#### STANDING RULES

1. We recommend that the Ways and Means, Resolutions and Statistical Committees be appointed by the District Superintendent at the conference for the following year. Be it further resolved that any material may be presented to said committees during the year.

2. That the pastors verify the reports of their respective churches before sending them to the District Conference.

3. That all buildings such as churches, parsonages, or extensive in provements, be approved by the District Superintendent before construction.

4. That no church of our District shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of foreign missions or other church institutions without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. That the Conference year close on May 31 and that all the reports be in the hands of the District Secretary by June 10, and that all District monies be sent in to the District Treasurer by the same date.

6. That we go on record as being opposed to our children having to dress, dance or do other things in the physical education department of the public schools in violation of our religious convictions and our church standards.

7. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, be it resolved that each pastor be privileged to hold two revival meetings of two weeks duration each year with regular support paid, subject to the approval of the District Superintendent.

8. Be it resolved that we have a Foreign Missionary Convention in the fall, time to be set by the District Council.

9. That the District Treasurer give an itemized account to the Districe Conference of where all the Home Missionary money was spent.

10. That all members pay their tithes and District budgets into the church in which they retain their memberships, according to Section 68 in the Manual.

11. That the District secure and maintain all the books in the different courses of study as prescribed by the Manual in sufficient number to accommodate, if necessary, any candidate taking any one of the courses. That the Educational Committee formulate rules for the loaning of such books, determine the number to be secured, and select the custodian, subject to the approval of the District Council.

12. That the conference bar shall include the first seven rows of seats in the center and south sections and the platform.

13. Be it resolved that the time for Conference sittings be fixed as follows: 8:00-11:45 A. M., 1:45-5:00 P. M. and 6:30-9:00 P. M.

14. That the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees and fill all vacancies.

15. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

16. Be it resolved that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

17. Whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the Word of God, the girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing the immodest forms of dress so current today; such as sun suits, shorts, anklets and no stockings, dresses of immodest lengths, slacks, or similar garments. Men and boys of the church should not appear in public in shorts or without shirts. And further, parents are strongly urged to dress their children in accordance with this standard. (Manual, page 49, section 65.)

18. Resolved that no one be advanced in ministerial standing unless actively engaged in the work of the Kingdom.

19. Be it resolved that each pastor report all seekers in the church of which he has the oversight.

20. Be it resolved that semi-annual zone Sunday school conventions be held for the purpose of encouraging the work of the Sunday School, such conventions to be arranged for, and supervised by the chairman of the District Sunday School board if possible, or by some other member of the District Sunday School board.

21. Whereas there is considerable work clearing the Camp ground and storing equipment, Be it resolved that each member of the Conference remain one day after Conference to assist the District Superintendent in doing this work.

#### STANDING RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. That all District monies be paid monthly through the local treasury.

2. That the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$2,200 per year with district parsonage and utilities, together with 4 cents per mile for traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise.

3. That an offering be taken on each official visit of the District Superintendent, the same to be applied on the District budget.

4. Be it resolved that District pastors and evangelists pay  $(\frac{3}{4})$  of their ministerial tithe into the District treasury to be applied on district administrative expense, and the remainder to be paid into the treasury of the local church to which they belong.

5. That each local church furnish their parsonage with at least a cookstove, a heater, a kitchen cabinet, six chairs, a dining room table, and a dresser.

6. We recommend that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be \$100 and \$200, respectively. Be it further resolved that the District Statisticians and the District Sunday School Secretary each be given \$15 per year from their respective departments.

7. With reference to our District support of Foreign Missions, we hereby recommend that we wholeheartedly support the General Board's program of prayer and preaching on missions, and will pledge ourselves to hold the weekly prayer service and the monthly missionary rally. In connection with this, we recommend that our pastors be responsible for raising their proportionate amount of the missionary offering each month by a free-will offering taken at the time of the monthly missionary rally.

8. We recommend that we set our District budget at \$1.00 per member for Home Missions, and \$3.00 plus pastors tithe for District

administrative expense, and 25 cents per member for General conference expense. We further recommend the General budget as adopted by the General conference; General administrative \$1.00, General Home Missions \$1.00. General Home Missions loan fund .50. Foreign Missions \$2.00, General Sunday School work .25, General Senior College .75.

9. We-recommend that all attending the Pikes Peak Holiness camp meeting be properly registered. Each registrant twelve years of age and above, except ac ive ministers and their families, will be required to pay a fee of \$2.00. Furthermore, all registering will be expected to work at least 30 minutes per day when called upon.

10. We recommend that the local church pay the expenses of its delegates to and from the District Conference.

11. That each church pay their pastor's offerings or salary during Camp and Conference.

12. We recommend that all treasurers see that all monies be correctly specified before being sent in to the District Treasurer.

13. We recommend each Sunday School pay 10c per enrolled Sunday School member per year for the promotion of District Sunday School work.

#### BIBLE SCHOOL RESOLUTION

Whereas the General Board and the Board of the Bible Training School have voted that each district place its zone school in the district budget, and

Whereas a uniform plan for regular financial support is desirable, be it therefore resolved that we adopt the following plan: That each church raise a minimum equivalent to a penny per day for each assessable member. Said funds to be raised monthly in accordance with the method preferred by each church and forwarded to the District Treasurer so as to give the school a regular monthly income throughout the year.

#### PENSION PLAN

Resolved that the following table be used for raising the churches quota of the pension plan. Be it further resolved that said quota be raised through the avenue of the Sunday School, to be paid monthly to the District Treasurer.

#### TWENTY-NINTH ANNUAL DISTRICT CONFERENCE First Sitting—9:00 A. M.

The Twenty-ninth annual assembly of the Rocky Mountain Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness church was called to order by the District Superintendent, W. F. Drown, at 9:00 A. M., July 3, 1950.

Rev. Nels Ibsen led the Conference in singing, "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes."

Rev. D. W. Lacy, Assistant District Superintendent led in prayer. The sweet presence of the Spirit settled down in our midst as Bro. Lacy prayed.

District Superintendent W. F. Drown presented our General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, who took the chair for the remainder of the conference.

The General Superintendent addressed the conference from Scripture found in Matt. 17:14-21. He spoke on, "The call to prayer and campaign of evangelism." Our hearts were greatly stirred by this wonderful address.

Bro. Drown led us in singing, "Revive Us Again."

The Roll was called.

The following were received into the District: Revs. O. J. and Ina B. Spaugh, L. L. Waddell, Mark Waddell, and Mrs. John Whitthuhn.

The bar was fixed according to the standing rule.

The time of the sitting was fixed according to the standing rule.

The following were introduced to the conference and given an honorary seat within the conference bar. Rev. Messer of the Free Methodist church, Rev. C. C. McNall from Denver, Rev. and Mrs. B. F. Durham from the Kansas District.

District Superintendent W. F. Drown read his report. The same was received.

The report of the District Statistician was read and accepted.

A rising vote of thanks was given the Statistical Committee.

Motion made and seconded and carried to adjourn.

#### Second Sitting-1:45 P. M.

Rev. C. J. Meyers led the conference in singing, "The Way of the Cross Leads Home."

Rev. Clifford Maxwell led us in prayer.

Minutes of previous sitting were read and approved.

The reception committee presented Rev. Swanson to the conference. Rev. Swanson gave a few words of greetings from the Michigan District. He was given an honorary seat in the conference bar.

Moved, seconded and carried that Rev. Swanson carry greetings from this district conference to the Michigan District conference.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and approved.

The District Treasurer read his report. The report was received.

Partial report of the resolutions committee was read.

Resolution No. 1. Inasmuch as a Home Missionary church should be self-supporting after having been organized four years, therefore be it resolved, that no church receive financial aid from district home missionary funds after that period of time. Moved and seconded to adopt.

Motion to amend to read that churches receive aid after four years only at the recommendation of the district council.

Previous question was called for. Carried.

Amendment lost.

The main motion was voted upon and lost.

Resolution No. 2. Resolved that No. 14 of the Standing Rules read 8:00 A.M. Motion made, seconded and carried to adopt.

Motion made, seconded and carried to include seat row No. 7 in the conference bar.

Ways and Means committee report.

Ways and Means No. 1. We recommend that we set our District budget at \$1.00 per member for Home Missions, and \$3.00 plus pastors tithe for district administrative expense, and 25 cents per member for General Conference expense. Plus the General budget as adopted by the General Conference.

Moved and seconded to adopt Ways and Means No. 1.

Amendment to change the main motion to read 3/4 pastor's tithe. Amendment carried.

Main motion as amended adopted.

Page Eleven

Ways and Means No. 2. That the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$2,200 per year with district parsonage and utilities, together with 4 cents per mile for traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise.

Motion made, seconded and carried to adopt Ways and Means No. 2.

Bro. Sturk sang for the spiritual delight of all. "Take My Hand Precious Lord," and "I'll Not Have to Cross Jordan Alone."

Sister Lacy gave a stirring testimony, a number of others testified, and our hearts were greatly edified.

The conference sang and shook hands in adjournment.

#### Third Sitting-6:30 P. M.

The third sitting was opened by Roy Ellis leading the conference in singing "He Is So Precious to Me."

Bro. Elmer Crow led in prayer.

Verses of Scripture were given from the conference.

Minutes of previous sitting were read and approved.

Resolutions committee continue to report.

Resolutions No. 3. Resolved that standing rules Nos. 8 and 20 be deleted from the minutes. Motion made, seconded and carried to adopt.

Resolution No. 4. Resolved to have a Foreign Missionary Conference in the fall; time to be set by the District Council; to take place of Standing Rule No. 9.

Joint report of the Examining and Educational Boards was read and adopted. (See official directory)

Moved, seconded and carried to make the election of officers the order of the day.

The following were appointed as tellers: Max Greene at the board, R. R. Sharp, Harold Pearson, H. J. McBride, Roscoe Sanders, Winfred Brown, LeRoy Felsburg.

The conference kneeled in humility before our heavenly Father as our General Superintendent asked God's Divine guidance and blessing on the balloting.
