PROCEEDINGS

Monday, June 16, 1947—9:00 A. M.

The thirty-fourth Annual Conference of the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:00 a. m. in the auditorium of the Allentown Bible Institute, Allentown, Pennsylvania.

Rev. Oliver G. Holdren led the conference in an inspirational song service.

Mrs. A. A. Passmore presided at the piano.

Rev. H. E. Uhrig, the District Superintendent, made some timely and encouraging remarks anticipating a spiritual conference. Rev. R. C. Dettmer led in an opening prayer.

Rev. H. E. Uhrig, the District Superintendent introduced The General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, who delivered a stirring and challenging address to the Conference on the subject, "The Mission of Our Church." Rev. Sturk presented and endeavored to answer the following questions regarding the church. First, Why are we here? He stated that though there are upwards of 300 Protestant groups, many unorthodox groups, 4,000 independent tabernacles and many other religious groups, yet we as a Pilgrim Holiness Church, have a definite place to fill. Though we are small in numbers and low in prestige, yet we must major in deep spirituality, preach definite holiness, maintain spiritual freedom and endeavor to save the lost. The second question presented was "What path shall we take?" Not ultra-modernism nor mild modernism, nor laodicean lukewarmness nor popular holiness should be our path, but we must pursue the rugged way of the cross. Regarding the question, why are we no larger, he stated that some of the reasons were these: a fear of being too large, too much rejoicing over back-door revivals and too little loyalty in our hearts for the church and each other.

The Secretary called the roll of the ministerial and lay delegates.

Churches who had no delegate present were given the privilege to place some one as delegate who may be present and eligible. Mrs. Edward Crosser was seated as delegate for Ashland church.

The Reception Committee presented the following ministers who were received by the District Council by transfer from other districts: Rev. A. J. Walters, of the Free Methodist Church; Rev. Edwin Houston, a licensed minister of the Virginia District; Rev. Clifford Berry, a licensed minister of the New York District; Rev. R. Lewis Adams, an ordained minister of the New York District; Rev. Charles Jester, a licensed minister of the Eastern District, and Rev. William Whitmore, an ordained minister of the Ohio District.

Rev. P. F. Elliott, General Secretary of Sunday Schools, was presented to the Conference and given a friendly welcome and granted an honorary seat within the Conference bar.

Rev. Dean Confer, a local minister and pastor of our church at Summit Hill, Pennsylvania, was presented to the Conference and granted a seat within the Conference bar.

Rev. Graham Senter, an Instructor in Allentown Bible Institute and an ordained minister of the Eastern District, was presented to the Conference and granted an honorary seat in the Conference bar.

By motion the Conference sittings were set as follows: 9:00 to 11:30 a. m., 2:00 to 4:30 p. m., and 7:00 to 9:00 p. m.

The District Superintendent's report was called for. Rev. Uhrig read his report and it was received by motion with gratitude.

Following the District Superintendent's report, the General Superintendent spoke of the great responsibility resting on the District Superintendent and exhorted all present to hold him up in prayer.

The Statistical Report was called for. Due to a near expiration of time, it was moved that time be extended until the Statistician had completed his report. Rev. J. Franklin Lint responded with a splendid report which was received by motion with gratitude.

By motion the Statistician was instructed to total all columns of major importance on his report and include them in the Conference Journal.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

The District Superintendent closed the sitting with prayer.

Monday, June 16, 1947—2:00 P. M.

The Conference was called to order by the Chairman, and opened with an inspirational song service, with Mrs. R. F. Finch presiding at the piano. Rev. Bessie Hatcher led in the opening prayer.

The General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, made a few but enlightening remarks regarding "trends in the church." He said there are trends in our church that manifests that we are moving in the right direction. Some of the trends are: a willingness to uphold spiritual freedom, a burden for souls, and a fervent desire to earnestly contend for the faith.

The Secretary called the roll of ministerial and lay delegates.

The minutes of the morning sitting were read and corrected and approved as corrected.

The Auditing Committee reported favorably on the District Treasurer's records. The report was received by motion.

Rev. W. R. Fitch, District Treasurer, read his annual report and it was received by motion.

Rev. R. F. Finch, secretary of the District Sunday School Committee, gave his report on District Sunday School work. His report was received by motion.

The District Superintendent presented a new church to the Conference, the Finesville, New Jersey church, with a membership of 14. Rev. Ellis F. Phillips, the pastor, and Mr. Harvey Beatty, were introduced to the Conference and each spoke briefly of the work in Finesville.

By motion the Finesville, New Jersey church, was received into the Conference.

The Committee on Resolutions reported.

Resolution No. 1 was received by motion. A motion to amend was offered. A motion was entertained to substitute for the amendment. The motion to

substitute was lost. The first amendment was passed by motion. A second amendment was offered by motion. By motion the resolution was referred to the Committee for re-drafting.

Resolution No. 2 was ruled out of order by the Chairman upon the basis that it was contrary to Manual.

Resolution No. 3 was adopted by motion.

By motion Resolution No. 3 was tabled.

The Ways and Means Committee reported.

Ways and Means Resolutions Nos. 1 and 2 were read.

Motion prevailed that Rev. P. F. Elliott, Chairman of the General Church Pension Plan, speak to the Conference Tuesday at 10 a. m. Carried.

The meeting adjourned.

Rev. P. F. Elliott closed the sitting with prayer.

Monday, June 16, 1947—7:00 P. M.

The conference was called to order by the chairman and opened with an inspirational song service led by Rev. Edward Shemelia. Rev. Harley Hoffman led in the opening prayer. In continuing the worship service the chairman called for Scripture quotations from the floor. Many responded in quoting some inspiring verses from the Word.

The General Superintendent spoke briefly but earnestly regarding some of the interests of the General Church. He spoke of the work of General Foreign Missions and General Home Missions and General Church Interests and requested that we earnestly pray that God continue to provide sufficient funds to carry on the great work.

By motion the roll call was dispensed with for the rest of the Conference. Carried.

The secretary read the minutes of the afternoon sitting. The minutes were corrected and approved as corrected.

The Ways and Means Committee reported.

Ways and Means Resolution No. 1 was read and adopted by motion. An amendment was offered by motion and carried. The resolution as amended carried.

A motion that Harold Crosser be appointed to report the Campmeeting and Conference to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate was carried.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

Resolution No. 1 formerly referred to the committee for redrafting was read as re-drafted and adopted by motion. An amendment was offered by motion that the Word Saturday be substituted for the word Friday in the resolution. The amendment carried. The resolution as amended carried.

Rev.. Ruth Nuby, an evangelist of the Ohio District, and Mrs. George Young, her co-laborer, were introduced to the Conference and granted an honorary seat within the Conference bar.

By request, Rev. Nuby sang two inspiring songs to the enjoyment and blessing of all present.

Resolution No. 5 was read and adopted by motion and carried.

Resolutions No. 4, 5, 6 were read. Resolution No. 4 was adopted by motion. The resolution carried.

A motion carried to extend the time until 9:30 p. m.

Resolution No. 6 was read and adopted by motion and carried.

By motion it was determined that the District should provide sufficient report blanks for the coming year to cover all necessary items to be reported. Carried.

The meeting adjourned with prayer by Samuel Gant.

Second Day—June 17, 1947—9:00 A. M.

The Conference opened with a song service led by Rev. Marlin Hain. Prayer was offered by Rev. S. Lewis Adams.

The General Superintendent read a Scripture Lesson.

The substance of religion is Love. The sum total of one's obligations to one another is love. It is convincing love, a respectful love, a liberal love, a sympathetic love, a uniting love, a condescending love, a peaceable love.

The District Superintendent spoke for a few moments relating to the Conference, the faithfulness and mercy of God in his own personal life during the past Conference year.

The Minutes of the Monday Evening sitting were read and approved.

Rev. R. N. Raycroft, evangelist of the New York District, and Rev. Elvin West, pastor of the Port Jervis, New York Pilgrim Holiness Church, were introduced to the Conference and granted an honorary seat within the Conference bar.

A motion was made to excuse the Resolutions Committee. The motion carried.

Rev. P. F. Elliott, chairman of General Church Pension Board, was presented to the Conference. He spoke briefly of the history and importance of the Pension Plan. A period of questions and answers followed to acquaint the Conference with the nature and execution of the plan.

Moved and seconded the time be extended twenty minutes.

A continuance of the discussion on the Pension Plan followed.

The meeting adjourned with prayer by Rev. L. W. Sturk.

Second Day—June 17, 1947—2:00 P. M.

The Conference opened with song service led by Rev. R. F. Finch. Rev. Thomas Ferguson led in prayer.

Rev. J. Franklin Lint was appointed Secretary pro-tem due to the fact that the Secretary was meeting with the Council.

The Minutes of June 17, 9:00 a. m., were read and approved.

Miss Clara Sherman, an instructor in Bible Holiness Seminary, Owosso, Michigan, and ———— Shaffer, of the New York District, were introduced to the Conference and gave brief testimonies.

A considerable length of time was spent in a further discussion of the Pension Plan.

It was moved and seconded that the matter of the Pension Plan be deferred.

A call was made for the previous question and a standing vote was taken. The motion carried.

The motion to defer carried.

Rev. P. F. Elliott made a few remarks of appreciation for the attitude of the Conference toward the General Pension Plan.

The Secretary presented the recommendations of the Examining Board as follows:

The recommendation was accepted by motion.

The Resolutions Committee presented Resolutions Nos. 7 and 8.

Resolution No. 7 was adopted by motion.

Resolution No. 8 died with want of a motion.

The Election became the next order of business.

The District Superintendent appointed tellers as follows:

Franklin Greenley, Clifford Berry, E. L. Zerby, Harold Crosser, Marlin Hain, Ellis Phillips, and J. Franklin Lint.

A ballot was cast for District Superintendent. 113 ballots were cast. Rev. H. E. Uhrig elected on the first ballot.

The newly elected Superintendent made a brief speech of acceptance and begged the prayers of the Conference for the District and its work.

A ballot was cast for Assistant District Superintendent. 116 ballots were cast with no election. A ballot was cast for the two having received the highest votes, R. H. Heckart and S. Lewis Adams.

A motion was carried that two groups of tellers should count the ballots.

Rev. S. Lewis Adams was elected as Assistant District Superintendent on the fifth ballot. (115 ballots cast.)

A ballot was cast for District Secretary. There was no election on the first ballot. A second ballot was cast for one of the two receiving the highest votes on the first ballot. Rev. J. Franklin Lint was elected as District Secretary on the second ballot. (114 ballots cast).

The District Secretary read the nominations of the District Council for District Treasurer: Rev. W. R. Fitch, Rev. Jack Campbell, Rev. W. F. Bubb.

Rev. W. R. Fitch was elected as District Treasurer on the first ballot. (115 ballots cast).

At 4:45 p. m. the meeting recessed until 7:00 p. m.

Closing prayer by Rev. J. A. Byrd.

Second Day—June 17, 1947—7:00 P. M.

The Conference re-convened with a song service led by Rev. Lodge Chappell. The blessing of the Lord descended on the conference and there was a period in which many were rejoicing and praising God.

Mrs. Florein Strohl requested prayer and was anointed and prayed for.

The minutes of the afternoon sitting were read and approved.

A motion was made to vote for additional members of the Council one at a time. Motion carried.

A ballot was cast for one ministerial member of the Council. There was no election on the first ballot. A ballot was cast for the two who received the highest vote on the first ballot: W. F. Bubb and R. H. Heckart. W. F. Bubb was elected. (104 ballots cast).

The secretary read the nominations of the Council for a member of the examining board: H. D. Dieter, Raymond Hoffman and E. E. Hostetter. H. D. Dieter was elected on the first ballot.

A ballot was cast for the second ministerial member of the Council. There was no election on the first ballot. The two who received the highest vote on the first ballot were voted on on the second ballot: H. A. Saneholtz and R. H. Heckart. There was no election. A third ballot was cast and there was no election. H. A. Saneholtz was elected on the fourth ballot.

A ballot was cast for a lay member of the Council. I. L. Crissinger was elected on the first ballot.

A motion was made to make nominations to fill the vacancy on the board of trustees created by the expired term of S. L. Adams and the unexpired term of William Wheatley. The motion carried. S. L. Adams and F. H. Schweitzer were nominated to fill the first vacancy, and Samuel Gant and W. D. Wolfe were nominated to fill the second vacancy.

Frank H. Schweitzer was elected to fill the seven-year term and W. D. Wolfe was elected to fill the three-year term.

The time was extended thirty minutes by motion.

Resolutions Committee reported. General Resolution No. 1 was read and adopted by a rising vote of thanks. General Resolution No. 2 was read and adopted by a rising vote of thanks.

3. *WHEREAS*, A generous gift of \$500.00 has been received by the District Council with which to establish a fund from which loans may be made to new and needy churches, be it

RESOLVED, That we maintain a Church Building Loan Fund. The fund is to be held in trust by the District Council, and

That 5% of the total Home Missionary Offerings be appropriated by the District Treasurer to the increase of said Church Building Loan Fund.

Loans can be made from said fund by the Council to congregations endeavoring to erect new church buildings, but only after a thorough investigation of the financial status of the congregation by the Council.

When a loan is granted, the congregation to which the loan is made shall give a note to the District Treasurer signed by the local trustees.

The principal shall be paid back in installments, with interest at 5% in advance, monthly, except that the minimum charge for interest shall not be less than 50¢ per month. The amount of the monthly installments shall be determined by the District Council.

The District Treasurer shall mail a statement of the amount due on the 20th of each month to each church that has a loan from said Fund.

In the event that a congregation which has made a loan according to this plan, fails to meet its installments for a period of three months, its financial standing shall be investigated by the District Council.

RESOLVED, That the names of all licentiates shall appear in the District Conference Journal under said classification.

5. Be it *RESOLVED*, That any congregation considering the erection of a church building and/or parsonage, or the making of extensive improvements and remodeling of church property, submit their tentative plans for same to the District Council for approval before final action by the local board and the beginning of said construction.

6. *RESOLVED*, That no one, having held or is holding ministerial credentials, making application for membership in any of our churches, shall be accepted without the approval of the District Council.

7. *WHEREAS*, The District Council generally lacks the proper and necessary information relative to ministers of other Districts and denominations desiring membership in our district; Be it

RESOLVED, That the same be required to answer a questionnaire supplied by the District Council. Be it further

RESOLVED, That no church shall extend a call to the said minister without first having obtained the approval of the District Council.

RESOLVED, That we express our appreciation to him by a rising vote of thanks, and be it further

RESOLVED, That we assure him of our prayers and support in the work the Church has called him to do.

9. *RESOLVED*, That we express our appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. H. E. Uhrig, for his faithful services on the District during the past year, by a rising vote of thanks.

THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

REV. H. E. UHRIG

To the Thirty-fourth Annual Conference of the Pennsylvania-New Jersey District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now convened at Allentown, Pennsylvania:

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resur-

rection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you, who are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation ready to be revealed in the last time." I Peter 1-3,4,5.

Through the Providence of God we are again privileged to meet in the Annual Conference. While there has been some serious illness in a number of our ministers' homes we are grateful indeed to our Heavenly Father that death has not entered our ranks.

Spiritual Status

Generally speaking I believe that we are holding to a good spiritual level. Many of our churches have had good revivals with lasting results. The visitation of the Holy Ghost in many of our meetings has been a welcome evidence of Divine favor, as has been witnessed in the Camp Meeting just closed.

Church Property

It was my happy privilege to dedicate a beautiful new brick church at Salem, New Jersey, last October. Another beautiful brick church is nearing completion at Stroudsburg, Pa.

Plans are under way at present for a new church building at Jersey Shore, while extensive alterations have been made on the property at York. Several of our churches have either bought or are building parsonages.

Home Missions

We have worked hard in this field, but with all our labors we have organized one church, located at Finesville, N. J. We have published the *Pilgrim Action*, which we believe is being made a blessing to our Home Missionary Department. This work is a burden of our heart and I trust that definite steps will be taken by our committee during this Conference that will bring about an extensive program for this field in the very near future.

The Bible School

We greatly appreciate the interest that is being manifested toward the Allentown Bible Institute. God has richly blessed in the School this past year, and many were the times when the Spirit was poured out upon services and classes.

Personal Report

Sermons preached, 111; Board meetings, 78; Annual business meetings, 13; Churches dedicated, 1; Churches organized, 1. I visited all our churches twice and some of them many times. I received for my support from Ministers' tithe \$3,815.41; from the Churches toward my traveling expenses, \$839.01, and traveled 22,000 miles.

I greatly appreciate the very kind cooperation which I have received of the Brethren this year.
