#### **REPORT OF FORMER DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT**

To the Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in session in Colorado Springs, Colorado, June 29, 1942-Greetings in Jesus' dear name:

I trust that much grace and glory has been yours through the Camp Meeting, and that you are entering this Conference with much of His presence. I trust that He will help in all deliberations and planning for another year of victory in this Holy War.

I submit the following report of my work on the District for three quarters:

I traveled 15,000 miles in the interest of the District, and 2000 miles doing Home Missionary work. On August 24, we organized the First Pilgrim Holiness Church of Denver with twenty-seven charter members. Also, a mission was organized in Fueblo, with prospects of a regular organized church later. Most every church has shown some gain, with

most of the pastors receiving a raise in support. With this report, I close six years of service on the District, and I can say it has been a pleasure to serve the Lord and the Church in the caracity I have. I regret the t I was not able to do more, and yet I praise God for what has been accomplished. There were seven churches organ-ized, and seven re-organized, five of which are still going and two of these are discontinued. There were eight church buildings either built or purchased, and eight parsonages. Most of the churches are out of debt; none have a very heavy debt, considering their constituencies. I trust each church that has any indebtedness at all will strive to clear it before the crash comes. No doubt when this report is read, we will be laboring in South America. We will appreciate your prayers. I trust that the same fellowship and cooperation that the District has been that the same fellowsnip and cooperation states blessed with the past six years will continue. We humbly submit the following report which includes our work in revivals, foreign missionary deputational work, personal report, and three morths' work on the District:

We have held three revivals in the Pilgrim Holiness Church and two elsewhere, preached 204 times, held 138 Missionary services and 25 an-nual business meetings. We have traveled a total of 38,745 miles, had 332 seekers at our altar, dedicated one baby and annointed 25 persons for healing. In our Missionary deputational work, we raised in cash and pledges, \$7,491.47. At the annual church business meeting rounds, we found the churches encouraged to press forward and do more for God and souls than ever before. A good spirit prevails over the District and we are expecting great things from the hand of our God the coming year.

The Examining Committee recommended that C. A. Tatum and Charles Chappell be granted second and third year licenses respectively. Moved, seconded, and carried that they be granted.

Our District Superintendent, W. F. Drown, read his report. It was cheerfully accepted.

Our District Suprintendent appointed Paul C. Nering to fill the vacancy on the Ways and Means Committee.

The Statistical Committee Report was read and gratefully accepted.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

The Treasurer read his report. It was accepted.

Partial reports of the Educational and Examining Committees were read and accepted.

Our District Superintendent appointed C. C. Coleman and Paul C. Hires as a Reception Committee.

It was moved, seconded, and carried that we proceed with the election of officers after the reading of reports in the afternoon sitting.

#### AFTERNOON SITTING

The Ways and Means Committee brought the following: It is recommended that the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$1100 per year, together with two and one-half cents per mile traveling expenses and his house rent.

It was moved and seconded that we adopt same. Carried.

The report of our former District Superintendent was read and cheerfully accepted.

Our District Superintendent, Rev. W. F. Drown, made a motion that we cable the following message to Bro. Elkins: "Great Camp. Re-port received. Praying for you."

Tellers were appointed and the Conference proceeded with the elec-tion of officers. The following were elected as members of the District Council: W. F. Drown, District Superintendent; D. W. Lacy, Assistant District Superintendent; Marion Hill, District Secretary; Charles Lus-combe, District Treasurer; F. L. Freed; J. A. P. Porter; Asa Wood.

Charles Luscombe was re-elected as a member of the Educational Committee.

J. A. P. Porter was elected to serve on the Examining Committee.

P. W. Thomas and Charles Luscombe were re-elected as members of the Bible School Board.

The District Superintendent appointed the following standing committees: Resolutions—Asa Wood, Clifford Maxwell, Harrison A. Downing; Ways and Means—C. C. Coleman, Paul C. Nering, Max Greene; Statistical—Marion Hill, L. E. Schendel; Auditing—Ruth Stapleton, R. D. Perry.

Several members spoke on the need of an advance in Sunday School work. Our Assistant District Superintendent, D. W. Lacy, gave the benediction.

#### EVENING SITTING

T. E. Aslin led the Conference in singing "The Solid Rock." F. L. Freed and C. C. Coleman prayed.

The roll was called and the minutes of the previous sittings were read.

The General Superintendent gave an account of the changes made by the General Conference.

The final report of the Examining Committee was read and accepted.

Russell Campbell was accepted as an ordained minister, Mrs. Mossie Campbell as a third year licentiate, Laurence Gifford as a second year licentiate, and Miss Amy Reiff was granted a deaconess license.

Donald Bogert was recommended for a first year license. It was moved, seconded, and carried that it be granted.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. and Mrs. C. J. Myers to the Conference, and they were welcomed by the Conference with a hearty "Amen."

The following Ways and Means recommendation was read:

"Be It Resolved, That each church pay fifteen cents per member per year for General Conference expense." It was moved and seconded that we adopt same. Carried.

The following Ways and Means recommendation also carried: "It is recommended that the district parsonage be supplied with a telephone, the same to be paid for by the District."

The pastors and other delegates promised to try to secure one hundred fifty subscriptions to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate during the coming year.

The Resolutions Committee brought in the following:

"Resolved, That all members pay their tithe and District budget into the church in which they retain their membership, according to Section 67 of the Manual."

The motion was made and seconded that the District Courcil take action on all unfinished business.

W. F. Drown led in a special season of prayer.

Special resolutions were read commending our General Superintendent, District Superintendent, District Secretary, and District Treasurer for services rendered during this Conference.

Our District Superintendent appointed an ordination committee on which General Superintendent W. L. Surbrook, District Superintnence W. F. Drown, Marion Hill, Charles Luscombe, F. L. Freed, and J. A. P. Porter served, and the following candidates for ordination were called forward: Mrs. Vada G. Henry, Mrs. H. A. Downing, Mrs. Sadie Howell, Ernest Howell, John F. Wilson.

A beautiful ordination service was held, at which time appropriate portions of Scripture were read by members of the District Council serving on the ordination committee. A very practical message was preached by Brother Surbrook, and the charge was given by him to the above mentioned candidates.

The Conference closed with prayer by the General Superintendent, W. L. Surbrook.

#### STANDING RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. That all District monies be paid monthly through the local treasury.

2. That the District Superinterdent be given a salary of \$1,100 per year, together with his house rent and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  cents per mile for traveling expenses.

3. That an offering be taken by our District Superintendent on each official visit to each respective church, the same to be applied on the District Budget.

4. That pastors and evangelists of this District, when working in the District, pay their tithe into the District Treasury.

5. That each local church furnish their parsonage with at least a cookstove, a heater, a kitchen cabinet, six chairs, a dining room table, and a dresser.

6. We recommend that each Sunday School take 5% of the regular Sunday offering to be sent to the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Tent Fund.

7. We recommend that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be \$25 and \$40, respectively.

8. With reference to our District support of Foreign Missions, we hereby recommend that we wholeheartedly support the General Board's program of prayer and preaching on missions, and will pledge ourselves to hold the weekly prayer service and the monthly missionary rally. In connection with this, we recommend that our pastors be responsible for reising their proportionate amount of the missionary offering each month by a freewill offering taken at the time of the monthly missionary rally.

9. We recommend that we set our District Budget at 60 cents per member for Home Missions and \$2 per member plus the pastor's tithe for District Administrative expense, also \$1.10 per member for General Administrative fund and General Home Missions to be divided in accordance with the Manual, Page 84, Section 12, and that Foreign Missions be raised under its own head and the minimum be in accordance with the Manual (\$1.90 per member).

10. It is recommended that a registration fee of \$2 be charged at the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp Meeting for all those registering who are twelve years of age and above, except active ministers and their families.

11. We recommend that each local church pay the expenses of its delegation to and from the District Conference.

12. That each church pay their pastors their offerings or salary during Camp and Conference.

13. In accordance with Section 52, Peragraph 8, and Section 65, where it is recommended that every pastor put his entire time in the work of the ministry, be it resolved, that each church be required to pay its pastor a minimum of \$8 a week cash, and a systematic pounding at least one Curcher morning each month, and that the District Super-intendent be responsible in seeing that this is carried out.

14. We recommend that the pastors see that all monies be correctly specified before being sent in to the District Treasurer.

15. That the local church pay to the District Treasurer one per cert of all regular offerings to be put aside by the District as a loan fund to be loaned to the local churches at the discretion of the District Counc'l.

16. That each church pay 15 cents per member per year for General Conference expense.

17. That the District parsonage be supplied with a telephone, the same to be paid for by the District.

#### STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. We recommend that the Ways and Means, Resolutions, and Statistical Committees be appointed by the District Superintendent at the Conference for the following year. Be it further resolved that any material may be presented to said committees during the year.

2. That the pastors verify the reports of their respective churches before sending them to the District Conference.

3. That all buildings, such as churches, personages, or extensive improvements, be approved by the District Superintendent before construction.

4. That no church of our District shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of foreign missions or other church institutions without first consulting our District Superintendent.

5. That money shall be paid from district treasury as directed by the District Superintendent.

6. In this day of worldliness and compromise, let all our pastors, evangelists, and laymen, take a more definite stand against anklets. rolled hose, short sleeves, permanents, short dresses, sport shirts, and similar apparel; also, that our members leave off the wearing of jewelry. including the wedding ring.

7. That the Conference year close on May 31 and that all the reports be in the hands of the District Secretary by June 10, and that all District monies be sent in to the District Treasurer by the same date.

8. That we go on record as opposed to being required to violate the religious convictions and standards of the church in physical education classes in the public schools.

9. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, be it resolved that each pastor be privileged to hold two

revival meetings of two weeks' duration each year with regular support paid, subject to the approval of the District Superintendent.

10. Be it resolved that the Conference decide the number of District Minutes to be printed annually.

11. Be it resolved that we have a District Ministerial and Young People's Convention during Thanksgiving week.

12. That the District Treasurer give an itemized account to the District Conference of where all the Home Missionary money was spent.

13. That all members pay their tithes and district budgets into the church in which they retain their memberships, according to Section 67 in the Manual.

1. We, the members of the Twenty-first Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District, resolve that there be given our General Superintendent. Rev. W. L. Surbrook, a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of his labors of love.

2. We, the members of the Twenty-first Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountair District, resolve that there be given our District Superintendent, Rev. W. F. Drown, our Secretary, and our Treasurer a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of their faithfulness to us.
