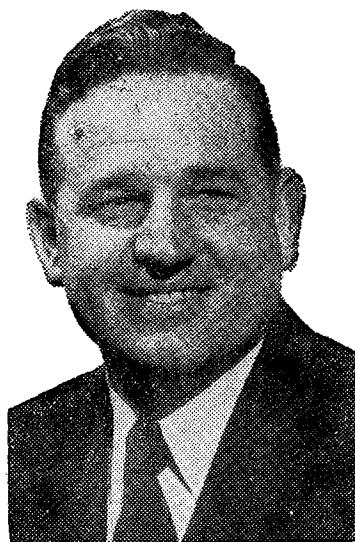

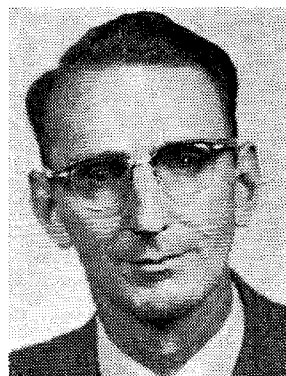

Greetings:

We shall begin with our fourth annual youth camp which was held last July 27 - 31. Our registration of 44 was lower than previous years, but it was a most successful camp. 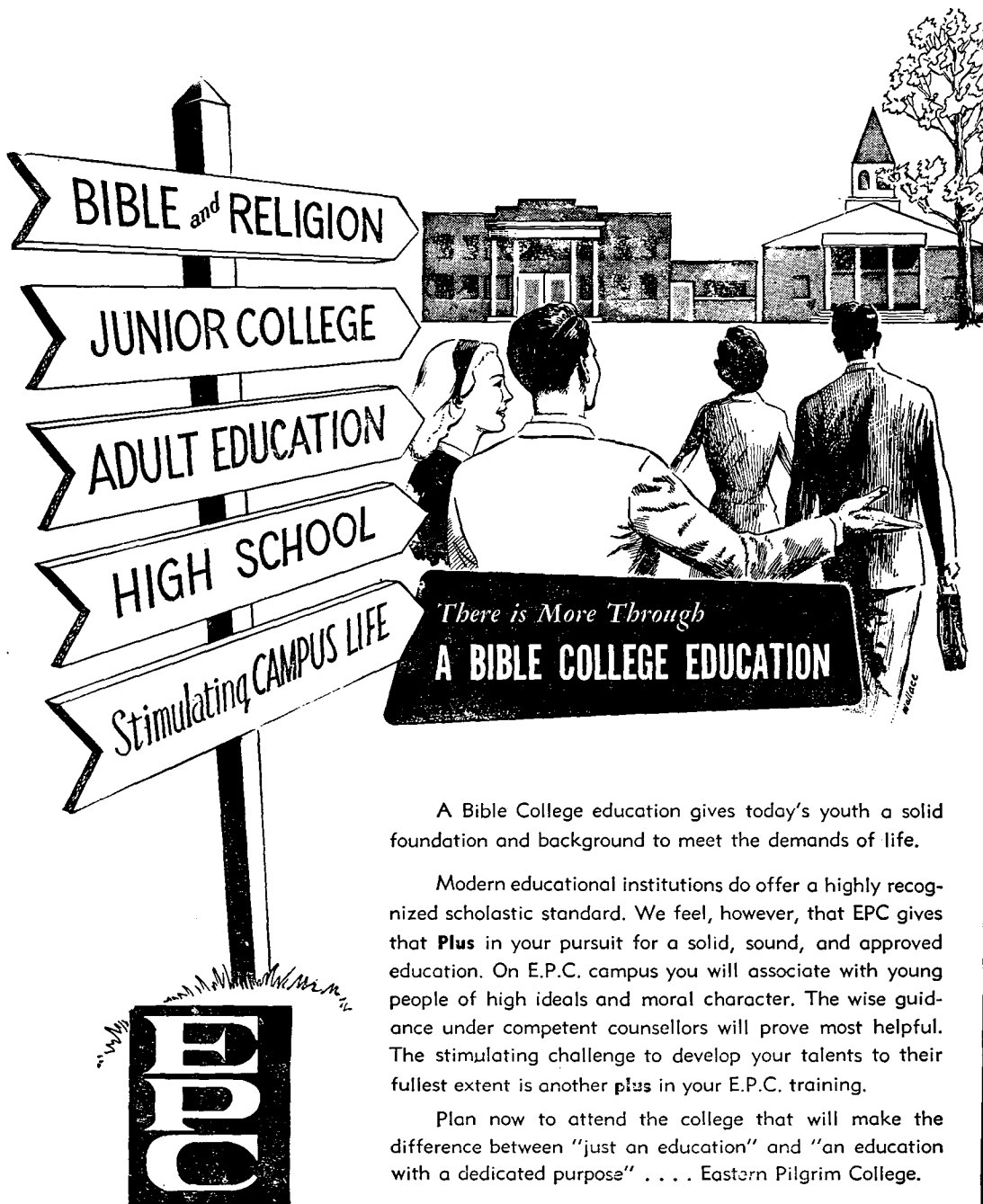
