STANDING RULES

1. We recommend that the Ways and Means, Resolutions, and Statistical Committees be appointed by the District Superintendent at the Conference for the following year. Be it further resolved that any material may be presented to said committees during the year.

2. That the pastors verify the reports of their respective churches before sending them to the District Conference.

3. That all buildings, such as churches, parsonages, or extensive improvements, be approved by the District Superintendent before construction.

4. That no church of our District shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of foreign missions or other church institutions without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. That money shall be paid from District Treasury as directed by the District Superintendent.

6. That the Conference year close on May 31 and that all the reports be in the hands of the District Secretary by June 10, and that all District monies be sent in to the District Treasurer by the same date.

7. That we go on record as being opposed to our children having to dress, dance or do other things in the physical education department of the public schools in violation of our religious convictions and our church standards.

8. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, be it resolved that each pastor be privileged to hold two revival meetings of two weeks duration each year with regular support paid, subject to the approval of the District Superintendent.

9. Be it resolved that the Conference decide the number of District Minutes to be printed annually.

10. Be it resolved that we have a District Ministerial and Young People's Convention during Thanksgiving week.

11. That the District Treasurer given an itemized account to the District Conference of where all the Home Missionary money was spent.

12. That all members pay their tithes and district budgets into the church in which they retain their memberships, according to Section 67 in the Manual.

13. That the District secure and maintain all the books in the different courses of study as prescribed by the Manual in sufficient number to accommodate, if necessary, any candidate taking any one of the courses. That the Educational Committee formulate rules for the loaning of such books, determine the number to be secured, and select the custodian, subject to the approval of the District Council.

14. That the conference bar shall include the first five rows of seats in the center and south sections and the platform.

15. That the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees and fill all vacancies.

16. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

17. Be it resolved that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

18. Whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the Word of God, the girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing the immodest forms of dress so current today; such as sun suits, shorts, anklets and no stockings, dresses of immodest lengths, slacks, or similar garments. Men and boys of the church should not appear in public in shorts or without shirts. And further, parents are strongly urged to dress their children in accordance with this standard. (Manual, page 49, section 65.)

STANDING RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. That all District monies be paid monthly through the local treasury.

2. That the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$2,000 per year, together with his house rent and 5 cents per mile traveling expenses.

3. That an offering be taken by our District Superintendent on each official visit to each respective church, the same to be applied on the District Budget.

4. That pastors and evangelists of this District, when working in the District, pay their tithe into the District Treasury.

5. That each local church furnish their parsonage with at least a cookstove, a heater, a kitchen cabinet, six chairs, a dining room table, and a dresser.

6. We recommend that each Sunday School take 5 percent of their regular Sunday offering to be sent to the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Tent Fund.

7. We recommend that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be \$100 and \$180, respectively.

8. With reference to our District support of Foreign Missions, we hereby recommend that we wholeheartedly support the General Board's program of prayer and preaching on missions, and will pledge ourselves to hold the weekly prayer service and the monthly missionary rally. In connection with this, we recommend that our pastors be responsible for raising their proportionate amount of the missionary offering each month by a free-will offering taken at the time of the monthly missionary rally.

9. We recommend that we set our District Budget at 50 cents per member for Home Missions and \$4.00 per member plus the pastor's tithe for District Administrative expense, also an amount equal to 3% of all regular offerings for Bible School, also \$1.10 per member for General Administrative fund and General Home Missions to be divided in accordance with the Manual, Page 84, Section 12, and that Foreign Missions be raised under its own head and the minimum be in accordance with the Manual (\$1.90 per member).

10. It is recommended that a registration fee of \$2.00 be charged at the Pike's Peak Holiness Camp Meeting for all those registering who are twelve years of age and above, except active ministers and their families.

11. We recommend that each local church pay the expenses of its delegates to and from the District Conference.

12. That each church pay their pastors their offerings or salary during Camp and Conference.

13. We recommend that all treasurers see that all monies be correctly specified before being sent in to the District Treasurer.

14. That the local church pay to the District Treasurer one per cent of all regular offerings, to be put aside by the district as a loan fund to be loaned to the local churches at the discretion of the District Council.

15. That each church pay 25 cents per member per year for General Conference expense

16. We recommend each Sunday School pay 10c per member per year for the promotion of District Sunday School work.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Resolved that no one be advanced in ministerial standing unless actively engaged in the work of the Kingdom.

2. Whereas there is a definite shortage of dishes in the Camp equipment, we recommend that the Camp registration fee for the next two years be used to buy dining room and kitchen equipment.

3. Be it resolved that a District Home Missions worker be appointed by the District Council, the same to be amenable to the District Council, under the direction of the District Superintendent.

4. Whereas there is a great need for united action against the liquor traffic; Be it resolved that we, the Rocky Mountain District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, unite with the Inter-Church Temperance Movement of Colorado.

SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

1. Be it resolved that semi-annual zone Sunday School conventions be held for the purpose of encouraging the work of the Sunday school, such conventions to be arranged for and supervised by the chairman of the District Sunday School board if possible, or by some other member of the District Sunday School board.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. We, the members of the Twenty-fifth Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District, resolve that there be given Rev. A. H. Wilson, our presiding officer, a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of his labors of love.

2. We, the members of the Twenty-fifth Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District, resolve that there be given our District Superintendent, Rev. W. F. Drown; our Secretary, Rev. L. E. Schendel, and our Treasurer, Rev. F. L. Freed, a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of their faithfulness to us.

3. Whereas there is considerable work clearing the Camp ground and storing equipment, Be it resolved that each member of the Conference remain one day after Conference to assist the District Superintendent in doing this work

THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

To the twenty-fifth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Rocky Mountain District, in session at Colorado Springs, Colorado, July 1st, 1946. Greetings in the name of Him who bought us with His own precious blood

Through many dangers, toils and snares we have already come, 'tis Grace that's brought us safe thus far, and Grace will lead us home.

I think perhaps this has been the busiest year of our lives, but also a year of Victory. We feel we have had the help of the Lord in our work. All of the churches but one have had two revivals, and some of them three, with numbers bowing at the altar of prayer. We have made a small gain in membership. The Sunday School work of the District has been given special attention, with a gain in that department. The finances have not been better in years, and many of the churches have liquidated their debts entirely, until the debt of the entire District is around six thousand dollars. We have had the privilege of taking part in several mortgage burning services.

The Home Missionary Department has had a building program this year, as no buildings could be found to worship in. The building started a year ago in Denver has been finished as much as possible with the material we could get. A revival was held just prior to camp, which resulted in a new local church. It will be brought in at this conference, and will seat a delegate. A new building at Dove Creek will be ready for a revival the twenty-first of July. Lodgepole has a nice parsonage practically finished, also a basement church, and will put the building on this fall, the Lord willing.

We have entered a new field in New Mexico. A group there have deeded the District four hundred and eighty acres of land at Gavalin, with several good buildings on it. We have finances to go into Albuquerque this summer.

We have made ninety-eight visits to the churches, held forty-nine quarterly meetings, thirty-nine board meetings, and twenty-eight annual meetings. We have preached one hundred and sixty-five times, held ten missionary services. Three hundred and thirty-one seekers have bowed at our altar. We have traveled a distance of 40,520 miles.

The prospects for the coming year are good for the District. By the help of the Lord and the united efforts of the workers we believe the district will go forward.
