STANDING RULES

1. We recommend that the Ways and Means, Resolutions, and Statistical Committees be appointed by the District Superintendent at the Conference for the following year. Be it further resolved that any material may be presented to said committees during the year.
2. That the pastors verify the reports of their respective churches before sending them to the District Conference.
3. That all buildings, such as churches, parsonages, or extensive improvements, be approved by the District Superintendent before construction.
4. That no church of our District shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of foreign missions or other church institutions without first consulting the District Superintendent.
5. That the Conference year close on May 31 and that all the reports be in the hands of the District Secretary by June 10, and that all District monies be sent in to the District Treasurer by the same date.
6. That we go on record as being opposed to our children having to dress, dance or do other things in the physical education department of the public schools in violation of our religious convictions and our church standards.
7. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, be it resolved that each pastor be privileged to hold two revival meetings of two weeks duration each year with regular support paid, subject to the approval of the District Superintendent.
8. Be it resolved that the Conference decide the number of District Minutes to be printed annually.
9. Be it resolved that we have a Foreign Missionary Convention during Thanksgiving week.
10. That the District Treasurer give an itemized account to the District Conference of where all the Home Missionary money was spent.
11. That all members pay their tithes and district budgets into the church in which they retain their memberships, according to Section 68 in the Manual.
12. That the District secure and maintain all the books in the different courses of study as prescribed by the Manual in sufficient number to accommodate, if necessary, any candidate taking any one of the courses. That the Educational Committee formulate rules for the loaning of such books, determine the number to be secured, and select the custodian, subject to the approval of the District Council.
13. That the conference bar shall include the first five rows of seats in the center and south sections and the platform.
14. That the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees and fill all vacancies.
15. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.
16. Be it resolved that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.
17. Whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the Word of God, the girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing the immodest forms of dress so current today; such as sun suits, shorts, anklets and no stockings, dresses of immodest lengths, slacks, or similar garments. Men and boys of the church should not appear in public in shorts or without shirts. And further, parents are strongly urged to dress their children in accordance with this standard. (Manual, page, 49, section 65)

STANDING RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. That all District monies be paid monthly through the local treasury.
2. That the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$2,000 per year, with District parsonage furnished, together with 5c per mile for traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise.
3. That an offering be taken on each official visit of the District Superintendent, the same to be applied on the District Budget.
4. Be it resolved that the pastors and evangelists pay all their ministerial tithe when working on the District into the District treasury, and evangelists pay three-fourths of their tithe to the District Treasurer when working off the District.
5. That each local church furnish their parsonage with at least a cookstove, a heater, a kitchen cabinet, six chairs, a dining room table, and a dresser.
6. We recommend that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be \$100 and \$200, respectively. Be it further resolved that the District Statistician and the District Sunday School Statistician (Sec.) each be given \$15 per year from their respective departments.
7. With reference to our District support of Foreign Missions, we hereby recommend that we wholeheartedly support the General Board's program of prayer and preaching on missions, and will pledge ourselves to hold the weekly prayer service and the monthly missionary rally. In connection with this, we recommend that our pastors be responsible for raising their proportionate amount of the missionary offering each month by a free-will offering taken at the time of the monthly missionary rally.
8. We recommend that we set our District Budget at .50c per member for Home Missions, and \$3.50 plus pastors tithe for District administrative expense, also an amount equal to 3% of all regular offerings for Bible School, and 25 cents per member for General Conference expense. Also \$1.00 for General Administrative and \$1.00 for General Home Missions and \$2.00 for Foreign Missions. (General Budget as recommended by the General board)
9. It is recommended that a registration fee of \$2.00 be charged at the Pike's Peak Holiness Camp Meeting for all those registering who are twelve years of age and above, except active ministers and their families.
10. We recommend that each local church pay the expenses of its delegates to and from the District Conference.
11. That each church pay their pastors their offerings or salary during Camp and Conference.
12. We recommend that all treasurers see that all monies be correctly specified before being sent in to the District Treasurer.
13. That the local church pay to the District Treasurer one per cent of all regular offerings, to be put aside by the District as a loan fund to be loaned to the local churches at the discretion of the District Council.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Resolved that no one be advanced in ministerial standing unless actively engaged in the work of the Kingdom.

2. Whereas there is a definite shortage of dishes in the Camp equipment, we recommend that the Camp registration fee for the next two years (1947-48) be used to buy dining room and kitchen equipment.

3. Whereas there is a great need for united action against the liquor traffic; Be it resolved that we, the Rocky Mountain District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, work with the Inter-Church Temperance Movement of Colorado.

4. Be it resolved that we the Rocky Mountain District interpret Sec. 30, Para. 13 of our Manual, prohibiting the wearing of gold, to include the wedding ring.

5. Be it resolved that each pastor report all seekers in the church of which he has the oversight.

6. Be it resolved that the Educational Committee shall each have oversight of one year of the ministerial correspondence course as provided by the Manual. Be it further resolved that there shall be a fourth member added to the Committee. Also that the first name appearing in the minutes shall have oversight of first year, the second name over second year, etc., throughout the four year course.

7. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent urge every church to bring in liberal monthly poundings for the pastor.

8. Be it resolved that with each camp meeting registration ticket issued to individuals 12 yrs. and over, each holder shall agree to give at least 5 hrs. of work to the Camp.

PENSION PLAN

Report of Resolutions Committee

Whereas the 1946 General Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church adopted a pension plan to aid retired and disabled ministers, and whereas each District Conference is asked to contribute the equivalent of four percent of the pastor's salary, evangelist's offerings, etc. to said pension fund, therefore be it resolved that we the Rocky Mountain District Conference fully co-operate with the General Board of Pensions in this matter.

THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

To the twenty-sixth annual conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Rocky Mountain District, in session at Colorado Springs, Colorado, June 30, 1947. Greetings in the name of Him who bought us with His own precious blood.

It seems that each successive year has this in common with the preceeding year, that it seems to have been the busiest year of my life, but it also has this in common with the year past, "Through many dangers, toils and snares I have already come, 'tis grace hath brought me safe thus far, and grace will lead me home." Certainly the Lord has helped us in our abundant labours for Him,

The work of the District in general has been very satisfactory in the past year. The churches have had a real revival spirit and expended much time, prayer and finances in revival meetings, which have not proved a disappointment, but been fruitful in many souls bowing at our altars of prayer and a goodly number uniting with the church. The overall increase in membership has been very satisfactory. The report of the District Sunday School statistician shows a fine average attendance increase over last year, for which we are grateful. The financial condition of the local churches is very gratifying. The gross receipts of the churches are perhaps the largest of any year of our history, and all departments of the work have shared alike in the increase. In proportion to the total value of our property, our indebtedness is very small. For all of this we thank our Heavenly Father.

The Home Missionary program has made a favourable show. The church at Omaha has been transferred to our District. Then a new church at Albuquerque, N. M. has been established and received into the District at this Conference. We thank God for our faithful home missionary workers. Our home missionary outlook is promising. We already have one portable tabernacle built, free of debt, which we hope to use in Colorado this year, and trust another can be built to use in the Nebraska part of our District this year.

Our personal report is as follows: We have preached 183 times, with 205 seekers at our altar; have dedicated 4 babies, and baptized 4 adults. Have held 6 missionary services, taught Sunday School class 23 times, and had 12 other services. We have made 98 visits to local churches, held 39 board meetings, 33 quarterly meetings, 29 annual church meetings, and 15 communion services. Have dedicated 1 church, and had 1 funeral. Our total miles traveled in the interests of the church is 29,597.

We trust that the coming year, by God's help, will measure up to the prospects and responsibilities that lie ahead.
