GENERAL PROCEEDINGS

The Tenth Annual Conference of the Tennessee District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Cumberland Grove Campground, Jamestown, Tennessee, July 26, 1943. Second Assistant General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk was the presiding officer. The first sitting opened at 10:15 A. M. by singing, "Take the Name of Jesus with you." Prayer was offered by the Campmeeting evangelist, Rev. P. O. Carpenter. Brother Sturk spoke to the Conference from the "Song of Solomon," after which "Amazing Grace" was sung.

Roll call and registration of delegates.

Moved and adopted that the first five seats in the two middle sections of the tabernacle constitute the conference bar.

Brother Brevard and Miss Georgia Sturk of Ohio, Mrs. Raleigh Butler of Indiana and the Campmeeting evangelist, Rev. P. O. Carpenter of Kentucky were introduced to the conference and given honorary seats within the bar.

Report of the Auditing Committee given and accepted.

Report of the District Treasurer given and accepted.

The annual report of the District Superintendent was read and accepted.

Moved and adopted that the time of meetings be as follows: 10:00 A. M. - 12:00 Noon; 1:00 P. M. - 3:30 P. M.

Report of the Educational and Examining Board read and accepted.

Mrs. Doris Shetler was given an honorary seat with the bar.

The meeting was recessed until 1:00 o'clock.

Second Sitting

The Conference was called to order by singing, "In the Sweet By and By." Prayer was led by Mrs. J. D. Ward.

Minutes of the previous sitting were read and accepted.

A partial report of the Resolutions Committee: Nos. 1, 7, 10 and 16 read and adopted.

A partial report of the Ways and Means Committee: Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4 and 7 read and accepted.

Motion carried to have the election of officers at the first sitting tomorrow.

Moved and adopted that the reading of church reports be discontinued.

The Statistician gave her report which was accepted.

Motion carried to adjourn until 10:00 A. M. tomorrow.

Third Sitting

Conference reconvened at 10:10 o'clock by singing, "He Brought Me Out." Prayer was offered by Brothers Virgial H. Green and E. A. Shetler. Brother Sturk addressed the conference on the subject, "Our Church."

Moved and adopted that the Educational and Examining Board report. They gave their report which was accepted.

The order of the day being the election of officers, the tellers were appointed.

On the first ballot cast for the office of District Superintendent, Rev. Neal Horton was re-elected.

On the first ballot cast for the office of Assistant Superintendent, Rev. Elmer Moon was elected to succeed himself.

Also on the first ballots cast, Rev. L. T. Wallingford was re-elected as District Secretary and Rev. Wm. E. Hall as District Treasurer.

Rev. H. H. Barton, Rev. J. C. Williams and Rev. E. A. Shetler were elected as additional councilmen.

The one year member, Rev. H. H. Barton, was re-elected to serve for three years on the Educational and Examining Board.

The three trustees, George Stair, Elmer Moon and Neal Horton were re-elected by acclamation.

As has been the custom, the District Superintendent to appoint the Committees.

Motion prevailed to recess until 2:00 o'clock.

Fourth Sitting

The conference was called to order by singing "Pass Me Not." Prayer by Brother Adams.

Minutes of the second and third sittings were read and accepted.

A partial report of the Resolutions Committee: Nos. 1 and 15 read and adopted. No. 21 was referred back to the committee for redrafting.

A partial report of the Ways and Means Committee: No. 8 read and accepted.

A report (partial) from the Educational and Examining Board was given and adopted. (Miss Beulah Moyers accepted for ordination.)

A motion prevailed to recess for one hour.

Fifth Sitting

Session opened by singing "Amazing Grace."

Resolution Number 21 was given by the Committee and adopted.

Moved and accepted that the Ministerial Convention be held at Chattanooga. See Resolution No. 16 for date. (Clinton church to have second choice.)

Moved and adopted that a rising vote of thanks be given to Bro. Sturk for presiding at the Conference.

The Educational and Examining Board gave a further report which was accepted. The following brethren being passed upon for ordination; George Edward York, C. A. Simmons, Wm. E. Hall and J. C. Wallace.

Moved and adopted that Rev. E. A. Shetler and Rev. H. H. Barton constitute a committee to send greetings to a number who were not present at the Conference.

Moved and adopted that rising vote of thanks be given to The District Superintendent, District Treasurer, District Secretary and Statistician for their services this year.

The Educational and Examining Board recommended that Rev. Charles E. Lory be accepted into the District. Carried.

Rev. Elmer Kizzee and wife, also Mrs. Charles E. Lory were introduced to the Conference.

Motion carried to recess until 6:30 P. M.

An ordination service was conducted for the class of five candidates. Bro. L. W. Sturk gave the charge.

Minutes yet to be approved were read and accepted.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Tenth Annual District Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, meeting at Jamestown, Tennessee, July 26 and 28, 1943, Greetings:

We have by God's grace lived through the most bloody year of all history. Since we met here last year, near two millions of souls have gone to meet God from battlefields all over the world. In spite of all we have been able to carry on and make progress on almost every line by the help of a gracious God.

The past year has been the best one in my knowledge of the District as your District Superintendent.

I believe we have deepened in grace and made progress on seeking the old land marks.

In the year I have held eleven week-end meetings, seven revivals, three on the District and four off. Have cared for the home missions work with help of pastors. Have preached 185 times and saw 195 souls seeking God.

The Lord has blessed and our District has made material progress that is very gratifying. The Clinton church is in a building program that will provide one of the nicest Pilgrim Holiness Churches in the Southland. Chattanooga is paying for their church by leaps and bounds. We look forward for a mortgage burning there soon. Many of our other churches have decorated and improved their parsonages and churches.

We had forty one percent gain in General Budget. Seventy percent gain in District Budget. Net financial gain \$1,047.40. Our Sunday School has made sizeable gains for the first time in three years.

All this has been made possible by the hard work, sacrifice and prayers of our pastors and laity.

I have received for my labors, \$900.70, traveling expenses \$85.45. From revivals \$500.00. Grand total \$1,486.15.

May Heaven bless all that had a part.

RESOLUTIONS

No. 1. Be it resolved that the date of the District Camp-meeting for 1944 be July 28 - August 6, and that the date of the Congerence be July 31 - August 1.

No. 2. Be it resolved that each Church devote one service each month to General Missionary interests, and offering be taken in the Sunday School or Church service and to be sent to the District Treasurer for General Missions.

No. 3. Resolved that each Church donate two bed springs

and furnishings, or the equivalent in cash, for Campmeeting equipment.

No. 4. Be it resolved that th District Superintendent, or his assistant, visit each Church three times a year, and that the Church give a pounding on each visit. Be it further resolved that he conduct a communion service at the Church on each visit. We request that he make one of these visits over Sunday at each Church during the year.

No. 5. Since it is a matter of importance for all pastors of the District to attend the Conference and Campmeeting, be it resolved that all pastor's support at the Church where he is serving continue over the Sundays he is attending Campmeeting and Conference.

No. 6. Resolved that we as pastor co-operate with our District Superintendent in work on the Campground, and that when called upon we come or send someone.

No. 7. Be it resolved that each Church with its pastor try to open an additional place of worship.

No. 8. Be it resolved that each pastor read all Resolutions, and also Recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee, to his Church at the earliest convenience, and also a few weeks previous to Campmeeting.

No. 9. Be it resolved that each Church take an offering of groceries, vegetables and cash for the Camp.

No. 10. Be it resolved that all monies raised by the local Church for District or General expense be sent to the District Treasurer by the 10th of each month.

No. 11. Whereas many of our pastors have not received sufficient financial support, be it resolved that each Church or pastor appoint someone to take poundings for the pastor.

No. 12. We request that no pastor's wife be elected to serve as delegate to the Conference where the Church has a sufficient number of members to select from.

No. 13. Be it resolved that each pastor organize a Young Peoples' Society where possible, and to encourage same. Furthermore, that Home Missionary offerings be taken monthly at regular Young Peoples' services.

No. 14. Be it resolved that one copy of the Minutes be in every Pilgrim Holiness Church to be there for use of those wishing to read same, also that pastor urge members to have their own copy of the Minutes.

No. 15. Be it resolved that the District Council have charge of the printing and provision for paying for the District Minutes.

No. 16. Be it resolved that the Ministerial Convention be held the 14, 15 and 16th of March, 1944.

No. 17. Be it resolved that all Annual Church and Ministerial reports be in the hands of the District Statistician not later than ten days before Camp, and that one copy be brought by the delegate or pastor to be read at the District Conference.

No. 18. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and his assistant be elected a Campground Committee to look after any emergency that may arise between Campmeeting seasons.

No. 19. Be it resolved that no children under twelve years of age be sent to stay at Campmeeting unless attended by parent or guardian.

20. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be empowered to appoint regular committees.

No. 21. Be it resolved that each Church in the District accept responsibility of building a cottage or finishing a room in the large dormitory before our 1944 Camp, same to be occupied by their pastor. Be it further resolved that a Committee be appointed by the District Council who shall provide plans and supervision for this project.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

No. 1. We recommend that the Ministers' tithes be sent to the District Treasurer, same to be applied on the District Superintendent's salary.

No. 2. We recommend that all members tithe into the local treasury, and that ten percent of the regular offerings, or its equivalent, be sent to the District Treasurer to be prorated to the various departments of the District work. Be it further resolved that the percent for the various departments be as follows: District Superintendent 45 percent; Home Missions 35 percent; Incidentals 20 percent.

No. 3. We recommend that the District Superintendent be allowed the privilege of holding four revivals off the District this year, and that he be permitted to keep his offerings, but he shall pay his own traveling expenses.

No. 4. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid three cents per mile for traveling expenses on the District, and that each Church be asked to take an offering for him, same to be applied on the traveling expense. These offerings are to be taken at his regular visits.

No. 5. We recommend that each church member be assessed fifteen cents per year in order to accumulate the General Conference expense for next General Conference in 1946.

No. 6. We recommend that the District Treasurer be allowed \$1.00 per month for postage, phone calls, etc., same to be paid from the incidental fund.

No. 7. After organizing the Cumberland Grove Campmeeting Association last year, charging \$1.00 per year membership fee, we further recommend that the District Council have charge of same Association.

No. 8. We recommend that all birthday offerings be applied on the District Home Missionary fund for work on the District.

No. 9. We recommend that a Home Missions Board consisting of the District Superintendent, Assistant District Superintendent and the District Treasurer be empowered to handle all home missions projects within the District, and that all expenditures to be made be agreed upon by a majority of said Board.
