including the place of worship and a parsonage.

At Lebanon we now have a nice six room parsonage in connection with the church.

The Jersey Shore property has been purchased and paid for.

The Bible School

This has been a year of victory both spiritually and financially at the Allentown Bible Institute. I have visited the school and preached to the students several times during the year. I also visited classes both in the High School and the School of Theology. It has been a year of many mighty visitations of the Spirit of God.

Statistical

During the past eleven months I have visited all our churches and preaching points twice and some several times. I have held three revivals and thirteen week-end conventions on the District.

I have traveled 13,850 miles in the course of my work; 5,800 miles by automobile and 8,050 miles by train and bus.

I have conducted 102 Board Meetings, two church meetings and six annual meetings.

I dedicated two children, anointed several for healing and preached 201 times. There were 101 seekers for salvation.

I received for my support: From the District, \$2,885.25; from visiting the churches and week-end conventions, \$843.38; from evangelistic meetings, \$175.00. Paid out for traveling expense, \$646.30.
