HENRY EDWIN UHRIG 1887 - 1948

Rev. Henry Edwin Uhrig was born August 15, 1887, converted 1908, and began his ministry in the Apostolic Holiness Church in Ohio, 1912. After several pastorates in Ohio and Eastern District, he came to Pennsylvania and New Jersey District as pastor of Reading Church for the years 1936 through 1943 at which latter date he was elected District Superintendent, serving faithfully until his death, January 26, 1948. He was a member of the Allentown Bible Institute Board of Directors since 1934, and since 1946 a member of the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

The church has lost a great leader, the District a beloved superintendent, his family a loving husband and tender father, and the people of God in general have lost a saintly brother. Earth's loss is heaven's gain, but his was not merely a death, it was an eternal promotion.

STANDING RULES

- 1. The District Superintendent shall appoint all Committees.
- 2. Thursday afternoon of our District Camp Meeting shall be devoted to the interest of Foreign Missions.
- 3. A Bible School service shall be conducted the last Sunday afternoon of our District Camp Meeting.
- 4. The first nine rows of seats and forward shall constitute the Conference Bar.
- 5. At the close of the Conference, the District Council shall attend to any business that may have been overlooked, and approve the minutes of the closing sitting.
- 6. The District Superintendent shall have a two weeks vacation annually, with pay.
- 7. The District Conference recommends that each Church in the Conference give its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay each year.

PROCEEDINGS

Monday, June 21, 1948

The thirty-fifth Annual Conference of the Pennsylvania and New Jersey District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the auditorium of the Allentown Bible Institute, Allentown, Pennsylvania on Monday morning at 9:45, June 21, 1948.

The Conference was called to order by the Superintendent, Rev. S. Lewis Adams. Rev. Thomas Ferguson led in prayer. Rev. William R. Munson led the conference in singing: "I Need Thee Every Hour", "Love Lifted Me", and "In the Cross".

The Superintendent addressed the conference in words of appreciation to God for His greatness to us. He introduced the General Superintendent L. W. Sturk to whom he surrendered the chair. Bro. Sturk brought greetings to the conference from the Leaders of the Church, namely, the personnel of the Executive Council of the General Board together with the Editor of the Advocate and the Sunday School Secretary.

The General Superintendent read a scripture lesson from Exodus 14 and delivered a challenging message on the faith and courage of Moses as he led the Israelites forward victoriously against the foe, and emphasized the need and the benefit of a united front in the church.

The Secretary called the roll.

By motion Sr. Saneholtz was seated as a delegate for Shillington Church.

By motion Sr. Smith was seated for Mt. Holly.

By motion the time for sittings was set as follows: 9:00 to 11:30 a. m., 2:00 to 4:30 p. m., and 7:00 to 9:00 p. m.

The District Superintendent, Rev. S. Lewis Adams gave his report which was accepted by motion.

The Secretary of Sunday Schools gave a verbal report which was received by motion.

The Resolution Committee reported.

Resolution Number 1 was adopted by motion.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

The General Superintendent offered the closing prayer.

Monday, June 21, 1948-2:00 P. M.

The Conference was called to order by the General Superintendent. Rev. H. A. Saneholtz led in prayer, and Rev. O. G. Holden led the Conference in singing, "Satisfied".

Brother Sturk read I John 2:27 and addressed the Conference on the subject, "Unction", emphasizing Lubrication, Discernment, and Fulness of Speech, and closing with a stanza of the song, "Ready".

The Secretary called the roll.

The minutes of the morning sitting were read and approved as read.

Rev. and Mrs. Carl Shafer, who transferred from the New York District, were presented to the Conference by the Reception Committee.

The Auditing Committee reported and the report was received by motion.

The District Treasurer, Rev. W. R. Fritch presented his report which was received by motion.

The Secretary read a letter of greeting from Mrs. Bessie Hatcher.

The Resolution Committee reported.

Resolution Number 2 was received by motion.

Moved and seconded we adopt Resolution Number 3. Moved and seconded that we table Resolution Number 3. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded we adopt Resolution Number 4. Moved and seconded we amend this resolution by striking out the request and penalty clauses. Motion carried. Resolution Number 4 was received by motion.

Resolution Number 5 was adopted by motion.

Resolution Number 6 was adopted by motion.

Moved and seconded we lift Resolution Number 3 from the table. Motion carried.

By motion the Conference recessed until 7:00 P. M.

Brother O. G. Holden prayed the closing prayer.

Monday, June 21, 1948-7:00 P. M.

The Conference was called to order by the Chairman. A number of choice Scripture verses were given by members of the Conference concluding with the First Psalm in unison.

The General Superintendent spoke briefly of his recent missionary trip to the West Indies.

A motion prevailed dispensing with the roll call for the rest of the sittings.

The Minutes of the afternoon sitting were read and approved as read.

Moved and seconded that we adopt Resolution Number 3. It was then moved and seconded that we amend the resolution to state "Saturday afternoon be designated as Young People's Rally". It was also moved and seconded that the amendment be amended to read "Saturday evening also be a Young People's Service". The amendment to the amendment carried. The Resolution as amended carried.

Resolution Number 7 was ruled out of order by the Chairman as not being in harmony with the Manual.

Rev. and Mrs. Lawrence of the New York District were presented to the Conference by the Reception Committee. Each gave a testimony of victory. By motion they were granted honorary seats within the Conference Bar.

Rev. and Mrs. C. F. Kresge, transferred to this District from the Eastern District, were presented to the Conference by the Reception Committee and gave their testimonies.

It was moved and seconded that Sr. Uhrig, widow of our former District Superintendent, be granted an honorary seat within the Conference Bar. The motion carried.

The Ways and Means Committee report was called for. The Ways and Means Committee reported.

It was moved and seconded that we refer Resolution Number 1 to the Committee with instructions to delete the sections having to do with the Superintendent and assistant and bring us something that deals with the ministers. The motion carried.

Resolution Number 2 was read. It was moved and seconded that we adopt.

Moved and seconded that we extend the time in order to finish this item of business. The motion carried.

Moved and seconded that we amend the resolution and set the Superintendent's salary at \$3200 and that all funds above that be turned into the Home Missionary Funds. The amendment carried.

Resolution Number 2 carried.

The sitting was adjourned at 9:30 P. M. by singing the Doxology and Rev. W. F. Bubb offering the closing prayer.

Tuesday Morning, June 22, 1948-9:00 A. M.

The conference was led in a song service by Rev. O. G. Holden.

The General Superintendent read a Scripture lesson from John 17 and addressed the Conference on the subject, "Unity", laying special stress upon unity of perfection, and pointing out its great need in the Church of Jesus Christ.

The Conference engaged in singing, "Amazing Grace", and "Blest Be the Tie that Binds".

The Minutes of the Monday evening sitting were read and approved as read.

The Resolution Committee reported.

Moved and seconded that we adopt Resolution Number 7.

Sr. Uhrig was called forward in the Conference by the chairman and she spoke briefly of Brother Uhrig's going. A stanza of "Blest Be the Tie That Binds" was sung.

Resolution Number 7 was accepted.

Resolution Number 8 was referred to the Ways and Means Committee.

Resolution Number 9 was read. It was moved and seconded that we adopt it. It was moved and seconded that we amend the resolution to read, "the Superintendent keep the remuneration from two revivals".

Resolution Number 9 was adopted by motion.

The Ways and Means Committee reported.

Resolution Number 1 previously referred to the Committee was presented. It was moved and seconded that we adopt. It was moved and seconded that we amend by substituting, "1% of the minister's income", for the term, "the tithe". The amendment carried. It was moved and seconded that we amend by striking out, "eligibility in this plan is contingent on participation in the plan".

The time was extended by motion until the ringing of the dinner bell.

The amendment carried. It was then moved and seconded that we amend the resolution to read, "benefits go to the immediate family and their dependent children".

It was then moved and seconded that we refer the Resolution to the Committee.

The meeting was adjourned by expiration of time.

The General Superintendent dismissed with prayer.

The Statistician, Rev. R. Lewis Adams presented a splendidly prepared report which was accepted with thanks.

The Secretary read a letter of thanks and appreciation from Brother Harold Dieter.

By motion the Chairman was requested to appoint tellers. The following were appointed as tellers: Melvin Dieter, Harold Crosser, Marlin Crissinger, L. W. Zehner, and E. L. Zerby.

A ballot was cast for District Superintendent. 115 ballots were cast. There was no election.

A second ballot was cast for District Superintendent. $\,$ 117 ballots cast. No election.

A third ballot was cast. 117 cast. No election.

Recessed while the ballots were counted.

A fourth ballot was cast resulting in Bro. Lint being elected, receiving 96 out of 119 votes.

Recessed for 15 minutes.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. Heisler of the Evangelical Church at Lehighton and Bro. H. J. Felter of the Church of the Nazarene to the Conference. They gave words of testimony.

The Conference cast a ballot for Assistant District Superintendent.

In accordance with Resolution Number 5 of the Resolution Committee, the Chairman appointed Bro. Jennings and Fitch as a Memorial Committee.

A third ballot was cast for Assistant Superintendent.

By motion the time was extended.

The Ways and Means Committee reported, Resolution Number 3. Moved and seconded we adopt. Motion carried.

Bro. Bubb was elected Assistant Superintendent on the third ballot with 93 out of 118 votes.

The Ways and Means Committee presented Resolution Number 4. Moved and seconded we adopt. Motion carried.

A ballot was cast for District Secretary. 112 ballots cast. No election.

By motion the time was extended until balloting for District Secretary is finished. 115 ballots cast.

A third ballot was cast for a District Secretary. 114 ballots cast. Bro. R. Lewis Adams was elected with 100 out of 114 votes.

Bro. R. Lewis Adams dismissed the Conference with prayer.

Moved and seconded that Bro. Edward Harper be elected to succeed himself as member of the Trustee Board. Motion carried.

A ballot was cast for a member on the Examining Board. 105 votes cast. No election.

The Committee on Memoirs reported. The report was accepted by motion.

Moved and seconded we vote for one of the two highest: Bro. Gunsalus and Bro. Schweitzer. Motion carried.

Moved and seconded we vote for the five advisory members on the Council one at a time. Motion carried.

Bro. Schweitzer was re-elected to the Examining Board for three years.

Bro. Schweitzer requested the Conference not to vote for him as a Councilman, feeling he would be unable to serve.

By motion the time was extended until the Conference is over.

A ballot was cast for an Advisory Member on the Council.

The minutes of the afternoon sitting were read and approved as read.

There was no election on the first ballot. 103 votes cast.

Moved and seconded we elect one of the two highest. Motion carried. A ballot was cast on the nominees, Bro. Saneholtz and Bro. Campbell. 103 votes cast. Bro. Campbell was elected.

A ballot was cast for the second Advisory Member on the Council. 109 votes cast.

By motion one of the two highest was voted for: Bro. Saneholtz and Bro. Raymond Hoffman. Raymond Hoffman was elected.

A ballot was cast for the third Advisory Member of the Council. 108 votes cast. No election.

By motion a vote was cast for one of the two highest: Bro. Saneholtz and Bro. Gunsalus. 104 votes cast. Brother Gunsalus was elected.

Bro. Sturk favored the Conference with a vocal solo entitled, "Stand by Me".

The Conference balloted for the fourth Advisory Member of the Council. 112 votes cast. No election.

Moved and seconded we vote for one of the two highest: Bros. Saneholtz and Holden. Motion carried. 107 votes cast. Bro. Holden was elected.

Nominations from the floor for the Lay Member to the Council were: Irvin Crissinger, Charles Martz, and Samuel Grant. By motion the nomination closed. 108 votes cast. I. L. L. Crissinger was re-elected.

The Resolution Committee reported.

2. INASMUCH, as the income from the pastors' tithe, has so rapidly increased, due to the development of the District; be it

RESOLVED, That we amend Resolution Number 9, page 16, to read as follows: Be it

RESOLVED, That we require all our ministers, who are actively engaged, to pay 50% of their tithe received from ministerial work, through the local treasurer to the district treasurer. Be it further

RESOLVED, That we pay our District Superintendent a salary of \$3,200 per year and that the balance received from said pastors' tithe, be placed in the Home Missionary Fund, and that each pastor shall raise an offering upon the visit of the Superintendent for his expenses and that the telephone, postage, and telegrams shall be paid from the District Treasury.

3. WHEREAS, There has been no fund provided to maintain the Superintendent's Retiring and Emergency Fund; be it

In the event that a congregation which has made a loan according to this plan, fails to meet its installments for a period of three months, its financial standing shall be investigated by the District Council.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Thirty-fifth Annual Conference of the Pennsylvania-New Jersey District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now convened at Allentown, Pennsylvania:

"Unto Him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in His own blood, and hath made us kings and priests unto God; to Him be glory and dominion forever and ever." A-men.

This Conference year has differed in some respects from that of previous years. Rev. H. E. Uhrig who was elected to the District Superintendency at our last Conference for the fifth consecutive year was suddenly taken from us on January 26th, leaving the district without an elected Superintendent. To fill this vacancy was our unusually difficult task because of its coming so suddenly and unexpectedly.

Visiting the Churches

When visiting the Churches I found a good spirit of worship among the

people and a hearty response to the truth I preached. The reports of revivals during the year were inspiring. There is a strong movement throughout the district to advance Sunday School interests and the result it gratifying. I was deeply impressed with the good standard of home life practiced by our preachers and their families.

Personal Mention

I have visited each of our churches once (except one). I also visited three independent churches who desire better acquaintance with the Pilgrims. I have edited the *Pilgram Action* each month, preached 57 sermons, conducted 36 business meetings, and seven annual meetings; traveled 10,500 miles. I received for my support \$1,701.74 from preachers' tithe, and \$351.29 from the churches toward my traveling expenses.
