STANDING RULES

1. We recommend that the Ways and Means, Resolutions, and Statistical Committees be appointed by the District Superintendent at the Conference for the following year. Be it further resolved that any material may be presented to said committees during the year.

2. That the pastors verify the reports of their respective churches before sending them to the District Conference.

3. That all buildings, such as churches, parsonages, or extensive improvements, be approved by the District Superintendent before construction.

4. That no church of our District shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of foreign missions or other church institutions without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. That money shall be paid from District Treasury as directed by the District Superintendent.

6. That the Conference year close on May 31 and that all the reports be in the hands of the District Secretary by June 10, and that all District monies be sent in to the District Treasurer by the same date.

7. That we go on record as being opposed to our children having to dress, dance or do other things in the physical education department of the public schools in violation of our religious convictions and our church standards.

8. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, be it resolved that each pastor be privileged to hold two revival meetings of two weeks duration each year with regular support paid, subject to the approval of the District Superintendent.

9. Be it resolved that the Conference decide the number of District Minutes to be printed annually.

10. Be it resolved that we have a District Ministerial and Young People's Convention during Thanksgiving week.

11. That the District Treasurer give an itemized account to the District Conference of where all the Home Missionary money was spent.

12. That all members pay their tithes and district budgets into the church in which they retain their memberships, according to Section 67 in the Manual.

13. That the District secure and maintain all the books in the different courses of study as prescribed by the Manual in sufficient number to accommodate, if necessary, any candidate taking any one of the courses. That the Educational Committee formulate rules for the loaning of such books, determine the number to be secured, and select the custodian, subject to the approval of the District Council.

14. That the conference bar shall include the first five rows of seats in the center and south sections and the platform.

15. That the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees and fill all vacancies.

16. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

17. Be it resolved that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

18. Whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the Word of God, the girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing the immodest forms of dress so current today; such as sun suits, shorts, anklets and no stockings, dresses of immodest lengths, slacks, or similar garments. Men and boys of the church should not appear in public in shorts or without shirts. And further, parents are strongly urged to dress their children in accordance with this standard. (Manual, page 49, section 65)

STANDING RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. That all District monies be paid monthly through the local treasury.
2. That the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$1,800 per year, together with his house rent and 4 cents per mile traveling expenses.
3. That an offering be taken by our District Superintendent on each official visit to each respective church, the same to be applied on the District Budget.
4. That pastors and evangelists of this District, when working in the District, pay their tithe into the District Treasury.
5. That each local church furnish their parsonage with at least a cookstove, a heater, a kitchen cabinet, six chairs, a dining room table, and a dresser.
6. We recommend that each Sunday School take 5 per cent of their regular Sunday offering to be sent to the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Tent Fund.
7. We recommend that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be \$90 and \$150, respectively.
8. With reference to our District support of Foreign Missions, we hereby recommend that we wholeheartedly support the General Board's program of prayer and preaching on missions, and will pledge ourselves to hold the weekly prayer service and the monthly missionary rally. In connection with this, we recommend that our pastors be responsible for raising their proportionate amount of the missionary offering each month by a free-will offering taken at the time of the monthly missionary rally.
9. We recommend that we set our District Budget at 50 cents per member for Home Missions and \$4.00 per member plus the pastor's tithe for District Administrative expense, also an amount equal to 3% of all regular offerings for Bible School, also \$1.10 per member for General Administrative fund and General Home Missions to be divided in accordance with the Manual, Page 84, Section 12, and that Foreign Missions be raised under its own head and the minimum be in accordance with the Manual (\$1.90 per member).
10. It is recommended that a registration fee of \$2.00 be charged at the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp Meeting for all those registering who are twelve years of age and above, except active ministers and their families.
11. We recommend that each local church pay the expenses of its delegates to and from the District Conference.
12. That each church pay their pastors their offerings or salary during Camp and Conference.
13. We recommend that all pastors see that all monies be correctly specified before being sent in to the District Treasurer.
14. That the local church pay to the District Treasurer one per cent of all regular offerings, to be put aside by the district as a loan fund to be loaned to the local churches at the discretion of the District Council.
15. That each church pay 25 cents per member per year for General Conference expense.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. We, the members of the Twenty-fourth Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District, resolve that there be given our General Superintendent, Rev. W. L. Surbrook, a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of his labors of love.

2. We, the members of the Twenty-fourth Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District, resolve that there be given our District Superintendent, Rev. W. F. Drown; our Secretary, Rev. L. E. Schendel, and our Treasurer, Rev. F. L. Freed, a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of their faithfulness to us.

3. We, the Sunday School Committee, recommend that each local church endeavor to promote a teacher training course during the coming year.

4. We, the Sunday School Committee, recommend that there be at least one special children's day program held during the year and that the morning preaching hour be used for this purpose.

5. Whereas there is considerable work clearing the camp ground and storing the equipment, Be it therefore resolved that each Pastor be requested to remain one day after Conference to assist the District Superintendent in doing this work, unless excused by Superintendent.

MEMORIALS TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY

1. We recommend that paragraph 9, section 60 of the manual be revised to read as follows:

It shall be the duty of the local churchboard to nominate one or more candidates for Sunday School Superintendent and church treasurer prior to the annual church meeting.

2. We recommend that paragraph 13, section 133 of the manual be revised to read as follows:

All newly organized churches on established districts shall be assessed but one-fourth of the general budget quota for the fiscal year following their organization, one-half for the following year, and three-fourths the third year. From then on they shall assume their full quota.

3. Whereas we, the Educational Committee, feel there is a need for special training, Be it resolved that there be included in the ministers course of study, a course in church administration, and a course in bookkeeping.

4. Whereas there are those who feel that a 14-year-old child is not mature enough to be eligible for voting, Therefore, be it resolved, that the age voting limit, section 39, page 36, be changed from voting age 14 to age 16.

TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL DISTRICT CONFERENCE

MORNING SITTING

The Twenty-fourth annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church was called to order by District Superintendent W. F. Drown, at 9:00 A. M. Monday, June 25, 1945.

The opening song service was in charge of Rev. L. L. Miller.

The Conference was led in prayer by Bros. D. R. Close and Paul C. Hires.

The chair was then turned over to General Superintendent W. L. Surbrook, who spoke to us from I Tim. 4:12-16. His message was spiritual and instructive.

The Conference roll was called by the District Secretary.

The bar was fixed according to the standing rule.

The hours of meeting were fixed as follows: 9:00-11:45 A. M.; 1:00-5:00 P. M.; 6:30-9:00 P. M.

The District Superintendent appointed T. E. Aslin to fill a vacancy on the Resolutions committee.

The Resolutions committee was appointed to act as the committee on memorials to General Conference.

Bros. W. A. Elkins and L. L. Miller were appointed on the Reception Committee.

The District Superintendent gave his report which was accepted with hearty Amens! He reported spiritual victory on the district, and that the Lord is helping us get out of debt.

The Statistical report was read and accepted.

The Reception committee presented Bro. and Sr. C. J. Meyers to the Conference.

Two new churches from Lodgepole, Nebr., and Dove Creek, Colo., were presented to the Conference by the District Superintendent. The churches and their delegates were accepted into the conference with gratitude to God.

The Reception committee presented Bro. J. J. Cork from Kansas District, and Bro. Guy of the church of the Nazarene.

The following were received into the Conference: C. J. Meyers, Marion Poff, J. C. Shreffler, Helen K. Shreffler and Ralph Armstrong as ordained ministers; Milton Harrington as a licensed minister, and Mrs. C. J. Meyers as an ordained deaconess.

The Ways and Means committee made a partial report: Recommendation No. 1 accepted. (See standing recommendation No. 2). Recommendation No. 2 accepted. (See standing recommendation No. 7).

Motion made and seconded that the Conference recess to 1:00 P. M.

AFTERNOON SITTING

Bro. Miller led the Conference in singing the old hymn "He Whispers His Love to Me."

Bro. F. L. Freed led in prayer.

General Superintendent W. L. Surbrook read the "Love Chapter" (I Cor. 13) from Moffett's translation. The Conference carried away a new sense of the import of Divine Love.

Ways and Means recommendation No. 3 was referred to the committee for redrafting.

The reception committee presented Sr. Goertzen, of the Mennonite Church, a returned missionary from Africa, Bro. and Sr. Close and Bro. Lucas from Oklahoma and Bro. Hooter from Louisiana.

Bro. Roy Nible was received into the district as an ordained minister from the Kansas District.

Partial report given by the Resolutions committee:

Be it resolved that Special Rules section 65, page 49 of the Manual be incorporated in our district minutes. Reason for so doing, only a few families have the manual, while every church family receives the minutes. (See standing rule 18).

The report of the auditing committee was read and received.

The report of the District Treasurer was read and received.

A partial report of the committee on memorials to General Conference was read.

Memorial No. 1 adopted.

Memorial No. 2 adopted.

It was moved, seconded and carried we have election of officers.

The District Superintendent appointed the following tellers: Bros. Greene, Campbell, Moller, Webster, Chas. Wilcox, Harrington and Howell.

C. J. Meyers was elected to the Examining Board for a term of 3 years.

D. W. Lacy was elected to the Educational Board for a term of 3 years.

Flora Morris was elected to fill a vacancy on the Educational Board for a 2-year term.

Motion made, seconded and carried that the Council nominate six lay delegates to General Conference.

Motion to adjourn to 6:30. Carried.

EVENING SITTING

The evening sitting opened with General Superintendent W. L. Surbrook in the chair. Bro. Aslin had charge of the song service and Bro. Greene led in prayer.

The ministerial delegates to General Conference were elected as follows: D. W. Lacy, H. A. Downing, C. C. Coleman, C. J. Meyers, Clifford Maxwell and T. E. Aslin. The alternates were in order as follows: Max Greene, E. L. Reiff, R. R. Sharp, A. F. Poff. Lay delegates were elected as follows: Ralph Garrison and Mrs. C. J. Meyers. Alternates in order as follows: Ralph Sanders, Carrie Anderson, J. W. Jenkins, Christa Corman.

Bro. Campbell read the report of the S. S. Committee. Report received.

Motion made, seconded and carried to adopt Memorial No. 3 to General Conference.

Motion to accept Memorial No. 4 to General Conference. Carried.

Bro. D. E. Snow reported to us on the purposed Pilgrim Mutual Benevolent fund.

Moved and seconded that we as a conference go on record as favoring the purposed Pilgrim Benevolent Fund as purposed by the General Committee. Carried.

Resolution from S. S. Committee. Resolution No. 1 accepted. (See Special Resolution No. 3). Resolution No. 2 accepted. (See Special Resolution No. 4).

Report of Resolutions Committee. Resolution No. 3. Carried. (See Special Resolution No. 5).

Moved, seconded and carried that Council be authorized to make investigation concerning the amount of money needed to send delegation to General Conference, and report same to churches.

Motion to extend time until 10:00 P. M.

Superintendent Drown appointed committees for the coming year.

Joint report of the Educational and Examining Boards read and received.

Council presented the name of Ruth B. Miller, Laurence Gifford and Murl E. Henry for ordination. Granted.

Motion to grant our pastors two weeks vacation with pay, to be included in Standing Rules. (Standing rule No. 17).

Partial report of Stationing Committee read and approved.

Letters of greeting were received with gratitude from Bro. and Sr. Asa Wood, and Bro. and Sr. Carl Dael.

Motion made, seconded and carried that the Conference send a letter of sympathy to Sr. R. R. Sharp on account of the death of her mother.

Motion made and seconded that a committee be appointed to look into the possibility of erecting a Camp-meeting Dormitory for preachers. Carried.

Motion made and seconded the Council read the Conference minutes. Carried.

Moved, seconded and carried the council take care of any business overlooked by the Conference.

Resolutions Committee reported. Special Resolution No. 1. Carried. Special Resolution No. 2. Carried.

District S. S. Board ratified by Conference. Moved, seconded and carried that Memorial No. 4 be accepted.

Bro. Surbrook conducted the ordination service in which three candidates were ordained to the ministry.

The Conference was dismissed with prayer by General Superintendent W. L. Surbrook.

THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

To the 24th Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Rocky Mountain District in session in Colorado Springs, Colorado, June 25, 1945—Greetings in the Precious name of Jesus.

The past year came and has gone with its burdens, trials and tests. This has been the busiest year of our life, having left the district but once during the year. The District has not made the gain we would liked to have seen, but we are very grateful to God for what has been accomplished. Practically all of the churches have had two revival efforts which were owned of the Lord.

There are three convention zones on the District now. These conventions meet once each month. The services are a real blessing. They are evangelistic, and numbers pray through to definite victory. It helps to keep the revival fires burning. The Conventions also carry a great burden for Home Missionary work.

The Home Missionary department has gone through some hard battles, but God vindicated the efforts with some last minute results. An effort was made at Las Animas, but seemingly resulted in effort only. Another effort was made in a new part of Denver. It closed down also. Not willing to be defeated the effort was turned to another location. Here we are working on an entirely new plan. This is a community of new homes. Not a place could be found to call folk together. We are in the process of building a new church building. This is to be erected from Cinder block. Bro. and Sr. Schreffler have this place on their hearts. It is in the community where they have their home.

We have two new churches to present to this Conference, with delegates to be seated. They are located at Lodgepole, Nebr., and Dove Creek, Colorado. Plans are being made for other places to be opened up this summer.

We have preached 147 times, had 152 seekers at our altar. Have made 110 visits to the churches, forty-two quarterly meetings, 30 Board meetings, 11 communion services, 6 Missionary meetings, two Young Peoples meetings, dedicated 9 babies, had 26 Annual meetings, and traveled 29,255 miles.

We have sent out 1,115 pieces of mail during the year.

The pastors have a wonderful spirit of unity and fellowship among them.

Battles, yes, plenty of them, but through and out of them comes victory. Praise the Lord.

The District has been blessed financially this past year. Debts have been paid. The Sutherland church has purchased a much needed parsonage. Colorado Springs redecorated the church, and did considerable work on the parsonage. Lewellen has put a new roof on half of the church. Ogalalla ceiled the church, put in a new oak floor, new lights and pulpit furniture. After many years of being loaded down with debt Lamar has burned the mortgage on the church.

From all appearances the coming of Jesus is near. We need to pray and labor as we never have before to see the lost brought to Him. The District has as fine a group of preachers that could be found anywhere, and with the splendid spirit that prevails we believe the work will go forward this coming year.
