- No. 9—BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Superintendent's four per cent toward the pension fund be paid by the District.

### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the TWELFTH Annual Conference of the Pittsburgh District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church — GREETINGS:

In the kind providence of God we are again permitted to meet here at Mt. Pleasant to do business for the King. The past year has been a busy one with many battles but our God has been with us, making us more than conquerors. We believe the coming of the Lord is at hand and what we do for God and souls we must do quickly.

To each pastor on the District we want to express our deep appreciation for his co-operation in the promotion of God's work. You have labored hard and faithfully. Some of the pastors' salaries have been very small but I have heard no word of complaining. However, many of the pastors have received a substantial increase in salary. I want to urge all the churches represented here to do their best by the pastor in these days of inflation. God bless our faithful, loyal, hard-working ministers of the Pittsburgh District.

Immediately following the Southern Zone Youth Rally held here at Mt. Pleasant last September it was my privilege to conduct a Home Missionary Revival at Emlenton, Pa. Some definite work was done and a Pilgrim Chapel was opened, under the direction of Rev. James Reed. An eight room brick house was purchased in the town and a partition removed making a fine place of worship. The church was organized with eight members the Sunday before Camp meeting. To date this church has cost the District less than \$75.00 and the local congregation is taking care of the monthly payment on the property.

The Church at Belgiumtown was organized October 17th, with ten charter members. Here we have a fine church building with a fine congregation. Rev. J. F. Clark is doing a splendid work here and they are now building a much needed parsonage. Partial support has been given this work by the Home Missionary Department.

In November I was called to Titusville where a group of Christians worshiping in a nice concrete block church wanted to know more about the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Giving them the desired information I departed and expected to again hear from them. I was called here for a two week revival meeting in January. Four other District Ministers preached a night each at this meeting acquainting the people further with the good Pilgrims. This church was organ-

ized with 13 charter members Feb. 12, 1950. Rev. Andrew Jalosky was called to be the pastor. This church building was dedicated on May 28th. The property has been deeded according to the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. The Sunday School attendance at Titusville on Easter Sunday was 108.

At Petersburg, Ohio where we have had a Sunday School for two years we now have an organized Pilgrim Holiness Church. Rev. Tom McConahy is the faithful laborer in this field. There were ten charter members, the church being organized May 21st.

We have these four new churches to present to the Conference this year.

The lease on the Belle Vernon church expired in March and some of the folk have joined other Pilgrim Holiness Churches.

At Kersey, Pa., a lot has been purchased by a party who is interested in a Filgrim Holiness Church. Soon after Conference a Pilgrim Holiness Church will be built in this town. We ask that you pray for the success of the work here.

We feel that during the past year some gains have been made. We wish to mention a few of these increases. There has been an increase of 64 in membership or a 7.6 per cent gain, a gain in Sunday School attendance of 12.9 per cent, and a gain of 17 per cent in pastors' salaries over last year. During the next four years we as a district should strive to have a 25 per cent gain in membership.

Our support to the Allentown Bible Institute during the past year shows an increase of about two thousand dollars or 67 per cent. We should give our whole hearted support to this institution in the year to come.

Four new parsonages have been added this year, namely; New Castle, Richeyville, Elizabeth and Franklin. New places of worship have been built or purchased at Franklin, Brookville, Emlenton and Titusville. Farsonages are in the process of being erected at Brookville, West Newton, and Twin Rocks. The main auditorium is being completed at Rimersburg and Twin Rocks. The Franklin church has purchased a church building which they are dismantling and moving into Franklin.

There are greater things ahead for the Pittsburgh District. In the years we have been organized we have almost doubled in number of churches and have had a 61 per cent increase in total membership. This is only the beginning so may we strive together for the realization of these greater things.

My personal report is as follows:

I have preached 175 times, conducted 27 Annual meetings, attended three General Board Meetings, three Bible School Board meetings, held five District Council Meetings, four Home Missionary Doard meetings, one District S. S. Board Meeting, held two Home Missionary Revival meetings which resulted in the organization of two new churches. Organized two other churches making a total of four. Held two revival meetings off the District, traveled 13,300 miles in District work, visited all the churches twice and most of them more often. I have received in salary from the District \$3,510.00, from revivals \$345.00 making a total of \$3,855.00.

We have appreciated the wholehearted co-operation of both the ministry and laity.

# PITTSBURGH DISTRICT SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

To the Twelfth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Pittsburgh District.

### GREETINGS:

Since God in His providence has seen fit to allow us to assemble in session in this Conference, it is with praise and gratitude to Him that we present this Sunday School Report.

The marked blessings of God have rested upon the Sunday School work of the Pittsburgh District this year. There have been gratifying advancements in spiritual attainments, numerical gains and financial receipts.

There are now 29 Sunday Schools in this District with an average attendance of 1,939 per Sunday. You will notice that the report is based on the total attendance for the District. Since the General Department of Sunday Schools uses this method of report, I felt that it was to our best advantage to follow the same method. The attendance on the same basis for the last year was 1,717 showing an increase of 12.9 per cent in attendance.

There are four new Sunday Schools to be welcomed in the Pittsburgh District, namely Belgiumtown, Emlenton, Petersburg, and Titusville. The six leaders in numerical gains for the year are: Belle Bridge 26, Franklin 25, Twin Rocks 25, Washington 21, Armbrust 14 and Elizabeth and Geneva with 13 each. There was a higher attendance in our Sunday Schools this year than there had ever been before in the history of the Pittsburgh District.

In connection with the co-ordination of the Sunday Schools in the program of Evangelism passed at the recent General Conference, the Sunday Schools of the Pittsburgh District should increase 646 in the next quadrenium. This would mean an increase of 162 per year for the District or an average increase of 6 per year for each Sunday School. IT CAN BE DONE. The major emphasis is

not primarily on increase in numbers but must be and should be on the endeavor to lead every student in the Sunday School to a saving knowledge of God. This is to steer clear of anything tending to savor of Decision Days etc. but is rather to be an endeavor to awaken by the aid of the Holy Spirit through prayer and fasting and teaching of the Scriptures, a seeking after God and a praying through to old time definite Salvation purchased by the precious blood of Jesus Christ. May God help us to advance along spiritual and scriptural lines and occupy till He comes.

The Twelfth Annual Conference of the Pittsburgh District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church met at 9:05 A. M., July 5, 1950, at the District Headquarters at Mount Pleasant, Pennsylvania.

The Rev. R. V. Wallace read a further report of the Resolutions Committee.

Moved, seconded and carried that the Secretary write the Grays by Air-mail and send a birthday greeting to the Rev. F. B. Gray whose birthday is July 22. The delegates of the Conference all stood in prayer for the Grays, led by the Rev. Miles Gray, a brother of the F. B. Gray.

The report of the Board of Examiners, through the District Council, was read and approved (the report is found in the Ministerial Directory).

Motion prevailed that the name of Gerald Franklin be omitted from the list of recommendation for renewal of District License. Moved and seconded that the evangelist of our district bring a written report to the District Conference. Carried.

Moved seconded, and carried that any minor business not taken care of by this Conference be cared for by the District Council.

The Resolutions Committee gave its final report.

The District Supt. appointed the committees for the coming year. It was moved and seconded we adjourn.

### STANDING RESOLUTIONS

- 1. WHEREAS, there has been considerable difficulty in operating the kitchen and dining room with help supplied by the present plan, BE IT RESOLVED, that the camp committee secure the requisite help irrespective of age and that their remuneration be stipulated by said committee.
- 2. RESOLVED, that no pastor shall be permitted to plan or hold a tent meeting, vacation Bible School, or revival during the dates set for the Annual District Camp and Conference within the bounds of the District without the consent of the District Council, provided these dates are announced a year in advance.
- 3. RESOLVED, that the District Council be authorized to appoint Trustees to receive the title to property in missions where property will be involved before the organization of a church.
- 4. RESOLVED, that all applicants for District credentials be required to complete the questionaire as provided by the District Council.
- 5. BE IT RESOLVED, that all pastors be required to attend our Ministerial Convention. Upon failure to be present a written reason must be given.
- 6. RESOLVED, that the District Council be empowered to erect and maintain suitable buildings on our District camp grounds.
- 7. Inasmuch as it is the pastor's duty to raise church finances, and WHEREAS it usually works great hardship on a pastor to raise salary in arrears for a former pastor in a church, wherein former pastor was unable to raise his own, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED, that no pastor, after his leaving a charge, press that church beyond that which is expedient to the financial
- 8. BE IT RESOLVED, that our District Treasurer be bonded and that the matter of bonding be left in the hands of the District Council.

stability of that former charge.

- 9. BE IT RESOLVED, that our licentiates be directed to take the specified course of study through the Allentown Bible Institute and that they secure the transcript of credits at the end of each school year and present it to the Board of Examiners.
- 10. BE IT RESOLVED, that we have a Home Missionary Board composed of the District Superintendent as Chairman, the District Treasurer and three (3) other members elected by the Con-

ference. Their duties shall be as follows:

To promote extensive Home Missionary activities in our District.

To investigate the prospects of new fields.

To place workers where they deem it advisable and as far as the District Home Missionary funds will permit.

- 11. BE IT RESOLVED, that the camp committee select song books to be used at least three consecutive years, same to be announced in camp advertising.
- 12. INASMUCH as many people pray through at our Camp Meeting who do not live in a community where we have a Pilgrim Holiness Church: AND WHEREAS, these people were saved under the ministry of our Church,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that in so far as possible such people be contacted by the District Council and passed upon for membership in the Church in the same manner as by a local church board, and that they be received into the Pilgrim Holiness Church at some service near the close of the Camp.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Missionary Board retain a list of these members with their proper addresses, and that they be held as a nucleus for a church in their community.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the meantime they be turned over to the nearest Pilgrim Holiness Church for pastoral care.

- 13. RESOLVED, that all ministers be required to attend the District Camp, and that the Superintendent be requested to instruct our people that the pastor's salary should continue during this time.
- 14. BE IT RESOLVED, that each pastor shall come to Camp two (2) days early to clean up and prepare the Camp and remain until the work is completed.
- 15. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Treasurer be directed to send to all ministers and local church treasurers a mimeographed copy of all Conference rules regarding finances.
- 16. INASMUCH as the views of the ministers' wives are largely ministerial views, therefore,
  BE IT RESOLVED, that our churches be discouraged from electing ministers' wives as delegates to the District Conference.
- 17. BE IT RESOLVED, that an Annual Camp Meeting be held and that the District Council be empowered to set the date.

- 18. BE IT RESOLVED, that each church give its pastor two weeks vacation with pay each year. In his absence the pastor shall secure a supply speaker, and an agreeable remuneration be made by the local Church Board.
- 19. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Young People's Officers and Zone Representatives plan for an Annual Youth Convention to be conducted over the week-end of Labor-Day.

  BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that our efforts for the promotion of Youth Work throughout the District be doubled.
- 20. BE IT RESOLVED, that three meals per day be served at our District Camp and at all District Gatherings.
- 21. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Council secure a man to be deputized to act as policeman on the Camp grounds during all District Gatherings.
- 22. INASMUCH as many local Sunday Schools are affected in their monthly attendance report during the month in which our District Camp is held, BE IT RESCLVED, that there be Sunday School Sessions with classes for adult, young people, intermediate, junior and primary departments each Sunday during Camp and District Gatherings, and those who attend be considered present in their home school.
- 23. We recommend that pastors of deceased members of our District bring to the Memorial Committee a copy of the obituary of the deceased and any other information that is available, the Memorial Committee report to be printed in our Conference Journal.
- 24. BE IT RESOLVED, that ministers' children receiving entertainment at our District Gatherings be assigned work when necessary.
- 25. RESOLVED, each church erect at its place of worship the name of the church, and name, address, and phone number of the pastor.
- 26. BE IT RESOLVED, that each pastor be permitted to engage in two revival meetings each year off his charge. It shall be his responsibility to secure and pay a supply speaker in his absence.
- 27. WHEREAS, cases of illness and injury which require treatment frequently occur on the camp grounds, and WHEREAS, adequate facilities for such treatment are not now available, therefore BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Council provide a room, equip it with the requisite facilities for emergency treatment and secure the services of a competent attendant therefore.

- 11. BE IT RESOLVED, that we extend to our esteemed Assistant General Superintendent, the Rev. A. H. Also that a vote of thanks be extended to the various District Officers, the cooks, and all who have contributed in any way to making this camp and conference so very pleasant and successful. And humbly and reverently do we offer to our gracious Heavenly Father sincere thanks for His blessings upon our annual gatherings.

### WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

- 1. BE IT RESOLVED, that each church raise the minimum sum of \$10.00 to help defray the cost of entertaining the pastor and his family at camp and the cost of entertaining pastor, family and delegate at conference, plus \$2.00 for each additional delegate to the conference.
- 2. RESOLVED, that whenever the District Superintendent visits the churches that the pastor receive a special offering to be applied to his traveling expenses.
- 3. Resolved, that we require our ministers actively engaged to pay 75 per cent of their tithe and evangelists 50 per cent of their tithes received for ministerial work, through the local treasurer to the District Treasurer.
