PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH

Rocky Mountain District COLORADO SPRINGS 1927

THE first session of the Sixth Annual District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Colorado, was opened Monday, June 27th, 1927, at 9:00 A. M. The Assembly was called to order by District Superintendent L. D. Sharp. Following song No. 51, of "Praise of His Glory," the Assembly was led in prayer by Brothers C. W. McCarty and L. D. Sharp. Song No. 125 was then sung. Following this, General Superintendent W. R. Cox was asked to preside. He then addressed the Assembly, using the Scriptures Romans 12: 3-21 as a basis of his discourse.

The Nebraska District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church then applied for union with the Colorado District, specifying one condition under which they desire to unite, as follows:

"That all moneys which prior to this Assembly of June 27-28, 1927, were paid, pledged, or otherwise subscribed or given for use in the Nebraska District, whether paid or yet outstanding, shall be used or placed in fund for use within the Nebraska District."

Moved and supported that the Nebraska District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church be granted permission to unite with the Colorado District. Carried.

The Chair then requested that Rev. C. W. McCarty, former Superintendent of the Nebraska District be seated on platform with the District Superintendent of Colorado.

Moved and supported that the former Secretary of the Nebraska District be seated with the Secretary of the Colorado District. Carried.

Moved and supported that we use the center tier of seats, first six rows as the conference bar. Carried.


Moved and supported that we grant an honorary seat in the conference bar to Rev. Jos. A. Smith. Carried.

the Churches and pastors be summarized and that they be given both separately and combined before this Assembly. Carried.

Moved and supported that after a good season of prayer we proceed to the election of officers of the District. Carried.

Election followed, the results showing on the official register of these minutes.



The third session of this Assembly opened at 7:00 P. M., June 27, 1927. Prayer by D. W. Reynolds, followed by solo by W. J. Boddy, accompanied by stringed chorus. Our General Superintendent then spoke from the 12th Chapter of I Corinthians.

Moved and supported that we accept into this District Rev. Jos. A. Smith of the Kentucky District. Carried.

Moved and supported that we grant an honorary seat in the conference bar to Rev. J. Thos. Johnson, Superintendent of Kentucky District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Carried.

Moved and supported that we grant to Rev. Leland Tinker a seat in the conference bar. Carried.

Moved and supported that we grant to our local preachers seats in the conference bar. Carried.

Following this, we as an Assembly, were favored by a speech of acceptance from Rev. L. D. Sharp, re-elected District Superintendent.

Moved and supported that our District Council serve in the capacity of a board to consider all needs and interests of the District. Carried,

- 9. That we express our appreciation of Brother Sharp's unselfish services in the interest of the Church Work and Camp Meeting by a rising vote of thanks
- 10. That we express our appreciation to Brother McCarty for his faithfulness as District Superintendent of the Nebraska District the past year, by a rising vote of thanks,
- 11. That by a rising vote of thanks we express our gratitude to Brother Cox for his unselfish services in our behalf at this Assembly.
- 12. That by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to the Camp Meeting Committee and those working under their supervision for the enter-

tainment of the Camp Meeting and Assembly,

- 13. That this District have a probation for its members on whom deposed and its length of duration to be six months.
- 14. That the Ministers who are behind with their tithe pay up at once so we can pay our District Superintendent.



COLORADO

District Superintendent's Report



A great year of my life has just gone into history; new experiences and battles have come our way, but we have found the blessed Holy Ghost present in every time of need.

Have held revivals in the following places:

Oshkosh, Nebr. Center, Colo. Sheridan Lake, Colo. Haigler, "Lamar, "Alamosa, "Colorado Springs, Colo. Wiley, "Sugar City, "

In the last two places we organized Churches. The Sugar City Church bought themselves a nice little hall in a good location. The Wiley Church is doing fine.

The Lord helped me to preach 201 times. There were 119 saved and about 50 sanctified. I travelled 25,000 miles by auto and 5,000 on the train. Visited each Church twice, and can say God has given most of our Churches good revivals this past year.

The Church at Pueblo has built an addition to their church building which they needed so badly. The Campo Church built a small parsonage. The Plainview Church is getting ready to build a new church in the new town of Walsh, on a lot the Santa Fe R. R. Co. donated to them for that purpose.

Have held about forty business meetings with the Churches; secured forty subscribers for the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate; prayed in a good number of homes; read 27 books, 6654 pages; took 18 members into the Church. Received on my salary \$1100.00 and \$150.00 in love offerings. My tithe and offerings amounted to \$200.00.

The District bought a new tent this year and it is being used in the Home Missionary department. Our District now has three tents and they will be busy this summer.

Our workers and preachers are pulling together fine and the entire District is expecting a greater year, and more to be accomplished for the coming year if Jesus tarries.

For all that has been done, we bow our heads and say that God did it.

NEBRASKA District Superintendent's Report



To the Annual Assembly of the Combined Colorado-Nebraska Districts of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convening at Colorado Springs, Colo.

GREETINGS:---

We have very much felt our inefficiency and our unworthiness for the work you have entrusted to us the last ten months, although we feel we can conscientiously say we have done our best and that the last year has been the best year of our lives.

Our helping to carry the pastorial work at Madrid, Nebr., has deterred us much and we have not been able to give ourselves wholly to the superintendent's work as we had wished to do.

We have had two Ministerial Conventions, visited all the Churches twice, and some several times, endeavoring to hold three services at each visit. We have travelled in line of duty 10,145 miles, preached 108 times, held 16 church prayer meetings and 12 cottage prayer meetings, visited 151 homes, prayed with 15 for their healing. We have assisted in four revivals in the Pilgrim Holiness Church and one revival elsewhere. Professions of regeneration 10, sanctification 11, outside of revivals we have assisted in, they having been reported elsewhere. Funerals 2; subscriptions to the "Advocate" 5. Expenses \$239.26. Received for support above our expenses \$396.14. Gifts and donations \$9.00. Gave in tithes and offerings \$89.22. We tithe into the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and subscribe to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate.

Opportunity has presented itself favorably for the organizing of two more Churches. One of these places has an attendanc of over 50 and have rented a hall and furnished it with piano and seats. A Mission has been opened in Omaha this year. The Wyoming Church has been built. The Lewellen folk have built a new parsonage; the Spring Valley folk moved to town and have purchased a fine hall there in Wauneta. The Oshkosh folk were given a \$500.00 lot in Oshkosh and they have started to erect a church building. The Cozad folk succeeded in moving a church building from the country to a fine site in Cozad, and the Eustis Church has been dedicted free from debt. To God be all the glory!

We feel the union of the two Districts will prove a success and we are more than willing to turn the leadership of the work over to more competent and experienced hands and we are willing to take the least place anywhere in the combined District, or any place God sees fit to place us.




