THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

To the 22nd conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in session at Colorado Springs, Colorado, June 28, 1943—Greetings in the name of our Blessed Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ:

We submit the following report of our labors for the past year. There have been many unforeseen problems and emergencies to meet, due to the chaotic condition of the whole world at this time. Heartache and sorrow is on every hand but through it all our God has proven Himself a present help in every time of need, for which we praise Him.

We have not gone forward by leaps and bounds, nor have we seen all accomplished that we wanted to see done; but the Lord has blessed the efforts of our faithful workers and some advancement has been accomplished. The churches have been blessed with gracious revivals, practically all of them having two revivals at least.

The Home Missionary Department has been working faithfully the past year. Three new churches have been brought in. Among them, the work at Ogallala, that had suffered such severe blows, has been re-organized. McCook has been organized with splendid prospects for the future. Pueblo has been organized and has a splendid church building purchased. The future of that work looks good. Then, we have a new place opened at Tecumseh, Nebraska, which we hope to bring in soon.

The Colorado Springs Soldiers' Mission has been marvelously owned of God in reaching service men. This work, which had its beginning only nine months ago, has made an outstanding record in bringing the Gospel to men from Camp Carson and Peterson Field. Several score have sought God at the Mission altar and among them many have found Him precious to their souls. Spiritual and aggressive street services have been held in connection with the Mission work, bringing the Gospel to thousands. Distribution of Gospel literature and Testaments and visits to the Camp Carson Base Hospital have brought contacts with other hundreds. Reverend G. M. Pratt and wife, assisted by Reverend T. E. Aslin, have been in charge of this work.

The District has been blessed financially. The following churches have paid off their entire indebtedness: Colorado Springs, Imperial, Oshkosh, Sutherland, Madrid, and Benkelman. There has been considerable remodeling and redecorating. Imperial has built on three Sunday School rooms with basement under the new addition. Stratton built a bath room on the parsonage. Oshkosh bought pews for the church, also an extra lot for garden. Sutherland, Madrid, Stratton, Walsh and Bladen have redecorated their churches. Practically all of the churches have done some improving. The Denver church has been sealed on the inside, and a walk in front. We were able to get the Grand Junction congregation moved into a new location in a church building. We were allowed to use this property for two years in return for a new roof and a paint job. Rocky Ford has refinanced their property, saving them considerable money.

We have preached 204 times, had 200 seekers, have visited all of the churches (but one) three times, have held forty board meetings, and twenty-five annual meetings, and have attended the General Board meeting in Indianapolis. We have traveled 33,700 miles in our work for the Lord. We have written about 1,000 letters in connection with the work.

The prospects look good for the future, calls are coming in for Pilgrim Holiness Churches, a wonderful spirit prevails among the brethren and we see no reason why we should not go forward as a District under God.

It was moved and seconded that the hours for gathering be as follows: 8:30 to 11:30 A. M.; 1:00 to 4:30 P. M.; 6:30 to 9:00 P. M. Carried.

Rev. C. C. Coleman and Rev. T. E. Aslin were appointed to serve as the Reception Committee.

Our District Superintendent, W. F. Drown, read his annual report. He reported a year of blessed victories won as well as hard battles fought. His report was accepted.

The report of the Statistical Committee was read and accepted.

Rev. R. D. Perry, District Treasurer, read his report and that of his predecessor, Rev. Charles Luscombe. The reports were accepted.

Letters were read to the Conference from Revs. Carl and Eva Dauel and Rev. and Mrs. W. A. Elkins. Brother and Sister Dauel, veterans of the Cross, reported blessed victories in the Lord's battles, though hampered somewhat by ill health. Brother and Sister Elkins, our missionaries in British Guiana, South America, gave an interesting report of their labors in the Neglected Continent, which was both humorous and pathetic as it described varied experiences among these people so long without the Gospel. The Secretary was instructed by the Conference to send Greetings to each of them.

Rev. Guy M. Pratt, Superintendent of the Colorado Springs Soldiers' Mission, read a report of his work.

The Ways and Means Committee reported. They recommended that we raise the salary of our District Superintendent to \$1,500 a year and the allowance for traveling expenses to 3 cents a mile. Carried. It was also recommended that the salaries of our Secretary and Treasurer be raised to \$35 and \$50, respectively. These recommendations carried.

AFTERNOON SITTING

The Conference joined in singing "A Fountain Filled With Blood."

Rev. W. L. Surbrook, General Superintendent, read Psalm 50 for a Scripture lesson.

Rev. Frank L. Freed led in prayer.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. R. W. Wolfe, Secretary of Home Missions, and Rev. Roy Nible, evangelist of the Kansas District.

Rev. Richard Felsburg was received from the Kansas District.

The Ways and Means Committee brought in the following: "We recommend that all pastors be responsible in seeing that each resident family in his church get a copy of District Minutes, to be paid for out of the local church treasury." Its adoption was moved and seconded. Carried.

Ways and Means Committee Recommendation Number 9 was moved, seconded, and carried.

The report of the Educational and Examining Committees was read and accepted.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried that we adopt the following: "In the event that the District provide a library for those taking the Course of Study, the Educational Committee shall draft rules governing the lending of such books, same to be presented to the District Council for approval."

The Conference proceeded with the election of officers after the appointment of tellers by the District Superintendent. Homer Sherwood, Max Greene, L. E. Schendel, Frank L. Freed, and Ray Gilbert acted as tellers.

EVENING SITTING

Our District Superintendent led the Conference in singing "Amazing Grace."

L. E. Schendel led in prayer.

The minutes of the previous sittings were read and approved.

The Resolutions Committee brought in the following report: We recommend the following resolutions:

1. That Standing Resolution No. 6 be deleted. (This is due to the fact that the Manual now covers same.)

2. That Standing Resolution No. 8 be changed to read, "That we go on record as being opposed to our children having to dress, dance, or do other things in the physical educational department of the public schools in violation of our religious convictions and our church standards."

3. That the District secure and maintain all the books in the different courses of study as prescribed by the Manual in sufficient number to accommodate if necessary any candidate taking any one of the courses. That the Educational Committee formulate rules for the loaning of such books, determine the number to be secured and select the custodian, subject to the approval of the District Council.

4. That the Special Resolutions be changed to read:

1. We, the members of the Twenty-second Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District, resolve that there be given our General Superintendent, Rev. W. L. Surbrook, a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of his labors of love.

2. We, the members of the Twenty-second Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District, resolve that there be given our District Superintendent, Rev. W. F. Drown; our Secretary, Rev. Marion Hill; and our Treasurers, Revs. Charles Luscombe and R. D. Perry, a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of their faithfulness to us.

The foregoing recommendations were accepted.

The final report of the Educational and Examining Committee was read and accepted.

Asa Wood, Mrs. Helen K. Shreffler, C. A. Wilson, Max Greene and District Superintendent W. F. Drown were appointed on the Sunday School Board for the District.

It was moved and seconded that we make an assessment of 10 cents per member in our Sunday Schools to defray the expenses of the Sunday School Board. Carried.

A motion was made that we grant our District Superintendent, Rev. W. F. Drown, a two weeks' vacation with pay. It was seconded and carried with heartfelt response from all.

District Superintendent W. F. Drown appointed an Ordination Committee. The charge was given by General Superintendent, W. L. Surbrook, to Mrs. Mossie Campbell, H. J. McBride and Max Greene.

It was moved and seconded that the District Council be empowered to approve the Minutes of this sitting and transact such unfinished business as may be left by the Conference. Carried.

Brother Surbrook dismissed the Conference in prayer.

STANDING RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. That all District monies be paid monthly through the local treasury.

2. That the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$1,500.00 per year, together with his house rent and 3 cents per mile traveling expenses.

3. That an offering be taken by our District Superintendent on each official visit to each respective church, the same to be applied on the District Budget.

4. That pastors and evangelists of this District, when working in the District, pay their tithe into the District Treasury.

5. That each local church furnish their parsonage with at least a cookstove, a heater, a kitchen cabinet, six chairs, a dining room table, and a dresser.

6. We recommend that each Sunday School take 5 per cent of their regular Sunday offering to be sent to the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Tent Fund.

7. We recommend that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be \$35 and \$50, respectively.

8. With reference to our District support of Foreign Missions, we hereby recommend that we wholeheartedly support the General Board's program of prayer and preaching on missions, and will pledge ourselves to hold the weekly prayer service and the monthly missionary rally. In connection with this, we recommend that our pastors be responsible for raising their proportionate amount of the missionary offering each month by a freewill offering taken at the time of the monthly missionary rally.

9. We recommend that we set our District Budget at 75 cents per member for Home Missions and three dollars per member plus the pastor's tithe for District Administrative expense, also \$1.10 per member for General Administrative fund and General Home Missions to be divided in accordance with the Manual, Page 84, Section 12, and that Foreign Missions be raised under its own head and the minimum be in accordance with the Manual (\$1.90 per member).

10. It is recommended that a registration fee of \$2 be charged at the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp Meeting for all those registering who

are twelve years of age and above, except active ministers and their families.

1. We recommend that each local church pay the expenses of its delegates to and from the District Conference.

12. That each church pay their pastors their offerings or salary during Camp and Conference.

13. We recommend that all pastors see that all monies be correctly specified before being sent in to the District Treasurer.

14. That the local church pay to the District Treasurer one per cent of all regular offerings, to be put aside by the District as a loan fund to be loaned to the local churches at the discretion of the District Council.

15. That each church pay 15 cents per member per year for General Conference expense.

1. We recommend that the Ways and Means, Resolutions, and Statistical Committees be appointed by the District Superintendent at the Conference for the following year. Be it further resolved that any material may be presented to said committees during the year.

2. That the pastors verify the reports of their respective churches before sending them to the District Conference.

3. That all buildings, such as churches, parsonages, or extensive improvements, be approved by the District Superintendent before construction.

4. That no church of our District shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of foreign missions or other church institutions without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. That money shall be paid from District Treasury as directed by the District Superintendent.

6. That the Conference year close on May 31 and that all the reports be in the hands of the District Secretary by June 10, and that all District monies be sent in to the District Treasurer by the same date.

7. That we go on record as being opposed to our children having to dress, dance or do other things in the physical education department of the public schools in violation of our religious convictions and our church standards.

8. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, be it resolved that each pastor be privileged to hold two revival meetings of two weeks' duration each year with regular support paid, subject to the approval of the District superintendent.

9. Be it resolved that the Conference decide the number of District Minutes to be printed annually.

10. Be it resolved that we have a District Ministerial and Young People's Convention during Thanksgiving week.

1. That the District Treasurer give an itemized account to the District Conference of where all the Home Missionary money was spent.

12. That all members pay their tithes and district budgets into the church in which they retain their memberships, according to Section 67 in the Manual.

13. That the District secure and maintain all the books in the different courses of study as prescribed by the Manual in sufficient number to accommodate, if necessary, any candidate taking any one of the courses. That the Educational Committee formulate rules for the loaning of such books, determine the number to be secured, and select the custodian, subject to the approval of the District Council.

Marion Hill, and our Treasurers, Revs. Charles Luscombe and R. D. Perry, a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of their faithfulness to us.
