## STANDING RULES

1. We recommend that the Ways and Means Resolution and Statistical Committees be appointed by the District Superintendent at the conference for the following year. Be it further resolved that any material may be presented to said committees during the year.

2. That the pastors verify the reports of their respective churches before sending them to the District Conference.

3. That all buldings such as churches, parsonages, or extensive improvements, be approved by the District Superintendent before construction.

4. That no church of our district shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of foreign missions or other church institutions without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. That the Conference year close on May 31 and that all the reports be in the hands of the District Secretary by June 10, and that all District monies be sent in to the District Treasurer by the same date.

6. That we go on record as being opposed to our children having to dress, dance or do other things in the physical education department of the public schools in violation of our religious convictions and our church standards.

7. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, be it resolved that each pastor be privileged to hold two revival meetings of two weeks duration each year with regular support paid, subject to the approval of the District Superintendent.

8. Be it resolved that we have a Foreign Missionary Convention in the fall, time to be set by the District Council.

9. That the District Treasurer give an itemized account to the District Conference of where all the Home Missionary money was spent.

10. That all members pay their tithes into the church in which they retain their memberships, according to Section 69 in the Manual.

11. That the District secure and maintain all the books in the different courses of study as prescribed by the Manual in sufficient number to accommodate, if necessary, any candidate taking any one of the courses. That the Educational Committee formulate rules for the loaning of such books, determine the number to be secured, and select custodian, subject to the approval of the District Council.

12. That the conference bar shall include the first seven rows of seats in the center and south sections and the platform.

13. Be it resolved that the time for Conference sittings be fixed as follows: 8:00-11:45 a.m., 1:45-5:00 p.m. and 6:30-9:00 p.m.

14. That the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees and fill all vacancies.

15. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted a two weeks' vacation with pay each year.

16. We recommend that each pastor be granted a two weeks' vacation with pay each year.

17. Whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the word of God, girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing immodest forms of dress so current today, such as sun suits, shorts or without stockings, dresses of immodest lengths, slacks, or similar garments. Men and boys of the church are not to appear in public in shorts or with out shirts.

18. Whereas the trend of worldliness is so prevalent and is making inroads in the Church, be it resolved that we strongly urge parents to dress their children according to the spirit of the Manual which sets forth a standard of modesty.

19. Be it resolved that District Minister's license shall not be granted to any person who does not have a definite call to, or who does not plan to enter the active ministry.

Be it further resolved, that no licentiate be advanced in ministerial standing unless actively engaged in the ministry.

20. Be it resolved that each pastor report all seekers in the church of which he has the oversight.

21. Be it resolved that semi-annual zone Sunday School conventions be held for the purpose of encouraging the work of the Sunday School, such conventions to be arranged for, and supervised by the chairman of the District Sunday School Board if possible, or by some other member of the District Sunday School Board.

22. Whereas there is considerable work clearing the camp ground and storing equipment. Be it resolved that each member of the conference remain one day after conference to assist the District Superintendent in doing the work.

23. We recommend that our laity be given recognition along with our ministry in the list of memorials.

24. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world. Be it resolved that our District Superintendent be privileged to hold two revival meetings during the year outside of the district with regular support.

25. Whereas in accordance with the Manual, Page 55, Section 156, Paragraph 1, "All licensed ministers failing to complete and report on at least two subjects a year in their required course of study for two consecutive years, will automatically forfeit their licenses..." and;

Whereas some of our licensed ministers have failed to comply with the above provisions.

Be it therefore resolved that we ask each member of the Educational Board to be responsible for contacting each licentiate under his jurisdiction, urging him to follow the prescribed course of study as outlined in the Manual, before the beginning of next conference.

Be it further resolved that we urge each licentiate to co-operate with the Educational Board in the above matter.



26. Whereas the Central Pilgrim College is now offering a Preacher's Seminar, and Whereas the work given in the Seminar is much more thorough and exhaustive than our regularly prescribed study course.

Be it resolved that our district give one-half year's credit to each licentiate for each such Seminar successfully completed.

Be it further resolved that our District Education Board be authorized to determine which books of study course need not be studied or read in lieu of the completion of the above Seminar work.

27. Whereas it is very necessary at the time of pastoral change for the new pastor to become acquainted with his people as soon as is possible and whereas the pastor leaving does not have adequate time for the preparation of a complete list of names and addresses of the members and constituency.

Therefore be it resolved that every pastor compile and keep up to date a complete file of all those attending his or her church.

28. Be it resolved that a printed statement be given each person registering at the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp showing the registration requirements.

29. Whereas the District has purchased a suitable safe for all abstracts and legal papers, be it resolved all abstracts and other legal papers be placed in same.

30. Whereas, the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has authorized Pilgrim Pension Plan, Inc. to make loans of pension funds to local Pilgrim Holiness Churches, under such conditions as required active participation on the part of the Pilgrim Holiness Districts.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Annual Conference of this district that the District Council, District Trustees, and all District Officials be, and they are hereby authorized, to do and perform any and all acts required of them in the consumation of authorized loans to local Pilgrim Holiness Churches of this district, subject however, to the limitations and conditions set out in said Resolution of the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church authorizing said loans.

31. Whereas the District Conference desires the continuation of the Rocky Mountain Pilgrim, with 10 issues per year.

We recommend the offices of Editor of the Rocky Mountain Pilgrim and the District Sunday School Secretary be combined.

32. Be it resolved that in case of the death of a minister or a member of the family, that the District Superintendent be responsible for notifying the pastors of the District, and the Conference to stand expense of same.

33. Whereas many times there are close friends and relatives of licensed ministers who want to attend the ordination service, but are unable to do so because necessary announcement has not been made, be it resolved that the ordination service be announced prior to conference.

34. Whereas the majority of television programs are a definite hindrance to the spirituality of our people, bringing evil influence into the home: Be it resolved we go on record as opposing television.

35. Be it resolved that all Sunday Schools in the Rocky Mountain District stop counting scholars present ten minutes before the close of the Sunday School period.

36. We recommend that the District Conference vote each year on the number of copies of the Conference Minutes to be printed and the price to be 50c per copy.

We further recommend that each pastor feel personally responsible for seeing that all copies of the Minutes sent to his or her church are paid for and the District reimbursed.

37. Be it resolved that the time of the District Camp Meeting be changed as follows: To begin the second Friday of July, the same to become effective in 1961.

### **Standing Recommendations of Ways and Means Committee**

1. We recommend that the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$300.00 per month with district parsonage and utilities, together with six (6) cents per mile for traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise.

We further recommend, that whereas, the mileage incurred by the District Superintendent in the work of the District is that beyond the average driven, thus making mechanical repair and trade-in more often than the recommended time of driving a car: We therefore recommend that the District Treasurer be instructed to set aside each year the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), the same to be applied as a supplement to the depreciation and trade-in of the District Superintendent's car.

2. Be it resolved that if the District Superintendent prefers not to live in the district parsonage, the rent from same be returned to the district treasurer.

3. We recommend that the assistant District Superintendent, or any member of the Council acting in the District Superintendent's place receive \$5.00 per day, plus (4) cents per mile traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise.

4. Be it resolved that the District pastors and unstationed ministers not participating in the Pension Plan pay three-fourths of their ministerial tithe into the district treasury to be applied on District administrative expense and the remainder to be paid into the treasury of the local church to which they belong.

Be it further resolved that all District evangelists, teachers and other unstationed ministers, participating in the Pension Plan, pay their entire tithe into the District treasury. On the basis of the tithe paid to the District, the District Treasurer shall pay he 4 percent as required by the Pension Plan.

5. That each local church furnish its parsonage with at least a cook stove, a heater, a kitchen cabinet, six chairs, a dining room table and a dresser.

6. We recommend that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be \$100 and \$250 respectively. Be it further resolved that the District Statisticians be given \$15 per year and that the salary for the combined offices of District Sunday School Secretary and Editor of the Rocky Mountain Pilgrim be set at \$50 per year.

7. We recommend that all attending the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp Meeting be properly registered. Each registrant twelve years of age and above, except active ministers and their families, will be required to pay a fee of \$2.00. Furthermore, all registering will be expected to work at least 30 minutes per day when called upon.

8. We recommend that the local church pay the expenses of its delegates to and from District Conference.

9. We recommend that each church pay their pastor's offerings or salary during Camp and Conference.

10. Be it resolved that each Sunday School pay 10c per enrolled Sunday School member per year, for promotion of District Sunday School work.

11. Be it resolved that each local church send to the District Treasurer each month an amount equivalent to 10 percent of all regular offerings. From this amount the District treasurer shall take a proper percent for District administration and District Home Missions. The remainder of the 10 percent shall apply on General administration, General Church extension loan fund, General Sunday School and youth work and Senior college.

Be it further resolved that each church be assessed \$1.50 per member to supplement the General Budget fund.

12. We recommend that the Foreign Missionary and Bible School budgets be raised separately and that the minimum amount be in accord with the General Church recommendation of \$1.60 per member for Foreign Missions, and one cent a day per member for Bible School to be raised in any way the local church may desire.

13. We recommend that the district treasurer set aside amount equal to 20 percent of the general budget, from the unspecified missionary funds, the same to be included in the general budget.

We further recommend the district treasurer set aside the amount equal to 14 percent from unspecified general church extension funds, the same to be included in the general budget.

14. Be it resolved that the members of the District Sunday School and Young People's Boards be given five (5) cents per mile for traveling expense to be paid from the funds of their respective boards.

15. We recommend that each Church take up a free will offering to help defray the expenses of the Ministerial meeting in March.

16. Be it resolved that a fee of one dollar each be made for the use of the District study books and that a fee of 50c each made for the use of District Reading Books.

17. Due to the conference decision to purchase a District Camp Grounds:

We recommend that the District Superintendent be authorized to take three special offerings in each church each year, 90 percent of said offerings to be applied to the District Camp ground debt and interest, and 10 percent to be set aside for maintenance and repair on the Camp Ground.

We further recommend that the goal for these offerings be set at \$10.00 per year per member for the District.

We further recommend that the District Superintendent be authorized to take a special offering each year at District Camp to be applied to the District Camp ground debt and interest.

### **Pension Plan**

Whereas the General Church has adopted and recommended the Pilgrim Pension Plan as a sound method of providing retirement benefits for aged Pilgrim ministers, and Whereas the Rocky Mountain Conference has declared its endorsement of the plan, and Whereas action taken at the 1954 General Conference makes it mandatory for each local church to participate in the plan, we therefore recommend that every church, no less than once each quarter, send to the District Treasurer an amount equivalent to four percent of the pastor's salary as the conference contribution to the Pension Plan.

## **THIRTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL DISTRICT CONFERENCE**

**First Sitting June 29, 1959—8:00 a.m.**

The thirty-eighth annual assembly of the Rocky Mountain Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church was called to order by District Superintendent L. E. Schendel at 8:00 a.m. June 29, 1959.

Rev. Paul Gafford led the Conference in singing "Love Divine".

The District Superintendent, L. E. Schendel, called the conference to prayer. Brother E. Reiff led in prayer.

Rev. L. E. Schendel introduced Dr. William Neff, General Superintendent, who took over the chair.

Dr. Neff brought the conference an inspiring devotional lesson from the fourth chapter of Philippians. He emphasized the importance of striving for a "soul winner's crown". He urged us to be of one purpose, that purpose to be to get the Word to the world. With the Mind of Jesus, the guidance of the spirit and a resting faith we are to press forward.

The secretary called the roll.

Motion prevailed to receive the following into the conference: Floyd Hadsell, from Kansas District; and Tommy Korb, from the Bible Missionary Union.

L. E. Schendel, District Superintendent, presented the new church at Grand Junction, Colorado to the conference. Bro. Hamilton and Sister Slates represented the church.

The Secretary read the joint report of the Examining and Educational Board which was received. (See Licensed Ministers Directory).

The District Superintendent, L. E. Schendel, read his report. The report was graciously received by a standing vote of appreciation.

Motion prevailed to permit every pastor, that can conscientiously say he has done his best to raise the General Stewardship Fund, a vote in the conference.

The auditors report was given and received with appreciation.

The District Treasurer, F. L. Freed, gave a well prepared report. The report was gratefully received.

The statisticians gave their report and it was gratefully received with a standing vote.

The reception committee presented Bro. Roy Nible to the conference. Motion prevailed to give Bro. Nible an honorary seat in the conference bar.

Moved, seconded and carried to recess for ten minutes.

Moved, seconded and carried that the District Secretary be instructed to send the Mason Twins an Air Mail letter from the Conference.

The committee on resolutions reported.

Resolution No. 1—Whereas it is very necessary at the time of pastoral change for the new pastor to become acquainted with his people as soon as possible and whereas the pastor leaving does not have adequate time for the preparation of a complete list of names and addresses of the members and constituency.

Therefore be it resolved that every pastor compile and keep up to date of complete file of all those attending his or her church.

Resolution No. 2—Be it resolved that standing rule number 27 be deleted from the Standing Rules of the Minutes.

Resolution No. 3—Whereas the District Council has recommended by unanimous vote to buy the Colorado Springs Bible College Campus with buildings, consisting of dormitory, kitchen, and dining room and two 75 foot lots south of Monument Street for a place for the Rocky Mountain District Camp grounds.

We recommend said property be purchased for Camp Meeting purpose.

By common consent resolution No. 3 deferred to hear report of the Ways and Means committee.

Recommendation No. 1—We recommend that the figures \$250.00 in recommendation 1 of Standing Recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee be changed to read \$300.00.

After hearing Recommendations of Ways and Means Committee deferred motion was brought back to the Conference.

Motioned prevailed to require a two-thirds vote to carry the motion for the purchase of the camp ground.

Motion prevailed to amend Resolution No. 3 to include all the property north of Monument Street. The District Council to have the authority to sell lots on east end of property with frontage on Dale Street if and when they deem it advisable.

Motion prevailed to extend time until 12 noon.

Moved, seconded, and carried to accept the deferred motion as amended.

The reception committee presented Dr. Owen to the Conference.

Motion prevailed to give Dr. Owen an honorary seat in the Conference bar.

Recessed by expiration of time.

#### Afternoon Sitting

The second sitting began by the Conference singing "The Solid Rock".

Bro. Freed let the Conference in prayer.

The Ways and Means Committee reported.

Recommendation No. 2 (Standing Recommendations of Ways and Means Committee No. 17).

Further report of the Resolution Committee.

Resolution No. 4 (See Standing Rules No. 31).

Further Report of Ways and Means Committee.

Recommendation No. 3 (See Standing Recommendations of Ways and Means Committee No. 6).

Committee on Memiors reported.

The committee on Memoirs read their report and it was gratefully received as the Conference stood for a moment of silent prayer. Dr. Neff closed the prayer and the Conference sang, "In The Sweet By and By".

Motion prevailed for voting to be the order of business. The District Superintendent appointed the following for tellers: J. H. Fortner at the board; Bob Sander, Ed Friesen, Paul Gafford, and D. E. Moller to hand out ballots and Hubert Hughes and Dale Rummel to read.

Ballots were cast for District Superintendent. L. E. Schendel was elected on the first ballot.

Ballots were cast for Assistant District Superintendent. R. L. Gilbert was elected.

Ballots were cast for District Secretary. W. J. Brown was elected.

Ballots were cast for District Treasurer. F. L. Freed was elected.

Ballots were cast for additional members of Council. The following were elected: Marion B. Hill, D. E. Moller, Duane Knierim.

The council's nomination for Examining Board were read and ratified.

The council's nomination for Educational Board were read and ratified.

Ballots were cast for lay-member of Central Pilgrim College Board. Oliver Brown was elected.

Ballots were cast for additional member of the Central Pilgrim College Board. J. H. Fortner was elected.

The following Committees were presented by Bro. Schendel and accepted by the Conference:

Resolutions—George Lingo, Bob Sander, James Flick.

Auditing—R. L. Compbell, Hubert Hughes.

Statistical—Duane Knierim, E. L. Reiff.

Reception—C. C. Darr, Elmer Jantz.

Memoirs—Verneeda Brown, Wanda Lingo.

The Pastoral appointments were read by the District Secretary.

Dr. Neff drew our attention to the importance of our getting out and getting the job done.

The Sunday School Board members were read and ratified.

Special resolutions received with standing vote of appreciation.

1. We the members of the Thirty-eighth Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church resolve that there be given our Chairman Dr. William Neff a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of his labor of love.

2. We the members of the Thirty-eighth Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District resolve that there be given our D'strict Superintendent Rev. L. E. Schendel; our Secretary Rev. W. J. Brown, and our Treasurer Rev. F. L. Freed a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of their faithfulness to us. Be it further resolved that there be given our cooks, Bro. Ray Gilbert and Bob Sander and all the kitchen and dining room help a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of their faithful service.

3. Be it resolved that the council take care of any unfinished business.

Motioned prevailed to recess for 15 minutes.

The Ordination Service was an impressive service with Dr. William Neff in charge. Mrs. Helen Doll was ordained to the Ministry. The Spirit seemed to settle down on the service as a special approval of the event.

The number of minutes to be printed for each church was determined.

The minutes of the Conference were read and approved.

Motion prevailed to ajourn.

## DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the pastors, evangelists and delegates of the Thirty-eighth Annual Conference of the Rocky Mountain District. Greetings in Jesus' name. For another year we have found that the promises of God are a source of unfailing strength.

God has given us a group of workers on the district that on the whole have accepted the challenge of their charge. They have been able, under God to go forward. As I have gone from place to place I have found a general atmosphere of spiritual progress. Naturally I have found pastors with heart-rending burdens because of certain conditions, but pressing forward never-the-less.

All of our active ministers have been spared to us this year, the hand of death did however, take from our ranks Ernest Howell. Also from our midst we miss the Mason Twins, not by the hand of death, but by the long arm of the missionary department.

### CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS

1. Arthur—completely re-decorated the interior with accoustic tile on the ceiling, and accoustic and mahogany paneling on the wall back of the pulpit.

2. Bellvue—completed the bathroom in the parsonage.

3. Boulder—completed the interior of the church, including hardwood floors.

4. Campo—remodeled the interior of the parsonage, including complete bathroom facilities and hardwood floors in several of the rooms.

5. Canon City—purchased a lovely new organ.

6. Colorado Springs (First)—new tile floor thruout the church basement.

7. Denver (First)—completed the basement of the church. They have also completely re-modeled the old building for a parsonage.

8. Grand Junction—moved out of the basement of the church into the church parsonage.

9. Imperial—has re-decorated the outside of the parsonage.

10. Lewellen—has added modern restroom facilities and a couple of class rooms.

11. Rocky Ford—has the construction of its new church well in hand. Services are being held in the new church.

12. Superior—re-modeled the interior of the church, including another exit. They have also fixed up a room in the parsonage for a Sunday School room.

### Our Losses

It is with a deep sense of regret that it seemed necessary to disband the church at Benkleman this year. This is no fault of the good pastor, Bro. Conard. God helped him to be faithful to the people. At the time of the writing of this report, negotiations are in progress for the sale of the property.

### DISTRICT CHURCH EXTENSION

This has been a good year for District Church Extension. Some of the zones of the District have helped with the work at Holdrege. This work is making headway under the leadership of Bro. Bob Sander. Discouraging things have come, such as people moving away, however God has given Bro. and Sister Sander a courage that will see the work thru. This work is not organized, but we look forward to the time when an organization shall be effected.

Lincoln, Nebraska has received some financial help from the District. This church has been organized for some time, and is making suitable progress under the leadership of Bro. Fortner.

The church at Tecumseh, Nebraska too is receiving some financial support from the District. It is not organized, but making progress under the faithful ministry of Sr. Stewart.

The church at Grand Junction, Colorado has had a struggle for some time. Bro. and Sister Coleman were the faithful pastors for several years and laid a foundation for another to build upon. In the good providence

of God, Bro. Hamilton was the man to do the building upon that foundation. The statistical report will give the cold figures of progress, but the real consciousness of progress only comes as one has the privilege of feeling the warmth of the people as they are ministered to. It was my happy privilege to organize a new Pilgrim Holiness church at Grand Junction on Feb. 28, 1959 with eleven members. This church will be ready to receive into the District at this Conference.

Early in the past conference year the Mason Twins got it on their heart to start a new church and Sunday School in West Pueblo. The complete story of this new venture is too long to report here, but in the good providence of God this work is progressing. The District is financially obligated in this work, but the Council feels it is a good investment in souls, as well as otherwise. God has blessed Bro. Rosentrator in his labor there, and it is with a deep sense of loss that the people at West Pueblo, as well as ourselves, bow to the orders of the physician when he tells the Rosentrators they must go to a lower climate. However, we look forward to a fine work in West Pueblo.

#### BIBLE COLLEGE

The College has closed its last year on this location. If God wills, the plans are to begin operation in Bartlesville, Okla next September. As a District it is our duty to stand by the school faithfully in this new location. Let us pray that the years ahead, if Jesus tarries will be the very best the College has ever known.

#### CAMP GROUNDS

This Conference must face the fact that something be done about a campground. Three ways are open to us—to go out somewhere and start all over by buying land and building up from the bottom, to find a suitable camp already in existence and rent from the people who own it, or to buy this present property and continue our camp meetings on these same grounds. I shall not make an official recommendation in this report, but will say that this conference must thoroughly discuss this problem and come to some definite decisions. We must not only make definite decisions as to location, but for financing the project as well.

#### FINANCES

Our finances this year have been good. We have been able, under God, to pay 92 percent of our United Stewardship fund. Whether this is more or less than our Districts have done is not for me to say in this report, but I do feel like saying thank you, to all the faithful pastors and people. It is only as we work together that we can met our obligations.

#### CAMP MEETING

Our camp workers this year have been of the highest quality. We regret that Rev. P. W. Thomas was not able to be with us because of sickness, however we were not disappointed in the ministry of Rev. S. I. Emery, who took his place. The preaching of Rev. Emery and Dr. G. Fredrick Owen was of the highest order, and God honored His word with souls at the altar. Such preaching as we have had this year is bound to bear fruit throughout the year. The musical part of the Camp was given by Professor Miller and enjoyed by all.

#### PERSONAL REPORT

In the past Conference year I have preached 95 times, held 25 church meetings, and held 16 local church board meetings. I have also conducted all the annual church meetings.

It has been my privilege to visit all the churches at least 3 times. While visiting the churches I have helped in communion services, dedicated 2 babies. I conducted one funeral and one wedding. This past year it was my happy privilege to organize the church at Grand Junction, and dedicate the church at Boulder. I have also been to all of the Bible College board meetings.
