"WHEREAS the ranks of our ministry are becoming more and more crowded by licensed and ordained men who are not devoting their time to the ministry, but are following secular pursuits, and whose voice and vote in conference count for as much as the men who are "actively and regularly" engaged in the work of the ministry, Therefore be it

RESOLVED, That all such inactive ministers, who have not been actively and regularly engaged in the ministerial work for a period of three years, shall be placed on an inactive list in the conference journal, with no voice in the district conference, and shall not be eligible to hold elective offices; and be it

RESOLVED further, That this rule shall not be interpreted to apply to aged, physically disabled, retired ministers, or students in school preparing for the ministry; and be it

RESOLVED further, That it shall be the duty of the district council to formulate said list of inactive ministers (Section 112 P. 21).

The above resolution is presently under consideration by District Council.

STANDING RULES

- No. 1.—The center tier of seats and platform constitute the Conference Bar.
- No. 2.—BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Council be empowered to set the date and place of the service for the ordination of eligible candidates for the ministry.
- No. 3.—The Fiscal Year shall run from May first to April thirtieth.
- No. 4.—All Annual Reports shall be sent to the District Statistician postmarked not later than the tenth of the month immediately following the closing of the Fiscal Year.
- No. 5.—The District Superintendent shall appoint all committees.
- No., 6.—BE IT RESOLVED, that all resolutions passed by the Conference shall be binding from year to year, unless otherwise changed or rescinded.
- No. 7.—The District Council shall constitute the District Board of Trustees.
- No. 8.—WHEREAS, the Gospel Minister should be provided for at the age of retirement, BE IT RESOLVED, that we finance the Pension Fund of the General Church by each minister and evangelist sending two per cent of his cash salary received for the month through the local church treasurer to the District Treasurer, and that each local church pay four per cent of each minister's and evangelist's cash salary to the District Treasurer.
- No. 9.—BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Superintendent's four per cent toward the pension fund be paid by the district.

A word of exhortation and appreciation was given by Bro. Thomas.

The Conference adjourned by Bro. Drury leading in a closing prayer.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE of the Pittsburgh District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, held this Second day of July, 1956 at Mt. Pleasant Camp Ground, GREETINGS- in the name of Him whose work engages our attention. Today we call the Conference to join in gratitude and praise to God for the many blessings which have marked our way throughout the past months since we last met in Annual Session. Through the manifold blessing and mercy of Almighty God we have been permitted once more to assemble in this the eighteenth Annual Session.

The year has not been without its problems. In fact in many ways they have been peculiarily difficult and unusually numerous. Many times we have been driven to our knees in earnest prayer and supplication. God has been good to us, has over-ruled the difficulties, has given increase to the work and blessing to the workers.

In spite of the conditions which sometimes outwardly appear so unfavorable, we see signs of Divine favor here and there, which make us look more and more for a real Holy Spirit revival among us. We believe the prospects for the future look bright. Opportunities for further advancement are on every hand if we will but take them. It is our conviction that this is our day, if we will maintain the attitude of utter dependance upon God and look to the leadership of the Holy Spirit. If we keep the emphasis upon the distinctive tenet of Scriptural Second-Blessing Holiness; if we refuse to compromise our principles and standards and maintain our margin of safety from all that would undermine spiritual life; if we keep enarmored with rock-ribbed convictions; if we keep our hearts aflame with the love of God and keep filled with a deep compassion for lost souls, we shall build for eternity and not for time.

We should allow no activities, however worthy and commanding, to turn us aside as a ministry and laity from the work of winning souls to Christ. This objective of winning souls to Christ is the chief aim of the FORWARD MOVE-MENT launched by our denomination. It is hoped that all pastors will take hold of this all-important matter and promote it with heart and soul. During this Conference a District Forward Movement Committee will be appointed, this committee to be amenable to the District Council. Legislation should also be passed during this Conference which will help implement in a practical way our efforts to reach the lost for Christ.

DISTRICT HOME MISSIONARY WORK

During the past year the District has been helping with the support of the Bloomingdale and DuBois pastors. These churches are now off support and the Home Missionary Board is ready to launch, with the aid of the District Forward Movement Committee, a new project. We await the release of the Home Missionary Chapel which has been located at Andover, Ohio for a year and a half. All should promote to offering for Home Missions which is to be given monthly through the Calendar envelopes.

SPIRITUAL PROGRESS

We sincerely feel our churches are on the upward trend in the Pittsburgh District. Many of our churches have enjoyed spiritual awakenings. The revival reports over the District indicate many souls won to God. This should reflect in the future an increase in membership. Our people desire a spiritual program. May we as ministers do our best to give our people such a program.

FINANCE

At the last District Conference we set as an objective —EVERY CHURCH MEET THE GENERAL BUDGET APORTIONMENT— You will be interested in knowing that although all churches were not 100% during the past year, yet more has been received for this phase of the work than ever before in the history of the Pittsburgh District. The report shows our District having paid 76.1% of the General Budget. Twelve churches have given increases to the pastor ranging from five to twenty dollars a week.

OUR MATERIAL GAINS

ELIZABETH church under the leadership of Rev. A. T. Adams made extensive repairs on the parsonage and installed a new heating system in the church. They also redecorated the inside of the church.

PITTSBURGH church under the direction of Rev. Huey Gillispie dedicated the new buff-brick church just following last Conference. Extensive repairs were also made to the newly purchased building.

GENEVA church purchased a new parsonage after fire destroyed their manse. Rev. George Harvey is the pastor of this work.

DUBOIS Church finished the basement and added convenient rest rooms. They also laid new carpeting in the church. Rev. J. L. Clark is the pastor.

WARREN church under the direction of Rev. Geo. Snow completely redecorated the church and purchased the house and corner lot adjoining the church.

BELGIUMTOWN placed new windows in the church, new doors on class rooms, new song books were purchased. Rev. Burch spent much time and effort in accomplishing this.

ANDOVER, Ohio church under the leadership of Rev. Greene purchased a parsonage for \$10,000. A lot on which to build a church was included.

ARMBRUST church under the direction of Rev. McClure excavated for their new building which in the end will cost them in excess of \$50,000.

NEW CASTLE church pastored by Rev. Duncan added new rest rooms, painted the church basement and reduced the debt on the church to \$1.800.00.

WEST FREEDOM church under the leadership of Rev. Chapman built a new basement church in which they are now worshipping.

BENTLEYVILLE installed a new heating system in the church. Rev. Pope directed the work here.

TITUSVILLE church under the guidance of Rev. Bair are in the process of erecting a much needed addition.

CLINTON church pastored by Rev. Kinnan recently painted the parsonage and plan to paint the church.

LISBON church under the leadership of Rev. Wayne Clark made repairs on the parsonage which increase the value of the property.

Other repairs to church properties too numerous to mention here were made.

MY PERSONAL REPORT

I have preached 125 times visited the churches 130 times; Conducted 95 Church Board meetings; Held 14 Annual meetings; 6 District Council meetings, 2 Home Missionary Boardmeetings, 5 committee meetings.

I have attended 3 Youth Rallies, 1 Youth Convention, held 3 week-end meetings, dedicated one church, held three communion services, 2 funerals, three revivals.

I also presided at the Ministerial Convention, attended the Leaders Conference and two General Board meetings at Indianapolis, Ind. Also attended in the interest of the church the Youth Convention at Allentown and the National Youth Convention at Winona Lake, Ind.

I have traveled over 14,000 miles in the interest of the Pittsburgh District work.

My salary from the District in the amount of \$80.00 a week is paid in full. I have received 6c a mile traveling expense in District work. Offerings for revivals and week-end meetings were \$325.00. I held one revival in the Home Missionary Chapel and turned the offering over to the District work.

The co-operation of the District Council and ministers of the District has made the load lighter than it would have otherwise been. I express my appreciation for the \$100.00 love offering at Camp and the \$75.00 gift at Christmas time from the ministers.

May we as a District chart our course for the coming year and labor for the advancement of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in the area allotted to the Pittsburgh District.

To the 18th annual conference of the Pittsburgh District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church:

Greetings in Jesus Name:

It has pleased the Lord in His wise providence to allow us to labor for one more year in the field of Sunday Schools and to again as emble ourselves to transact His business and to praise His dear Name.

This has been a disappointing year, generally speaking for the Sunday schools of the Pittsburgh District and it is with reluctance that we submit this report.

The church has launched a Forward Movement and surely it hasn't come a moment too soon for the schools of our district. If we are to truly move forward it will mean that we must completely re-examine our attitudes and thinkirg, and, further to re-appraise our methods. It is the humble opinion of this secretary that too long have we been bound (and continue to be bound) by the traditional, the accepted and the historic approach to the problems of soul winning for Christ, For example, we depend almost entirely on the revival meeting as the chief harvesting method and in our thinking we seem to feel that this is the only method that bears the Divine stamp of approval for bringing souls face to face with their need of salvation. We would like to ask the question, Why shouldn't souls be brought to the crisis of decision through other means? And what a magnificent opportunity is afforded by Sunday Schools and Daily Vacation Bible Schools. In terms of money and human effort, no means are more economical than these in winning converts to Christ. It is our earnest conviction that if as much time, effort and prayer were expended on Sunday Schools and Vacation Bible Schools, as are showered on less effectual efforts, we would be reporting a gain and not a loss in this report. Like it or not the stark fact remains that generally speaking, we the pastors are ultimately responsible for the success or failure of our work and this is our problem and we must supply the answer.

The district schools are now 36 in number, a gain of one over last year, the Hartstown school having been reactivated under the direction of the Rev. George Harvey and the Rev. Andrew Slozat.

- 1. WHEREAS, there has been considerable difficulty in operating the kitchen and dining room with the help supplied by the present plan, BE IT RE-SOLVED, that the camp committee secure the requiste help irrespective of age and that their remuneration be stipulated by said committee.
- RESOLVED, that no pastor shall be permitted to plan or hold a tent
 meeting Vacation Bible School, or revival during the dates set for the Annual
 District Camp and Conference within the bounds of the District without the
 consent of the District Council, provided these dates are announced a year
 in advance.
- 3. RESOLVED, that the District Council be authorized to appoint Trustees to

- receive the title to property in missions where property will be involved before the organization of a church.
- 4. RESOLVED, that the District Council be empowered to erect and maintain suitable buildings on our District Camp grounds.
- BE IT RESOLVED, that our licentiates be directed to take the specified course of study through the Eastern Pilgrim College and that they secure the transcript of credits at the end of each school year and present it to the Board of Examiners.
- 6. BE IT RESOLVED, that we have a Home Missionary Board composed of the District Superintendent as Chairman, the District Treasurer and three (3) other members elected by the conference. Their duties shall be as follows:

 To promote extensive Home Missionary activities in our District.

To investigate the prospects of new fields.

- To place workers where they deem it advisable and as far as the District Home Missionary funds will permit.
- 7. BE IT RESOLVED, that the camp committee select song books to be used at least three consecutive years, same to be announced in camp advertising.
- 8. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Superintendent be requested to instruct our people that the pastor's salary be continued during the time of the District Camp and Conference.
- 9. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Treasurer be directed to send to all ministers and local church treasurers a mimeographed copy of our Conference rules regarding finances.
- 10. INASMUCH as the views of the minister's wives are largely ministerial views, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED, that our churches be discouraged from electing minister's wives as delegates to the District Conference.
- 11. BE IT RESOLVED, that an annual camp meeting be held and that the District Council be empowered to set the date, BE IT FURTHER RESOLV-ED, that the camp be supervised by a Camp Committee composed of the following personnel: The District Superintendent, Camp Clerk, Purchasing Agent, Superintendent of Buildings, Commissary, Custodian or Superintendent of Grounds. And Receptionist or Room Clerk, The District Superintendent shall appoint these persons. This Committee shall meet at the discretion of the District Superintendent, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Camp Meeting rules be formulated, printed, and enforced and that copies be posted conspicuously about the camp grounds and also that copies be mailed to all pastors before the time of Camp Meeting.
- 12. BE IT RESOLVED, that each church give its pastor two weeks vacation with pay each year. In his absence the pastor shall secure a supply speaker, and an agreeable remuneration be made by the local Church Board.
- 13. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Council secure the necessary number of laymen to be deputized to act as policemen twenty-four hours daily on the Camp Grounds during all District gatherings.

INASMUCH as many Sunday Schools are affected in their monthly attendance report during the month in which our District Camp is held, BE IT RESOLVED, that there be Sunday School Sessions each Sunday during Camp and District gatherings, and those who attend be considered present in their home school.
- 15. We recommend that pastors of deceased members of our District bring to

- the Mcmorial Committee a copy of the obituary of the deceased and any other information that is available, the Memorial Committee report to be printed in our Conference Journal.
- 16. BE IT RESOLVED, that Minister's single and unemployed children receive entertainment at our District gatherings and be assigned work.
- 17. BE IT RESOLVED, that each pastor be permitted to engage in two revival meetings each year off his charge. It shall be his responsibility to secure and pay a supply speaker in his absence.
- 18. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Council have printed on good bond paper or light cardboard—whichever is cheaper—the Church Covenant and preceding questions, together with such other questions as the District Council may deem advisable; providing at the end of the form a place for signature and addresses; and that these forms be distributed to the churches free of charge.
- 19. BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Treasurer be instructed to publish an itemized report of all funds raised for the expansion, maintenance and operation of the District Camp and the same be mailed to all local churches, also a mimeographed copy of the District financial report be included.
- 20. WHEREAS, we have but one gathering of our ministers each year, since we feel that we would benefit greatly from frequent meetings, therefore: Be IT RESOLVED, that the District Superintendent arrange for quarterly meetings of our preachers.
- 21. WHEREAS there is confusion and uncertainty involved in the present method of recalling the pastors; BE IT RESOLVED, that the recall of all pastors on the Pittsburgh District be held within the period of the first and second Sunday in April, by a person designated to preside by the District Superintendent.
- 22. WHEREAS the present fiscal year ends May 31st and Whereas the District Conference convenes in the latter part of June: BE IT RESOLVED, that the Conference fiscal year end April 30th.
- 23. INASMUCH as many pastors have failed to respond to standing resolution No. 9, page 28: BE IT RESOLVED, that it be amended to read as follows: That each pastor come to camp two days early to clean up and prepare the camp, and remain until the work is completed unless duly excused by the Executive Committee of the District Council.
- 24. WHEREAS the District Conference has been convening the morning following the last Camp Meeting service and WHEREAS insufficient time is available to adequately prepare for conference: BE IT RESOLVED, that the District Council be urged to set the conference time to begin the Monday afternoon following Camp Meeting.
- 25. INASMUUCH as other Districts of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are sponsoring Youth Camps for the youth of their Districts separate from the District Youth Convention and District Camp Meeting: BE IT RESOLVED, that a Youth Camp be held under the direction of the Youth Committee of the Pittsburgh District, separate from the District Camp and District Youth Convention which will include an educational, recreational, and evangelistic program.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

- RESOLVED, that we kindly ask each lay member to give at least \$2.00, and that each District licentiate contribute \$5.00 annually to share in defraying the expense of the engaged workers, etc. and that each church raise the minimum sum of \$15.00 for the general expenses of the camp and conference.
