#### STANDING RULES

1. We recommend that the Ways and Means, Resolutions and Statistical Committees be appointed by the District Superintendent at the conference for the following year. Be it further resolved that any material may be presented to said committees during the year.

2. That the pastors verify the reports of their respective churches before sending them to the District Conference.

3. That all buildings such as churches, parsonages, or extensive improvements, be

approved by the District Superintendent before construction.

4. That no church of our District shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of foreign missions or other church institutions without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. That the Conference year close on May 31 and that all the reports be in the hands of the District Secretary by June 10, and that all District monies be sent in to the District Treasurer by the same date.

6. That we go on record as being opposed to our children having to dress, dance or do other things in the physical education department of the public schools in violation of our religious convictions and our church standards.

7. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, be it resolved that each pastor be privileged to hold two revival meetings of two weeks duration each year with regular support paid, subject to the approval of the District Superintendent.

8. Be it resolved that the Conference decide the number of District Minutes to be printed annually.

9. Be it resolved that we have a Foreign Missionary Convention during Thanksgiving week.

10. That the District Treasurer give an itemized account to the District Conference of where all the Home Missionary money was spent.

11. That all members pay their tithes and district budgets into the church in which they retain their memberships, according to Section 68 in the Manual.

12. That the District secure and maintain all the books in the different courses of study as prescribed by the Manual in sufficient number to accomodate, if necessary, any candidate taking any one of the courses. That the Educational Committee formulate rules for the loaning of such books, determine the number to be secured, and select the custodian, subject to the approval of the District Council.

13. That the conference bar shall include the first six rows of the seats in the center and south sections and the platform.

14. Be it resolved that the time for conference sittings be fixed as follows: 9:00-11:45 A.M., 1:45-5:00 P.M. and 6:30-9:00 P.M.

15. That the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees and fill all vacancies.

16. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

17. Be it resolved that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

18. Whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the Word of God, the girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing the immodest forms of dress so current today; such as sun suits, shorts, anklets and no stockings, dresses of immodest lengths, slacks, or similar garments. Men and boys of the church should not appear in public in shorts or without shirts. And further, parents are strongly urged to dress their children in accordance with this standard. (Manual, page 49, section 65)

19. Resolved that no one be advanced in ministerial standing unlsss actively engaged in the work of the Kingdom.

20. Be it resolved that we, the Rocky Mountain District, interpret Sec. 30, Para. 13 of our Manual, prohibiting the wearing of gold, to include the wedding ring.

21. Be it resolved that each pastor report all seekers in the church of which he has the oversight.

22. Be it resolved that semi-annual zone Sunday school conventions be held for the purpose of encouraging the work of the Sunday school, such conventions to be arranged for, and supervised by the chairman of the District Sunday School head if possible,

or by some other member of the District Sunday School board.

23. Whereas there is considerable work clearing the Camp ground and storing equipment, Be it resolved that each member of the Conference remain one day after Conference to assist the District Superintendent in doing this work.

#### STANDING RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. That all District monies be paid monthly through the local treasury.

2. That the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$2,200 per year, with District parsonage furnished, together with 5c per mile for traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise.

3. That an offering be taken on each official visit of the District Superintendent, the same to be applied on the District budget.

4. Be it resolved that District pastors and evangelists pay three-fourths (34) of their ministerial tithe into the District treasury to be applied on district administrative expense, and the remainder to be paid into the treasury of the local church to which they belong.

5. That each local church furnish their parsonage with at least a cookstove, a heater, a kitchen cabinet, six chairs, a dining room table, and a dresser.

6. We recommend that the annual renumeration of the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be \$100 and \$200, respectively. Be it further resolved that the District Statisticians and the District Sunday School Secretary each be given \$15 per year from their respective departments.

7. With reference to our District support of Foreign Missions, we hereby recommend that we wholeheartedly support the General Board's program of prayer and preaching on missions, and will pledge ourselves to hold the weekly prayer service and the monthly missionary rally. In connection with this, we recommend that our pastors be responsible for raising their proportionate amount of the missionary offering each month by a free-will offering taken at the time of the monthly missionary rally.

8. We recommend that we set our District budget at \$1.00 per member for Home Missions, and \$3,00 plus  $\frac{3}{4}$  minister's tithe for District administrative expense, and 25 cents per member for General Conference expense. Also \$1.00 for General Administrative and 1.00 for General Home Missions and \$2.00 for Foreign Missions. (General budget as recommended by the General Board.)

9. We recommend that all attending the Pikes Peak Holiness camp meeting be properly registered. Each registrant twelve years of age and above. Except active ministers and their families, will be required to pay a fee of \$2.00. Furthermore, all registering will be expected to work at least 30 minutes per day when called upon.

10. We recommend that the local church pay the expenses of its delegates to and from the District Conference.

11. That each church pay their pastor's offerings or salary during Camp and Conference.

12. We recommend that all treasurers see that all monies be correctly specified before being sent in to the District Treasurer.

13. We recommend each Sunday school pay 10c per enrolled Sunday school member per year for the promotion of District Sunday school work.

#### **BIBLE SCHOOL RESOLUTION**

Whereas the General Board and the Board of the Bible Training School have voted that each district place its zone school in the District budget, and

Whereas a uniform plan for regular financial support is desirable, be it therefore Resolved that we adopt the following plan: That each church raise a minimum equivalent to a penny per day for each assessable member. Said funds to be raised menthly in accordance with the method preferred by each church and forwarded to the District Treasurer so as to give the school a regular monthly income throughout the year.

#### GENERAL CONFERENCE RESOLUTION

We recommend that each church that is behind in meeting their General Conference expense the past three years be asked to bring this up to date as soon as possible, and paid hato District treusnay.

#### PENSION PLAN

Resolved that the following table be used for raising the churches quota of the pension plan. Be it further resolved that said quota be raised through the avenue of the Sunday school, to be paid monthly to the District Treasurer.

Moved and seconded the order of the day be election of officers at 2:00 P.M. Carried-Recess to 1:45 P.M.

The afternoon sitting was opened by being led in song by Brother Sharp. Brother Gilbert led in prayer.

Motion made and seconded to dispense with the roll. Carried.
