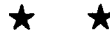

## DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT

To the SIXTEENTH Annual Conference of the PITTSBURGH DISTRICT of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, held at Mount Pleasant this twentieth day of June, 1954, GREETINGS:

"The Lord spoke unto Joshua. . . saying. . . Every place that the sole of your foot shall tread upon, that have I given unto you."

With these momentous words, I greet you in the name of our Lord and as colleagues in a great Gospel enterprise. These momentous words present to us the panorama of our present situation here in the Pittsburgh District and the promise of our future than could be embodied by any phrases of my own choosing. It is startlingly true that we stand now at the gateway to our greatest usefulness. There are no incapacities and inabilities with God. All limitations to the future of this District shall be found within us. What a great challenge to our faith and our several abilities as leaders in this great Gospel work.

To me it is a time for both humility of soul and inspiration of spirit. On the one hand, we must not assume a humility which weakens us until we are too meek to venture; and on the other, we must not become so inspired as to be reckless and presumptive. This moment, for we are called to the kingdom for such a time as this, calls for a step by step program. We are assured that a step at a time is always consistent with the Divine promise and with trusting faith.

Many decisions must, of necessity, be made during this Conference and in the months that lie ahead. The simple truth is that we shall need Divine guidance and we must continue to maintain a respectful confidence in God and each other. If we are to share in the pleasure of having done the work well for Jesus' sake, then we must also be prepared to accept whatever disappointments and perhaps criticism which shall be the outgrowth of our decisions.

I want to express my sincere appreciation for the spirit and fellowship among the ministers of the District. Such unity is not always existent among District leaders though it should be. May God grant that nothing ever shall arise which shall injure or mar this harmony and fellowship. In unity there is strength.

This past year has been one of victory and blessing on the Pittsburgh District. Although there have been no new churches added this year it is encouraging to note that for the past quadrennium our District has been among the leaders in the United States in the number of new churches received. It appears that there are two churches to be organized in the near future.

Substantial gains have been made in the Home Missionary Chapel which is located at DuBois, Pa. Our support for the Rev. J. L. Clark comes through the Home Missionary Calendar offering. Brother Clark has done a commendable work and a good, spiritual, aggressive church should be the result of his capable leadership. Plans are in the making to build a place of worship on the lot which is owned by the Pilgrims in this city.

The District has helped in the support of Rev. Jalosky at Seneca, Pa. During the past year, five or six revival meetings were held here which resulted in the conversion of some folk who are interested in the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

During the past year we have launched the Minister's Fellowship meetings on the respective Zones. Eight of these meetings were held and they resulted in a closer relationship among the ministers. Problems, of interest to the pastor, and the solution of such problems were matters of discussion. Such meetings are of great benefit as we march on together to possess the land.



There were some major improvements in church property during the past year. The Bentleyville Church completed a new brick parsonage valued at about twelve thousand dollars. The Emlenton church burned the mortgage of the church property last month. Additional Sunday School rooms were added at Salem, Elizabeth, and Washington. Material improvements, too numerous to mention in my report, were made on other churches and parsonages and have already been reported in the District publication.

There has been a substantial gain in the Sunday School work of the District. This will be revealed in the report of the Promotional Secretary. We rejoice in the fact that our Sunday Schools are growing and we are reaching more people than ever with the Gospel message. My heart cry is that we shall be able to reach more of our Sunday School scholars for Christ and enlist them as members of our church. I do not mean that we should railroad numbers of children into the church merely to show a gain in membership. However, I do mean that we should do our best to build up the kingdom through the avenue of the church of our choice. With all due consideration of the gains of the past, we as a District should be moving along more rapidly than we are. I enlist the co-operation of all our faithful pastors in this task.

In conclusion, I must say that my work as Superintendent of this District has been a pleasure. There have been burdens to carry and decisions to make, but my trust in God, is the mainstay of all vision and hope for this District. This conviction and feeling, I am sure, reflects the sentiment of all our faithful pastors. Your vision together with your submission to the Holy Spirit's leadership, makes it a joy to labor with you in this great work. May God overshadow us with His presence during the days that lie ahead.

My personal report is as follows:

I have visited each church at least three times, Conducted twenty-seven Annual meetings, preached 125 times, attended two meetings of the College Board at Allentown, the District Superintendent's Conference at Indianapolis, Ind.; Conducted seven District Council meetings, two District Sunday School Board meetings, One Youth Council meeting; Three Camp Committee meetings and seven Zone Ministers' Meetings and Dedicated one church.

I have traveled 13,862 miles in District work receiving 6c per mile, plus postage, telephone and telegrams. My salary is paid to date to the amount of \$80.00 a week plus house and all utilities. I have also received a Camp love offering of over \$100.00 and \$230.00 from revivals. Offerings to the amount of \$536.34 were turned in to the District Treasurer.

### PITTSBURGH DISTRICT SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT.

To the Sixteenth Annual Conference of the Pittsburgh District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Greetings:

Another year of activities in this beloved and important work has become history, and how the record will stand, as judged by the great Lord of Harvest, is a matter of supreme concern to each of us. I trust that it will at least be that we have been faithful. It is our desire in this report to reveal major trends in our Sunday Schools and cover our promotional activities.

Our Sunday Schools this year averaged 2153 in attendance; against an average of 2004 in 1953 for a gain of 149 over the previous year. This was a

7% gain for the year. It is also worthy of note that our Schools averaged 2307 for the last quarter of this year or a gain of 303 over last year. If this upward trend continues we should pass the 2500 mark as an average for our district.

Twenty of our Sunday Schools have showed gains this year, eleven have showed a loss and six have the same as last year. There are now 34 Sunday Schools on the District.

Each year the General Sunday School Department awards two certificates to the District Conference to be presented to the Sunday School with the largest attendance gain and one to the Sunday School with the largest percentage gain. The leaders in numerical gains were: New Castle 31; Belgiumtown 16; Clinton and Washington 15. The leaders in percentage gains were: New Castle 155 percent; DuBois 66 percent; Sharon 44 percent; Belgiumtown 30 percent; Lisbon 27 percent. The New Castle Sunday School with Mr. Sanford Rhoades as Superintendent receives the certificate for the highest attendance with 31 and the largest percentage gain certificate with 155 percent gain. Their average attendance last year was 20; this year it is 51.

Your promotional secretary proposed to the General Dept. of Sunday Schools that an award be made to each District Sunday School with the highest gain for the Quadrennium. This award goes to the Armbrust Sunday School with a gain of 43 for the Quadrennium. Josephine Sunday School was a close second with 42.

We are happy to mention that we have one new unorganized Sunday School at Seneca, Pa. with an average of 24 for the year.

There were two major attendance drives this year in our District. The first was the Annual Sunday School Rally in the fall month of October. The District Sunday School set as a goal a mark of 3000 or a 10% increase over 1953. The attendance at the Rally Day in our Schools was 2918 for a new record. It provided a springboard for our schools to go forward and the average remained above 2100 after the Rally. In the spring of the year our District promoted the Sunday School Revival which lasted from Easter to Mother's Day. We asked for a gain of 10% on Easter Sunday and all records were broken when 3325 scholars entered our Sunday Schools. This was a gain of 538 over 1953 or an 18% gain.

In the month of March a Sunday School Leader's Institute was held at Allentown, Pa. with all the Sunday Schools of the Eastern Zone participating. This regional institute was a great blessing to our leaders who could attend. Because we left this institute would provide training and help on a higher level than small district conventions, we majored on encouraging our leaders to attend this, and many Sunday Schools responded by paying the expenses of delegations from their church.

During the year the District Council purchased a Gestetner Duplicating machine to be used by the promotional secretary in publishing a monthly bulletin named, The Pittsburgh District Sunday School Messenger. This bulletin furnishes news from our Sunday Schools, various announcements, and the statistical report from our Schools. This has met with much favor from our people and pastors, and has proved to be a good promotional effort. However, in order to continue this effort, it will require that more of our Sunday Schools pay their Dollar-per-month Sunday School expense budget.

We are indeed grateful for a constantly increasing interest in the Sunday Schools of our District. There is no branch of our Church activities that is more deserving of the earnest heart felt interest of every Pastor, every Sunday School

official, every Sunday School teacher, every delegate, yes, and every member of our churches, than the Sunday School. When this interest becomes a passion of each just named, then we will witness a great revival in our Churches and our District will grow as it never has before. When our, sometimes I fear, cold nominal feeling for our Sunday School becomes a yearning that will send us on our knees before the Lord and then into the streets and lanes to gather in those who are not attendants of Sunday School and pray over them with a genuine yearning, then, and then only, will we fulfill our obligation to them and unto God, and fortify them against the awful influences of modern filth and corruption they are meeting. We strongly urge that the work of the Sunday Schools with all their interests be given, our prayerful and earnest consideration, and that we do all we can to make them more efficient and spiritual.

### REPORT ON YOUTH ACTIVITIES

To the Sixteenth Annual Conference of the Pittsburgh District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Greetings:

Because of the unfailing goodness and grace of our Father, we, with an attitude of gratitude and praise, are privileged to present to this Conference a general review of the past year's District Youth endeavours.

A survey of the Youth activities for the past months will certainly reveal no colossal accomplishments. It is, however, encouraging and gratifying to observe that God is working in and through the Youth of the Pittsburgh District. The reports reaching us from the local societies and the evident spiritual and enthusiastic tempo of the Zone and District rallies confirm this fact.

Definite progress is reflected in the several phases of the local youth activities. Additional societies have been Chartered; many have campaigned successfully for new subscriptions of the "Pilgrim Youth News," our General Youth publication; some have engaged in projects relative to the church program. Pilgrim Youth Week was observed by many churches with obvious victory and success as they engaged in special evangelistic services and various other endeavours.

It is felt, by those near the heart of the District Youth work, that the Zone and District rallies have been spiritually and otherwise beneficial to the Youth of the District and have served to strengthen the local church and the cause of Christ in general.

In the Northwestern Zone, Rev. Dale Bair planned and held seven rallies. He reports that "the presence of the Lord was keenly felt in all these services with six young people kneeling at an altar of prayer." The combined attendance of these rallies reached nearly 700. The total receipts amounted to \$58.16 and the disbursements to \$56.16.

Rev. E. R. Mitchell, Western Zone leader, conducted four rallies during the year, each of which was characterized with the anointed presence of God. His report reflects commendable cooperation and enthusiasm on the part of the churches of that Zone. The attendants of these rallies, totaling 622, gave offerings amounting to \$106.19. The expenditures came to \$102.69.

The Southern Zone, with Rev. William Pope as leader, held three successful and well attended rallies with a grand total attendance of 535. The receipts from these rallies was \$54.16. The expenditures amounted to \$44.23.

Three rallies were held on the Northwestern Zone with Rev. E. S. Rutherford and Rev. L. E. Patmore serving successively as leaders. Approximately 500 people attended these rallies.

These Zone leaders have forwarded to the District Youth treasurer their financial balances.

A District Youth rally was designed and held at the District Ministerial Convention at Salem, Ohio in March. A glorious time of spiritual blessing and fellowship was enjoyed by the crowd that filled the church to near capacity. Our annual District Youth Convention was again observed this year the first two days of Camp. It is believed that a record number of our District Youth gathered for this occasion. It has been rewarding to see many of them find Christ as Saviour and Sanctifier. The Sharon society, for the second consecutive year, was awarded the banner for the largest total attendance.

In March the Youth secretary compiled, edited, and distributed in multiple number to the local society presidents a youth news sheet entitled "Pilgrim Youth Echoes." In addition to the rallies held on his own Zone, he visited rallies on the Northwestern and Western Zones.

The interest and cooperation of all has been appreciated. It is the burden of my heart to see the Youth of our District launch out and press forward for Christ and The Pilgrim Holiness Church with a real fervency of spirit and interest until Jesus shall come again.

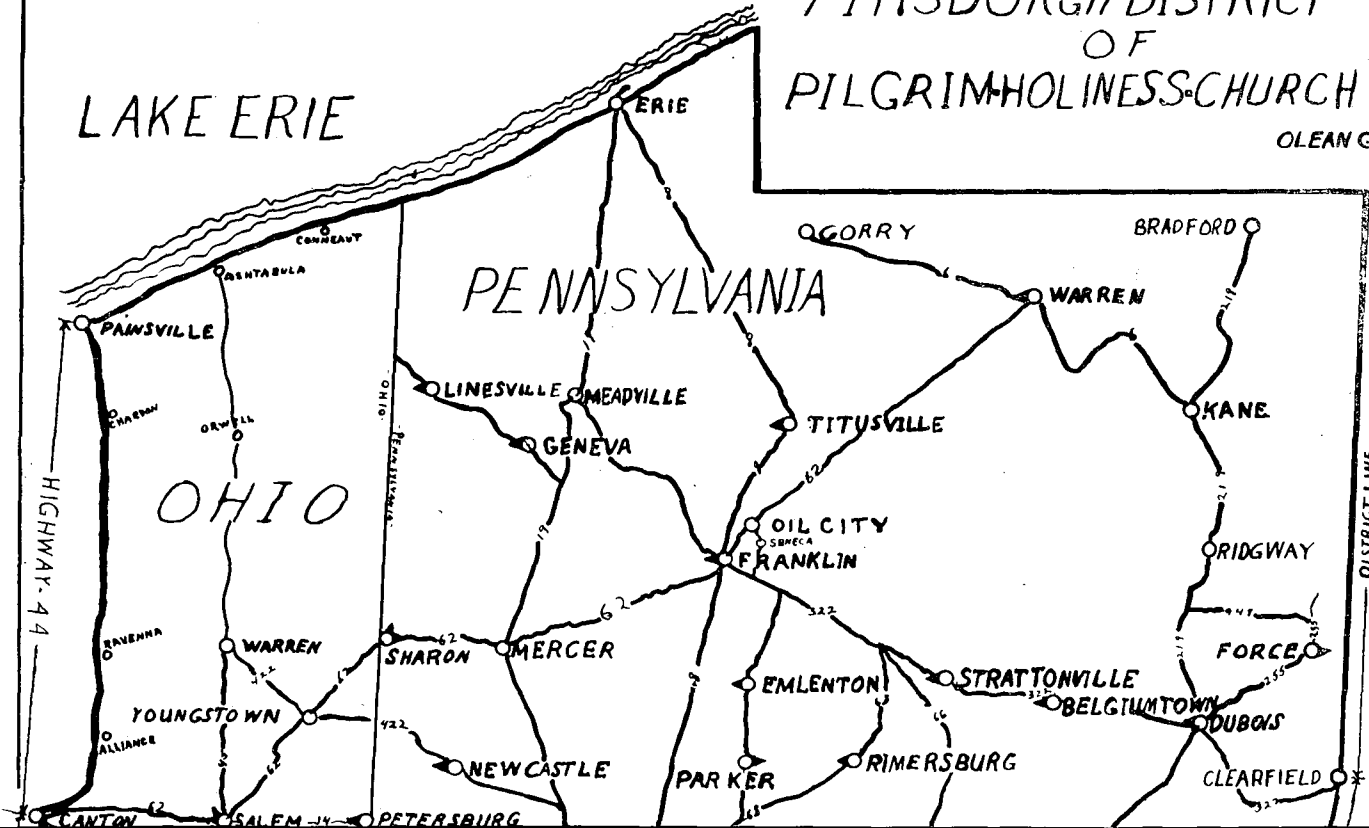

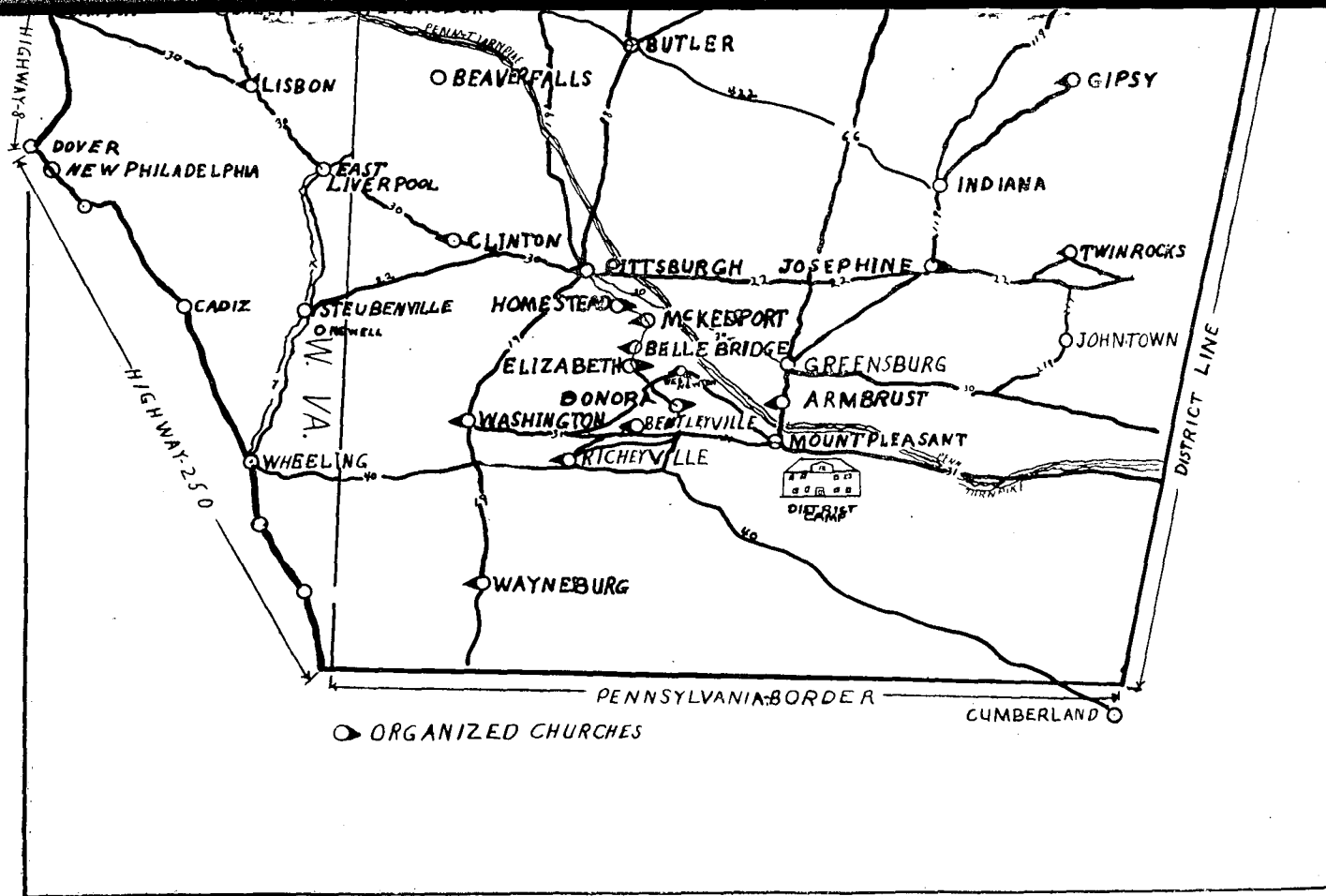

### STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. WHEREAS, there has been considerable difficulty in operating the kitchen and dining room with help supplied by the present plan, BE IT RESOLVED, that the camp committee secure the requisite help irrespective of age and that their remuneration be stipulated by said committee.
2. RESOLVED, that no pastor shall be permitted to plan or hold a tent meeting, Vacation Bible School, or revival during the dates set for the Annual District Camp and Conference within the bounds of the District without the consent of the District Council, provided these dates are announced a year in advance.

3. RESOLVED, that the District Council be authorized to appoint Trustees to receive the title to property in missions where property will be involved before the organization of a church.
4. RESOLVED, that the District Council be empowered to erect and maintain suitable buildings on our District Camp grounds.
5. BE IT RESOLVED, that our licentiates be directed to take the specified course of study through the Eastern Pilgrim College and that they secure the transcript of credits at the end of each school year and present it to the Board of Examiners.
6. BE IT RESOLVED, that we have a Home Missionary Board composed of the District Superintendent as Chairman, the District Treasurer and three (3) other members elected by the conference. Their duties shall be as follows:  
 To promote extensive Home Missionary activities in our District.  
 To investigate the prospects of new fields.  
 To place workers where they deem it advisable and as far as the District Home Missionary funds will permit.

The District Superintendent shall appoint these persons. This Committee shall meet at the discretion of the District Superintendent. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Camp Meeting rules be formulated, printed, and enforced and that copies be posted conspicuously about the camp grounds and also that copies be mailed to all pastors before the time of Camp Meeting.
13. BE IT RESOLVED, that each church give its pastor two weeks vacation with pay each year. In his absence the pastor shall secure a supply speaker, and an agreeable remuneration be made by the local Church Board.
14. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Council secure the necessary number

of laymen to be deputized to act as policemen twenty-four hours daily on the Camp Grounds during all District gatherings.

15. INASMUCH as many Sunday Schools are affected in their monthly attendance report during the month in which our District Camp is held, BE IT RESOLVED, that there be Sunday School Sessions each Sunday during Camp and District gatherings, and those who attend be considered present in their home school.
16. We recommend that pastors of deceased members of our District bring to the Memorial Committee a copy of the obituary of the deceased and any other information that is available, the Memorial Committee report to be printed in our Conference Journal.
17. BE IT RESOLVED, that Minister's single and unemployed children receive entertainment at our District gatherings and be assigned work.
18. RESOLVED, each church, erect at its place of worship the name of the church, and name, address, and phone number of the pastor.

25. WHEREAS the Mt. Pleasant Camp Ground and facilities have been dedicated to the preaching of Holiness; **BE IT RESOLVED**, that the District Council be empowered to permit the use of the grounds and facilities to groups who are in harmony with the doctrine of Scriptural Holiness.
26. INASMUCH as there has been no adequate recreational facilities provided by the District Camp;  
**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the District Council appoint a committee of three persons to plan and operate a program of supervised recreation.
27. WHEREAS the Camp does not provide adequate dormitory facilities for men; **BE IT RESOLVED**, that the District Superintendent appoint a committee in each church with the approval of the pastor to raise funds to build a boys dormitory.
28. **BE IT RESOLVED**, that the District Council be empowered to appoint a District Missionary Chairman to co-ordinate the work of our District Missionary Societies.

#### REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that resolution 9, Page 28, be amended in the following manner: the name "Eastern Pilgrim College" be substituted for the the name "Allentown Bible College".

Resolved, that article 6, in the Constitution of the Pilgrim Pension Plan, be amended to read as follows:

1. Each local church shall contribute to the pension fund each month an amount equivalent to four percent of the salary of the pastor, the same to be remitted to the district treasurer who will forward same to the general pension treasurer.

2. If the pastor of the local church is not a member of the Pilgrim Pension Plan, the said four percent paid by the church of which he is pastor



shall be placed in a fund to assist aged ministers or supplement the amount members of the pension plan would receive as pension from the pension fund. THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that each local church of the Pittsburgh District wholeheartedly co-operate in the support of this action.

4. We recommend that resolution 10, page 28, be deleted.
5. We recommend that no minister be permitted to pastor a church on the Pittsburgh District until he has promised his whole-hearted co-operation in the support of the various District financial policies in the pastorate to which he is called.
6. We recommend that Resolution 7, page 28 be amended to read as follows: BE IT RESOLVED, that the District pay any minister or any other person whose travel is authorized in the interest of the District at the rate of six (.06) cents per mile and that any other expense incurred incidental to the District work also be paid.
7. BE IT RESOLVED, that the money received from the sale of the Clymer Church be applied to pay off indebtedness on the Camp Loan, the balance on the Home Missionary Chapel, and the balance of the money be placed in the treasury of the Home Missionary Department.

#### STANDING RESOLUTIONS OF THE WAYS & MEANS COMMITTEE

1. BE IT RESOLVED, that each church raise the minimum sum of \$15.00 to be applied to the expense of Camp and Conference.
2. RESOLVED, that whenever the District Superintendent visits the churches that the pastor receive a special offering to be applied to his traveling expenses.
3. RESOLVED, that we require our ministers actively engaged to pay 75 percent of their tithe, and evangelists 50 percent of their tithe received for ministerial work, through the local treasurer to the District Treasurer.
4. BE IT RESOLVED, that all ordained and licensed ministers doing secular work pay 50 percent of their tithe from such labors through the local church treasurer to the District Treasurer and FURTHERMORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that all ordained Deaconesses pay \$1.00 per month through their local church treasurer to the District Treasurer, and that the District Council be empowered to make adjustments when necessary.
5. WHEREAS, there is much labor and time involved in carrying out the duties of the offices of District Secretary, District Treasurer, and District Statistician, BE IT RESOLVED, that we pay \$75.00 to the District Secretary; \$240.00 to the District Treasurer, and \$40.00 to the District Statistician as a yearly salary.
6. WHEREAS, the General Board sets the salaries of all the General Officers, and WHEREAS, the District Council is in a position to better know the financial status of the District and handles District funds, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Superintendent's salary be set by the District Council before the election.

7. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District pay any minister or any other person whose travel is authorized in the interest of the District at the rate of six (.06) cents per mile and that any other expense incurred incidental to the District work also be paid.
8. BE IT RESOLVED, that we ask our churches to give an amount equal to ten (10) percent of the pastor's salary and expense account, same to be paid monthly through the local church treasurer to be apportioned as follows:
  - 25 percent for Home Missions.
  - 70 percent for District Expense.
  - 5 percent for General Sinking Fund.
9. BE IT RESOLVED, that we as a District contribute to the Eastern Pilgrim College the equivalent of twenty-five (25) cents a month per member, said funds to be paid through the District Treasurer and that we put forth a whole-hearted effort to raise our quota for the College.
10. Because of the high cost of printing THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we charge 25 cents per copy for our District Minutes.
11. WHEREAS, according to the action of our General Conference of June, 1954 a general budget was set as follows:
 

General Administrative Expense .....	\$1.50.....(25%)
Foreign Missions .....	2.10.....(35%)
Church Extension .....	1.20.....(20%)
Church Extension Loan Fund .....	.36.....( 6%)
General Sunday School Expense .....	.24.....( 4%)
Senior College .....	.60.....(10%)

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that we as a District faithfully endeavor to abide by this legislation.

12. WHEREAS, the 1954 General Conference adopted the following resolution pertaining to the Pension Plan:
 

Resolved, that article 6, in the Constitution of the Pilgrim Pension Plan, be amended to read as follows:

  1. Each local church shall contribute to the pension fund each month an amount equivalent to four percent of the salary of the pastor, the same to be remitted to the District Treasurer who will forward same to the General Pension Treasurer.
  2. If the pastor of the local church is not a member of the Pilgrim Pension Plan, the said four percent paid by the church of which he is pastor shall be placed in a fund to assist aged ministers or supplement the amount members of the pension plan would receive as pension from the pension fund.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that each local church of the Pittsburgh District wholeheartedly co-operate in the support of this action.
13. BE IT RESOLVED, that no minister be permitted to pastor a church on the Pittsburgh District until he has promised his whole-hearted co-operation in the support of the various District financial policies in the pastorate to which he is called.
14. BE IT RESOLVED, that the money received from the sale of the Clymer Church be applied to pay off indebtedness on the Camp loan, the balance on the Home Missionary Chapel, and the balance of the money be placed in the treasury of the Home Missionary Department.

REV. WALTER DRURY was born in England in 1872. On May 4, 1954, just as the Angel of Day was drawing aside the curtains of night, the Angel of God leaned over his pillow and whispered the summons of departure, "The Master has come and calleth for thee." A life throb rifted the veil, and on the chariot which the King of Glory holds in readiness for each one of His Elijahs, he took his departure from Elizabeth, Pennsylvania, to the sinless, nightless, sorrowless country that lies beyond the river we call Death.

Early in life, Brother Drury was gloriously saved and knowingly sanctified in the Methodist Church. Later he was instrumental in helping to organize and establish the Pilgrim Holiness Church in Elizabeth, Pa. of which he was a faithful charter member until he became a pillar in the higher Temple of God. He was faithful and loyal to the local, district, and general work of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. He served on two occasions as a delegate to the General Conference and numerable times as a delegate to the District Conference. Truly he was full of the gospel of practical help and brotherly upbuilding. His life was orderly, faithful, harmonious, and well-balanced. His character was based upon the Word of God and if there was any one truth of Christianity that had entered more deeply than another into the formation of his character, it was this one: his deep conviction of peace with God.

But not merely for eulogy, however merited, would we stop to consider the character of Brother Drury, but with the hope that such consideration may inspire others to emulate the virtues and seek for the Spirit and power of Jesus that in such a marked manner possessed him.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Emmaline Drury, of Elizabeth; three daughters, Mrs. Edith Henderson, Washington, Pa., Mrs. Lois Baker, Cincinnati, Ohio; Mrs. Ida Webster, Dayton, Ohio; two sons, Mr. Roy Drury and Rev. L. W. Drury of McKeesport, Pa.; a number of grandchildren; and a host of friends.

Funeral services were conducted in the Elizabeth Pilgrim Holiness Church on May 7, where a large gathering of laymen and ministers congregated to pay a last tribute of honor to the memory of one whom they respected. The Rev. A. T. Adam was in charge of the services, with the following ministers participating: Rev. George Cole, Rev. Samuel Byers, and Rev. H. E. Williams. The Congregational as well as the special singing added much to the service. The service closed with the singing of "Meet Me There."

He was laid to rest in the Round Hill Cemetery near Elizabeth. His spirit has ascended, and his body, interred; both are invisible; but his holy influence remains with us as a noble heritage and a strong example."—H. E. Williams, Pastor.
