STANDING RULES

1. We recommend that the Ways and Means, Resolutions and Statistical Committees be appointed by the District Superintendent at the conference for the following year. Be it further resolved that any material may be presented to said committees during the year.

2. That the pastors verify the reports of their respective churches before sending them to the District Conference.

3. That all buildings such as churches, parsonages, or extensive improvements, be approved by the District Superintendent before construction.

4. That no church of our district shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of foreign missions or other church institutions without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. That the Conference year close on May 31 and that all the reports be in the hands of the District Secretary by June 10, and that all District monies be sent in to the District Treasurer by the same date.

6. That we go on record as being opposed to our children having to dress, dance or do other things in the physical education department of the public schools in violation of our religious convictions and our church standards.

7. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, be it resolved that each pastor be privileged to hold two revival meetings of two weeks

duration each year with regular support paid, subject to the approval of the District Superintendent.

8. Be it resolved that we have a Foreign Missionary Convention in the fall, time to be set by the District Council. (Resolution as passed by District Council, November 5, 1953; Resolved that the missionary convention be held at Colorado Springs, Colorado the first Tuesday of November, beginning at 2:30 o'clock P. M., and the Imperial, Nebraska missionary convention be held the Thursday night and Friday preceding the Colorado Springs date.)

9. That the District Treasurer give an itemized account to the District Conference of where all the Home Missionary money was spent.

10. That all members pay their tithes into the church in which they retain their memberships, according to Section 68 in the Manual.

11. That the District secure and maintain all the books in the different courses of study as prescribed by the Manual in sufficient number to accommodate, if necessary, any candidate taking any one of the courses. That the Educational Committee formulate rules for the loaning of such books, determine the number to be secured, and select the custodian, subject to the approval of the District Council.

12. That the conference bar shall include the first seven rows of seats in the center and south sections and the platform.

13. Be it resolved that the time for Conference sittings be fixed as follows: 8:00-11:45 a.m., 1:45-5:00 p.m. and 6:30-9:00 p.m.

14. That the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees and fill all vacancies.

15. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted a two weeks' vacation with pay.

16. Be it resolved that each pastor be granted a two weeks' vacation with pay.

17. Whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the Word of God, the girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing the immodest forms of dress so current today; such as sun suits, shorts, anklets and no stockings, dresses of immodest lengths, slacks, or similar garments. Men and boys of the church should not appear in public in shorts or without shirts. And further, parents are strongly urged to dress their children in accordance with this standard. (Manual, page 49, section 65.)

18. Be it resolved, that District Minister's license shall not be granted to any person who does not have a definite call to, or who does not plan to enter the active ministry.

Be it further resolved, That no licentiate be advanced in ministerial standing unless actively engaged in the ministry.

19. Be it resolved that each pastor report all seekers in the church of which he has the oversight.

20. Be it resolved that semi-annual zone Sunday School conventions be held for the purpose of encouraging the work of the Sunday School, such conventions to be arranged for, and supervised by the chairman of the District Sunday School Board if possible, or by some other member of the District Sunday School Board.

21. Whereas there is considerable work clearing the camp ground and storing equipment, Be it resolved that each member of the conference remain one day after conference to assist the District Superintendent in doing this work.

22. We recommend that our laity be given recognition along with our ministry in the list of memorials.

23. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, Be it resolved that our District Superintendent be privileged to hold two revival meetings during the year outside of the district with regular support.

24. Whereas in accordance with the Manual, Page 109, Section 149, Paragraph I, "All licensed ministers failing to complete and report on at least two subjects a year in their required course of study for two consecutive years, will automatically forfeit their licenses . . ." and

Whereas some of our licensed ministers have failed to comply with the above provisions, Be it therefore resolved that we ask each member of the Educational Board to be responsible for contacting each licentiate under his jurisdiction, urging him to follow

the prescribed course of study as outlined in the Manual, before the beginning of next conference.

Be it further resolved that we urge each licentiate to co-operate with the Educational Board in the above matter.

25. Whereas the Colorado Springs Bible College is now offering a Preacher's Seminar, and Whereas the work given in the Seminar is much more thorough and exhaustive than our regularly prescribed study course,

Be it resolved that our district give one-half year's credit to each licentiate for each such Seminar successfully completed.

Be it further resolved that our District Educational Board be authorized to determine which books of study course need not to be studied or read in lieu of the completion of the above Seminar work.

26. Resolved that each pastor let the District Secretary know how many copies of the Minutes his church will need.

27. Be it resolved that a printed statement be given each person registering at the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp showing the registration requirements.

Standing Recommendations of Ways and Means Committee

1. We recommend that the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$250. per month with district parsonage and utilities, together with six (6) cents per mile for traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise.

2. Be it resolved that if the District Superintendent prefers not to live in the district parsonage, the rent from same be turned to the district treasurer.

3. We recommend that the assistant District Superintendent, or any member of the Council acting in the District Superintendent's place receive \$5.00 per day, plus four (4) cents per mile traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise.

4. We recommend that district pastors and evangelists pay three-fourths of their ministerial tithe into the district treasury to be applied on district administrative expense and the remainder to be paid into the treasury of the local church to which they belong.

5. That each local church furnish its parsonage with at least a cook-stove, a heater, a kitchen cabinet, six chairs, a dining room table, and a dresser.

6. We recommend that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be \$100. and \$250., respectively. Be it further resolved that the District Statisticians and the District Sunday School Secretary each be given \$15. per year from their respective departments.

7. We recommend that all attending the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp Meeting be properly registered. Each registrant twelve years of age and above, except active ministers and their families, will be required to pay a fee of \$2.00. Furthermore, all registering will be expected to work at least 30 minutes per day when called upon.

8. We recommend that the local church pay the expenses of its delegates to and from the District Conference.

9. We recommend that each church pay their pastor's offerings or salary during Camp and Conference.

10. We recommend each Sunday school pay 10c per enrolled Sunday school member per year for the promotion of District Sunday School work.

11. We recommend that each church send to the District Treasurer each month an amount equivalent to ten per cent of all offerings taken for regular expense to cover the following items of our District and General Budgets, namely: General administration, General Church Extension, General Church Extension Loan Fund, Senior college, General Sunday School and Youth Work, General Conference expense, District Home Missions, and District administrations.

12. We recommend that the Foreign Missionary and Bible School budgets be raised separately and that the minimum amount be in accord with the General Church recommendation of \$2.10 per member for Foreign Missions, and one cent a day per member for Bible school to be raised in any way the local church may desire.

13. Be it resolved that the members of the District Sunday School and Young People's Boards be given five (5) cents per mile for traveling expense to be paid from the funds of their respective boards.

Pension Plan

Whereas the General Church has adopted and recommended the Pilgrim Pension Plan as a sound method of providing a retirement benefits for aged Pilgrim ministers, and Whereas the Rocky Mountain Conference has declared its endorsement of the plan, and Whereas action taken at the last General Conference makes it mandatory for each local church to participate in the plan, we therefore recommend that every church, no less often than once each quarter, send to the District Treasurer an amount equivalent to four per cent of the pastor's salary as the conference contribution to the Pension Plan.

THIRTY-THIRD ANNUAL DISTRICT CONFERENCE

First Sitting June 28, 1954, 8:10 a.m.

The Thirty-third Annual Assembly of the Rocky Mountain Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church was called to order by District Superintendent W. F. Drown at 8:10 a.m., June 28, 1954.

Rev. K. R. Sharp led the Conference in singing, "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes."

The District Superintendent W. F. Drown gave his report. The report was received with a hearty "Amen."

The Assistant District Superintendent gave a verbal report. The report was heartily received.

The Auditors' report was read and received.

The District Treasurer, Max Greene, gave a well prepared report. The report was heartily received.

The report of the Statistical Committee was read. The report was gratefully received.

Rev. R. E. Evans and Eugene Glendenning were presented to the Conference, and gave their testimonies. Moved, seconded and carried to give them an honorary seat in the bar.

It was moved, seconded and carried to receive the following into the District:

A. I. Wise—Ordained minister from the Kansas District.

David Shafer— from New Jersey District.

Ronald E. Evans—Ordained minister from Michigan District.

Chester Mueller—Licensed minister from Kansas District.

Charles Mayfield—Licensed minister from Southern Indiana District.

Clifford Conard—Ordained minister from Kansas District.

Eugene Glendenning—Received on first year license.

Hubert Jenewein—Received on first year license.

Lewis Guliford—Received on first year license.

The following were presented to the conference by the Reception Committee: Mrs. Eugene Glendenning, Rev. E. R. Snook, Rev. Clifford Conard. They were granted an honorary seat within the bar.

The joint report of the Educational and Examining Boards was read and accepted. (See Licensed Ministerial Directory)

The Committee on Ways and Means reported.

Recommendation No. 1—We recommend that the Assistant District Superintendent, or any member of the council acting in the District Superintendent's place receive \$5.00 per day, plus four (4) cents per mile traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise. Recommendation carried.

Recommendation No. 2—We recommend that the Foreign Missionary and Bible School budgets be raised separately and that the minimum amount be in accord with the General Church recommendation of \$2.10 per member for Foreign Missions, and one cent a day per member for Bible school to be raised in any way the local church may desire. Recommendation carried.

Recommendation No. 3—Whereas the General Church has adopted and recommended the Pilgrim Pension Plan as a sound method of providing a retirement benefits for aged Pilgrim ministers, and whereas the Rocky Mountain Conference has declared its endorsement of the plan, and whereas action taken at the last general conference makes it mandatory for each local church to participate in the plan, we therefore recommend that every church, no less often than once each quarter, send to the District Treasurer an amount equivalent to four per cent of the pastor's salary as the conference contribution to the pension plan. Recommendation carried.

Report of the Resolutions Committee.

Resolution No. 1—Standing recommendation of Resolutions Committee.

Be it resolved that if the District Superintendent prefers not to live in the District parsonage, the rent from same be turned to the District Treasurer.

The committee on Memoirs reported, and the report was received.

Moved, seconded and carried to recess to call of the Chair, and the order of the day be election of officers.

The Chair called the conference to order.

Sister Pratt, from New York District, was presented to the conference and gave her testimony. She was given an honorary seat within the bar.

Motion prevailed to have the District Superintendent appoint tellers. The following were appointed: Duane Knierim at the board, Hubert Hughes to read, and the following to pass out ballots: J. F. Garst, T. E. Aslin, R. L. Campbell, Chester Mueller.

The Chairman called the conference to prayer before the first ballot was cast. Brother Busby led us in prayer.

L. E. Schendel was elected District Superintendent. ✓

Recess to 1:45.

Rev. Wayne Plummer, of Goodland, Kansas, was presented to the conference and given an honorary seat within the conference bar.

Ballots were cast for Assistant District Superintendent. R. R. Sharp was elected.

Ballots were cast for District Secretary. Walter Cole was elected.

Ballots were cast for District Treasurer. Max Greene was elected.

Sister D. R. Close from Lawrenceville, Illinois, and R. E. Nible from Amarillo, Texas were introduced to the conference, and gave their testimony. They were granted an honorary seat in the conference bar.

Ballots were cast for additional members of the Council. The first ballot elected R. L. Gilbert. The second ballot elected W. J. Brown, and A. I. Wise, completing the Council.

Walter Cole was ratified as Education Board member for 4 years. .

Rev. T. E. Aslin was ratified for 3 years on the Examining Board.

The following were ratified as Bible College Board members from the Rocky Mountain District: Max Greene and A. I. Wise.

The following were ratified as members of the Sunday School Board:

Florence Stewart—Chairman

Duane Knierim—Secretary

D. E. Moller—Treasurer

It was moved, seconded and carried that this conference send greetings and assurance of our prayers to Rev. L. L. Waddell in his time of sickness.

Special resolutions were received with hearty Amens.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

June 28, 1954

To the Thirty-third Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, now in session at Colorado Springs, Colorado. Greetings in the precious name of Jesus.

Another year has closed and we have met to report the results of our labours and to lay plans for the new year. We have just closed a gracious camp, where our hearts have been stirred and our souls blessed. Our workers were faithful, and the Spirit set His seal upon the Word. Numbers found God for pardon, purity, or to be reclaimed. The departments of the church were represented and offerings were raised to help carry on the work in each respective field.

There have been no spectacular advances on the District, but we can say that the Lord has been with us. According to an advance report there has been a gain in membership of 8%. The Sunday School with a gain of 3% plus, for which we are thankful to God and give Him the praise. Gains are not made without work and labor.

We have not had a new home missionary project the past year, but have labored to get the Lincoln work off to a good start. We have purchased a property there, both church building and parsonage, at a cost of \$16,000. This property is in the heart of the city, not far from the State Capitol building.

Our people over the district are fighting a courageous battle. The country is being hit with an awful drouth. Crops have burned up. Prospects do not look too good from a financial standpoint, but still they press on. God bless them for their determination to occupy 'till Jesus comes.' Revivals have been held, properties have been taken care of.

My personal report is as follows. After conference last year we filled in at the Knob Hill church for five Sundays, also some at the Oshkosh church until their pastors arrived. We preached 154 times and saw 373 seekers bow at the altar. Held two revivals off the District, two short meetings on the District, also at the Bible College

convention. We attended two General Board meetings, a Superintendents meeting, General Conference, our District ministerial meeting and Western Zone Youth Camp. We have had 2 funerals, dedicated 3 babies, took 10 into the church. We held 15 annual church meetings, had 7 sacrament services and held 45 church board meetings. We have traveled 31,321 miles. We received \$3,000. salary with additional remuneration of approximately \$1,000.

We want to thank you one and all for your co-operation and help. The Council have been wonderful. Our Assistant, Brother Sharp, has helped in every way that he could. This closed eleven years as Superintendent of the District. We love it with all our heart, and as we go to other fields of labor we shall pray for God's best upon you. We covet your prayers that we shall still be used of the Lord somewhere in the great harvest field.
