PROCEEDINGS

First Day—Monday, August 6, 1945 Afternoon Session

The twelfth Annual Conference of the Tennessee District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Cumberland Grove Campground, Jamestown, Tennessee, August 6th, 1945. The District Superintendent, Rev. Neal Horton, Presided. The conference was opened by singing, "I Love To Tell The Story". Rev. Wm. E. Hall, Assistant District Superintendent, read the scripture lesson. Rev. Elmer Moon led in prayer.

The following were presented to the conference and each gave a word of testimony: Rev. and Mrs. H. A. Wilcox, of Knoxville, Sister G. W. Smith, of Paris, Rev. Lester Mahew, of Indiana.

Roll call and registration of delegates.

Moved and adopted that the first six rows of seats constitute the conference bar.

Moved and adopted that Sister H. A. Wilcox be seated as a delegate from the Knoxville church.

Moved and adopted that Rev. H. A. Wilcox, acting pastor of the Knoxville church, be given a seat in the conference.

Rev. Neal Horton, District Superintendent, read his report which was accepted.

Report of the Statistical Committee read and accepted.

Report of the newly organized church at Paris was given verbally by Bro. Elmer Moon, and the new church was received into the conference.

Report of the District Treasurer was read and accepted.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE:

Resolution No. 2 read and accepted as amended.

Resolution No. 5 read and accepted.

Resolution No. 10 referred back to the committee for redrafting.

Resolution No. 11 read and accepted.

Moved and adopted that the conference recess until 7:00 o'clock P. M.

Evening Session

The evening session was opened by singing, "When We All Get To Heaven".

Report of Rev. Wm. E. Hall, former District Treasurer, who acted from July 16, to the 1944 Conference which convened AUG. 17 1944, was given and accepted.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE:

No. 10 read and accepted.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE:

No. 1 read and accepted.

No. 3 read and referred back to the committee for redrafting.

No. 7 read and rejected.

No. 14 read and accepted.

No. 19 read and accepted.

Rev. Bruce Thum and Rev. Charles J. Verness were introduced to the conference. They gave their testimonies.

Moved and adopted that a partial report of the Educational and Examining Board be given at this time. (See Ministerial Directory)

Moved and adopted the hour for business for August 7th be from 9:00 A. M. until 12:00 noon.

Moved and adopted that the election of officers be held at 9:45 A. M. August 7th.

Moved and adopted that the conference adjourn.

Second Day—Tuesday, August 7th, 1945 —Morning Session

The morning session was opened by singing, "The Solid Rock".
Prayer by Bro. Elmer Moon.

Minutes of the previous sessions read and accepted.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE:

No. 3 read and accepted.

Roll Call.

The election of officers was held at this time.

Moved and adopted that the conference recess until 1:30 P. M.

Afternoon Session

The afternoon session was opened by singing, "Standing On The Promises". Prayer by Sister J. D. Ward-Pitman.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE:

No. 20 read and accepted.

Moved and adopted that the report of the Committee for formulating a plan for Pilgrim Ministers Benevolent Fund be approved.

Moved and adopted that resolution No. 9 of the Ways and Means Committee be deleted. (As it appears in 1944 minutes).

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE:

No. 9 read and accepted.

The ordination service was then entered upon. Rev. Neal Horton, District Superintendent, delivered the charge. The District Council assisted in the service. The three candidates ordained were: Rev. Donnell E. Tousley, Rev. Charles J. Verness and Rev. H. A. Wilcox.

Moved and adopted that matter of the indebtedness on the new dormatory be referred to the District Council.

Moved and accepted that we extend to our retiring District Superintendent, Rev. Neal Horton, a rising vote of thanks.

Moved and adopted that a rising vote of thanks be given to Bro. Moon for his labors on the campground this year.

Moved and adopted that a rising vote of thanks be given to the District Secretary for his services.

Moved and adopted that a rising vote of thanks be given to the District Treasurer for his services.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE:

No. 2 read and accepted as amended.
There being no further business the conference adjourned.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the Tennessee District Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church meeting at Jamestown, Tennessee, August 6th and 7th.

The four years I have been privileged to serve you will forever hold many happy memories.

Am grateful that the Lord allowed me to labor with the best of His servants in the gospel ministry. A number of them are here to-day but others have gone to other districts, where they are proving themselves as they did among us.

I shall never be able to thank God enough for our loyal lay membership that have stood so loyal during these months. Much credit goes to them for any progress we might be able to show.

I must express a grateful word that it has been my privilege to have had the wise counsel of our beloved General Superintendent, Rev. W. L. Surbrook, and fine spirit of co-operation from our General Church.

The District has made progress every year, though the world conflict has added many hardships.

This year has been one with many battles, but when weighed against the victories it looks like we have come out more than conquerors. Every one of our godly pastors have labored against many odds, but I would not say a one could be called a quitter.

We have bought and paid for a nice property in Jellico.

A new church has recently been organized at Paris.

Soon afaer conference Bro. Moon and the good folk expect to build a new church at Alpine.

The church at Chattanooga has added more rooms to their parsonage.

The new building that we enjoy tells of progress on our Camp Ground.

Bro. Shetler has opened a new work at Fountain City, Knoxville. I have visited all the churches except one, three times. Conducted all our annual business meetings.

I have held two revivals off the district and four on. Spent three months in a Home Mission work at McMinnville. The last few weeks I have been with our work on the Camp Ground. Have traveled 12580 miles and preached 225 times. Received as salary \$1,280.00. Received from revivals \$370.00.

RESOLUTIONS

No. 1. Be it resolved that the date of the District Camp Meeting for 1946 be July 26th - August 4th, and that the date of the Conference be August 5th and 6th.

No. 2. Be it resolved that each church devote one service each month to General Missionary interests, and offerings be taken in the Sunday School or Church service and to be sent to the District Treasurer for General Missions.

No. 3. Be it resolved that the District Secretary be paid \$25.00, and the District Treasurer be paid \$50.00 for their yearly service to the District.

No. 4. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent, or his assistant, visit each church three times a year, and that the church give a pounding on each visit. Be it further resolved that he conduct a communion service at the church on each visit. We request that he make one of these visits over Sunday at each church during the year.

No. 5. Since it is a matter of importance for all pastors of the District to attend the Conference and Campmeeting, be it resolved that all pastors' support at the church where he is serving continue over the Sundays he is attending Campmeeting and Conference.

No. 6. Be it resolved that each pastor read all resolutions, and also recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee, to his church at the earliest convenience, and also a few weeks previous to Campmeeting.

No. 7. Be it resolved that each church take an offering of groceries, vegetables and cash for the camp.

No. 8. Be it resolved that all monies raised by local church for District or General expense be sent to the District Treasurer by the 10th of each month.

No. 9. Whereas many of our pastors have not received sufficient financial support, be it resolved that each church or pastor appoint someone to take poundings for the pastor.

No. 10. We recommend that no pastor's wife be elected to serve as a delegate to the Conference where the church has a sufficient number of members to select from.

No. 11. Be it resolved that each pastor organize a Young Peoples' Society where possible, and to encourage same. Furthermore, that Home Missionary offerings be taken monthly at regular Young Peoples' services.

No. 12. Be it resolved that one copy of the Minutes be in every Pilgrim Holiness Church for use of those wishing to read same, also that pastors urge members to have their own copy.

No. 13. Be it resolved that the District Council have charge of the printing of the minutes and provision for paying for same.

No. 14. Be it resolved that we have two ministerial conventions this conference year. Workers and dates to be arranged by the District Council.

No. 15. Be it resolved that all annual church ministerial reports be in the hands of the District Statistician not later than ten days before Camp, and that one copy be brought by the delegate or pastor to be read at the District Conference.

No. 16. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and his assistant be elected a Campground Committee to look after any emergency that may arise between Campmeeting seasons.

No. 17. Be it resolved that no children under twelve years of age be sent to stay at Campmeeting unless attended by parents or guardian.

No. 18. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be empowered to appoint regular committees.

No. 19. Be it resolved that churches desiring to finish rooms, or build cottages for their pastor, be allowed to do so under supervision of the District Council.

No. 20. Be it resolved that the church entertaining the Ministerial Convention make arrangements with some restaurant for said delegation, to be fed at own expense, and that bedding arrangements be made by the entertaining church.

No. 21. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be empowered to appoint a person to see after the rooms, beds and bedding on the Campground. To see that the bedding on Campground is properly cleaned and stored under lock. Said person to receive \$15.00 out of Campmeeting fund.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

No. 1. We recommend that the ministers' tithes be sent to the District Treasurer, same to be applied on the District Superintendent's salary.

No. 2. We recommend that all members tithe into the local treasury, and that ten percent of the regular offerings, or its equivalent, be sent to the District Treasurer to be prorated to the various departments of the District work. Be it further resolved that the percent for the various departments be as follows: District Superintendent 25 percent; Home Missions 35 percent; Incidentals 20 percent; Campground fund 20 percent.

No. 3. We recommend that the District Superintendent be allowed the privilege of holding two revivals off the district this year, and that he be permitted to keep his offerings, but he shall pay his own traveling expenses.

No. 4. We recommend that each pastor take a free will offering at each visit of the District Superintendent or assistant for his traveling expenses, and that each local church treasurer report said amount to District Treasurer with other monies.

No. 5. We recommend that each church member be assessed \$1.00 in order to accumulate the General Conference expense for next General Conference, in 1946.

No. 6. We recommend that the District Treasurer be allowed \$2.50 per month for postage, phone calls, etc., same to be paid from the incidental fund.

No. 7. After organizing the Cumberland Grove Campmeeting Association, charging \$1.00 per year membership fee, we further recommend that the District Council have charge of same Association.

No. 8. We recommend that all birthday offerings be applied on the District Home Missionary work in the District.

No. 9. We recommend that the District Council have charge of the Home Missionary work in the District.

No. 10. We recommend that the District Superintendent have oversight of the campground and buildings, and that all monies appropriated for such purposes be used by him.

No. 11. We recommend that each preacher donate two days labor each year or pay \$10.00 in cash to support the work on the campground.

No. 12. We recommend that our District Superintendent pay his tithes to the District Treasurer, the same to be placed in the District Home Missionary fund.
