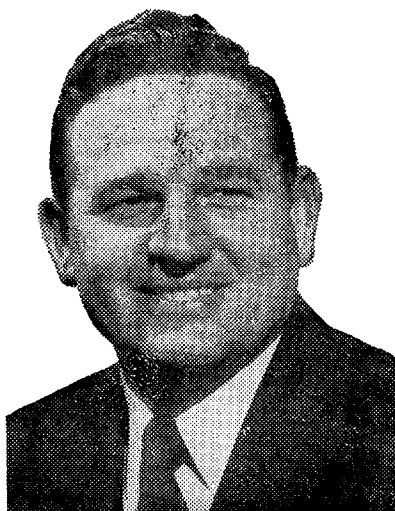

With reference to the aged ministers we suggest that only those above 65 years may be so classified.”

DAILY PROCEEDINGS**FIRST SESSION**

The Twenty-third Annual Conference of the Pittsburgh District Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened at the Methodist Camp Ground at Cherry Run, Rimersburg, Pennsylvania on July 17, 1961 at 9:05 A. M.

Bro. Norman Wilson led the Conference in singing "Higher Ground". The people were called to stand around the altar for the opening prayer led by Bro. George Harvey, the Assistant Superintendent. "Blest Be the Tie that Binds" was sung by the people, followed by a few remarks by Wm. Neff, General Superintendent.

District Superintendent, Rev. Willis Clock, welcomed and presented Dr. W. H. Neff to the Conference. Dr. Neff assumed the chairmanship of the Conference. Bro. Neff read from Romans 12, beginning with the 4th verse. He addressed the Conference with the following remarks: We should take stock of our relationship with God and man. We should set directions for the year to come and have goodness in fellowship with each other. There will be differences and tension and rivalries and debates, because of differences in people, but there should be a concern for truth and everything should be done in love. Conference was adjourned with prayer by Dr. Wm. Neff.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Dr. William Neff, our esteemed General Superintendent; co-ministers of the Pittsburgh District; faithful lay-delegates; and friends. Greetings:

The Pilgrims from our district are the very best in the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Our pastors are self-sacrificing men who love God and our church. I appreciate our assistant superintendent Rev. George Harvey who has been faithful in helping me on different occasions this past year.

As this twenty-third annual conference convenes, the world situation looks very dark. However, the prospect of the coming of our Lord is very bright. The Bible teaches us to occupy until He comes, believe His word, and trust in His faithfulness.

There is no doubt in my mind about the authenticity and the divine inspiration concerning the Holy Bible. I would proclaim along with the psalmist, "Forever, Oh Lord, Thy word is settled in Heaven." As strange as it may seem the Holiness people simply need to believe the Bible in its entirety; to believe only part is to question the integrity of the author. What God has proclaimed is truth and what He has promised He will fulfill! But many do not believe this because they are pessimistic about finances and winning the unchurched. These go hand in hand for defeat.

The need of this district is for us to believe what God has said through His word concerning His work. God must have full control of our lives if success is to be assured. Let us apply the teachings of His word concerning our problems and the advancements He expects us to make in our district.

"For all the promises of God in Him are yea, and in Him amen, unto the glory of God by us."

RECOMMENDATIONS

I am presenting three goals for the next two years. These goals are reasonable, practical, and obtainable.

1. Increase in membership

I am proposing that we have a gain of "one new member for every ten" each year in all of our churches. We shall all endeavor to do this by the help of God through prayer, evangelism, visitation, and faith.

2. District Sunday School Goal

"One new scholar for each Sunday school class," every six months. With an estimated 200 Sunday school teachers, their class members, and thirty-two pastors and Sunday school superintendents, we should be able to do this and more if we all work and have a compassion for the lost.

3. Finances

I am proposing a brand new plan for our denominational giving. The financial plan for the World Wide Ministry of the Pilgrim Holiness Church would be called the World Service Offering. This would pay our United Stewardship Fund, Eastern Pilgrim College, and the Pittsburgh District Administration expense. I further recommended that the World Service Offering be 18 percent of all current regular offerings monthly from our Sunday Schools and Churches. This would provide the local church with 82 percent of their regular giving for their own local administration.

The World Service Offering may be raised in many different ways such as through the local church treasury, Sunday school treasury, coin cards, missionary society, individual subscribers, special offerings and District Superintendent visits. By employing one or part of some of these methods, and everyone fully cooperating we can pay 100 per cent of our World Service Offering. You will receive a clear picture of this program when I show the new audio-visual presentation of the World Wide Ministry of the Pilgrim Holiness Church at the close of my report.

CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS

The Bentleyville Church has completely remodeled their auditorium by installing new doors, hardwood flooring and new pews and pulpit furniture.

The Force Church is completing their new church building valued at \$150,000 and are contemplating dedication this fall. This modern brick edifice is located adjacent to a new high school on a beautiful 420 foot lot on the main highway in the town of Weedville. The building is 108x50 with full basement, and will seat 450 comfortably.

The Elizabeth Church made some worthy improvements on their church property. They have completely redecorated their church basement, installed new storm doors, windows and a gas furnace in the parsonage.

The Franklin Church could have experienced a real tragedy to their property when the parsonage caught on fire, but by the mercies of God, the work of an efficient fire department the property was spared. Since the fire, the parsonage has been completely redecorated.

The new Educational Unit of the McKeesport Church is now a reality. Rev. R. A. Beltz dedicated this new facility last fall. This new unit has eleven classrooms, a fellowship room and is valued at \$20,000.

The Pittsburgh Church has voted to sell their church and parsonage and take the proceeds and relocate in a more desirable section of Pittsburgh.

The Washington Church has been forced from their building which they have occupied for many years. The building was considered unsafe for occupancy. The present plan is to sell their old church and parsonage and to build new facilities on their acquired lots in the Elwood Park addition in Washington.

PERSONAL REPORT

I have visited our churches 167 times, preached 132 sermons, attended 32 church business meetings, eight council meetings, five youth zone meetings, one Sunday School meeting, two Home Missionary Board meetings, two Board of Director meetings at Eastern Pilgrim College, two General Superintendent meetings, two ministerial fellowship meetings, held three week end revivals and one week revival.

I traveled 22,512 miles in the interest of the district.

REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

To the Twenty-third Annual Conference of the Pittsburgh District: Greetings in the Name of The Master Teacher.

This year our district schools were hindered in realizing anticipated growth due to an abnormal and prolonged winter season which continued beyond Easter. Despite Nature's abnormality 12 of our 33 churches experienced a growth which was nearly sufficient to off-set the loss of the remaining twenty-one schools.

The average attendance for the year was 2055 as against 2068, for the previous year which represented a numerical loss of 13; a percentage loss of about one-half of one percent.

During the course of the year the secretary encouraged the pastors and superintendents to utilize the Standard of Excellence. This tool will not solve all of our Sunday school problems and it has admitted weakness but if conscientiously employed it will facilitate organization and function of the average school to the great end of better Christian education for our Pilgrim constituents. Sixteen schools responded to our repeated petitions.

Last December first, Rev. J. D. Abbott launched what is known as the Decade of Progress. By this time every pastor and superintendent should be fully oriented in regards to this competitive stimulus and should have their local machinery in gear for the purpose of earning the annual honors. This year the McKeesport school qualified for first position with 34,645 points. Force was runner-up with 11,220 points. Thirteen schools participated in this program.

 - (1) Three points for each person between the ages of 12 and 35.
 - (2) Two points for each person outside of the 12 to 35 age bracket.
 - (3) One point for each mile traveled.
 - (4) Five additional points be given for each pastor present.
 - (5) Five additional points be given for each Youth President present.
 - (6) Each youth president or pastor shall be prepared to submit their total number of points to the zone leader.
 - (7) The host church shall be eligible for competition for the zone banner.
6. Resolved, That each society submit the names and addresses of all local youth officers to the District Youth President.
7. Be it resolved that each zone leader establish the mileage between the churches of his zone, and that this shall be the basis for awarding points for mileage.

Be it further resolved that this action shall not be applied to churches now in existence until the close of the 1953-64 Conference year.
2. Be it resolved that Section 39, #2 of the Manual be changed to read;
No member under the age of 18 years and no probationary member shall be allowed to vote at any church meeting, and all such members shall be listed as non-assessable members.
3. Be it resolved that the basis of the United Stewardship Fund be changed from per capita assessment to percentage of regular offerings of each local church.
4. Whereas there is considerable repetition in the questions for membership and the Covenant of membership, therefore
Be it resolved that the Covenant be edited and placed in the Special Rules section and
Be it further resolved that a Membership Training Class be held prior to reception of members, fully instructing them in the beliefs and practices of the Pilgrim Holiness Church as outlined by the Word of God and the Manual.
5. Be it resolved that Section 45 be changed to read;
The annual church meeting shall elect one delegate for each 30 members or less, and an additional delegate for every additional 30 members or major fraction thereof, to the annual meeting of the District Conference,

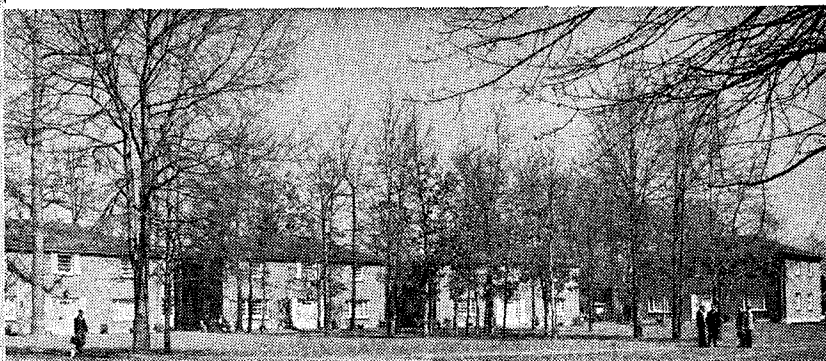
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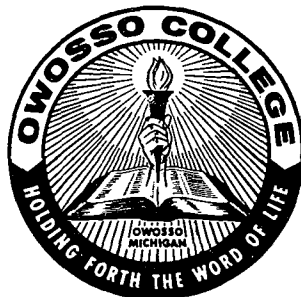
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OUR FINANCIAL PROGRAM

WORLD SERVICE OFFERING

An amount equal to 18% of Sunday School and Church unspecified receipts of each local church. This offering of 18% of all unspecified funds is to be forwarded to the District Treasurer by the tenth of each month who will then disburse it as follows:

61% to District Budget

31% to General Budget (United Stewardship Fund)

8% to Eastern Pilgrim College (or an amount equal to
.25 per member per month)

Note: This is a substitute plan for the former USF, District Budget, 75% of the pastor's tithe, Sunday School activity fee and District Superintendent's offering.

MINISTERIAL OFFERING

All District Ministers, not pastoring, shall pay 50% of their tithe from secular work to the district through their local church treasurer.

CAMP AND CONFERENCE

Each church to pay \$18.00 per year

Each minister to pay \$5.00 per year. (see standing resolution #1, Ways and Means)

DISTRICT YOUTH

Each society to pay \$1.00 per month to the District Youth Treasurer.

SPECIAL OFFERINGS

Easter - Offering for General Church Extension

May - Offering for Christian education (EPC and Owosso)

Rally Day - Offering for General Sunday School Department

November - Self Denial offering for Foreign Missions

PENSION PLAN

Each church to pay an amount equal to 4% of the pastor's salary
