STANDING RULES

1. We recommend that the Ways and Means, Resolutions and Statistical Committees be appointed by the District Superintendent at the conference for the following year. Be it further resolved that any material may be presented to said committees during the year.

2. That the pastors verify the reports of their respective churches before sending them to the District Conference.

3. That all buildings, such as churches, parsonages, or extensive improvements, be approved by the District Superintendent before construction.

4. That no church of our District shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of foreign missions or other church institutions without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. That the Conference year close on May 31 and that all the reports be in the hands of the District Secretary by June 10, and that all District monies be sent in to the District Treasurer by the same date.

6. That we go on record as being opposed to our children having to dress, dance or do other things in the physical education department of the public schools in violation of our religious convictions and our church standards.

7. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, be it resolved that each pastor be privileged to hold

two revival meetings of two weeks duration each year with regular support paid, subject to the approval of the District Superintendent.

8. Be it resolved that the Conference decide the number of District Minutes to be printed annually.

9. Be it resolved that we have a Foreign Missionary Convention during Thanksgiving week.

10. That the District Treasurer give an itemized account to the District Conference of where all the Home Missionary money was spent.

11. That all members pay their tithes and district budgets into the church in which they retain they memberships, according to Section 68 in the Manual.

12. That the District secure and maintain all the books in the different courses of study as prescribed by the Manual in sufficient number to accomodate, if necessary, any candidate taking any one of the courses. That the Educational Committee formulate rules for the loaning of such books, determine the number to be secured, and select the custodian, subject to the approval of the District Council.

13. That the conference bar shall include the first six rows of seats in the center and south sections and the platform.

14. That the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees and fill all vacancies.

15. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

16. Be it resolved that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

17. Whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the Word of God, the girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing the immodest forms of dress so current today; such as sun suits, shorts, anklets and no stockings, dresses of immodest lengths, slacks, or similar garments. Men and boys of the church should not appear in public in shorts or without shirts. And further, parents are strongly urged to dress their children in accordance with th's standard. (Manual, page 49, section 65.)

18. Resolved that no one be advanced in ministerial standing unless actively engaged in the work of the Kingdom.

19. Be it resolved that we, the Rocky Mountain District, interpret Sec. 30, Para. 13 of our Manual, prohibiting the wearing of gold, to include the wedding ring.

20. Be it resolved that each pastor report all seekers in the church of which he has the oversight.

21. Be it resolved that with each camp meeting registration ticket issued to individuals 12 years and over, each holder shall agree to give at least 5 hours of work to the Camp.

22. Be it resolved that semi-annual zone Sunday School conventions be held for the purpose of encouraging the work of the Sunday School, such conventions to be arranged for and supervised by the chairman of the District Sunday School board if possible, or by some other member of the District Sunday School board.

STANDING RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. That all District monies be paid monthly through the local treasury.

2. That the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$2,200 per year, with District parsonage furnished, together with 5c per mile for traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise.

3. That an offering be taken on each official visit of the District Superintendent, the same to be applied on the District budget.

4. Be it resolved that the pastors and evangelists pay all their ministerial tithe when working on the District into the District treasury, and evangelists pay three-fourths of their tithe to the District Treasurer when working off the District.

5. That each local church furnish their parsonage with at least a cookstove, a heater, a kitchen cabinet, six chairs, a dining room table, and a dresser.

6. We recommend that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be \$100 and \$200, respectively. Be it further resolved that the District Statistician and the District Sunday School Statistician (Sec.) each be given \$15 per year from their respective departments.

7. With reference to our District support of Foreign Missions, we hereby recommend that we wholeheartedly support the General Board's program of prayer and preaching on missions, and will pledge ourselves to hold the weekly prayer service and the monthly missionary rally. In connection with this, we recommend that our pastors be responsible for raising their proportionate amount of the missionary offering each month by a free-will offering taken at the time of the monthly missionary rally.

8. We recommend that we set our District budget at \$1.00 per member for Home Missions, and \$3.00 plus pastor's tithe for District administrative expense, also an amount equal to 3% of all regular offerings for Bible school, and 25 cents per member for General Conference expense. Also \$1.00 for General Administrative and \$1.00 for General Home Missions and \$2.00 for Foreign Missions. (General budget as recommended by the General Board.)

9. It is recommended that a registration fee of \$2.00 be charged at the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp Meeting for all those registering who are twelve years of age and above, except active ministers and their families.

10. We recommend that the local church pay the expenses of its delegates to and from the District Conference.

11. That each church pay their pastor's their offerings or salary during Camp and Conference.

12. We recommend that all treasurers see that all monies be correctly specified before being sent in to the District Treasurer.

13. We recommend each Sunday School pay 10c per member per year for the promotion of District Sunday School work.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Be it resolved that no person serve on more than one committee where there are other capable persons available to serve.

2. We recommend that the Conference appoint a committee for the

promotion of Missionary Societies in the Rocky Mountain District, and that a report be given at the Thanksgiving Missionary convention.

3. Be it resolved that the District Council employ a District Home Missions worker who shall labor under direction of the District Superintendent. The salary to be set by the District Council.

4. Be it resolved that this conference send flowers and a note of encouragement to Howard Greene.

5. Inasmuch as our conference blackboard is in dilapidated condition, be it resolved that a new board be built before next conference.

THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

To the twenty-seventh annual conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Rocky Mountain District, in session at Colorado Springs, Colorado, June 28, 1948.

Greetings in Jesus name. We are indeed grateful to God for His love, care and blessing the past year. As in every preceding year it has been a very busy one. The Camp meeting just closed was one of the most outstanding camps in many respects we have had for years. It was marked with the freedom of the Spirit in our midst, and the preaching was of the very best. Some very definite work at the altar was accomplished. There was never a time that the finances came with more freedom. The departments of the church were represented, and an offering taken.

We have not made the progress that we would liked to have seen made, but the Lord has helped for which we are thankful. Gracious revivals have been held in all of the churches. The Sunday School work is still growing. Many of the churches have been able to improve their properties. Debts have been paid. The Grand Junction church has sold their parsonage and are building a church on their lots by the college.

A new church was organized at Knob Hill in Colorado Springs the first day of October. The basement and foundation is ready for the building of a church building. They will be taken in at this time and seat a delegate in the conference.

Our personal report for the year is as follows: We have preached 216 times, had 311 seekers at our altars, dedicated two churches and one parsonage, held five missionary services, made 123 visits to the churches, and 46 quarterly meetings. In our work for the Kingdom we have traveled 29,225 miles.

Our personal testimony is that there was never a time in our life when we loved the Lord more and our desire is to be used in His vineyard in the salvation of Souls. The future looks bright as we look forward to it, and by God's Grace we expect to be faithful.
