

Yoder, Mrs. A. E. Box 3808, San Jose Br., Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico

- No. 1.—The center tier of seats and platform constitute the Conference Bar.
- No. 2.—BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Council be empowered to set the date and place of the service for the ordination of eligible candidates for the ministry.
- No. 3.—The Fiscal Year shall run from June first to June the first.

- No. 4.—All Annual Reports shall be sent to the District Statistician postmarked not later than the tenth of the month immediately following the closing of the Fiscal Year.
- No. 5.—The District Superintendent shall appoint all committees.
- No. 6.—BE IT RESOLVED, thall all resolutions passed by the Conference shall be binding from year to year, unless otherwise changed or rescinded.
- No. 7.—The District Council shall constitute the District Board of Trustees.
- No. 8.—WHEREAS, the Gospel Minister should be provided for at the age of retirement. BE IT RESOLVED, that we finance the Pension Fund of the General Church by each minister and evangelist sending two per cent of his cash salary received for the month through the local church treasurer to the District Treasurer, and that each local church pay four per cent of each minister's and evangelist's cash salary to the District Treasurer.
- No. 9.—BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Superintendent's four per cent toward the pension fund be paid by the district.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the FIFTEENTH Annual Conference of the PITTSBURGH DISTRICT of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in session at Mt. Pleasant, Pa.: GREETINGS:

It is with gratitude to God that we meet again this year to report our activities and lay plans for the forthcoming year. We meet, I'm sure, with a sense of responsibility to help and serve the world as never before. The message of God which we have to offer will meet the need of those to whom we minister. "TIMES LIKE THESE" call for the best that is in us in the promotion of God's great work. Evil forces are arrayed against the church and ministry and I feel we should rise up against those things which are trying to make inroads into our midst. God has a place for an unworldly, holy and aggressive people in this section of our great United States of America. Let us not fail our leaders in the General Church who expect us to carry on a spiritual program.

The spiritual tide seems to be constantly rising on our District. I have stressed in many places the different points in the Program of Evangelism. The four meetings in the interest of this program held in the District were very profitable. Fasting and prayer is on the increase and I believe there are many more Pilgrim homes with a family altar this year than last. God has honored us with His sweet presence this past year.

Not long after Conference last year, I was called to dedicate the new brick church at Bentleyville. For many years the Pilgrims here worshipped in their basement church; but, with much donated labor by pastor and people, they were able to build and dedicate this fine building in which to worship God. It is fitting to call attention to what has been done in a number of places relative to buildings and improvements. The Belguimtown church has built five additional Sunday School rooms, Titusville has added material improvements to their church, as has Lisbon, Force and Belle Bridge. Linesville has purchased a building which has been dismanteled and moved on a lot to be rebuilt as a church. Geneva has added material improvements to the parsonage. Other churches too numerous to mention here have added improvements which will be a great benefit to them.

Six new pastors have been added to our number this past year, namely: G. H. Shull at Waynesburg, George Harvey at Sharon, E. R. Mitchell at

Salem, William Saccani at Homestead Park and George Bowen at Franklin. We welcome these brethren and trust their ministry shall be fruitful among us.

It was my privilege to conduct a revival meeting in our Home Missionary Chapel at DuBois with some definite results. The pastor resigned a few months ago and the Home Missionary Board has secured one of our successful young pastors as the worker for the coming year. Rev. Jay L. Clark will be moving to DuBois shortly after Conference and will be supported partially through finance obtained from the Home Missionary Calendars. We urge all pastors to receive a good liberal Home Missionary offering once a month.

After a few revivals held at Parker, Pa., we were able to organize a church with eight members. We present this church for acceptance into the Conference. Although barely over the minimum for organizing a church, their Sunday School has been averaging about thirty-five.

A friend of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has purchased a building at Seneca, Pa. and our Oil City Mission will be moving to Seneca, just outside Oil City where Rev. Andrew Jalosky will be the full time pastor. It is hoped that we shall be able to organize a church here during the coming year.

I have very thoroughly appreciated the privilege of working with all the ministers of the Pittsburgh District and more intimately with the Disrict Council and Home Missionary Board. I have had the complete cooperation of the District Council at all times. It has been the work of everyone that has made possible the achievements of past years and although the gains have been small, comparatively speaking, we march on to greater things in the years that lie ahead.

We seek the guidance of God in our deliberations in this Conference and pray that His will and His alone may be sought, in order that we may continue to grow and maintain deep spirituality on the Pittsburgh District.

May God bless us and give us guidance in matters of business that will come before us for disposition.

My personal report is as follows:—I have preached one hundred and twelve times, conducted two revivals on the district, one of these in the Home Missionary Chapel; presided over six Council Meetings, two Home Missionary Board meetings, two Young People's Committee meetings, three Camp Meeting Board meetings, two Sunday School Board Meetings, and the District Ministerial Convention.

It was my privilege to attend the District Superintendents' Conference at Indianapolis, Indiana and two School Board Meetings at Allentown, Pa. 1 also conducted thirty-one Annual meetings and worked approximately twenty-five days on the camp ground.

I have received for my labors the following: Salary from the District, \$4,073.30; revivals, \$86.00; parsonage, utilities supplied and traveling expense at the rate of five cents a mile.

PITTSBURGH DISTRICT SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

To the fifteenth annual conference of the Pittsburgh District of the Pilgrim Holinees Church.

Greetings:

Since God in His all-wise providence has seen fit to allow us to assemble in this fifteenth District Conference for this District, it is with praise and gratitude to our God that we present this Sunday School Report showing some important major trends in our District Sunday School.

A number of the churches have surged forward in their average attendance in the Sunday School. Among the leaders in this respect are:

McKeesport 24; Josephine 17; West Newton 11.

We are happy to welcome two new Sunday Schools to our midst this

past year, Parker, Pa., with an average attendance of 30 and DuBois, an as yet unorganized Sunday School, with an average attendance of 18. The district as a whole must show a slight loss of 59 in average attendance; this is occasioned by the fact that the Ambridge church withdrew from the Pilgrim Holiness Church and the Clymer church was closed and the building sold. Omitting these two churches, the district would have shown a slight gain of 21. However, these figures must be shown in order to keep our totals properly correlated with the General Church set-up.

There were some major improvements in the administration of the District Sunday Schools. A complete ledger showing the average attendance for each Sunday School for the past three years was set up. show on a single page the average monthly attendances for 16 years as well as the special days, i.e., Easter, Christmas, Rally Day and the Sunday by Sunday attendances of the Sunday School Revival. This ledger will enable the District Sunday School Board to intelligently set goals for the various special occasions out in the future. Then, also a new system of reporting District Attendances for each month was set up. The Sunday Schools were assigned to various classes based on their average attendance. The Sunday School Board also had certificates printed with seals for each school to be attached to the said certificates showing the class of the school for the current quarter. These certificates have now all been sent out to each Sunday School in the District. No doubt you are happy with your new certificate and have made plans to advance to the next class or if you are already in the top class to stay in that class.

There were four major drives this past year by the District Sunday School Board. In September, Rev. Paul F. Elliott, Sec. S. S. of the General Church held a S. S. rally in the Josephine Church and also in the Salem Church. Then, in March, the District Sunday School Board travelled to Indianapolis, Indiana, for the Sunday School Institute put on by the General Department of Sunday Schools. It was decided to have three special Institutes in the District. These were held at Titusville, Strattanville and Mc-Keesport. For the Church Wide Rally Day three pictures were given to the Sunday Schools with the highest numerical attendance, the highest gain in attendance over the preceding quarter, and the highest percentage of gain over the previous quarter. The highest attendance was awarded to Armbrust, the highest gain in attendance to Josephine and the highest percentage of gain to Bentleyville. In the Sunday School Revival a number of schools made sizeable average gains over the previous year. The leaders were Armbrust 185, McKeesport 149, Josephine 137, Warren 111, Elizabeth 110.

This year the General Department of Sunday Schools awarded two certificates to the District Conference to be presented to the Sunday School with the largest attendance gain and one to the Sunday School with the largest percentage gain. The leaders in numerical gain were: McKeesport 24, Josephine 17, West Newton 11, Linesville 9. McKeesport Sunday School, with Willard Kleppinger, Sunday School Superintendent, receives the largest attendance gain with 24 and the largest percentage gain certificate with 27.6 per cent increase.

I wish to call attention to the outstanding piece of work done by the Armbrust Church, Rev. H. James McClure, Pastor. Starting the 1946-47 year with an attendance of 86 they have advanced to 163 for the current year thus nearly doubling their school in five years. This is indeed a com-

mendable work effected by prayer and hard work on the part of Pastor and people. I feel that we should give them a hearty God bless you. Work of this nature should not go unmentioned. May God grant that they shall continue to grow, and that every Sunday School may grow accordingly.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

Samuel A. Byers, Treasurer. Respectfully submitted,

- WHEREAS, there has been considerable difficulty in operating the kitchen and dining room with help supplied by the present plan, BE IT RESOLVED, that the camp committee secure the requisite help irrespective of age and that their remuneration be stipulated by said committee.
- 2. RESOLVED, that no pastor shall be permitted to plan or hold a tent meeting, Vacation Bible School, or revival during the dates set for the Annual District Camp and Conference within the bounds of the District without the consent of the District Council, provided these dates are announced a year in advance.

- 3. RESOLVED, that the District Council be authorized to appoint Trustees to receive the title to property in missions where property will be involved before the organization of a church.
- 4. RESOLVED, that the District Council be empowered to erect and maintain suitable buildings on our District Camp grounds.
- 5. BE IT RESOLVED, that our licentiates be directed to take the specified course of study through the Allentown Bible College and that they secure the transcript of credits at the end of each school year and present it to the Board of Examiners.
- 6. BE IT RESOLVED, that we have a Home Missionary Board composed of the District Superintendent as Chairman, the District Treasurer and three (3) other members elected by the Conference. Their duties shall be as follows:

To promote extensive Home Missionary activities in our District. To investigate the prospects of new fields.

To place workers where they deem it advisable and as far as the District Home Missionary funds will permit.

- 7. BE IT RESOLVED, that the camp committee select song books to be used at least three consecutive years, same to be announced in camp advertising.
- 8. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Superintendent be requested to instruct our people that the pastor's salary be continued during the time of the District Camp and Conference.
- 9. BE IT RESOLVED, that each pastor shall come to Camp two (2) days early to clean up and prepare the Camp and remain until the work is completed.
- 10. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Treasurer be directed to send to all ministers and local church treasurers a mimeographed copy of our Conference rules regarding finances.
- 11. INASMUCH as the views of the minister's wives are largely ministerial views, therefore,
 - BE IT RESOLVED, that our churches be discouraged from electing minister's wives as delegates to the District Conference.
- 12. BE IT RESOLVED, that an annual Camp Meeting be held and that the District Council be empowered to set the date.
 - BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Camp be supervised by a Camp Committee composed of the following personnel: the District Superintendent, Camp Clerk, Purchasing Agent, Superintendent of Buildings, Commissary, Custodian or Superintendent of Grounds, and Receptionist or Room Clerk. The District Superintendent shall appoint these persons. This Committee shall meet at the discretion of the District Superintendent. It shall also be responsible for the prosecution of Resolution No. 29.
- 13. BE IT RESOLVED, that each church give its pastor two weeks vacation with pay each year. In his absence the pastor shall secure a supply speaker, and an agreeable remuneration be made by the local Church Board.
- 14. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Council secure the necessary number of laymen to be deputized to act as policemen twenty-four hours daily on the Camp Grounds during all District gatherings.

- 15. INASMUCH as many local Sunday Schools are affected in their monthly attendance report during the month in which our District Camp is held, BE IT RESOLVED, that there be Sunday School Sessions with classes for adult, young people, intermediate, junior and primary departments each Sunday during Camp and District gatherings, and those who attend be considered present in their home school.
- 16. We recommend that pastors of deceased members of our District bring to the Memorial Committee a copy of the obituary of the deceased and any other information that is available, the Memorial Committee report to be printed in our Conference Journal.
- 17. BE IT RESOLVED, that minister's children receiving entertainment at our District gatherings be assigned work when necessary.
- 18. RESOLVED, each church, erect at its place of worship the name of the church, and name, address, and phone number of the pastor.
- 19. BE IT RESOLVED, that each pastor be permitted to engage in two revival meetings each year off his charge. It shall be his responsibility to secure and pay a supply speaker in his absence.
- 20. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Council have printed on good bond paper or light cardboard—whichever is cheaper—the Church Covenant and preceding questions, together with such other questions as the District Council may deem advisable; providing at the end of the form a place for signature and addresses; and that these forms be distributed to the churches free of charge.
- 21. BE IT RESOLVED, that we print in our District Minutes the program of evangelism as adopted by our General Conference.

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Conference go on record as being one hundred per cent in favor of said program. BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that in pursuance of this project we set the following objectives for the quadrennium:
 - (a). Eight new churches.
 - (b). An increase in membership of 250.
 - (c). An increase of 700 in Sunday School attendance.
 - BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that our ministers do their utmost to increase the number of subscriptions to the Advocate. BE IT RESOLVED, that special emphasis be laid on the Young People's work of the District and local churches; and that we endeavor to build a more spiritual Y. P. organizaion. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that youth meetings in our District gatherings be made more fruitful in soul-saving and in outreach.
- 22. BE IT RESOLVED, that Camp Meeting Rules be formulated and printed; and that copies be posted conspicuously about the camp grounds; and also that copies be mailed to all pastors before the time of camp meeting.
- 23. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Treasurer be instructed to publish an itemized report of all funds raised for the expansion, maintenance and operation of the District Camp and the same be mailed to all local churches, also a mimeographed copy of the District financial report be included.
- 24. INASMUCH, as the Northern Zone of the Young People's work involves

much travel for rallies, therefore BE IT RESOLVED, that the Northern Zone for the Young People's work be divided into the Northeastern and Northwestern Zones. The dividing line will be Route 68 and all on or east of this line will be Northeastern Zone, and all west of this line be the Northwestern Zone. The Northeastern Zone shall include the following churches: Force, Gipsy, Josephine, Rimersburg, Strattanville, Twin Rocks, and Belgiumtown. The Northwestern Zone shall include the following churches: Geneva, Franklin, Titusville, Emlenton, and Warren.

- 25. Whereas, we have but one gathering of our ministers each year, since we feel that we would benefit greatly from frequent meetings, therefore: BE IT RESOLVED, that every effort be made to arrange for quarterly meetings of our preachers.
- 26. EE IT RESOLVED, that the following churches be formed into a new Youth Zone to be known as the Western Zone: Clinton, Salem, Lisbon, Petersburg, Sharon, New Castle.

RESOLUTION REGARDING CHURCH-WIDE PROGRAM OF EVANGELISM

AS PASSED BY GENERAL CONFERENCE IN JUNE 1950.

(See Standing Resolution 28)

WHEREAS, the great objective of our church is the salvation of souls as learly stated in our Manual, and WHEREAS we fully understand that the work of God must be carried on and propagated by men and women who are soundly converted and Spirit-filled, and WHEREAS, this transformation which brings them into right relationship wih the Lord is usually brought about by an intensive evangelistic effort, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that as a hurch we launch, with the beginning of this quadrennium, an intensive four-year campaign to be carried out to the following plan:

Expect the leader of each department of our church to emphasize soulwinning.

Encourage our local churches to exercise every possible effort for the salvation of souls in their special revival campaigns by employing evangelists who carry a burden for souls and whose great objective is soul-winning.

To encourage revivals in our Sunday schools by setting times when children shall be invited to seek salvation.

To ask our young people's leaders to give altar calls frequently in youth services of all kinds, in an effort to bring our young people to Christ.

To emphasize the spirit of evangelism in our schools and seek to impress our students with the fact that soul-winning is the greatest work in which one can be engaged.

To emphasize in all our work the doctrine of entire sanctification in an effort to lead the people into this blessed experience.

To encourage the maintenance of the family altar in every Pilgrim home as a means of bringing our people to a better spiritual state, and our families to Christ.

To encourage personal evangelism as a means of soul-saving in keeping with the Scriptural command to go into the highways and hedges and compel the people to come in.

To emphasize the importance of fasting and prayer as a means of bringing about a mighty revival of religion among our people everywhere.

Inasmuch as people are generally encouraged to greater efforts by the setting of objectives, be it further resolved that our districts and local churches be encouraged to set some definite objectives, particularly to increase attendance in our services and the membership of our churches; this, of course, with the understanding that the increase of membership means the salvation of souls, inasmuch as we do not receive into membership any who do not give evidence of having been born again.

Be it further resolved that in the carrying out of the above program that the following objectives be set for the quadrennium:

- (a). To gain 200 new churches in the homeland.
- (b). To bring our total membership to 50,000.
- (c). To increase our annual average Sunday School attendance in the homeland to 65,000 by 1953.
- (d). To increase our average Advocate subscription list to 15,000 per year.
- (e). To support our great foreign missionary and church extension work by every church paying its general budget in full and participating each year in the Easter offering for church extension and the self-denial offering for foreign missions; these two special offerings to be over and above the budget.

Inasmuch as the budget and these two special offerings are yet insufficient to finance this work (and should be considered a minimum and not a maximum amount) we urge our people wherever possible, to give liberally as God prospers them, ever bearing in mind that we are obligated to carry out the Great Commission to get the gospel to as many people as possible.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

- 1. BE IT RESOLVED, that each church raise the minimum sum of \$15.00 to be applied to the expense of Camp and Conference.
- 2. RESOLVED, that whenever the District Superintendent visits the churches that the pastor receive a special offering to be applied to his traveling expenses.
- 3. RESOLVED, that we require our ministers actively engaged to pay 75 per cent of their tithe, and evangelists 50 per cent of their tithe received for ministerial work, through the local treasurer to the District Treasurer.
- 4. BE IT RESOLVED, that all ordained and licensed ministers doing secular work pay 50 per cent of their tithe from such labors through the local church treasurer to the District Treasurer and FURTHERMORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that all ordained Deaconesses pay \$1.00 per month through their local church treasurer to the District Treasurer, and that the District Council be empowered to make adjustments when necessary.
- 5. WHEREAS, there is much labor and time involved in carrying out the duties of the offices of District Secretary, District Treasurer, and District Statistician, BE IT RESOLVED, that we pay \$75.00 to the District Secretary; \$240.00 to the District Treasurer, and \$40.00 to the District Statistician as a yearly salary.

- 6. WHEREAS, the General Board sets the salaries of all the General Officers, and WHEREAS, the District Council is in a position to better know the financial status of the District and handles District funds, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Superintendent's salary be set by the District Council before the election.
- 7. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District pay any minister whose travel is authorized in the interests of the District at the rate of six (.06) cents per mile and that any other expense incurred incidental to district work also be paid.
- 8. BE IT RESOLVED, that we ask our churches to give an amount equal to ten (10) per cent of the pastor's salary and expense account, same to be paid monthly through the local church treasurer to be apportioned as follows:

25 per cent for Home Missions.

- 70 per cent for District Expense.
 - 5 per cent for General Sinking Fund.
- 9. BE IT RESOLVED, that we as a District contribute to the Allentown Bible College the equivalent of twenty-five (25) cents a month per member, said funds to be paid through the District Treasurer and that we put forth a whole-hearted effort to raise our quota for the College.
- 10. BE IT RESOLVED, that the remuneration of those preachers employed by the District include their 4 per cent contribution to the Pension Plan.
- 11. Because of the high cost of printing THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED. that we charge 25 cents per copy for our District Minutes.
- 12. WHEREAS, according to the action of the General Conference of June 13, 1950 a General Budget was set as follows:

MRS. INA LOUISE JOY. The Church lost one of its choice characters on July 21 when the Rev. Mrs. Ina Louise Joy was called from the church militant to joint the church triumphant.
