STANDING RULES

- 1. We recommend that the Ways and Means Resolution and Statistical Committees be appointed by the District Superintendent at the conference for the following year. Be it further resolved that any material may be presented to said committees during the year.
- 2. That the pastors verify the reports of their respective churches before sending them to the District Conference.
- 3. That all buildings such as churches, parsonages, or extensive improvements, be approved by the District Superintendent before construction.
- 4. That no church of our district shall call a pastor, evangelist, representative of foreign missions or other church institutions without first consulting the District Superintendent.
- 5. That the conference year close on June 30 and that all the reports be in the hands of the district statistician by July 10th and that all district monies be sent to the District Treasurer by the same date.
- 6. That we go on record as being opposed to our children having to dress, dance or do other things in the physical education department of the public schools in violation of our religious convictions and our church standards.
- 7. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world, be it resolved that each pastor be privileged to hold two revival meetings of two weeks duration each year with regular support paid, subject to the approval of the District Superintendent.
- ject to the approval of the District Superintendent.

 8. Be it resolved that we have a Foreign Missionary Convention in the fall, time to be set by the District Council.
- 9. That the District Treasurer give an itemized account to the District Conference of where all the Home Missionary money was spent.
- 10. That all members pay their tithes into the church in which they retain their membership, according to Section 69 in the Manual.

- 11. That the District secure and maintain all the books in the different courses of study as prescribed by the Manual in sufficient number to accomodate, if necessary, any candidate taking any one of the courses. That the Educational Committee formulate rules for the loaning of such books, determine the number to be secured, and select custodian, subject to the approval of the district Council.
- 12. That the conference bar shall include the first seven rows of seats in the center and south sections and the platform.
- 13. Be it resolved that the time for Conference sittings be fixed as follows: 8:00-11:45 a.m., 1:45-5:00 p.m. and 6:30-9:00 p.m.
- 14. That the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees and fill all vacancies.
- 15. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted a two weeks' vacation with pay each year.
- 16. We recommend that each pastor be granted a two weeks' vacation with pay each year.
- 17. Whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the word of God, girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing immodest forms of dress so current today, such as sun suits, shorts or without stockings, dresses of immodest lengths, slacks, or similar garments. Men and boys of the church are not to appear in public in shorts or without shirts.
- 18. Whereas the trend of worldliness is so prevalent and in making inroads in the Church, be it resolved that we strongly urge parents to dress their children according to the spirit of the Manual which sets forth a standard of modesty.
- 19. Be it resolved that District Minister's license shall not be granted to any person who does not have a definite call to, or who does not plan to enter the active ministry.
 - Be it further resolved, that no licentiate be advanced in ministerial standing unless actively engaged in the ministry.
- 20. Be it resolved that each pastor report all seekers in the church of which he has the oversight.
- 21. Be it resolved that semi-annual zone Sunday School conventions be held for the purpose of encouraging the work of the Sunday School, such conventions to be arranged for, and supervised by the chairman of the District Sunday School Board if possible, or by some other member of the District Sunday School Board.
- 22. Whereas there is considerable work clearing the camp ground and storing equipment. Be it resolved that each member of the conference remain one day after conference to assist the District Superintendent in doing the work.
- 23. We recommend that our laity be given recognition along with our ministry in the list of memorials.
- 24. Owing to the soon coming of Jesus and the great spiritual need of the world. Be it resolved that our District Superintendent be privileged to hold two revival meetings during the year outside of the district with regular support.
- 25. Whereas in accordance with the Manual Page 55, Section 156, Paragraph 1, "All licensed ministers failing to complete and report on at least two subjects a year in their required course of study for two consecutive years, will automatically forfeit their licenses—" and;

Whereas some of our licensed ministers have failed to comply with the above provisions.

Be it therefore resolved that we ask each member of the Educational Board to be responsible for contacting each licentiate under his jurisdiction, urging him to follow the prescribed course of study as outlined in the Manual, before the beginning of next conference.

Be it further resolved that we urge each licentiate to co-operate with the Educational Board in the above matter.

26. Whereas the Central Pilgrim College is now offering a Preacher's Seminar, and Whereas the work given in the Seminar is much more thorough and exhaustive than our regularly prescribed study course.

Be it resolved that our district give one-half year's credit to each licentiate for each such Seminar successfully completed.

Be it further resolved that our District Education Board be authorized to determine which books of study course need not be studied or read in lieu of the completion of the above Seminar work.

27. Whereas it is very necessary at the time of pastoral change for the new pastor to become acquainted with his people as soon as is possible and whereas the pastor leaving does not have adequate time for the preparation of a complete list of names and addresses of the members and constituency.

Therefore be it resolved that every pastor compile and keep up to date a complete file of all those attending his or her church.

28. Be it resovled that a printed statement be given each person registering at the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp showing the registration requirements.

Whereas the District has purchased a suitable safe for all abstracts and legal papers, be it resolved all abstracts and other legal papers be placed in same.

30. Whereas, the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has authorized Pilgrim Pension Plan, Inc. to make loans of pension funds to local Pilgrim Holiness Churches, under such conditions as required active participation on the part of the Pilgrim Holiness Districts.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Annual Conference of this district that the District Council, District Trustees, and all District Officials be and they are hereby authorized, to do and perform any and all acts required of them in the consumation of authorized loans to local Pilgrim Holiness Churches of this district, subject however, to the limitations and conditions sets out in said Resolutions of the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church authorizing said loans.

31. Whereas the District Conference desires the continuation of the Rocky Mountain Pilgrim, with 10 issues per year.

We recommend the offices of Editor of the Rocky Mountain Pilgrim and the District Sunday School Secretary be combined.

32. Be it resolved that in case of the death of a minister or a member of the family, that the District Superintendent be responsible for notifying the pastors of the District, and the Conference to stand expense of same.

33. Whereas many times there are close friends and relatives of licensed ministers who want to attend the ordination service, but are unable to do so because necessary announcement has not been made, be it resolved that the ordination service be announced prior to conference.

34. Whereas the majority of television programs are a definite hinderance to the spirituality of our people, bringing evil influence into the home: Be it resolved we go on record as opposing television.

35. Be it resolved that all Sunday Schools in the Rocky Mountain District stop counting scholars present ten minutes before the close of the Sunday School period.

36. We recommend the price of Conference Minutes be set at 50c each and that each pastor be responsible to collect and bring to conference the money for the number of minutes that his church desires.

37. Be it resolved that the time of the district camp meeting be set as follows: To begin the Friday nearest of July 15, the same to become effective in 1961.

Standing Recommendations of Ways and Means Committee

1. We recommend that the District Superintendent be given a salary of \$300.00 per month with district parsonage and utilities, together with six (6) cents per mile for traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise.

We further recommend, that whereas, the mileage incurred by the District Superintendent in the work of the District is that beyond the average driven, thus making mechanical repair and trade-in more often than the recommended time of driving a car: We therefore recommend that the District Treasurer be instructed to set aside each year the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), the same to be applied as a supplement to the depreciation and trade-in of the District Superintendent's car.

- 2. Be it resolved that if the District Superintendent prefers not to live in the district parsonage, the rent from same be returned to the district treasurer.
- 3. We recommend that the assistant District Superintendent, or any member of the Council acting in the District Superintendent's place receive \$5.00 per day, plus (4) cents per mile traveling expense while driving his own car, and actual traveling expense while traveling otherwise.
- 4. Be it resolved that the District pastors and unstationed ministers not participating in the Pension Plan pay three-fourths of their ministerial tithe into the district treasury to be applied on District administrative expense and the remainder to be paid into the treasury of the local church to which they belong.

Be it further resolved that all District evangelists, teachers and other unstationed ministers, participating in the Pension Plan, pay their entire tithe into the District treasury. On the basis of the tithe paid to the District, the District Treasurer shall pay the 4 percent as required by the Pension Plan.

- 5. That each local church furnish its parsonage with at least a cook stove, a heater, a kitchen cabinet, six chairs, a dining room table and a dresser.
- 6. We recommend that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be \$100 and \$250 respectively. Be it further resolved that the District Statisticians be given \$15 per year and that the salary for the combined offices of District Sunday School Secretary and Editor of the Rocky Mountan Pilgrim be set at \$50 per year.
- 7. We recommend that all attending the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp Meeting be properly registered. Each registrant twelve years of age and above, except active ministers and their families, will be required to pay a fee of \$2.00. Registration cards will be so made that each registrant be assigned specific duties in one of the work departments of the camp, the foreman of that detail to punch each card each day when duty has been performed. These duties will be assigned by a Camp Meeting Committee of three persons to be appointed by the District Supt.

We further recommend that an attendant be in charge at each meal to check registration cards and receive free-will offerings.

8. We recommend that the local church pay the expenses of its delegates to and from District Conference.

9. We recommend that each church pay their pastor's offerings or

salary during Camp and Conference.

10. Be it resolved that each Sunday School pay 10c per enrolled Sunday School member per year, for promotion of District Sunday School work.

11. Be it resolved that each local church send to the District Treasurer each month an amount equivalent to 10 percent of all regular offerings. From this amount the District Treasurer shall take a proper percent for District administration and District Home Missions. The remainder of the 10 percent shall apply on General administration. General Church extention loan fund, General Sunday School and youth work and Senior college.

Be it further resolved that each church be assessed \$1.50 per member to supplement the General Budget fund and 50 cents per member for

General Conference expense fund.

- 12. We recommend that the Foreign Missionary budget be raised separately and that the minimum amount be in accord with the General Church recommendation of \$1.60 per senior member, to be raised in any way the local church may desire.
- 13. We recommend that, in compliance with the request of our zone school board, each senior member of our district be assessed \$5.00 per year for Bible School budget, 25 cents of which will go for the Rocky Mountain District's portion of the school boards travel expense, this budget to be raised in any way the local church may desire.
- 14. We recommend that the district treasurer set aside amount equal to 20 percent of the general budget, from the unspecified missionary funds, the same to be included in the general budget.

We further recommend the district treasurer set aside the amount equal to 14 percent from unspecified general church extension funds. the same to be included in the general budget.

- 15. Be it resolved that the members of the District Sunday School and Young People's Boards be given five (5) cents per mile for traveling expense to be paid from the funds of their respective boards.
- 16. We recommend that each Church take up a free will offering to help defray the expenses of the Ministerial meeting in March.
- 17. Be it resolved that a fee of one dollar each be made for the use of the District study books and that a fee of 50 cents each made for the use of District Reading Books.
- 18. Due to the conference decision to purchase a District Camp Grounds:

We recommend that the District Superintendent be authorized to take three special offerings in each church each year, 90 percent of said offerings to be applied to the District Camp ground debt and interest, and 10 percent to be set aside for maintenance and repair on the Camp Ground.

We further recommend that the goal for these offerings be set at \$10.00 per year per member for the District.

We further recommend that the District Superintendent be authorized to take a special offering each year at District Camp to be applied to the District Camp ground debt and interest.

19. We recommend that the District Superintendent meet with each local Advisory Board at least once each year to review the Church's financial welfare and endeavor, wherever possible, to obtain yearly raises in pastors support.

Pension Plan

Whereas the General Church has adopted and recommended the Pilgrim Pension Plan as a sound method of providing retirement benefits for aged Pilgrim ministers, and Whereas the Rocky Mountain Conference has declared its endorsement of the plan, and Whereas action taken at the 1954 General Conference makes it mandatory for each local church to participate in the plan, we therefore recommend that every church, no less than once each quarter, send to the District Treasurer an amount equivalent to four percent of the pastor's salary as the conference contribution to the Pension Plan.

THIRTY-NINTH ANNUAL DISTRICT CONFERENCE First Sitting June 27, 1960 - 8:00 a.m.

The thirty-ninth annual assembly of the Rocky Mountain Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church was called to order by District Superintendent L. E. Schendel at 8:00 a.m., June 27, 1960.
Reverend Paul Gafford led the Conference in singing "I Know I Love

Thee Better Lord.

The Superintendent called the Conference to Prayer. Bro. Drown led in prayer.

Rev. L. E. Schendel introduced Rev. Flexon, General Superintendent. who took the chair.

Dr. Flexon challenged our hearts with a message from I Cor. 9:26, on the subject, "A Planned Ministry". He stated that many ministers waste both time and talent. The conference was urged to plan our Ministry and expect results from God.

The Conference sang, "He Will Roll the Sea Away."

The Secretary called the roll.

Motion prevailed to seat all the pastors and delegates due to our having paid 91 percent of our General Stewardship Fund.

The Reception Committee presented Wilma Reiff, Rev. and Mrs. C. P. Pridgon, and Rev. Roy Nible to the Conference.

Motion prevailed to grant them an honorary seat within the Conference Bar.

The secretary read the report of the examining and educational boards, which was accepted, (see licensed ministers directory).

The District Superintendent, L. E. Schendel, read his splendid report. The report was graciously received by the Conference.

Motion prevailed to give the superintendent a rising vote of thanks. Auditors report was given and received.

The secretary read the treasurer's report at the request of Bro. Freed, district treasurer. After a word of appreciation from Bro. Flexon, Bro. Schendel presented a gift of appreciation to Bro. Freed from the district. A rising vote of acceptance was given the report and also in appreciation of Bro. Freed.

The statistical committee gave their report which was gratefully received by a unanimous standing vote.

The Ways and Means Committee Reported:

Recommendation No. 1—We recommend that the District Superintendent meet with each local advisory board at least once each year to review the church's financial welfare and endeavor, wherever possible, to obtain yearly raises in the pastors support. Carried.

Recommendation No. 2—We recommend that standing recommendation number 7 be deleted and the following recommendation be made to replace it.

We recommend that all attending the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp be properly registered. Each registrant twelve years of age and above, except active ministers and their families, will be required to pay a fee of \$6.00, \$4.00 of which may be worked out at \$1.00 per meal by helping in the dining room, or by other assigned camp duty. Registration cards will be so made that each person will be assigned specific days, and duties if they wish to work for part of their registration.

We further recommend that at each meal an attendant be in charge of checking registration cards, receiving free will offerings, and issuing visitors meal cards to those attending only a short portion of the camp.

Referred to Ways and Means Committee:

Recommendation No. 3—We recommend that a dish washer be purchased and that our kitchen methods be brought up to State Sanitary standards. Carried.

Recommendation No. 4—We recommend that, in compliance with the request of our zone school board, each senior member of the district be assessed \$5.00 per year for Bible School budget, 25c of which will go for the Rocky Mountain District's portion of the school boards travel expense, this budget to be raised in any way the local church may desire. Carried.

Recommendation No. 5—We recommend that standing recommendation number 12 be changed to read, "We recommend that the Foreign Missionary budget be raised separately and that the minimum amount be in accord with the General Church recommendation of \$1.60 per senior member, to be raised in any was the local church may desire. Carried. Recommendation No. 6—We recommend that paragraph two of

Recommendation No. 6—We recommend that paragraph two of standing recommendation number 17 be changed to read \$10.00 per year

per senior member.

We further recommend that the following be added to the end of paragraph three; This offering shall be taken on the last Saturday night of the camp, and shall be an urged offering of both cash and pledges. Lost.

The Resolutions Committee reported.

Resolution No. 1—Be it resolved that standing rule No. 5 be changed to read: "That the conference year close on June 30 and that all the reports be in the hands of the district statistician by July 10th and that all district monies be sent to the district treasurer by the same date." Carried.

Resolution No. 2—We recommend that standing rule No. 37 be changed to as follows:

Be it resolved that the time of the district camp meeting be set as follows: To begin the Friday nearest of July 15, the same to become effective in 1961. Carried.

Resolution No. 3—Be it resolved that each church be given the privilege of furnishing and maintaining a room at camp for their pastor. Lost. Resolution No. 4—Be it resolved a preachers' retreat be held once yearly on our district camp grounds. Lost.

Resolution No. 5—Be it resolved that a committee of four be appointed, composed of representatives from different areas of the Rocky Mountain District to investigate the feasibility of renting a camp ground for our District Camp and Conference. Lost.

Resolution No. 6—Be it resolved that the publicity committee extend the advertising for district camp. Carried.

Resolution No. 7—Be it resolved that no church property of the Pilgrim Holiness Church on this district be sold to lodges, secret societies or any other organization that would use it for purposes that would violate standards of our general church as set forth in our Manual. Ignored.

Motion prevailed to set the time of the Ordination Service at 1:30 p.m.

Motion prevailed to recess until 1:30.

Afternoon Sitting

The ordination service was very impressive with Dr. R. G. Flexon in charge. His charge to the candidates, Marvin Moberly and Elgin Glendenning, was certainly instructive and inspirational.

The roll call was answered by the pastors telling how many subscriptions to the Advocate they would try to secure this year. The rest of the roll call was dispensed with.

The reception committee presented Rev. LaVerne Day.

Motion prevailed to grant him an honorary seat in the Conference Bar.

Bro. Schendel presented a card from Bro. Evans asking prayer for Sister Evans who is to undergo surgery soon. Bro. Flexon called the conference to prayer. Bro. Brown led in prayer.

The Committee on Memoirs reported.

Bro. Flexon asked all to stand who were in favor of accepting this report and after a moment of silence he led the conference in prayer.

Further report of the Resolutions Committee.

Resolution No. 8—We recommend the price of Conference Minutes to be set at 50 cents each and that each pastor be responsible to collect and bring to conference the money for the number of minutes that his church desires. This to take the place of standing rule No. 36. Carried.

Further Report of the Ways and Means Committee.

Recommendation No. 7—We recommend that standing recommendation number 7 be changed to read; We recommend that all attending the Pikes Peak Holiness Camp Meeting be properly registered. Each registrant twelve years of age and above, except active ministers and their families, will be required to pay a fee of \$2.00. Registration cards will be so made that each registrant be assigned specific duties in one of the work departments of the camp, the foreman of that detail to punch each card each day when duty has been performed. These duties will be assigned by a Camp Meeting Committee of three persons to be appointed by the District Superintendent.

We further recommend that an attendant be in charge at each meal to check registration cards and receive free-will offerings, Carried.

The election of officers was the order of business.

The District Superintendent appointed the following for tellers: Hubert Hughes at the board; Marvin Moberly, Floyd Kelley and Jimmy Koons to hand out ballots; Bob Sander and Floyd Hadsell to read.

Ballots were cast for Assistant District Superintent. R. L. Gilbert was elected.

Ballots were cast for District Secretary. W. J. Brown was elected.

Ballots were cast for District Treasurer. J. H. Fortner was elected.

Ballots were cast for additional members of the District Council. The following were elected: D. E. Moller, Marion B. Hill and Duane Knierim. Motion prevailed to recess until 3:30.

Vallots were cast for the member on the Examining Board. Bro. Hill was elected.

Ballots were cast for Educational Board member. Bro. Reiff was elected.

Ballots were cast for Bible College Board member. W. J. Brown was elected.

The Pastoral Appointments were read.

The District Superintendent read the appointment of Committees as follows: (See the Committees in the Official Directory.)

Further report of the Resolution Committee.

The following Special Resolutions were read and approved by a standing vote:

Brown, and our Treasurer, Rev. F. L. Freed a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of their faithfulness to us. Be it further resolved that there be given our cook, Mrs. Ruth Edwards, and all the kitchen and dining room help a rising vote of thanks to express our appreciation of their faithful service.

Be it resolved that the council take care of any unfinished business.

The minutes were read and approved.

Bro. Flexon expressed his appreciation to the conference for their kindness to him. He stated he plans to spend two weeks on the district this conference year.

The conference was urged to employ the personal visitation program.

Bro Schendel urged that the dorm rooms be well cleaned before the

Church Improvements

ARTHUR has purchased different pews as well as purchased a new piano which is dedicated to the memory of Sr. Hartman, a long time member of the local church.

BELLVUE—The people at Bellvue have purchased a fine lot in a very desireable location in Fort Collins. Both the church and parsonage in Bellvue have been sold and work has begun on the property at Fort Collins. This is a move that meets the whole hearted approval of the District Council, and I believe there are great prospects ahead for this church in this fine college town.

BOULDER—In the good providence of God a fund was begun at Boulder for new pews. God laid this on the heart of one family of the church, and their large gift, along with the gifts of others made possible the purchase of these fine blonde oak pews. These lovely new pews add much dignity and comfort to all the services of the church.

CANON CITY this past year has added lovely oak pews. They are now in the process of planning an expansion program, both to the church and parsonage.

LAMAR is in a building program. The new addition is being built in such a way that it can be built onto and become the church building and the old church be torn down.

OSHKOSH—The streets on two sides of the church at Oshkosh have been paved.

PUEBLO (West Park) our youngest church, yet unorganized, has built on top of their basement. God is blessing Bro. and Sr. Sanders there, and we look forward to organizing the church this conference year.

ROCKY FORD has made further improvement on the new church building there.

District Church Extension

The District has been helping three of our churches this year— Tecumseh, Grand Junction and Pueblo West Park. The church at Holdrege has been progressing with assistance from the zone in Nebraska.

Bible College

This has been a good year for our College. There have been problems, of course, but we look forward to the future with confidence. We rejoice that in the good providence of God he has sent Rev. N. N. Bonner to head our school as president. I feel it is the duty of every member of our district to stand by our College. I recommend that this conference adopt the resolution relative to our financial obligation that will be brought in by our Ways and Means committee.

Camp Grounds

The Lord has helped us in the purchase of our camp ground. The task of getting it ready has been tremendous. The rooms have been entirely re-furnished, and the kitchen and dining room partly re-furnished. Maintaining the property is not an easy task. The upkeep, including insurance, plumbing, repairs, etc., is proving expensive. The time may come when we will need to explore the possibilities of relocating the camp. Our district treasurers report will show that many of our churches came far short of meeting their suggested quota for camp ground expense. Our pastors must give this special consideration.

Finances

This year again our financial picture as a whole has been good. However, our folk have given heavily to some departments of the work and have slighted others. The Rocky Mountain District, under God has been able to pay 91.8% of the United Stewardship fund, we thank God for this.

Camp Meeting

God, in his good providence has sent us some of his choice workers for our Camp meeting just closed. The preaching and teaching of Brothers Snyder and Stauffer has had a wholesome effect on everyone who has come. Under the direction of the Holy Spirit, the Word has found its way to the hearts of people until sinners have been saved, backsliders reclaimed and believers sanctified. I am sure too, that each of us has been greatly encouraged and will never be the same in our Spirit and Service for Jesus Christ. It has been a real pleasure and blessing to all to have Bro. and Sr. Waddell here again for our song evangelists.

Personal Report

This past conference year I have preached 101 times, held 19 church meetings, and 14 church board meetings. I also conducted all the annual meetings except one.

It has been my privilege to visit all of the churches, except one, three times. While visiting the churches I have assisted in communion services, and had part in special services of one kind or another. I have officiated at one wedding, and assisted in one funeral. I have driven many miles to be at all of the board meetings of our College. Miles traveled for the District were 18,087.
