PROCEEDINGS

First Day—Monday, July 31, 1944—Morning Session

The Eleventh Annual Conference of the Tennessee District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Cumberland Grove Campground, Jamestown, Tennessee, July 31, 1944. Second Assistant General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, was with us again this year and took the chair. The members of the conference joined in singing, "Take the Name of Jesus with you." Rev. Elmer Moon lead in prayer, after which, hymn, "Close to Thee," was sung. Brother Sturk spoke to the conference upon the subject, "The things upon which the success of our church depends." Rev. J. H. Philpot, Camp evangelist also lead in prayer.

Roll call and registration of delegates.

Moved and adopted that the first six rows of seats in the two middle sections of the tabernacle constitute the conference bar.

By motion the time for meetings were 10:00 A. M. - 12:00 Noon; 1:00 - 3:30 P. M.

By motion the following were appointed to serve until the absent members of the Resolutions Committee arrived: Rev. Virgil H. Greene and Rev. Chas. F. Lory, with Rev. C. A. Simmons as chairman.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

Report of District Superintendent was read and accepted.

Rev. W. E. Honeycutt, Rev. Roy C. Hill, Rev. Donnell Tousley and Mrs. Tousley were introduced to the conference.

The meeting was recessed by motion until 1:00 P. M.

Afternoon Session

The afternoon session was called to order, and the song, "Covered by the Blood," was sung. Rev. I. J. Adams lead in prayer.

The Ways and Means Committee read resolutions No. 2, No. 3, No. 4, No. 6, No. 10, No. 11, and No. 12.

Resolutions No. 2, No. 3, No. 4 and No. 6 were adopted by motion.

Resolution No. 10 as amended was adopted.

Resolutions No. 11 and No. 12 were adopted.

The report of the Resolutions Committee was read. Resolutions number 1 as amended was adopted. Resolutions No. 16 was adopted.

By motion the reading of church reports was omitted.

It was moved and adopted that the election of officers be held at 10:30 A. M., August 1st.

The report of the Educational and Examining Board was read, and by motion was adopted.

A motion prevailed that the Campground Construction Overseer be elected at this time. Brothers Hotel, Simmons and Moon were nominated, and Brother Moon was elected.

By motion the conference adjourned until 5:00 P. M.

Evening Session

The third session was reconvened by singing, "Standing on the Promises." Rev. J. C. Williams lead the conference in prayer. Rev. and Mrs. Smith, pastor of the First Wesleyan Methodist Church, Knoxville, Tennessee, were introduced to the conference. They gave their testimonies. Rev. J. H. Philpot, of Fredonia, Kansas, was also introduced to the conference. They were given honorary seats with the bar.

The conference adjourned by motion until 9:30 A. M., tomorrow,

Second Day—Tuesday, August 1, 1944—Morning Session

The morning session was opened by singing, "How Firm a Foundation." Brother Sturk spoke to the conference from the Word of the Lord.

It was moved and adopted that the roll call be omitted.

The minutes were read and approved.

Rev. R. D. Brown was introduced to the conference. He gave a word of testimony.

It was moved and accepted that Mrs. Maynard Wilson be accepted as a delegate from the Lake City church.

The report of the Educational and Examining Board was read at this time. (See Ministerial Directory).

At this time the following officers were elected for the coming year. Rev. Neal Horton was re-elected as District Superintendent, and Rev. Wm. E. Hall was elected as Assistant District Superintendent.

A motion prevailed that the conference recess until 1:30 P. M.

Afternoon Session

The song, "Covered by the Blood" was sung. Brother Jesse Carter lead in prayer.

The election of officers was continued after nominations for District Treasurer were made by the District Council.

Rev. L. T. Wallingford was re-elected as District Secretary, and Rev. W. E. Honeycutt was elected to fill the office of District Treasurer.

The additional councilmen elected are: Rev. H. H. Barton, Rev. Elvin F. Hotle and Rev. Virgil H. Greene.

Rev. E. A. Shetler was elected as the new member of the Educational and Examining Board.

Trustees are as follows: Rev. Neal Horton (3 Years), Mr. George Stair (2 Years), Rev. Elmer Moon (1 Year).

Rev. H. H. Barton and Rev. L. T. Wallingford were elected as the District Sunday School committee.

At the beginning of the present session the minutes were read and approved.

The report of the Auditing Committee was given and accepted. The Statistical Committee's report was read and accepted.

Last Session

Meeting opened by singing "The Unclouded Day." Prayer by Sister Blanch Byrd.

On motion Mrs. W. E. Honeycutt was accepted into the conference as an ordained minister.

It was moved and adopted that Resolution No. 6 be deleted.

Resolution No. 13 of the Ways and Means Committee was read and accepted.

On motion the Ministerial Convention will be held at Clinton.

It was moved and adopted that the ordination service be held at 7:45 P. M. tomorrow.

On motion a rising vote of thanks was given to Brother Stark for his presence and assistance in the conference.

Moved and adopted that a rising vote of thanks be extended to the kitchen force for service rendered.

Moved and adopted that while the District Superintendent stands the ministers and delegates pass around and give him a hearty handshake.

Moved and adopted that the minutes be accepted as read.

A motion prevailed that the District Treasurer, District Secretary and District Statistician be given a rising vote of thanks for services rendered.

By motion the conference was adjourned.

REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Greetings in the Master:

Through the mercy and the favor of the Lord, we have come through another Conference year, and we are able to meet for a free assembly; out of the reach of the madness of this most cruel of all wars. The tragic events of the past year have affected every

phase of our lives, and the shadow of the conflict has fallen across every door step of our nation. The church has been deeply affected. This year has been one of heavy burden heartache. The nights and days have been packed with burdens. There has been cause for many hours of intercessory prayer. Through all, thank God, it has not been clouds. The Lord has let the sunshine of His love encourage our hearts many times, and we feel like singing, "Praise God from who all blessing flow."

This year has brought to near completion one of the most beautiful churches in the entire connection of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Thank God it is paid for in full. The Chattanooga church with much sacrifice paid off their indebtedness, and burned the mortgage. Monterey has cash and pledges to pay off all indebtedness, and they have made some much needed improvements on the church. McEwen improved their church in a number of ways. The Moss church and parsonage has been improved. The Knoxville parsonage has a new roof and a new coat of paint.

This has been a blessed year in Home Missionary work. We have a new work in Jellico that has been a real blessing to the District since its very beginning. We opened up a new work in a blaze of glory and fire in North Chattanooga. Brother Moon brings in good reports from the new work at Alpine. Brother Johnson has a very encouraging work at Lone Mountain. Brother Greene has been preaching to a nice band of people at Elm Grove. Brother Coston has opened up a new Sunday School at Frogge Chapel, and last report showed forty three in attendance.

I preached 195 times and saw 160 souls seeking God. Have held twelve week end meetings. Traveled near 10,000 miles in the interest of the District and evangelism. Received \$300.00 net from revivals. From the District \$1,180.50, and \$106.02 for traveling expenses.

We are grateful to God for the loyal support from the District. It has been near 100 percent. I have all reasons to believe that the next year will be a better year.

RESOLUTIONS

No. 1. Be it resolved that the date of the District Campmeeting for 1945 be July 27 - August 5, and that the date of the Conference be August 6 and 7.

No. 2. Be it resolved that each church devote one service each month to General Missionary interests, and offering be taken in the Sunday School or Church service and to be sent to the District Treasurer for General Missions.

No. 3. Be it resolved that each church donate two bed springs and furnishings, or the equivalent in cash, for Campmeeting equipment.

No. 4. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent, or his assistant, visit each church three times a year, and that the church give a pounding on each visit. Be it further resolved that he conduct a communion service at the church on each visit. We request that he make one of these visits over Sunday at each church during the year.

No. 5. Since it is a matter of importance for all pastors of the District to attend the Conference and Campmeeting, be it resolved that all pastors' support at the church where he is serving continue over the Sundays he is attending Campmeeting and Conference.

No. 6. Deleted.

No. 7. Be it resolved that each church with its pastor try to open an additional place of worship.

No. 8. Be it resolved that each pastor read all resolutions, and also recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee, to his Church at the earliest convenience, and also a few weeks previous to Campmeeting.

No. 9. Be it resolved that each church take an offering of groceries, vegetables and cash for the Camp.

No. 10. Be it resolved that all monies raised by the local

church for District or General expense be sent to the District Treasurer by the 10th of each month.

No. 11. Whereas many of our pastors have not received sufficient financial support, be it resolved that each church or pastor appoint someone to take poundings for the pastor.

No. 12. We request that no pastor's wife be elected to serve as delegate to the Conference where the church has a sufficient number of members to select from.

No. 13. Be it resolved that each pastor organize a Young Peoples' Society where possible, and to encourage same. Furthermore, that Home Missionary offering be taken monthly at regular Young Peoples' services.

No. 14. Be it resolved that one copy of the minutes be in every Pilgrim Holiness Church for use of those wishing to read same, also that pastors urge members to have their own copy.

No. 15. Be it resolved that the District Council have charge of the printing and provision for paying for the minutes.

No. 16. Be it resolved that the Ministerial Convention be held the 13, 14 and 15th of March, 1945.

No. 17. Be it resolved that all Annual Church and Ministerial reports be in the hands of the District Statistician not later than ten days before Camp, and that one copy be brought by the delegate or pastor to be read at the District Conference.

No. 18. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and his assistant be elected a Campground Committee to look after any emergency that may arise between campmeeting seasons.

No. 19. Be it resolved that no children under twelve years of age be sent to stay at Campmeeting unless attended by parents or guardian.

No. 20. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be empowered to appoint regular committees.

No. 21. Be it resolved that each church in the District accept responsibility of building a cottage or finishing a room in the large dormitory before our 1945 Camp, same to be occupied by their pastor. Be it further resolved that a committee be appointed by the District Council who shall provide plans and supervision of this project.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

No. 1. We recommend that the ministers' tithes be sent to the District Treasurer, same to be applied on the District Superintendent's salary.

No. 2. We recommend that all members tithe into the local treasury, and that ten percent of the regular offerings, or its equivalent, be sent to the District Treasurer to be prorated to the various departments of the district work. Be it further resolved that the percent for the various departments be as follows: District Superintendent 25 percent; Home Missions 35 percent; Incidentals 20 percent; Campground fund 20 percent.

No. 3. We recommend that the District Superintendent be allowed the privilege of holding two revivals off the district this year, and that he be permitted to keep his offerings, but he shall pay his own traveling expenses.

No. 4. We recommend that each pastor take a free will offering at each visit of District Superintendent or assistant for his traveling expenses, and that each local church treasurer report said amount to District Treasurer with other monies.

No. 5. We recommend that each church member be assessed fifteen cents per year in order to accumulate the General Conference expense for next General Conference in 1946.

No. 6. We recommend that the District Treasurer be allowed \$2.50 per month for postage, phone calls, etc., same to be paid from the incidental fund.

No. 7. After organizing the Cumberland Grove Campmeeting Association, charging \$1.00 per year membership fee, we further recommend that the District Council have charge of same Asso-

ciation.

No. 8. We recommend that all birthday offerings be applied on the District Home Missionary fund for work on the district.

No. 9. We recommend that a Home Missions Board consisting of the District Superintendent, Assistant District Superintendent and the District Treasurer be empowered to handle all home missions projects within the district, and that all expenditures to be made be agreed upon by a majority of said board.

No. 10. We recommend that the conference elect a responsible person to have oversight of camp ground and buildings and be empowered to use all monies appropriated for such purposes to repair, complete and build if possible. We further recommend that this person be under supervision of District Council.

No. 11. We further recommend that all monies now on hand for this purpose be transferred to campground funds.

No. 12. We recommend that our District Superintendent pay his tithes to the District Treasurer, the same to be placed in the District Home Missionary fund.

No. 13. We recommend that each preacher donate five days work on campground each year under supervision of the overseer of the campground.
